

Bouchard Wins Consolation

Corbin Tops National Open

Richard Corbin, pegging on his home turf, won the National Open on July 29. This unique event is a best 4 of 7, double elimination, with skunks counting as two games won. Corbin's last match was a tough one as he was pitted vs. Grand Master Marlene Lazachek, director of the Milwaukee, WI Grass Roots club and the Milwaukee Challenge sanctioned event. And Milwaukee produces some of the nation's finest peggers (two of this year's top ten are from Milwaukee... Steinmetz and Julian). Nevertheless, Corbin prevailed and garnered 196 MRP's, plus qualifying points. Lazachek brought home 147 MRP's.

Grand Master Todd Schaefer (MN) wings it to the 500 MRP mark for the year by finishing 3rd, followed by Keith Widener (NC) in 4th in this 193-player event.

146 peggers were in action in the Consolation, and it was Roger Bouchard (CT) coming home the winner. His final match was vs. Grand Master Peter Setian (MA), with Bouchard prevailing for the win. Marvin Lewis (VA) and local Terry

Gooden finished 3-4. Mona Wahlig (IL) nailed a 8/9 19 GP +135 card to easily take qualifying honors.

Director Catherine Perkins has cribbage on tap for four days running. The satellite winners:





For the first time since 1985, veteran pegger Ray Boesel, Glenbuelah, WA, has won a sanctioned Main Event. Boesel won the 152-player Lewis and Clark Classic in Sioux Falls, SD, on July 15. This Life Master had been knocking on the door for some 16 years for another win. His final playoff match was vs. Steve Herwig, Paullina, Iowa, and he came away the winner...and \$1,500! And 196 MRP's to add to his lofty lifetime total. Herwig fared well in finishing 2nd, taking home 147 MRP's and a hefty 2nd place check. Les Johnson (CO) and Master Clay Collier (NE) finished in the 3-4 slot.

Russell Adams (MN) is very close to becoming the ACC's 14th One-Star player, and he made a move with a top qualifying round score. His 39 GP card in the 22-game round netted yet another 65 MRP's.

Master Doug Henderson (WI) won the 102-player Consolation, nipping Life Master Jerry Gruber (MN) in the final playoff match. Lyle Lund (MN) and Jerry Jaeger (NE) finished 3-4. Vickie Long (WI) is co-director of the popular St. Croix Classics in Turtle Lake, WI, and this time around, decided to do some pegging on her own behalf. She nailed the top score in the Consolation...a nifty 18 GP card (9 games).

Director Scott Kooistra had a full array of satellite events. The winners: Friday: Doug Munneke (MN) 9/9 20 GP's Saturday: Larry Rowley (WI) 17 GP's All-Events: Don Patrin (MN) 64 GP's 28's: Sharon Schaefer, John Bakeberg, Steve Herwig.

Director Kooistra reported that this was the first Lewis & Clark tourney to be held at the Oaks Hotel in Sioux Falls, after 13 years in Yankton, SD. This facility will be the site of Grand National XXII in 2003.

Hot June For Doug Henderson Master Doug Henderson, Racine, WI, had an unusual month of June. He scored THREE 28-hands at three different events.

On June 3, he scored a 28-hand in the Consolation at the St. Croix Classic in Turtle Lake, WI. On June 24, he scored yet another at the Capital City Classic in Des Moines, IA, and, finally, he scored his third 28 on June 30 at the Independence Day Classic in Reno, NV.

Newly-crowned Master Helene Sontag (CA) came to play at the Devil Mountain Caper on July 22. Sontag wound down the 2001 cribbage season in style as she nailed the 110-player event and carted home 147 MRP's to add to her 2,000+, as well as bragging rights.

Her final match pitted her against the formidable Roy Banducci (CA) and she prevailed with the win against this Grand Master. Master Dale Kochenburg (CA) and Bill Robe (CA) finished 3-4. Grand Master Mary Gladish (CA) scored a great 37 GP card (22 games) to take qualifying honors...and added 55 MRP's to her lifetime total, in addition to playoff MRP's.

The 56-player Consolation had the Western Region top runners in action, with One-Star Paul Hatcher (OR) winning the event. Grand Master Bill Wakeman (CA), newly-crowned Life Master Jim Hornbacher (WA) and Master John Schmucker (CA) finishing 2-3-4. Hornbacher also was the event's top qualifier (17 GP's, 9 games).

Director Bob Clark featured Friday Singles and Doubles matches. The winners: Singles: Betty McBride; Doubles: Dennis Ryan & Gary Wilkinson. Rollie Heath won the Saturday Singles. Marilyn Anderson and Anne Sheeran scored 28's, but no 29's showed.

Dan Mitchell is a veteran Master pegger from Crescent City, CA...and he has gone to the main event championship match 13 times, and walked away the bridesmaid 13 times! That is, until the Portland Summer Open. The 14th try was the magic one, as he nailed the huge 192-player event going away. He took home 196 MRP's, \$1,310 (including the super Q), and, finally, bragging rights!

His final match pitted him with Master Morris Schiffman who was pegging on his home turf, but Mitchell was not to be denied on his 14th try. Schiffman netted 147 MRP's and a great weekend of pegging. Michelle Barthelmess (MT) had a great 2001 year, and finished 3rd, carting home well over 400 MRP's for the season. She also won the All-Events and also had a great tournament. Grand Master Jim Waldorf (OR) nailed down 4th.

Ken Slama (WA) qualified tops with a nice 36 GP card (50 MRP's), taking home a nice "Q" pool orize.

Another large crowdplayed the Consolation (128) and it was Grand Master Jim Gogolin (OR) winning 2-0 over three-star DeLynn Colvert (MT) in the final playoff match. Colvert's 54 MRP's (aggregate) gives him 1,335 MRP's for the year... and the 16th time he has earned All-American honors. National champ Jim Langley (CA) finished in the 3-4 bracket, after qualifying with great 17 GP card. His aggregate MRP take was 48 MRP's, running his season's MRP take to a new record 2,245! Master Eileen Shine (OR) also finished in the 3-4 bracket in this event. Al Nelson (WA) nailed a grand slam 9/9 19 GP card to easily take qualifying honors.

The satellites? It was Master Roger Lueschow (WA) hogging almost every event in sight. He began by taking the 83-player Time Passer on Friday afternoon, then teaming with Grand Master Gene Sissel (OR) to win the Friday doubles, and came back with yet another win on Saturday night, besting 68 players. The High Rollers played to 34 players and Master John Furler (OR) won the "Q" (\$600), but Bill Hutchinson (CO) won the playoffs. Neva Richmond (OR) won the Last Chance event.

Ken and Tim Julkowski had all events running smoothly, and the host Ramada Inn served a tasty lunch and proved good hosts. This event wound down play for the 2001 season, and the large growd attests that the ACC is alive and well!



Life Master Bill Medeiros, Shrewsbury, MA, wound down the 2001 cribbage year with a flourish. He won the 114-player Main Open, and with the 147 MRP's earned runs his yearly total to the 1,200 mark...and All-American team honors. This is his second All-American team appearance (top 10: 1994).

Medeiros's final match pitted him vs. David Campbell (ME) and he won going away. Campbell netted 105 MRP's for his 2nd place finish. Grand Master Donna LaFleur (CT) nailed 3rd and posted a fine year's pegging, finishing with 500+ MRP's. Life Master David Clemmey (MA) finished 4th...and zipped to a spot on the All-American team as well. He posted over 1,100 MRP's for the year. He took home 2nd place in 1993, and returns to the team.

Master Frank Reddy (MA) won 10 of 12 games, posting a 23 GP card (+175) to easily take qualifying honors.

Some 62 peggers played the Consolation and George Tetrault (NH) was not all the way, taking qualifying honors (15 7/8 +100) and winning the playoffs as well. His MRP take (aggregate) was 60! Bob Chevalier (MA) nailed 2nd, followed by Grand Master John Groz (FL) and Paula Abele (MA) in 3-4.

Directors Laurie Owen and Don Russell sported a doubles and high rollers on Saturday. Doubles action saw Bud Elston and Barbara McFee come home winners. Dick Clausson won the high rollers. Dick West and Stan Mullins scored sanctioned 28-hands...but no 29's showed.

James Langley National Champ

James Langley, Red Bluff, CA is officially the ACC's 2001 National Champion. National Statistician Bob McCabe verifies that Langley has set a new standard for a single year's play, scoring a record 2,245 MRP's. Beginning with a torrid streak in early April, and continuing on until the season wound down on July 31, Langley easily captured this year's crown. With the record MRP's, Langley also zipped to the ACC's 59th Life Master rating, and had a season to long-remember.

Life Master Wayne Steinmetz, Milwaukee, WI made a valiant effort to stay with Langley as the season wound down, and finished with some 1,617 MRP's...enough to win in most years, but only good enough for second in this unusual year. Three-Star DeLynn Colvert, Missoula, MT put together a steady year, and earned his 16th All-American team honors (1,335 MRP's). Life Master Bill Medeiros, Shrewsbury, MA came on strong with a season-ending rush and finished 4th (1,225). Grand Master Ronald Morgan, Loyalton, CA, pegged far and wide, and his dedication paid off with a 5th place finish (1,208). Life Master David Clemmey, Mansfield, MA finished 2nd in 1993, and re-joins the All-American team, posting 1,157 MRP's for the year. George "Ras" Rasmussen, Centralia, WA also re-joins the team (having won a spot in 1998), finishing the year with 1,155 MRP's. Perennial winner One-Star Harry Palmer, W. Springfield, MA makes his 4th appearance on the team, posting 1,151 MRP's. Life Master James Hornbacher, Mountlake Terrace, WA, appeared to have the inside track for this year's title at the half-way mark, winning two huge events back-toback in mid-winter, but could not match Langley's finishing kick. Hornbacher scored 1,104 MRP's to earn his first All-American honors. Rounding out the top ten is another perennial winner and threetime national champion, Bob Julian, Milwaukee, WI. This One-Star player travels far and wide, having earned top ten honors five times.

Hard Luck Story

Master Sharon Hejtmanek (MT) gave it the old college try this cribbage year in an effort to earn top-ten honors. With a month to go, and two large events on tap, she was running 11th, with an excellent chance of making the All-American team. Alas, she was forced to undergo heart surgery, and was unable to compete the last month. She finished the year 12th with 959 MRP's. Cribbage World is happy to report Sharon is on the mend, and will be back in action soon.

Phil Martin Earns Life Master

Phil Martin, East Hartford, CT, wound down the 2001 cribbage year by earning the ACC's 62nd Life Master rating.

6,000 Master Rating Points are required, with very few players reaching this plateau. Eight ACC players made the grade this cribbage year.

David, Not Jim

Last month, CW reported that Jim Clemmey was among the top ten in the nation this cribbage year. Wrong, it was brother David tattooing the boards. CW apologizes for the mistake. (David did, indeed, earn top ten).

These seven events gave cribbage competition to some 1,534 constestants in well-run events that stressed fair play and comaraderie exemplified by the American Cribbage Congress. In addition, five of these events played at the St. Croix Casino, Turtle Lake, Wisconsin, awarded players some \$40,650 in bonus awards. Linder's expertise in managing tournaments, in addition to negotiating perks for players, make his events favorites for Central Region players, and from throughout the nation.

Special recognition is also given to Lindner's co-director **Pithit Long.** Her tireless help in managing these tournaments added much to their success.




