# Logan: 121-120!

Ron Logan, pegging out of Gold Canyon, Arizona, came away the winner in one of the most exciting finishes in recent Grand National play. With the score at 3-3 in the championship match, and facing the formidable Larry Phifer (a Master pegger from Raleigh, NC), Logan gamely pegged into the winner's hole, leaving Phifer in the stinkhole for a 121-120 win! And the single point was a pricey one as the championship paid \$2,400, and second place was pegged at \$1,200! Master pegger Logan also garnered 196 MRP's with the win and is among the MRP leaders in this fledgling cribbage year.

Frank Bodogh, a Master pegger from Lewiston, NY nailed down 3rd, followed by Sharon Deane (VA) in 4th. Grand Master Peter Setian (MA) topped the 236-player field in the qualifying round with a superlative 38 17/22 +265 (60 MRP's).

This event fell on the heels of the national tragedy of September 11th, causing some 80 players to cancel their plans for play. Airline schedules were in a chaotic situation, causing many of the cancellations. The semi-annual Board of Directors meeting was cancelled when a bevy of newly elected board members, mainly from the Western Region, threw in the towel as they had no stomach for a cribbage game under these depressing circumstances.


Nevertheless, directors John Mangiaratti and Huston Kitts continued on with a well-run event that sported many satellite events. Beginning with the Thursday Old Dominion match and continuing on through Sunday's Last Hope, players gamely played on.

The Consolation played to 182, and none other than the Eastern Region's premier player came home the winner...One Star Harry Palmer (MA). Joyce Bryant (MD) nailed down 2nd, followed by Grand Master Sharlene Medeiros (MA) and John Dydalowicz (VA) in the 3-4 slot. Bill Hutchinson (CO) topped the field in the qualifying round with a nice 22 10/12 +147.



One Star Bob Julian (WI) finished 5th in the Consolation and the 30 MRP's earned give him the unofficial lead this cribbage year. He now stands at 413...and is off to a great start. He has won three National Championships and he has set his sights on number four!

Henry Douglass was the recipient of the A-J Award for his superb Hospitality Room generosity. What is the A-J award? It is the Alan Lindner/Jim Ready combo's largess. They plan this award every GN in the future. The award? A heavy floor tile with red inscription!

Two record-setting ACC members were in attendance. The record? Who has gone the longest without a haircut! # Vadnais, Rein Nail St. Croix

It was Mike Vadnais from nearby St. Paul, MN coming home the winner at the recent record-breaking (228 peggers) St. Criox Classic, played at Turtle Lake, WI. The win came complete with 196 MRP's, giving Vadnais one-ups-manship on the entire nation as the 2002 cribbage year kicks into gear.

But is was Joan Rein, a Grand Master from Carver MN, who is leading the nation on August 12. She nailed the qualifying round with a great 39 16/22 +302, and then finishing 2nd in the playoffs as well. Her MRP take? A whopping 212 (aggregate), and bragging rights as the nation's leading pegger in this fledgling year.

Norbert Upton (MN) is nearing his Grand Master by taking home 3rd, followed by the streaking Ray Boesel (WI) in 4th. Boesel is a Life Master who recently won the Lewis & Clark Classic (July 15).

With 134 peggers in the field, Karen Bouffiou (WI) took home the top prize in the Consolation. Dave Yaeger (MN), Life Master Roger Wilson (CO), and Chris Moller (MN) finished 2-3-4. One-Star Bob Julian (WI) topped the field in the qualifying round, scoring a 19 8/9 +150.

The others in the lucky van: Warren Sondericker, Martha Fingleton, Bob McCabe, Don Flesch, and Ken Benson. Rumor has it that One-Star Julian had the right pools at the right time, and took home yet another wad!

Lindner, recipient of the 2001 President's award for these typical events, urge all players to sign on early for upcoming St. Croix matches.

#### **Terry Smith Hits Whopper!**

At Walla Walla's (WA) Grass roots club each player adds one dollar per session to the 28/29 pot. This has been going on since January 4, 2001.

On Friday, August 24, the pot had grown to a whopping \$484! And then Terry Smith did it! A 29-hand! He cleaned out the pot!

According to co-director Lisa Duff, some \$725 was awarded at this season's finale! The Summer Season champion? Jim Duff!

Wrong, this team scored a dismal 98 GP's (110 game match), and finished dead last! The members: Jarrell, Hatcher, Colvert. Rasmu ssen, and Heath.

#### Schell, Bowman Agree: 649,740 to 1

The odds of scoring a 29-hand in doubles is 649,740 to 1. And that must be the gospel truth as two of the ACC's mathematical whizzes came up with this same huge number...Mike Schell (WA) and Bruce Bowman (MI). Bowman also reports that scoring a 28-hand in doubles has odds of 39,505 to 1 (in singles, the odds are 15.028 to 1).
