Record Perks Awarded By St. Croix Casino

Al Schaefer Tops 206 At June St. Croix

The St. Croix Casino set a record for awarding perks to players at the recent St. Croix Classic, played June 1-3. With 262 24-hands scored, 10 28-hands, and one grand slam (9/9), the Casino awarded a whopping \$9,150 in added perks to the players.

But the biggest award of all went to winner Al Schaefer, Slinger, WI. Schaefer bested the 206-player field and took home a whopping 196 MRP's for winning, the top prize, and bragging rights. His final match pitted him vs. Bill Neidlein (WI) and his cards remained hot for the win. Neidlein took home 147 MRP's for 2nd. Master Len Wahlig (IL) and Mike Lund (WI) finished 3-4. Jerry Goedert (WI) blistered the boards in the qualifying round, scoring a great 40 18/22 +293...and that was worth 70 MRP's.

Norbert Upton (MN) nailed the 122-player Consolation and is zeroing in on his Grand Master with the win (63 MRP's). David Shaff (MN), Life Master Lloyd Kraft (WI), and Dorothy Schaefer (MN) finished 2-3-4. Ginger

Grogan (MN) won 8 of 9 to take qualifying honors (19 8/9 +140).

Master Doug Henderson, Racine, WI, added yet another 147 MRP's to his lifetime ledger by winning the recent 86-player Potawatomi Peggers Pow Wow, in Stevensville, MI. Frank LaPan (MI) finished 2nd (and 105 MRP's), followed by Grand Master Donald Flesch (WI) and Master J. B. Blough (MI) in the 3-4 slot. Brenda Carson (MI) won 16 of 22 games to take qualifying honors (35 16/22 +241).

Don Bossche (MI) won the 56-player Consolation, edging Hall 'o Famer Bob Madsen (IL) in the final playoff match. Madsen is a Grand Master from Chicago. Dave Gerke (MI) and Allen Schiller (MI) finished 3-4. Life Master Wayne Steinmetz (WI) is in the hunt for national honors this cribbage year, and he nailed a great 18 9/9 +86 grand slam in the qualifying round (21 GP's) in his effort to keep pace with leader Jim Langley (CA).

Daryl Halopka Cops Island Quest

Daryl Halopka, pegging out of Dorchester, WI, came away the winner at the huge 154-player Island Quest event played on Michigan's Upper Peninsula. And for the second year in a row it was Master Ted Hokenson (MI) coming home 2nd. Halopka took home \$1,100 for the win...and 196 MRP's. Hokenson took home a nice 2nd place check, and 147 MRP's. Life Master Wayne Steinmetz (WI), in the hunt for national honors this cribbage year, scored a nice 3rd place finish. He scored 165 MRP's (aggregate). He also took qualifying honors with a nice 38 17/22 +254. He vaults into 2nd place nationally this cribbage year. Grand Master Don Flesch (WI) finished in the 3-4 bracket as well, and keeps his hat in the annual run for All-American honors, moving into 3rd place in the Central Region with over 800 MRP's in the bag.

Some 88 peggers played the Consolation, and One-Star Joe Bernard (IL) made a comeback from his all-time low score (Milwaukee Challenge) to earn qualifying honors with a grand slam 21 9/9 +168. Bernard moved into 3rd place, lifetime, in ACC standings with this high score. It was Master Doug Henderson (WI) winning the playoffs, with John Aird (MI), Joe Aird (MI), and One-Star Warren Sondericker (WI) in 2-3-4.

Thursday night saw Life Master Al Schaefer (WI) taking home this satellite event. On Friday night it was Jon Taylor (MI) winning with a grand slam. The island Quest Casino paid \$100 for grand slams, and Taylor and Bernard took home this bonus. The Island Quest also paid \$250 for a 28-hand, and four peggers earned this nice bonus: Bea Johnson, Rick Kuehn, Ray Boesel, and Jo Ann Morrison. In addition, some 210 24-hands were scored and each was worth an extra \$24. Some \$6,240 in perks was paid by the Island Quest Casino.

Director Joe Aird reported a smooth-running event, thanks to help from Aggie and Gene Mikulsky, and members of the Bay de Noc Peggers, Gladstone, MI.



Glenn Scott Wins Crescent City



Fair Paybacks! Herb Lee Tops Alberta Open

Is there any formula for payouts? I know the payout is based on the amount of people attending but mostly up to the tournament director's discretion. We all pay the \$50 to \$60 entry fee to visit with out-of-town friends, but most of all for a challenging day of cards with the hope of qualifying and getting some "bucks" back.

After 22 games of grueling play and managing to get into the top 25%, lo and behold, the cribbage gods turn their back on you and you get knocked out the first round. You go to the director and find out for all your efforts you lost \$10!! Because the payout is \$40 or \$50. If you really want to get upset, one director had the gall to pay \$40 for not only the first round losers but also for the 2nd round losers. What a kick in the backside! 3rd place got \$200. Is there something that can be done about payouts? At least get your money back 1st round and maybe \$20 or more for 2nd round. Let's keep cribbage fun but also fair. Fair is fair, the payouts are not fair as they are now. Any help from tourney directors or whoever has a say so on this subject would be appreciated. From all of us that are at out wits end with payouts.

Marilyn, Cribbage World gets letters like yours from time to time, and, I agree, we must make tournament directors understand the meaning of fairness, especially when it comes to paybacks. Your feelings that the first round losers should get their entry fee back is a pretty much universal feeling among our nation's peggars. From that point on, many directors lose sight of fairness. Let's take a \$50 first-round prize as an example. If that round is worth \$50, then the 2nd round should be worth as much (or more). If cribbage is a game of skill (and most agree there is some skill involved), then the 2nd round is tougher and should be worth more than the first round (say, \$60). I feel a slightly ascending scale would be fair. Let's start with \$50, then \$110, then \$190, \$290, \$410, \$550, \$710, etc. This is a scale that rewards each round as the difficulty increases. A straight line scale is minimal. That would be \$50, \$100, \$150, \$200, \$250, etc. Most sporting events have the accelerating scale. My dear friend, Beverlee Honeycutt knocked me out in the 2nd round recently, and would you believe she earned exactly \$5!! I received \$60 for the first round, and she received \$65 for the 2nd round. Totally unfair (gads, I was insulted...only \$5 to beat me...no respect!). Anyway, happy pegging! And you tournament directors out there in cribbagedland....work on your fairness! Ed.

Way up north in Edmonton, Canada, Harold and Marion Buckley know how to attract players. With a cookout as an enticement for an early Thursday night game, some 38 players began the long weekend of pegging with gusto. Many Americans showed for this cookout and play, and despite the get-acquainted friendliness, two Canadian ladies walked away with the top prizes...May Sauer and Irene Lamereaux!

After the get-acquainted warmup, the peggars got down to serious pegging. The Friday early bird game was won by Canadian Dennis Kilba. Doubles were taken by the Vegreville duo (Paul Wilde and Del Allen), but when it came to the high rollers, the heat was really applied. In one of the tightest matches in memory, it was Life Master Jeanne Hofbauer (WA) coming away the winner with a tough (very low winning score) 13 6/9 card, gaining some respect for the American contingent.

The 74-player Main Event saw I. V. Graham (MT) taking qualifying honors (35 16/22 +122), but Canadian Herb Lee pocketed the \$800 for the win. 



His lone loss? None other than a person who signed the card "DW!" His wife! According to Linton, "She is still the nicest person in the world!"


Brumley Scores 19th 29-Hand



The 2-3 and A-4 Combo "Ras" Rasmussen

Should I lead the larger card from A-4 or 2-3 couplets?

Since there is always a distinct chance that opponent will be holding 10-point cards with one or more fives, play for the 15-2. Lead the larger card of the five point couplet. Dealer cannot chance dropping the five on a 3 or 4 lead. In leading the smaller card, an experienced player will drop the five spot and deprive you of the 15-2 play. Do you see the difference in dropping a five on the ace or deuce lead as compared to dropping the five on the 3 or 4 lead?

Cribbage Tip

DeLynn Colvert

Every little edge should be used in gaining the advantage over your fellow competitor. Voice inflections are important. Some players will ask a question when leading a card. "Four?" This may very well mean he is asking you to pair the four. If he says "Four!" with gusto, he may be daring you to pair the four. Check out your opponent and his habits in calling the count.

But here is the tip of the month. Do you check out the blinking of your opponent's eyes when a card is cut? This could be a clue. This doesn't work on women, however, as they blink twice as much as men! On the other hand, if a woman fails to blink at all, she may be in shock! Work on the finer points in cribbage...your game may very well improve! As for me? Well, I work on not blinking at all! And if that doesn't work, I may start wearing dark sunglasses!
