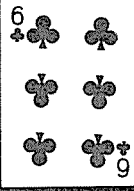
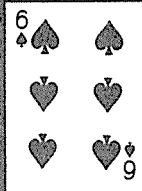

3 Consecutive Wins Langley: Record Run

Jim Langley, Red Bluff, CA, is on a record run! Beginning with a record spread point score at Winnemucca, he continued his hot streak by winning three consecutive events...and then finishing 3rd at the huge Oregon Coast Classic (see summary, this issue).

Langley Tops 192 at World Championship

With 192 players on board for the 30th annual run for the roses, it was newly crowned Life Master Jim Langley winning his 3rd consecutive win. The final playoff match had Frank Hansberry (CA) trying to stop his run. In a very close match, Langley prevailed and waltzed home with yet another 216 MRP's (aggregate). Hansberry garnered 147 MRP's. Both players agreed to split the \$1,200 - \$800 pot before play began and each took home a cool \$1,000.

Bruce Forbes (CA) is the only contestant to have played in all 30 WCCT contests, and this time around he nailed the 60-player Consolation. Al Logan (CA) finished 2nd.

This annual event is played at Quincy's Plumas-Sierra County Fairgrounds, and comes complete with a lunch and steak fry. With a well-stocked raffle and bar, the carnival-like atmosphere is unique in cribbage land. A portion of the proceeds from this three-day event are used to fund the Quincy Rotary Club's community service projects.

Phil True Stops Langley at Oregon Coast Classic at Chinook Winds

Grand Master Phil True, Richland, WA, appears to be the only player able to handle Langley's recent run. With 216 players on board, Langley had zipped through all but the final four, and lost a close match 3-2 to True, taking home 3rd...and only 105 MRP's. With Langley down, True continued on to win this event by besting Ken Slama (WA) in the final match. Life Master George "Ras" Rasmussen (WA) keeps his hat in the ring for All-American honors by finishing in the 3-4 bracket with Langley.

Rosemary Hendricks (WA) was smoking in the qualifying round, nailing down a great 40 18/22 +370 to easily take honors.

Some 148 peggers played the Consolation and it was Jim Crawford (CA) coming away the winner. Dick Walcker (OR) finished 2nd, followed by Margery Clark (OR) and Clyde

Prendergast Nails Blackstone Valley

Clovis Prendergast, pegging out of Boston, nailed the recent Blackstone Valley Open. With 131 players on board at this Franklin, MA, event, Prendergast came home with a whopping 196 MRP's for the win...and the winner's trophy board. His last playoff match was vs. Larry Harmon (CT), and his cards remained hot for the win. Harmon took home 147 MRP's for his 2nd place finish.

Bill Richmond (CT) and David Statz (NH) finished in the 3-4 slot, and garnered 105 MRP's each.

Sharlene Medeiros (MA) is zeroing in on her Life Master rating by scoring a superlative 22 10/12 +159 in the qualifying round. She netted 40 MRP's for this high finish.

66 players stayed for the Consolation and veteran Grand Master Charlie Finley (CT) came home the winner. Finley is also nearing his Life Master with the 63 MRP's earned with the win. ACC Treasurer Fred McGibney (VT) finished 2nd. McGibney is a Master Pegger and earned 45 MRP's. Master Ann Somers (MA) qualified tops (16 8/8 +64 grand slam) and finished in the 3-4 slot, netting an aggregate 48 MRP's. Life Master Bill Medeiros (MA) finished in the 3-4 slot also.

Director Shawn Jordan reported two 28-hands: Warren Gallagher (MA) and Phyllis Aronoff (MA). No satellite events were played.

Manter Cops Vetterline Memorial

Louis Manter came to play at the Ken Vetterline Memorial in Westbrook, Maine. Manter, from Portland, ME, picked up 147 MRP's in this 88-player event, in addition to a nice purse...and bragging rights. His final playoff match pitted him vs. Al Giannotti (MA) and he prevailed for the win. Giannotti netted 105 MRP's for a 2nd place finish. Kiak Hobbs (MA) and Life Master David Clemmey (MA) finished 3-4. Clemmey also won the High Rollers event and had a successful weekend pegging.

Janet Meinert (VA) scored a nice 20 GP card (12 games) in the qualifying round to take honors, picking up 30 MRP's.

It was Harry Palmer all the way in the 50-player Consolation. This One-Star player is in the hunt for national honors again this year and his aggregate 66 MRP's earned keep him in the chase for the top ten honors (All-American). He qualified tops with a nice 18 GP card (9 games), and finished first in the playoffs. Laurie Owen (ME) took home 2nd, followed by Phil Martin (CT) and Roger Bouchard (CT) in 3-4. Martin's high finish netted 18 MRP's, and the book on him has him at 5,970, needing but a scant 30 MRP's to earn Life Master.

Martin also teamed with Grand Master Frank Corrado (CT) to win the Doubles event. Director Dennis Cousens reported that no 28 or 29-hands were scored.

Henry Douglass Smoking at Atlanta Classic

Henry Douglass, pegging out of Reidsville, NC, was smoking at the recent Atlanta Classic. First, he scored a superlative 34 14/20 +248 to take qualifying honors, and continued on to win the playoffs as well in this 69-player event. This run netted Douglass an aggregate 197 MRP's and propels him to 3,915 (lifetime) and very nearly Grand Master. And, undoubtedly, he also picked up his Super Q that he is famous for selling at events he attends.

Jerry Gooden (NC) finished 2nd, being unable to cope with Douglass's hot run of cards. One-Star Harry Palmer (MA) continues his

recent run by finishing in the 3-4 bracket, as did Buzz Adams (GA).

Some 46 players played the Consolation and it was Bob Milk (VA) nailing the win. Master John Worley (NC) took home 2nd, followed by Curtis Barbour (NC) and Doris Stump (FL) in 3-4. Barbour also took qualifying honors with a nifty 15 7/9 +111.

Director Bobby Stuart hosted a Friday and Saturday night game. On Friday, it was Jerry Russell (GA) winning, and Saturday's event saw Kerry Gardiner taking home the marbles.

Stuart reported the cards were cold the entire weekend, as no 28 or 29-hands were scored.

In an unusual finish, the top three spots were captured by non-members at the recent Colorado Winter Open, played in Denver on April 20-22.

Bruce Foltz (CO) won the 74-player Main Event, followed by Wes Haw (CO) and John Handy (CO) in 3-4. ACC member Howard Pearson (SD) nailed down 4th. Another ACC member...Wes Hall (SD) took qualifying honors (35 16/22 +245), and took home 45 MRP's. Pearson grabbed 70 MRP's for his 4th place finish. Foltz, Haw, and Handy forfeited their MRP's as non-members.

The 40-player Consolation had all ACC winners. Jalae Tomasek (CO) nailed down the win, followed by Larry Shuel (CO), Blanche Edwardson (CO) and Eddie Judkins finishing 2-3-4. Dude Reyman (CO) won 8 of 9 to take qualifying honors.

Two 18-game events were played in Honolulu in March and April. The March event saw local Charlie Rodgers take the win (and 70 MRP's). Ray Sakai (HI) finished 2nd.

In the April event, Master Fred White (HI) not only was top qualifier (21 9/12 +151) but came home the winner in the playoffs as well. This running of the table netted a nifty 105 MRP's. Roy Wong (HI) finished 2nd. Tsarke keeps 'em pegging on a monthly basis in sunny Hawaii.

Denis Kilba Hot at Prince George

In another 18-game event, it was Denis Kilba (BC) all the way at the Canadian Championship, played at Prince George, BC. Kilba was smoking in the qualifying round, scoring a superlative 41 19/22. Kilba also won the playoffs and took home a whopping 145 MRP's. Norma England (BC) finished 2nd. Dave Kee (BC) won the 18-player Consolation. J. Brent Miners (BC) finished 2nd after qualifying tops with a 14 6/9. Gerald Mohr (BC) won the Friday night game.

Tax Relief for Langley? Not Likely!

Newly crowned Life Master Jim Langley, Red Bluff, CA began his three-event streak of wins at the first annual Tax Relief Open, played in Alamo, CA on April 21. Two weeks earlier, Langley had set a new ACC record for spread points in a 22-game match in Winnemucca (an even +400), and the momentum continued on in the Tax Relief Open. In winning this 92-player event, Langley carted home 147 MRP's, and was beginning an unbelievable run of wins...and MRP's.

Grand Master Mary Herrmann, on her home turf, very nearly won, but settled for 2nd. Grand Master Bea Olyer (CA) finished 3rd, followed by Tom Owens (CA) in 4th. Paul Gregson (CA) took qualifying honors with a 30 GP card in the 16-game round.

Dennis Phillips (CA) won the 52-player Consolation, followed by Herschel Mack (CA), Master LaDonna Govenor (CA) and Tom Miller (CA) in 2-3-4. Bob Siebert (CA) took qualifying honors (18 +180).

Director Mary Herrmann reported three 28-hands were scored: Jay Snyder, Frank Hansberry, and Walt Ball.

Family Affair at Clovis, CA Horne's Cop Gateway To Sierras

In an unusual finish, it was husband Boyd Horne facing off with wife Sara Horne in the final playoff match...and when the smoke had cleared Boyd was declared the winner! Some 46-peggers began the Main Event, and only the Hornes remained for the finish. The Horne's split 175 MRP's, with Boyd taking home 105. Ronald Reid (CA) and Master Wes Summers (CA) finished 3-4. Tad Pilecki (CA) took qualifying honors with a 28 GP card in the 18-game round.

Roland Hall very nearly ran the table in the 30-player Consolation. He qualified tops (16 GP's, 9 games) and finished 2nd in the playoffs. John Prehn (CA) nailed down the win, with Don Brown (CA) and Grand Master Roy Banducci (CA) finishing 3-4.

Director Dennis Bays had a doubles match on Friday night. The winners: Ira Deutsch & Maryann Milliken (CA). Ted Allen (CA) scored the meet's only 28-hand.

186 In Pawtucket

Phyllis Schmidt Nails Ocean State

One-Star Phyllis Schmidt, a perennial winner from Williamstown, MA, nailed down her 11th sanctioned Main Event by winning the huge Ocean State Classic. With 186 peggers in action in Pawtucket, Schmidt added yet another 196MRP's to her lifetime ledger (12,824...8th place lifetime in ACC action).

Her final playoff match pitted her with the formidable Charlie Rapoza...a Grand Master from Brocton, MA who is zeroing in on his Life Master rating. Schmidt's cards remained hot for the win. Stan Plachowicz (MA) and Roger Bouchard (CT) finished 3-4. Roland LaFramboise (MA) scored an excellent 22 GP card in the 12-game qualifying round to take honors.

112 peggers played the Consolation and Ron Foley (MA) came away with the win. George Muzzy (CT), Elizabeth Kelly (RI), and Marc Cinelli (MA) finished 2-3-4. Emily Medeiros (MA) scored an excellent 18 GP card +110 in the 8-game qualifying round to take honors.

Director John Chambers reported Life Master Henry DeLong was very sociable this time around...he had two 28-hands scored against him in back-to-back games. And he reports that the fair sex have a run going in this event....winning three of the last four.

Five 28-hands were scored: Gene Strom, Fred Gowen, Darren Sevigny, Paul Cormier, and Sharlene Medeiros turned the trick...with two being scored against DeLong.

Chambers ran an excellent tournament, attested to by yet another large crowd. His format has modest entry fees and no Q-pool, and it appears players favor this approach, as they vote with their feet.

He was also the meet's high qualifier with a nice 37 17/22 +241.

Kraatz also won the Early Bird event, attesting to his home-town advantage. Cal Braun (NY) and Bill Poole (NY) won the doubles event.

Some 40 peggers played the Consolation and it was Julien Pomerleau coming away the winner. Pomerleau hails from Disneyland country (Anaheim) in California. Richard Betts (NY) took 2nd, followed by Paul Eichler (NY) and Utah Walton (VA) in 3-4. Pomerleau also was the event's top qualifier with a 19 8/9 +124. This great 1-1 finish netted him a cool 72 MRPs.

Director Nelson Wheaton reported this event played at a new facility (Quality Hotel), and with the famous Niagara Falls in the background, everyone enjoyed themselves.

Lightning Strikes Twice

Grass Roots 227 (Laguna Hills, CA) has had lightning strike twice. Harry Luettchau scored a grand slam in April to take home the Grand Slam Pot (\$175). One year ago, Harry struck the Grand Slam Pot for \$305!

And at a recent GR 227 meeting it was Paul Yellon and Ken Miller pegging wildly. The pegging went as follows: Ken, 3; Paul 7; Ken 5 (15-2); Paul 6 (21 for 3); Ken 4 (25 for 5); Paul 2 (27 for 6); Ken "go"; Paul 1 (28 for 8). Ken K for go. Total pegged? Ken 8; Paul 17!

Langley Zips to Huge Lead

Jim Langley, Red Bluff, CA, has all but put the race for the national championship out of reach. In a 6-week span (see below), he has scored a whopping 766MRP's and stands at 1,750+ MRP's for this cribbage year. In this record-setting run, Langley started by breaking the all time spread-point mark, scoring a +400 with a 16/22 card at Winnemucca. He then ran off three consecutive Main Event wins, and, then finished 3rd at the huge Oregon Coast Classic. Only Wayne Steinmetz (WI), with 1,200+ MRP's, and DeLynn Colvert (MT) with 1,100+ has an outside chance of catching the streaking Langley.

Now the race for national honors centers on who will make the top ten and All-American honors. As we go to press, and with two months pegging still to go, it appears that 14 ACC members are still in the hunt. They are: Jim Langley (CA) 1,750+; Wayne Steinmetz (WI) 1,200+, DeLynn Colvert (MT) 1,100+; Ron Morgan (CA) 1,000+; Bob Julian (WI) 900+; "Ras" Rasmussen (WA) 900+; Harry Palmer (MA) 900+; Jim Hornbacher (WA) 900+, David Clemmey (MA) 900+; Bill Medeiros (MA) 800+; Phil True (WA) 800+; Sharon Hejzmanek (MT) 800+; Jack Moritzky (WA) 800+; and Jack Shumate III (CA) 700+.

Many large events remained to be played the last two months, and other ACC players could possible zip to All-American honors. With 1,000 MRP's or better predicted to determine this elite field, the race is on!

Ongoing Debate About Skunk Value

OK, Mr. Daesch, you asked for my opinion (Mar CW) about your proposed playoff scoring system. It has always been my opinion that a win is a win. But as I have seen over the past 16 years the ACC rating system is slightly bent towards the skunker and is somewhat unfair to the skunkee. That's just my opinion, now you decide.

Bracketed play: my opinion is that in any bracketed play, whether for play-offs or not (as in the national Open format), a 2-game reward for a skunk does one of two things. It either unfairly penalizes the skunkee for having a bad streak of cards, or unfairly rewards the skunker for having a great streak of cards. A 2-game reward for skunks defeats the purpose of rewarding players for skill (as opposed to luck). Wins by a skunk, or not, should only be awarded one win in a bracketed format. Period. Your proposal to run a secondary round-robin playoff falls into another problem with the current system, as described below.

Qualifying rounds (round robin): to earn MRP's a 3-point skunk reward during qualifying play is fine. Notice I said "to earn MRP's." It is my opinion, however, that the ranking of the scorecards for the playoff bracket has an inherent flaw by rating the scorecards by Game Points first and Games Won second. I believe Games Won should be primary, Game Points secondary, and Net Spread last. Why? Assume in a 22-game qualifier that Jim has 13 wins, no skunks. Bob has 12 wins, 3 skunks. Bob qualifies with 27 GP's, but Jim, with 26, does not. Jim has more wins than Bob. Jim has a better average than Bob. Yet based upon the current ranking criteria, Bob qualifies over Jim. Skunks should count only as a tiebreaker if games won is tied. In what other sport does a player with more wins, and/or better average, take a back seat to the other player?...

If you agree with my assessment, please write to your ACC BOD representative to have this format for ranking changed.

Robert, this has been debated many times in the past, and reviewed by the BOD more than once. Skunks are 12-1 odds, a win is 2-1 odds. Why not reward a more difficult achievement (albeit, any game, skunk or not, depends on some luck)? Let's take basketball for an example. A dunk is 2 points, behind the arc (long shot) is worth 3-points. In football, a TD is 6 points, a field goal is 3 points. More points for the more difficult accomplishment. As for cribbage, the heritage is that a skunk is worth two games. Let's not make Sir John Suckling turn over in his grave by minimizing the value of a skunk. I disagree with Joe Daesch's proposed playoff format for one reason...it would take roughly two hours longer to complete playoff play, as most matches would go one game longer. Ed.

Points To Ponder

Historically the ACC has functioned as an organization successfully staffed by dedicated, but not always, numerous volunteers. Now that people in some former volunteer positions are being paid, some questions need to be asked and answers need to be provided.

1- I notice that all newly paid positions are filled by current BOD members. Will that be a requirement? If so, why?

2- If a member holding one of these newly paid positions resigns, what kind of procedure is in place for replacing him/her? Does he/she get to name their successor?

3- Some of the paid positions might have multiple volunteers now that money is involved. How will those volunteers be evaluated and selected? Some process needs to be initiated to address these concerns as soon as possible.

Lee, let's take your questions one at a time: (1) Not all paid positions are members of the BOD. National Statistician Bob McCabe and Treasurer Fred McGibney are not members of the BOD. Both do yeoman's work in keeping the ACC on track. As for McCabe, one might just look at the monthly tournaments reported, with each one requiring an average of about 75 individual entries. In addition, he coordinates with the Membership Secretary and Cribbage World Editor, to report names and numbers. Cribbage World receives a monthly report from McCabe (33-page report last month) listing the myriad statistics and lifetime numbers. As a long-time member who loves competing for MRP's, I feel that McCabe is underpaid! Being a BOD member is NOT a requirement for compensation.

(2) The ACC has long operated on a "crisis" basis. If a position needs filling, a person has been found to do the job. With the paid positions now in place, this should be much easier. Who names this replacement? If more than one applicant is in the hopper, the person being replaced may make a recommendation, and the five-person Executive Committee would choose and name the replacement (if between BOD meetings), otherwise, a discussion and vote would be conducted at a BOD meeting.

(3) Evaluations of volunteers will be made just as any business hiring employees does. Interviews, recommendations, and the standard way of filling a job as done nationwide by any business.

Catherine Perkins headed a "Compensation Committee" and her committee's recommendations were accepted and voted in place at the last BOD meeting in Reno. I feel the BOD has fully analyzed all factors of workloads of those being compensated, and are cognizant of our member's concern for their membership fees. I feel we all get a whale of a bargain for a \$10 yearly membership, and the \$1.50 sanctioning fee. As for respecting the ACC's dollar balances, you may ask Paul Barnes how jealously they are guarded. But, thanks to members like you, the ACC BOD will be on their toes to maintain a solvent, efficient organization. Thanks for your concerns.

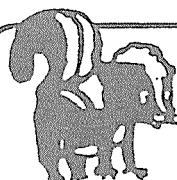

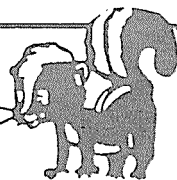

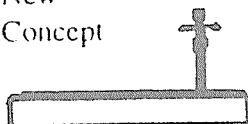
