Kochenburg Repeats TOC Win Dulin Wins JPW/ACC Open

The annual gathering of the clan saw some 1,014 peggers descend on Reno in early February for some spirited pegging...and when the pegs were laid away on Sunday evening, it was Virgil Dulin, Fayettville, NC, and Dale Kochenburg, San Jose, CA coming home the winners. Dulin copped the 1,014 player JPW/ACC Open on Sunday and Kochenburg nailed the 500-player Tournament of Champions on Friday. Dulin's \$10,000 first-place prize is the largest of the year in sanctioned play. Kochenburg took home a whopping \$7,900, but no MRP's, in this by invite only event. Kochenburg also won this event in 1996, and he joins One-Star Warren Sondericker (WI) as a two-time winner.

And Dulin also finished 2nd in the TOC, and scored that weekend that all players dream about. His combined take was well over \$15,000, not to mentioned a whopping 315 MRP's earned in the JPW/ACC Open. Another Eastern Region player scoring that dream weekend was Life Master Bob Drukman (MA). He finished in the 3-4 bracket in the TOC (after qualifying first) and nailed down 2nd in the JPW/ACC Open to cart home well over \$10,000. Another player scoring well in both events was Scott Kooistra (SD). This One-Star player finished in the top ten in both events, and went home well rewarded for his weekend's play.

In the TOC, it was Michael Shell (WA), fresh from winning the Washington Championship two weeks earlier, taking home 3.4 and he took home \$3,475.

In the JPW/ACC Open, Craig Phipps (NJ) and Norm Nikodym (CA) finishing in the 3-4 bracket. They each won \$3,200 and carted home some 196 MRP's.

The TOC sported a new event this year...a "Cribbage Bowl" was played in lieu of the usual Consolation, allowing players in town for the weekend a chance for some Friday action, in addition to the losers in the TOC's Main Event. The event was well received and a whopping 488 players signed on. Bill Cooper (GA) scored the top card (\$1,450), followed by Jesus Fernandez (CA), Bill Robe (CA), and Carmen Lanagan (OR).

On Sunday afternoon, the ACC's 2nd largest event of the year saw some 808 players sign on for the JPW/ACC Open's Consolation event. Warren Gallagher (MA) scored a grand slam 20 9/9 +157 to easily take qualifying honors, but it was Master LaDonna Govenor (CA) taking home the playoff action. Matt Easterbrook (VA), Paul Hirschmann (OR), and Ken Johnson (FL) finishing 2-3-4.

A highlight of the JPW/ACC Open saw John Jenkins (NC) score the ACC's 9th 29-hand of this cribbage year...and he was rewarded with \$100 from the ACC for a sanctioned 29-hand.

His final match with David O'Neal (GA) went to the wire, but Raynes prevailed with the win. Charles Dolge (NC), and Ed Reinhold (VA) finished in the 3-4 bracket, earning 70 MRP's each. Curtis Barbour (NC) took qualifying honors with a nice 33 15/22 +192.

Master Paul Barnes (FL) won 7 of 9 with three skunks to take qualifying honors in the 62-player Consolation, but it was Master Larry Phifer (NC) winning the playoffs. Lindsay Peever (FL), Perry Stump (FL), and Master John Worley (NC) finished 2-3-4.

Director Bill Cooper kicked off his first event in style, drawing a nice crowd. He reported that Aaron Geroux and Buzz Adams won the satellite events. He also reported that John Worley and Joe Daesch scored 28-hands (worth half of the skunk pool). In addition, he wishes to thank Ken Cambell for donating his entry fee to the tourney's charity. Ken was unable to attend the event. And next year, Cooper will have his wife, Mary Ann, as his co-director.

Dead Heat! Langley, Hornbacher, Morgan Set MRP Pace

Shimp Repeats as Roadrunner Champ

Jeff Shimp, a Life Master from Nashville, IN, loves the Arizona sunshine. For the second year in a row, he has won the Roadrunner Classic in Mesa, AZ. This time around, a record crowd was on hand (114 players) as the cribbage grapevine is spreading the word that Arizona is the place to play in February.

Local Leonard Duckworth gave Shimp a run for the money, but settled for 2nd place. Duckworth kicked off the long weekend's pegging by winning the Friday Special and enjoyed a great weekend of play. Life Master Jeanne Hofbauer was a long way from her Washougal, WA home, but paid for the trip with a 3-4 finish. Local Helen Burley joined her in this bracket.

Frank Podjun (GA) had a hot card (39 18/22 +273) to take qualifying honors (and 65 MRP's).

Arizonan John Alig took the 56-player Consolation, besting Canadian Leo Schnurr in the final playoff match. And not to be outdone by his spouse, Life Master Roy Hofbauer finished in the 3-4 bracket with Arizonan Maxine Burgert.

National MRP front-runner Jim Langley (CA) was on hand and he won the Saturday night game, qualified in the Main, and won the All-Events, to prove his run for the roses is no fluke.

Directors Ron and Laurie Logan were pleased with the record turnout, up from 84 last year. Snowbirds were on hand from all parts of the country...and it was first-time tournament player from Detroit, MI taking home 5th...Tom Halatsis! He was elated after his great first-time effort netted this high finish. *Cribbage World* predicts this event will continue to grow as word gets out about the great climate, coupled with the Logan's expertise in running this event.

Late St. Croix Classic Report

Cribbage World has not received the official report, as we go to press, from the latest Turtle Lake event (St. Croix Classic) but the cribbage grapevine has Master Dave Gustafson edging Grand Master Todd Schaefer for the title. This is Gustafson's first sanctioned Main Event win. Schaefer is getting a bridesmaid complex, as this is the third time he has finished 2nd at this event in 15 trys.

\$30,000 Restitution to ACC Monroe Sentenced to 9 Months

At the ACC's Board of Director's meeting on February 4, 1999 at Reno (NV), Jeff Shimp moved and Pat Barrett seconded a motion to authorize Bob Julian to contact legal counsel and any other person as required to resolve the Membership Secretary Situation. Motion carried.

As the theft of ACC funds occurred in Napa, CA, the Napa Police Department was contacted. Detective Paul Paniagua was assigned to the case and after nearly a year of investigation, including contacts with Fred McGibney and Roger Wilson, a sum of \$73,000 was determined as allegedy taken by Jeff Monroe. After nearly a second year of trial dates and postponements, a final trial date in August 2000 was set. At that time a plea-bargaining arrangement was discussed with Mr. Monroe's attorney and Deputy District Attorney B. Tong of Napa County whereby a restitution of \$30,000 would be made to the ACC prior to any decision by the court. A new trial date was set for November 29, 2000. At that time, and as a result of the plea-bargaining arrangement, Jeff Monroe pleaded "no contest" to a charge of grand theft felony with sentence to be deferred until a one-time restitution of \$30,000 was made to the ACC. A sentence date of January 29, 2001 was set.

The check for \$30,000 was received by ACC Treasurer Fred McGibney on January 17, 2001. On January 29, 2001 Mr. Monroe was sentenced with some of the following conditions:

Incarceration for 270 days in the Napa Department of Corrections, starting at 8 AM on Monday, February 26, 2001. Defendant may apply for work furlough with eligibility to be determined by the Review Board.

Pay the jail booking fee set by Napa County.

Obey all reasonable orders of the probation officer.

Seek and maintain gainful, full-time employment.

Immediately enroll in, pay for, and succesfully complete the theft awareness program chosen by the probation officer.

Attend Gamblers Anonymous as directed by the probation officer and give written proof of attendance.

Pay a \$200 penal code section 1202.4 restitution fine.

The entire case was carried on and concluded with minimal cost and no legal counsel expense to the ACC.

34 peggers were in action in the Consolation, and Paul Halucka (CA) nailed the win (and 45 MRP's). Sara Horne (CA) took 2nd and was the top qualifier with a 7-game grand slam.

Director Hunstad reports "not a one!" insofar as 28's and 29's were concerned.

Paulette Rowe Tops Moose Nugget

A small crowd barely made the minimum for a sanctioned event in Anchorage, AK on December 16. With 17 players in action, it was Paulette Rowe (AK) winning...and picked up 70 MRP's. Pinquoch Waggner (AK) took 2nd and was also the top qualifier. No sanctioned Consolation was played.

Annett Eiffert Wins Super Bowl

The first Super Bowl Classic was played in Elmira, CA on January 27, and since this was a day early for the football Super Bowl, some 78 players came to play. This time around, Annett Eiffert (CA) didn't use her stock of 29-hands to win, and came away with 147 MRP's...and better results than the New York Giants would receive the next day. Charlie Dunn (CA) took home 2nd, with Jim Weires (MN) and John Schmucker (CA) in 3-4.

Life Master Jones Hom (CA) is in the hunt for the national title this cribbage year, and he took qualifying honors with a superlative 27 11/14 +246 for a nifty 55 MRP's.

Walter Pilgrim (CA) won the 48-player Consolation, with Jim Crawford (CA), Mark Jenkins (CA) and Master Thelma Weber (CA) in 2-3-4. Master Harold Sontag won 7 of 9 games to take qualifying honors. Director Jeanne Jelke is off and running with Super Bowl action.

Bolstad Wins Pacific Coast

Grand Master Helen Bolstad, Martinez, CA is at the 400 mark for MRP's this cribbage year, and she brought home another bushel for winning therecent Pacific Coast Championship in Salinas, CA. In topping the nice field of 114 players, she scored yet another 147 MRP's, and has topped 5,000 MRP's (lifetime).





O'Malley Maker Unique Board

Bill O'Malley, Salem, OR, is one of cribbageland's best craftsmen when it comes to making a cribbage board. His brother, Mike came up with a unique design (see below), and Bill made one up to his specifications. This unique board is surprisingly easy to play, with units of five holes easily played.

Bill is unique in another way...he makes his boards from scratch. He will pick out a tree (black walnut, or other hard woods) and with a chain saw, will rough cut boards about the size of a cribbage board. He then carefully drys the wood. He then finishes the boards with the usual tools...and the workmanship is top notch. Bill says that sometimes the wood checks (or cracks)...and then it is nothing but firewood.

He was the champion of the 2000 River City Open, yet never had to pay an entry fee. Why? Because he was the High Qualifier at the 1999 River City Open (35 17/22 +139). That great card earned him his free entry to the next year's tournament!

Proposed Playoff Scoring System

Joe Daesch, Coconut Creek, FL, and the directors of the South Florida Open (Nov. in West Palm Beach) are considering changing the play-off format from a best 3 of 5 (Main) and best 2 of 3 (Consolation) to a best of 13 GP's (Main), and best of 9 GP's (Consolation). Game Points would be scored as in the qualifying round, zero for a loss, two for a win, and three for a skunk win.

The reason for this change is to give extra credit for a skunk. They believe that a skunk is worth more than a game won, but not as much as two games won, like most best-of-7 game playoffs.

In the Main, you would need a minimum of 3 games won, with a skunk, to win the match, and four games without a skunk to win the match. Likewise, in the Consolation, you would need a minimum of two games won with a skunk, to win the match, and three games won without a skunk to win the match.

This group also believes that the National Open in Raleigh should change their format to best of 15 GP's, to lessen the value of a 2-game skunk.






