Local pegger William Kraatz finally lost this time around. He had won 3 of the last 4 events, but it was Gerke's day in the sun. Director Nelson Wheaton reported nary a 28 or 29 hand showed. He keeps 'em pegging under the falls!

# **Big Night In Hermiston**

On October 22 some 9 peggers from Grass Roots 2 (Hermiston, OR) had a heated match. High for the night was 13 GP's and low was 6. Four tied for 2nd with 10 GP's, resulting in 5 of the 9 receiving rating points.

The next week (Oct. 29) the 28-29 pot had grown to \$122.75 and 10 players were in the field. Iris Sundquist scored a 29-hand, receiving 75% of the pot, leaving \$30.69 up for grabs. Shortly thereafter Everett McKinney scored a 28-hand getting \$12.28 (40%). Then Bill Hill scored a 28-hand and was awarded a paltry \$7.37. The 28-29 pot was left with \$11.05 after the hot night's play!

And it was Tony Murawski, Camas, WA, coming home the winner, His take? \$1,150, 196 MRP's, a Bill O'Malley trophy board...and bragging rights galore. Grand Master Frank Ornie (OR) has had several high finishes this cribbage year, and he nailed down 2nd this time around. Newly-crowned Master Herschel Mack (CA) is in the thick of this year's MRP race, and his 3rd place finish netted 105 MRP's. Glenna Little (WA) had a tournament to remember as she finished 4th, after sizzling to the meet's top qualifying score (36 GP's). She netted an aggregate 155 MRP's for a great weekend.

The host Comfort Inn furnished all players, guests or not, a full, hot breakfast. This largess certainly helped attendance, attested to by this record crowd.

# American Cribbage Congress Hall of Fame

# Hall of Fame Nominating Criteria

- 1- All nominations for the American Cribbage Congress Hall of Fame must be submitted in writing to the Chairman of the Balloting Committee.
- 2- An individual nominated for the American Cribbage Congress Hall of Fame must meet the following *mandatory* criteria:
  - A- be a member in good standing of the ACC for seven (7) consecutive years or have been a member for a minimum of five (5) consecutive years until death intervened.
  - B-have displayed and complied with the rules of ethical play.
  - C-have displayed and complied with the standards of good sportsmanship.
- 3- In addition, to be eligible for nomination, a candidate is required to meet at least three (3) of the following *optional* criteria. He or she must have:
  - A-promoted the game of cribbage and/or served the American Cribbage Congress by specific acts or as specified in the written nomination.
  - B- established his/her expertise by being rated a Master player or higher.
  - C- estanlished his/her expertise by being rated a Bronze Award recipient or higher in Grass Roots competition.
  - D-served as a Tournament Director, or Co-director, of an ACC sanctioned tournament for a minimum of five (5) years. E-served as a Grass Roots Director, or Co-director, for a minimum of five (5) years.
  - F- served as a member of the Board of Directors of the American Cribbage Congress for a minimum of four (4) years.
- 4- Any exceptions to or exemptions from the above criteria must be initiated by a current member of the ACC Board of Directors.

# Hall of Fame Balloting Procedures

- 1. Publish annually in the November issue of Cribbage World the criteria for nominating individuals to the Hall of Fame. Declare that nominations are currently being accepted and must be in written form limited to one (1) page to the Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee of the ACC, postmarked no later than December 31 of that year.
- 2. The Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee will review all letters of nomination received for compliance with the nominating criteria and submit those letters to the ACC Hall of Fame Committee.
- 3. Voting will take place at the Board of Directors meeting held in conjunction with the JPW/ACC Open Tournament in Reno. NV. All attending current ACC Board members have voting rights and each eligible nominee will be voted on by the Board.
- 4. Each nominee will be notified of the results of the balloting applicable to him/her. The President of the ACC or the Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee will notify in writing any members who are elected to the Hall of Fame. Induction, if any, will take place at the Grand National Tournament and Awards banquet later that year.


