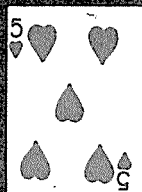
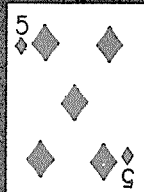

Milwaukee Challenge Draws 140 **Don Flesch Winner in Wisconsin**

Grand Master Don Felsch, pegging out of Brookfield, WI, came home the winner at the recent Milwaukee Challenge. In besting the large field of 140 peggers, Flesch added yet another 196 MRP's to his 5,000+ lifetime tally. His final playoff match pitted him vs. Tina Rouse (WI), and his cards remained hot for the win. Rouse picked up a nice 2nd place purse and 147 MRP's.

Newly crowned Life Master Lloyd "Gabby" Kraft (WI) nailed down 3rd, followed by Rudy Roughtich (WI) in 4th.

Life Master Russell Adams, the ACC's 15th ranked player (lifetime), showed the field how to play in the qualifying round as he posted an excellent 39 GP card...and another 65 MRP's to add to his lofty lifetime total (9,500+).

A sizeable crowd of 86 players stayed for the Consolation, and Al Schaefer (WI) unofficially earned his Life Master by winning this event. Dale Rohm (WI) finished 2nd, followed by Master Bob Chase (MN) and Master John Syftestad (WI) in 3-4. Chase's high finish keep him among the Central Region's leaders this cribbage year. Ed Kramer (IL) topped the qualifiers with a nice 18 GP card.

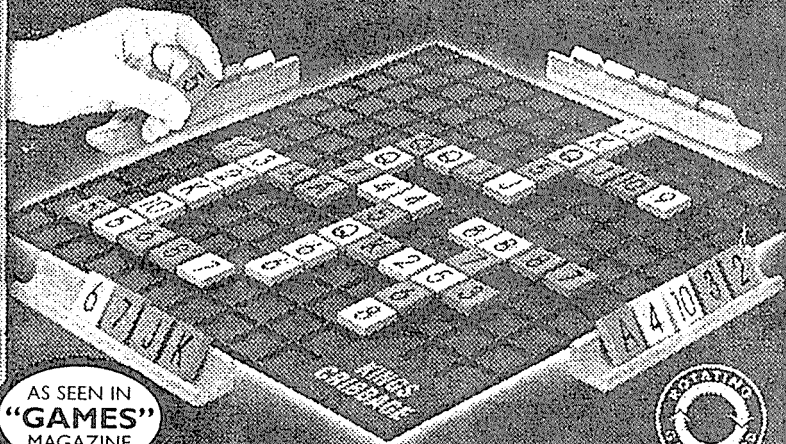

"Ras" Tops Winnemucca

George "Ras" Rasmussen, a Life Master from Centralia, WA, has thrown his hat into the annual MRP race for the roses by winning the huge 158-player Winnemucca Classic. With the win, "Ras" has zipped to well over 800 MRP's for the season, and is on track for top ten honors. This event awarded "Ras" 196 MRP's, a sizeable winner's check, and bragging rights. Graeme Gossett (OR) has been on a roll lately, and with a 2nd place finish, adds another 147 MRP's to his ledger. Master Leslie Hein (WA) and Chuck Ramsey (NV) finished 3-4.

But the big news was the record spread-point score posted by national front-runner Grand Master Jim Langley (CA). He won 16 of 22 games, but 8 of his wins were by skunks, tallying up to an even +400!

124 peggers played the Consolation, and Janice Roberts (OR) came home the winner, with Millie Moritzky (WA) taking home 2nd. Richard Wardenburg (CA) and Greg Ginocchio (CA) finished 3-4. Ginocchio was also the top qualifier (17 8/9 +143).

Eastern Region Wrap

Life Master David Clemmey Takes Shawn's Special

Woonsocket, RI, Feb. 25: Life Master David Clemmey (MA) nailed the 102-player Shawn's Special, nipping Jim Lynch (MA) in the final playoff match. The 147 MRP's earned give Clemmey a boost upwards in the national MRP race. His totals for this cribbage year are nearly 800. He is leading the Eastern Region and is among the national leaders. Grand Master Richard West (MA) and Life Master Emil Chrabaszcz (MA) finished in the 3-4 bracket, earning 70 MRP's each. Lynch took home a nifty 105 MRP's for his 2nd place finish. Paul Musard (RI) earned 40 MRP's with a nice 22 10/12 +139 qualifying round score. Mark Cinelli (MA) won the 54-player Consolation with Grand Master John Rooney (MA) taking 2nd. Another Eastern Region front-runner, Life Master Bill Medeiros and Master Pat Frattalloni (CT) finished 3-4. Life Master Bill Shoemaker nailed an 8/8 grand slam in the qualifying round (18 8/8 +120) to easily take honors (and 24 MRP's). A highlight of this event saw Don Shields (CT) score the ACC's 12th 29-hand of the season, netting Shields a nice \$100 bonus from the ACC. Winners Clemmey and Cinelli are both from GR 81 (Mansfield, MA).

John Chambers Tops Tri-Valley

Medway, MA, March 11: Author and Grand Master John Chambers (RI) zipped to the win at the large Tri-Valley Open (148 players), and took home a whopping 196 MRP's for the effort. Jim McDonald (MA), Jim Lynch (MA), and Brian McCoy (MA) finished 2-3-4 in this spirited match. McDonald earned his Master rating with this high finish. Veteran Grand Master Charlie Finley (CT) posted a great 23 GP card (12 games) in the qualifying round and took home yet another 45 MRP's. Neil Boreham (MA) won the 86-player Consolation (63 MRP's), besting Hal Muller (ON) in the final playoff match. Master Paul Cormier (MA) and Don Janelle (CT) finished in the 3-4 bracket. Janelle also topped the field in the qualifying round, scoring 18 GP's in the 9-game round. Director Pat Llewellyn reported that Dick Closson and John Pizio scored a grand slam in taking the doubles event on Saturday night. She also reported that Kirk Hobbs scored the meet's only 28-hand. No 29's showed.

Grand Master Phil Martin Wins South Shore

Randolph, MA, March 25: Grand Master Phil Martin is zeroing in on his Life Master rating by coming home the winner at the 124-player South Shore Open. Martin is standing at 5,883 MRP's, needing but a scant 117 to earn Life Master. Jim McDonald (MA) finished 2nd (again) and the 105 MRP's move him up well over the 500 mark for this cribbage year, giving him a shot at top ten All-American team honors. Master Dorothy Boreham (MA) and George Edge (RI) finished 3-4. Edge earned his Master rating with this high finish. David Statz (NH) won 10 of 12 games in the qualifying round to take home honors (23 10/12 +240). Some 72 peggers played the Consolation and it was numbers whiz Grand Master Dwight Christiansen (CT) running the table. He scored a nice 17 7/8 +160 to take qualifying honors (8-game round) and came home the winner in the playoffs as well. This run netted Christiansen a nifty 84 MRP's (aggregate). Grand Master John Rooney (MA) took 2nd, followed by Daniel Patriss (CT) and the streaking One-Star Harry Palmer (MA) in 3-4. Director Jim Ready reported a single 28-hand...John Campanella (MA).

One-Star Harry Palmer Cops Eastern States

Shrewsbury, MA, April 1: One-Star Harry Palmer (MA) throws his hat into the All-American race ring once again by taking home yet another 147 MRP's by winning the Eastern States Open Championship. His MRP totals are over the 700 mark for the year, and he is among the national leaders as the ACC hits into the home stretch this cribbage year (July 31 ends the season). Master Robert Kaplan (MA) took home 2nd (and 105 MRP's), followed by Wayne Hittle (MA) and Wayne Tyler (FL) in 3-4. Hittle was also the meet's top qualifier (21 GP's in the 12 game round). Master Syd Lampke (MA) very nearly ran the table in the 80-player Consolation. He took qualifying honors (18 GP's, 8-game round) and finished 2nd in the playoffs as well. Bob Cunningham (MA) won the event, with Master Shawn Jordan (MA) and Pat Jackson (MA) finishing in the 3-4 bracket. Cunningham's run for the roses was especially sweet as he scored the ACC's 17th 29-hand (this season) during his playoff matches. His top purse was sweetened by yet another \$100 for this gem. Director Bill Medeiros reported that Ray Tondorf also scored the meet's only 28-hand.

Mid-Columbia Open Draws Record Crowd Antijunti Columbia King

Larry Antijunti does his pegging out of Scappoose, OR, but he prefers playing on the banks of the Columbia River. With a record crowd of 135 players on hand, Antijunti roared home the winner at the recent Mid-Columbia Open (Hood River, OR). The win came with 196 MRP's, a four-figure winner's check, and a novel wooden aircraft carrier cribbage board trophy. Jan Scott (OR) nailed down 2nd (and garnered 147 MRP's), followed by the streaking Graeme Gossett (OR) and Shari Wikstrom (WA) in 3-4. Denny Van Orsow smoked the field in the qualifying round with a great 37 18/22 +105. The 55 MRP's unofficially zip Van Orsow to his Life Master rating (6,000 MRP's).

ACC newcomer Chris McComas (WA) won the 84-player Consolation, nipping veteran Master Lee Chambers (OR) in the final playoff match. Lee's wife, Susan, a Master in her own right, came home 3rd, followed by Mike Derrick (OR) in 4th.

Jon Olson Wins April Meet

Director Alan Lindner continues to pack 'em in at his St. Croix Classics in Turtle Lake, WI. With casino perks adding to the prize fund, these popular events hosted some 188 players in February, and yet another record crowd of 210 players in late March and April 1.

In the February meet it was Master David Gustafson (MN) coming home the winner (and taking home 196 MRP's). Grand Master Todd Schaefer (MN) finished 2nd...and this is the third time he has taken the bridesmaid spot in these St. Croix Classics. Life Master Wayne Steinmetz (WI) finished in the 3-4 bracket with Life Master Pat Barrett (WI), each player adding yet another 105 MRP's to their lofty lifetime totals. Steinmetz is currently leading the nation and is standing at the 1,000 MRP mark. One-Star Bob Julian (WI) finished in the 5-8 bracket, adding 70 MRP's to his lofty total this cribbage year, keeping his championship hopes alive as well.

Lyle Lund (MN) took qualifying honors with an exceptional 39 18/22 +259. This effort netted Lund some 65 MRP's.
