

Prizes Galore!

Schell Cops Washington State

Michael Schell, pegging out of Seattle, took home the Washington State Championship on January 14. Schell is an experienced internet player and the at-home practice paid off to the tune of \$1,480! Second place went to Grand Master Rollie Heath (OR) (\$1,255, including a Super Q win). Heath is warming up for his appearance in the upcoming All Star Game in Reno.

Verne Nielsen (OR) is nearing his Grand Master by taking home 3rd in this huge 186-player event. Patrick Ward (WA) took home 4th. Clarence Cole (OR) nailed 18 of 22 qualifying round games to take honors (37 18/22 +184).

Rosemary Hendricks was smoking in the Consolation event, taking qualifying honors with a nifty 18 8/9 +134. Louise Wilson (WA) won the playoff action (\$470). Local Sherri Albrecht nailed down 2nd, followed by Grand Master Bernie Saueressig (WA) and Bob Wilson (WA) in 3-4. The Wilson clan fared quite well in this event.

George "Ras" Rasmussen conducted an amazing tournament, as he cajoled local merchants, and players alike for donations, and came up with a

whopping \$9,000 in cash, merchandise, and related services. This added to the paybacks of all events. The Main event paid back 142% in cash and merchandise, and the Consolation paid 156%. Other satellite events also had added paybacks. There is no doubt that "Ras" is the King of the Promoters!

Some 48 players showed on Thursday for some really "Early-Bird" Grass Roots action, with the Main Event kicking off at 2:30 PM Friday with a Time Passer. The winners:



Finally...MN-01 WINS Patrin Tops Eau Claire

Don Patrin is from St. Paul, MN...and he is the first Minnesota player to sign on to the American Cribbage Congress. He holds the coveted MN-01 membership card.

And now he holds his first championship! He topped a large crowd of 128 peggers at the recent Eau Claire Classic, picking up his first sanctioned Main Event win. With the win came 147 MRP's, zipping Patrin to 5th place in the Central Region, with this year's total at 387. In addition, he collected a sizeable first place check...and bragging rights...finally!

Larry Algiers (WI), Dan McCarthy (WI), and Grand Master Richard Frost nailed down 2-3-4.

GrandMaster Don Flesch (WI) held the hot hand in the qualifying round, scoring a very nice 37 17/22 +295 to take honors...and some \$2,000 in side pool action.

It was LifeMaster Martha Fingleton all the way in the 56-player Consolation event. She topped the field in the qualifying round (18 7/9 +192) and went on to win the playoffs as well. This hot run brought home some 66 MRP's (aggregate). Elizabeth Miller (MN) was the victim of this hot run, but, nevertheless, a 2nd place finish netted 30 MRP's. Francis Pasik (MN) and Lyle Lund (MN) took home 3-4.

Director Alan Lindner ran his usual well-run event, complete with satellite events.

Rhonda Swift Tops In Virginia

Rhonda Swift, Williamson, NC, came to play at the Holiday Classic in Portsmouth, Virginia in early December. Not only did she take qualifying honors (38 18/22 +308), but ran the table in the playoffs and came away with the championship as well. Her last opponent in the playoffs was Master Larry Phifer (NC), but he simply could not match her hot run of cards.

Life Master Bill Medeiros (MA) and Master Bobby Stuart (GA) finished in the 3-4 bracket in this 72-player event. Stuart won Grand National XVII and continues his fine play. Medeiros's high finish adds yet another 70 MRPs to his lofty 8,000+ total. In addition, he is leading the Eastern Region this cribbage year with well over 600 MRPs in the bag.

Bobby Moore (VA) won 9 of 10 (20 9/10 +198) to take qualifying honors in the 50-player Consolation. But it was Janet Viané (VA) taking the playoff action...and 45 MRPs. Moore finished 2nd and garnered an aggregate 54 MRPs. Curtis Barbour (NC) and Ray Klocko (VA) nailed down 3-4.

Director Marvin Lewis conducted many satellite events.

Grass Roots Rolling

Grass Roots Commissioner Joan Rein reports that the Grass Roots program is fully active and enjoying their leagues. Approximately 165 clubs are in action, with nine new clubs chartered since the beginning of the 2000-2001 season.

A few clubs have not sent in their club information for this year, but Rein feels confident the program will be up to date soon.

Some 51 awards have been presented, with four 29-hands having been scored: Hazel Weichseldorf, GR 148 (Sept. 26); Max Candiotti, GR 271 (Oct. 14); Ed Kersing, GR 191 (Sept. 26); and Irene Joseph, GR 269 (Oct. 4).

Rein also reports new Bronze winners waiting to be confirmed, and the disposition of the GRCP, Inc. funds has been accomplished, with the exception of a few clubs.


Ron Morgan Makes MRP Move
