Eastern Region Events

Schmidt Cops South Shore Fitzgerald Wins Eastern States

Two Massachusetts events were played in late March and early April, kicking off the final drive of the 2000 season in the Eastern Region. Some 130 peggers were on hand for the annual South Shore Open in Randolph, MA on March 26. After the last peg had been put away, only One-Star Phyllis Schmidt (MA) was left unbeaten in the playoff round. The win came with 196 MRP's and vaults Schmidt into the thick of the annual run for the roses with some 750+ points in the bag.

Bob Turcotte (MA) nailed down 2nd...and 147 MRP's, followed by Dudley Dumaine (MA) and Bob Fitzgerald (CT) in 3-4. Life Master Bill Medeiros (MA) scored 10 wins (21 GP's +159) in the 12-game qualifying round to take honors.

Some 76 peggers played the Consolation, and Dick West, a Grand Master from Attleboro, MA ran the table, taking qualifying honors (17 7/8 +186) and winning the playoffs as well. Grand Master Joe Ramos (RI) took home 2nd, followed by Master Cindy Veradt (MA) and Harvey Glass (CT) in 3-4.

Director Jim Ready reported that Judy Finley and Kirk Hobbs scored 28-hands, but nary a trace of a 29! This event was played as a memorial to the late Leo Horigan.

Bob Fitzgerald, fresh from a 4th place finish a week earlier, came home the winner at the Eastern States Championship in Shrewsbury, MA on April 2. Life Master David Clemmey (MA) took home 2nd money, followed by Wayne Hittle (MA) and Life Master George Webb (MA) in 3-4. Hittle was also the high qualifier with a nice 24 GP card in the 12-game round, besting the 110 players in the match.

One-Star Harry Palmer (MA) took home the marbles in the 60-player Consolation, besting Grand Master Peter Setian (MA) in the final playoff match. Bruce Brown (MA) and Larry Harmon (CT) finished 3-4. Life Master George Bickford (MA) scored 16 GP's in the 8 game qualifying round to take honors. Palmer's top finish (45 MRP's) keeps him near the top of the Eastern Region's MRP leaderboard for this cribbage year.

Director Bill Medeiros reported that Joe Henry scored two 28-hands, and Harry Palmer another. He also reported that Louis Petosa and Al Stephanian split the skunk pot (\$45) by having the dubious honor of being the top non-qualifiers in the Main and Consolation events.

Record St. Croix Classic **Lyle Lund Tops 194**

Director Alan Lindner: "Tournaments are going over seating capacity and if you show up on Saturday morning to play there may NOT be any room or openings!"

And this time around, the St. Croix Classic (April 1-2) was at full capacity. With 194 peggers on board, Lyle Lund, Caver, MN, came home the winner. The win came with a sizeable purse and 196 MRP's. His win came the hard way, as he had the streaking Life Master Roger Wilson (CO) for his final opponent. His cards stayed hot and he came away the winner. Wilson also took qualifying honors with a fine 37 17/22 +157. He garnered 202 MRP's (aggregate) and zips to the 800 mark for this cribbage year. He now stands among the national leaders in the annual run for the roses. But this event belonged to Lund. Not only did he win the \$1,500 first place prize, but also took home other Q-pools. His take? A cool \$5,000!

Master Shawn Andrusko (MN) and Richard Cruse (WI) nailed down 3-4.

Bob Sommer (MN) is moving in on his Grand Master by winning the 126-player Consolation. Grand National III winner Grace Cummings, a Master pegger from Madison, WI, finished 2nd, followed by Kevin Post (MN) and Barney Baird (MN) in 3-4. Master Bob Loch (NV) took qualifying honors with a 16 7/9 +135.

Bob Brown (WI) played the hottest game of the match. He scored a 28-hand and a 24-hand in the same game...for a whopping \$275 bonus!!

Director Lindner reported the event was played without a hitch, and the casino's largess in providing cash and other perks keep this event humming. Lindner remains amazed that in the 12-event history at St. Croix no 29's have been scored. And they are worth \$500! See Tournament Trail, this issue, for upcoming St. Croix events.

Sioux Falls Event **Bob McGuire Tops In South Dakota**

T. J. Lewis and his crew of five got the inaugural SunBird O'Classic off and running in fine style on March 17-19 in Sioux Falls, SD. With 66-peggers on hand, local Bob McGuire took home the championship, besting Iowan Jeff Crane in the final playoff match. McGuire took home 147 MRP's and the top prize for the win.

Ron Hamilton (KS) is zeroing in on his Life Master by taking home 3rd. Ben Garner (NE) nailed down 4th. Crane was also the high qualifier with a nice 34 GP card, and he took home an aggregate 145 MRP's.

40 players stayed for the Consolation and Master Bob Chase (MN) took home the marbles. Life Master Jim Rein (MN) finished 2nd, followed by Bob Sivertson (SD) and Bob Joslin (MN) in 3-4. Grand Master Joan Rein (MN) took qualifying honors with an excellent 18 GP card in the 9-game round.

Jim Weires, Faribault, MN, came to play at the inaugural Zumbrota Open (MN) on March 26. He took home the championship, besting a sizeable crowd of 108 peggers. His take? A nice 147 MRP's and bragging rights, in addition to the winner's purse.

Grand Master Frank Trojan (MN) nailed 2nd and added 105 MRP's to his lofty lifetime total. Kelvin Andow (MN) and Gerald Huebbe (MN) came home 3-4 (and 70 MRP's).

Ray Kimmen (MN) won 12 of 14 qualifying round games, taking honors (with 3 skunks and a nice +244!)

Don Jurgens (MN) won 6 of 7 games in the Consolation qualifying round, but Master Shawn Andrusko (MN) won the playoffs. Myron Schmidt (MN) copped 2nd, with Francis Pasiuk (MN) and One-Star Bob Julian (WI) finishing 3-4. Julian picked up yet another 18 MRP's in his quest for his fourth national championship.

Director Ken Lothar reported that Jack Rosener scored his first-ever 28-hand. Terry Shelstad also scored this elusive gem. Lothar was pleased with the large turn-out and is looking forward to a re-match next year.

Record Crowd In Montana Hatcher Wins Montana Open, Takes MRP Lead

Paul Hatcher, pegging out of Salem, OR, came home the winner at the record-setting Montana Open on April 2. With the win (and qualifying MRP's) came 221 MRP's, running this year's tally to 1,056! He becomes the first ACC pegger to crack the 1,000 mark this cribbage year. The win also came with a nice \$1,100 top prize... and also has Hatcher knocking on the door for his One Star rating.

Tony Murawski (WA) came very close, taking Hatcher to the 7th game and losing by a single point in the final game. He took home 182 MRP's (aggregate) and \$800. Grand Master Betty Johnson (WA) and Jake Elwell (WA) finished 3-4 in this 141-player event. Johnson took home \$600, and Elwell netted \$400. Both hail from Spokane.

Grand Master Jim Hartung (WA) smoked the field in the qualifying round with a superlative 40 18/22 +300.

Master Jim Waldorf (OR) ran a Grand Slam 9/9 +111 in the Consolation qualifying round to take honors, but Jack Perkins (MT) won the playoffs in this 90-player event. Lee Carpenter (ID) took 2nd, with Charley Brown (WA) and Grand Master Bayard Lliteras (ID) in a tie for 3rd. Waldorf's run keeps his top-ten hopes alive for this cribbage year.

A large contingent of peggers from Edmonton, Alberta were in the field, and Roy Hawryluk and Linda Piro fared the best. Piro won the Time Passer (82 players) and Hawryluk won the Saturday night game (80 players).

Grand Master Ken Capper (OR), fresh from winning the Oregon Championship, came home the winner in the High Roller, besting some 30 players... and took home \$875. Noyes (MT) and Ron Whyde (MT) won the Doubles, and Two-Star DeLynn Colvert copped the Last Chance.

Four 28-hands were scored: Pat Rice, Charles Tetrault, Rex Paddock, and Ryan Uhlenkat. Uhlenkat's 28 was scored in his first-ever sanctioned event.

Directors DeLynn Colvert and Sharon Hejtmanek had their hands full with the large crowd, but volunteers, mainly from the Helena Grass Roots club, provided expert help in getting all events off on time.

Cribbage is on a roll in the Northwest, attested to by this record crowd, and the ACC gained five new members.

With the 5 cut, both players would score a 20-point hand, and a 21-point crib nets a stunning 70 for the dealer and 32 for the non-dealer.

And after all the pegs were laid away only Master Harold Buckley, pegging out of Spruce Grove, Alberta, was left unbeaten in the playoff round. He garnered an attractive gold-plated gold pan and the top prize, in addition to 105 MRP's.

The field was evenly matched, attested to by an almost unheard of 26 GP qualifying card (Jim Sime, WA). National front-runner Life Master Paul Hatcher, a winner of 11 games (of 22) in the qualifying round, was feeling blue, until he discovered he had qualified 14th (of 15). He scored 5 skunks to keep his hopes alive (27-11/22). With this break he roared into 2nd place and tacked on yet another 70 MRP's to his lofty 1,100+ total for this cribbage year. Grand Master Ken Capper (OR) continues his roll with a 3rd place finish, with Master Jim Sime (WA) in 4th. Capper also took home a gold-plated gold pan by taking top honors in the qualifying round (33 16/22 +169).

Local Duff Bonomi nailed the 46-player Consolation....and won the Saturday Special as well. Canadian Gerald Mohr took home 2nd, followed by Master Lynn Gillespie (WA) and Jim Best (ID) in 3-4.

The Time Passer was won by Grand Master Rollie Heath (OR) and the doubles action was taken by Grand Master Rex Paddock (MT) and Ronda O'Brien (ID). Life Master Hatcher won the High Rollers.

Director Roy Carlson, with help from Betty Johnson ran a spirited, fun event. And Carlson posted a real oddity in the Consolation event. He scored consecutive hands of 17-17-17-16-16-16...and out! The odds? A million to one (with each hand of 16 or better being 10-1).

The Michaelis 1-2-3-4-J-Q

The late Mick Michaelis gave me a tip years ago concerning the 1-2-3-4, two face card hand. When it is your own crib, he would discard the 2-3, keeping the 1-4-J-Q (or any two 10 cards).

I argued that the 1-2-3-4 is a far better pegging hand, and might possibly outweigh the advantages of having a 2-3 in your own crib. But after studying and playing several of these hands, I came to the conclusion that Mick was right. The larger cribs that resulted outweighed the pegging advantages of holding all small cards.

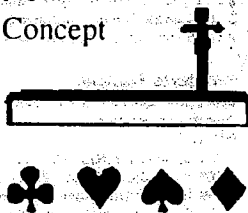
