# American Cribbage Congress Completes Record Year

The American Cribbage Congress sanctioned a record 153 tournaments in the 2000 year, complete with another record twenty-two 29-hands (at \$100 each) scored in sanctioned events.

The year wound down with a bang, as One-Star Phyllis Schmidt (MA) came home with the National Open championship...and a spot on the All-American team. In winning this Raleigh, NC classic, Schmidt scored a whopping 196 MRP's, finishing the year with 1,275 MRP's in the bag, topping all players in the Eastern Region.

But out west it was Two-Star Jesse Jarrell (CA) coming home the 2000 National Champion. Scoring at almost every stop, he culminated a hot finish with a record 1,615 MRP's to easily cop the title. This is Jarrell's second national title, having won in 1993.

Out west, Grand Master Gene Sissel came home the winner at the 186-player Portland Summer Open, capping a nice season, garnering 621 MRP's.

A complete run-down of the season-ending events are in this issue.

The Grand National's Awards Banquet will award another record 99 awards (not counting the Grass Roots program) at the upcoming Eau Claire, WI event. This season has been a banner one, despite debates over Grass Roots leadership and authority. The upcoming 2001 year is on track to equal, or better this past record year. Internet play has added interest in cribbage, and the ACC's membership is growing at a steady rate.

# Sissel Nails Portland Summer

Grand Master Gene Sissel, Baker city, OR, finished the 2000 season in grand style! He won the 186-player Portland Summer Open. In addition to a nice trophy board, and a four-figure check, he took home 196 MRP's, running this year's total to well over 600.

Master David Gilkeson (OR) took home 2nd, and the 147 MRP's ran his yearly total to well over 400. Life Master Gary Motley (OR) and Grand Master Todd Malmgren (OR) finished 3-4. Malmgren's 105 MRP's gave him exactly 999 MRP's for the year, narrowly missing All-American honors.

Denny Edwards, a Master pegger from Hermiston, OR, fresh from winning the huge National Grass Roots Open, showed the field how cribbage is played. In the qualifying round, he won an outstanding 19 of 22 games (41 19/22 +238) to take honors. Two other 40 GP cards were scored as the cards were hot (or cold) in this season-ending match.

A goodcrowdof 120 players played the Consolation, and it was Tony Murawski (OR) winning going away. Murawski also had a fine season, topping 400 MRP's. Bill O'Malley (OR) took home 2nd, with Master Roger Lueschow (WA) and Marcia Glenn (OR) in 3-4. Glenn has been busy recruiting new players via internet play. She now has some results to entice new players.

James Kahue (HI) came home the winner in the July edition of the Hawaii Open. Daniel Ogden (HI) took 2nd. Director Tsarkie had 17 players on hand, and barely made the minimum for a sanctioned event. Nevertheless, Kahue took home 70 MRP's for the win.

# Cousens Cops Granite State

On April 9, some 98 players played the Granite State Open in Manchester, NH. Master Dennis Cousens (ME) came away the winner...and took home another 147 MRP's to add to his lifetime totals. Author John Chambers, a Grand Master from Providence, RI, nailed down 2nd, followed by Bruce Brown (MA) and Sam Shwartz (MA) in 3-4. Life Master George Bickford (MA) has scored a whopping 7,000 MRP's in his cribbage travels...and he added yet another 60 MRP's by posting a great 26 11/ 12 +280 in the qualifying round. One-Star Harry Palmer (MA) won the 58-player Consolation, and the 45 MRP's helped propell him to All-American honors this cribbage year. Newly-crowned Grand Master Lou Caccia (MA) took 2nd, with Ed Donahue (MA) and H. Gagnon in 3-4. Donahue is very close to his Masters with this high finish.

# Wakeman Tops Devil Mountain

Grand Master Bill Wakeman (CA) came home the winner at the 108-player Devil Mountain Caper on July 16. Wakeman had an outstanding season, scoring some 833 MRP's. 1998 All-American Bob Clark (CA) finished 2nd, with Grand Master Claire Morse (OR) and Grand Master James Langley (CA) in 3-4. Morse's high finish helped earn All-American honors this cribbage year. He finished the year 8th with 1,140 MRP's in the bag.

Rickie Mack (CA) continues her hot streak by taking qualifying honors (37 GP's). Another of the Mack clan...Herschel...ran the table in the 58-player Consolation, He took qualifying honors and won the playoffs as well. His MRP take? 63!

Grand Master Mary Herrmann (CA) finished 2nd, and very nearly earned All-American honors. She scored a whopping 1,032 MRP's this cribbage season, finishing 12th nationally. Pamella Pomeroy (CA) and Graeme Gossett (OR) finished 3-4.

# Schmidt Cops National Open

With but a month to play, One-Star Phyllis Schmidt, Williamstown, MA, appeared out of the running for top-ten honors for this cribbage year, but in the season's last event...the National Open...she came to play. In topping the huge 220-player field, she zipped to 1,275 MRP's and third place nationally, earning her 5th All-American honors. She was national champ in 1992.

Her last best 4 of 7 match pitted her with Master Larry Phifer, and he was pegging on his home turf (Raleigh, NC). Schmidt prevailed, taking home 196 MRP's...and national honors.

Joy Barnes, a Master pegger from DeLand, FL, came close, taking home 3rd. Barnes won Grand National X in 1991. Marvin Lewis (VA) finished 4th...and garnered 95 MRP's for the effort.

Scott Christman (OH) won the sizeable 158-player Consolation, and William Billow (NC) finished 2nd. Bill Poole (NY) and Sidney Weinberg (VA) took home 3-4.

# Corrado Tops Sizzler

With 94 players in action, it was Master Frank Corrado, East Hartford, CT, coming home the winner. In picking up another 147 MRP's Corrado moves to the 700 mark for the year...and very possibly a spot on the Eastern Region's All-Star team. Master Bob Kaplan (MA) nailed down 2nd, moving his MRP's to well over 600 for this cribbage year. One-Star Duane Toll (WI) was pegging outside his territory, and by finishing in the 3-4 bracket, cements his spot on the Central Region's All-Star team, and gives him an outside shot of earning yet another All-American team spot (900+ MRP's). Joyce Vanelli (MA) also finished in the 3-4 bracket (70 MRP's).

Co-director Brenda Palmer (MA) won 10 of 14 (with 4 skunks) to take qualifying honors (24 10/14 +163). This Life Master earned yet another 40 MRP's with this effort.

Grand Master Dwight Christensen (CT) won the 50-player Consolation, nipping One-Star Phyllis Schmidt (MA) in the final playoff match. Schmidt's 30 MRP's place her at the 900+ mark for the year, giving her an outside chance of earning All-American. She will be a member of the Eastern Region's All-Star team and in action at Reno's huge February meet. Barbara Barbour (CT) and Tom Fiorini (MA) finished 3-4. Grand Master Phil Martin (CT) topped the field in the qualifying round, winning 6 of 8 (16 6/8 +155).

Director Harry Palmer reported two 28-hands: Roland Hall (CA), and Daniel Patriss (CT). He also reported an oddity: Grand Master Bill Shoemaker, dealing, scored a single peg point, held a blank hand and a blank crib! His opponent pegged zero and scored a 2-point hand...for an unbelievable 3-point total hand!

Life Master Jim Rein, Carver, MN, came home the winner at the recent Lewis & Clark Classic, played at Yankton, SD. With a huge crowd of peggers in action (150), Rein carted home a whopping 196 MRP's, running his 2000 season totals to the 700 mark.

Jim Harrison, pegging out of Iowa, came home 2nd, followed by Master Bob Chase (MN) and Merle Hollands (MN) in 3-4. Chase picked up another 105 MRP's for his high finish and has topped 1,000 MRP's for the season...and an excellent chance of earning All-American honors. One-Star Bob Julian (WI) finished in the 5-8 bracket, and the 70 MRP's keep his slim title hopes alive for yet another national championship. He stands at 1,300 for the year, trailing frontrunner Two-Star Jesse Jarrell (CA) by some 250 MRP's. With two events to play, it will take a hot run of cards to pull the top spot out of the bag.

Grand Master Frank Trojan (MN) put on a show in the qualifying round, posting one of the season's best scores...a very nice 40 17/22 +283.

Grand Master Bob Hanes (IA) is warming up for his usual Grand National run (a 2-time winner) by taking qualifying honors in the 82-player Consolation. But it was Master Jean Cervantes (WI) coming home the winner in the playoffs. Newly crowned Grand Master Marlene Lazachek (WI) came home 2nd, with Jeff Crane (IA) and Tony Danihel (WI) in the 3-4 spots.

Julian also copped the Saturday Night Special, and Jeff Crane won the Friday Early Bird. Jerry Mittlestaedt (CO) nailed a 28-hand (to go with his 29 scored on May 20.

Director Scott Kooistra (and spouse Linda) once again hosted a well-run event...and this time around added yet another attraction. A 36-player duplicate event was played, with 18 players on one side playing the same cards, and 18 players on the other side also playing the same cards. In a tough match, Sue Edwards (CO) and Charles Ritter (NE) came home winners. Kooistra thanks Arnold Groskreutz (MN) and his crew for a mountain of work in pre-sorting all the hands.

Kudos to Mikulsky

I would like to thank Gene and Aggie Mikulsky for all the time they have given to the Grass Roots and running tourneys for us players. I have heard that Gene is resigning from his leadership in the Grass Roots. You deserve thanks from many of us, but I have seen and heard words that I believe to be slanderous, as there were no hard facts stated, only inuendos. I will not name the accusers but I want you to know that nearly all of us trust you and thank you. As for the few that inferred your unsavory character, think about your unkind accusations that you align him with a few bad apples that most of us know were caught at their dishonest acts. # Jesse Jarrell Cops National Championship

Jesse Jarrell, the Pittsburg, CA, king of cribbage, has done it again! He nailed down the 2000 cribbage year National Championship in a convincing fashion, scoring a whopping 1,615 MRP's. His late-season run was especially strong, taking four consecutive 2nd place finishes in major events. He also won the National Championship in 1993, and has had seven top-ten finishes. He capped a great season by earning his Two-Star rating...the ACC's 2nd.

One-Star Bob Julian, Milwaukee, WI also came on strong with a season-ending flourish, but simply could not match Jarrell's run. Julian has won the national title three times. and this is his fourth All-American honors. Another One-Star player... Phyllis Schmidt, Williamstown, MA... finished 3rd, her 5th time to the top ten. She won the National Championship in 1992. Paul Hatcher, Salem, OR, earned his One-Star this year, and had an early lead this season. He suffered a cold run in the late going but, nevertheless, finished a solid 4th for the year. He was co-champion in 1998, and has finished in the top ten five times. One-Star Harry Palmer, W. Springfield, MA, nailed down the 5th spot...his 3rd time in the top ten. Three-Star DeLynn Colvert, Missoula, MT is a perennial top-ten finisher, having earned All-American 15 times. He earned his 20,000th MRP this past season .. and became the ACC's first Three-Star player. Grand Master Rollie Heath, Lincoln City, OR, has been coming on like gang-busters the past four seasons...and he took home his third top-ten honors. Three Grand Masters earned their first trip to the top ten this cribbage year...Claire Morse, Bend, OR; Ronald Morgan, Loyalton, CA; and Jack Moritzky, Mabton, WA.

Pros and Cons **World Championship Prizes Debated** 

Last month's CW published a letter from Pat Barrett (WI) supporting World Championship director Mike Taborski in his handling of the prize fund at this large California meet.

In rebuttle, Mel Ashley (CA) responded to Taborski's open letter asking for suggestions. Ashley's letter is condensed as follows:

Ashley feels that the Rotary Club could increase the prize fund and with the resulting increase in players (back to the 300-400 who played years ago) the bottom line income could probably be maintained just on the income from the raffle and drinks. His suggestions:

Do NOT take the 15% from entry fees.

Do NOT charge \$18 for food. \$10 is standard. Put a donation can for coffee and donuts.

Trophies for top 8 is sufficient.

Perhaps get the city or county to donate the fairgrounds building as part of their share of the charity.

He concludes: "This is too prestigious a tournament to be going downhill like this ... and you folks work too hard to let it happen."

As cribbageland offers more and more sanctioned events, the competition is keener to attract players. Events that add prize money are becoming more prevalent, thus making events supporting a charity all the more difficult to compete. 

Enough Already! Editorial by DeLynn Colvert

As editor of *Cribbage World*, I have been unceremoniously thrust into the Grass Roots controversy. Having been lambasted by several ACC members for failing to give details of this issue, especially the suspensions of former Grass Roots director Gene Mikulsky and former Grass Roots Statistician Joe Ramos.

The American Cribbage Congress's Constitution and ByLaws (Article X, Ethics, e.: If any member is suspended or expelled, that fact (only) shall be included in the next regular publication of the Congress. Cribbage World did just that.

Now, an uproar concerning the Grass Roots program has erupted.

This entire imbroglio, in my opinion, was caused by a failure to communicate, a failure of team play and cooperation, and, perhaps, inflated egos and stubborness.

Let's go back to the rumor mill. Many ACC members feel that the Grass Roots program was a separate organization from the get-go. Even Jerry Dickinson, the GR's 2nd director, fueled that rumor by claiming the Grass Roots program was a separate organization (perhaps a simple misunderstanding). During his tenure he repeatedly reported to the ACC's Board of Directors. President Joe Wergin began the program in 1983, with his home club (Madison, WI) designated club no. 1. Out west, Jeanne Hill, BOD member, chartered club no. 2 in Hermiston, OR...and the program took root quickly, and was off and running.

In August, 1986, President Wergin appointed Jerry Dickinson as director of the Grass Roots program (see inset, this page). Under Dickinson's direction, the program flourished...and earned Dickinson a ticket to the Cribbage Hall of Fame. But, the Grass Roots program was, and is, under the direction of the ACC's Board of Directors.

Dickinson retired from his directorship in the mid-1990's and Gene Mikulsky was appointed as the new director by the ACC's Executive Committee, Ev Bey, President.

So what went wrong? A simple misinterpretation of how to manage the GR's bank account and the use of the ACC's tax ID number. With that problem, Mikulsky, without consulting the ACC's Board of Directors, decided to form a Grass Roots Corporation, and created a separate organization. This was, of course, a major change in how the ACC operates. By divorcing the GR from the ACC, control over the program was in limbo, and caused consternation among BOD members.

After several Board meetings, and being unable to resolve this issue, the BOD voted 21-2 for Mikulsky to dissolve this Grass Roots Corporation, with the deadline for this action set at July 1, 2000. The deadline came and went, and no dissolution action was taken. Mikulsky mailed each BOD member a registered letter stating this simply could not be done (and gave his reasons).

With that shocker, the Ethics Committee (7-person committee) voted to suspend Mikulsky and Ramos, and the Executive Committee appointed Joan Rein as new Grass Roots director, and Paul Barnes appointed new Grass Roots Statistician.

And that is where we are now. We must simply get back on track and work as a democratically elected team, stop all this bickering, and play some cribbage. We have a wonderful organization, that is ultimately controlled by all the members by electing a Board of Directors every two years. Each and every bonifide ACC member in good standing is entitled to run for election. We must abide by the ACC's Constitution and make any changes through debate and vote by this elected Board of Directors. It's a great democratic system, let's make it work!

# JERRY DICKINSON NEW GRASS ROOTS COMMISSIONER

Jerry Dickinson of Mt. Horeb, WI, was selected by Joe Wergin, originator of the Grass Roots Program, to head the program in 1986-87.

The retired U.S. Army Colonel has been-playing in the Madison Metro #1 Club for two years and has the time and desire to extend the program. He has played in a number of major tournaments of the Congress and has a computer to help his new job of record-keeping.

Wergin said, "I had to prove that the Grass Roots idea would work and after two years, we have developed a workable and competitive system. I have said before that the Grass Roots Program will prove to be the life blood of the Congress and it is getting more evident all the time. Now I will have time to devote to other programs of the Congress."

The new Commissioner has requested that all correspondence dealing with the new season be sent to him at Box 126, Mt. Horeb, WI 53572. Old business should be directed to President Wergin.


