

# Home Field Advantage Rozmairek Tops MGM

With a whopping 294 peggers in action at the recent MGM Open in Green Bay, WI, it was local peggers taking home all the top spots in this annual cribbage shootout. Mike Rozmairek led the charge by taking home the championship...and 252 MRP's as well. Another Green Bay pegger...Richard Pigeon...nailed down 2nd (and 196 MRP's). Master Max Steplyk, Pleasant Prairie, WI took 3rd, and yet another Green Bay pegger, Clarence Charles, copped 4th.

Louie Kamps (WI) scored the meet's top qualifying card...a nice 37 +375 (55 MRP's).

118 peggers stayed for the Consolation and it was yet another Green Bay pegger (Peter Boerschinger) winning the event. Master Jerry Fischer (WI) is zeroing in on his Grand Master by taking home 2nd, followed by Master Nicky Kniech (WI) and Sandra Stroup (IL) in the 3-4 slot. Darrell Tease, Green Bay, scored a whopper in the qualifying round...a superlative 19 +185 (9 games).

Directors Tom Gallagher, Bob Miller, and Jerry Lemke, as usual, had a full slate of satellite events. And Green Bay is famous for a huge Friday Doubles match. This year's event drew 234 teams (468 players). The satellite winners:

With a huge crowd on hand (151 players), Kraft came home with yet another 196 MRP's to add to his 6,800+ (lifetime) total. His final playoff match pitted him vs. Ginger Grogan (MN) and his cards stayed hot for the win. Grogan carted home 147 MRP's for her 2nd place finish. Grand Master Bob Sommer (MN) and Nick Severson (MN) took home 3-4...and 105 MRP's each. Severson scored a 28-hand to aid in his run for the roses.

Local Ed Balcer was smoking in the qualifying round, winning 17 of 22 (39 17/22 +266) to easily take honors. Balcer earned 65 MRP's for this high finish.

82 players stayed for the Consolation, and Tim Kunst (MN) edged Mike Burns (MN) for the win in the final playoff match. Grand Master Bob Hanes (IA) is nearing his Life Master by finishing in the 3-4 slot with One-Star Warren Sondericker (WI). Local Dave Yaeger won 8 of 9 (17 8/9 +134) to top the field in the qualifying round (18 MRP's).

Director Todd Schaefer puts on a well-run show in St. Paul and has the usual satellites. The winners:

William Carlstrom won 13 of 14 games in the qualifying round to easily take honors (27 13/14 +218).



As the 2002 cribbage year hits the final leg, the old veterans of cribbage play are setting the pace. One-Star Bob Julian (WI) is picking up MRP's at very nearly every stop and has scored an unofficial 1,071 MRP's to lead the nation. He topped the 122-player field at the River City Open in early March (147 MRP's) and qualified with a high score at the Zumbro Open (MN) to maintain his torrid pace. Three-Star DeLvnn Colvert (MT) is steadily piling up points as well, and is unofficially at 1,031. Grand Master Jack Shumate (CA) qualified tops at the recent Northwest Open (OR) and he has also been tatooing the boards. He is unofficially at 863 MRP's for the year. Life Master Wayne Steinmetz (WI) is among the leaders as well. Out west, it is Life Master George "Ras" Rasmussen (WA) and One-Star Paul Hatcher (OR) leading the way. In the Eastern Region, One-Star Harry Palmer (MA), Life Master David Clemmey (MA) and One-Star Phyllis Schmidt (MA) are leading their region.

With four month's play remaining, the pace is quickening, with many players within shouting distance, and a hot run may very well propell a player to an All-American finish!

### To All Members of the American Cribbage Congress

A committee has been appointed to make recomendations to the ACC Board of Directors about dealing practices.

The ACC has always promoted fair play to all tournament players. For example; Ed Horigan developed a new MasterPoint system and presented it to the board for review. Not all board members or players agreed to the changes at first, but through time it became the standard; because it was fair and reasonable. The ACC rulebook was adopted to establish fair play and to eliminate controversy and confusion during play. In addition, a few accomplished players have studied the game, compiled various kinds of statistics, and some even published books. These authors and statisticians have chosen to share valuable information to help players become more knowledgeable and skillful about the game.

Most, if nor all, competitive players look for fair advantage over their opponents. It is our responsibility as board members, tournament directors and members to examine statistical facts and exercise our best judgement relevant to fair play during tournaments.

Certain methods of play have become the norm, simply because nobody has offered a reasonable alternative to change them. However, when new evidence is presented it must be given fair examination and then acted upon if it benefits all players and does not violate the rules, charter, or spirit of the American Cribbage Congress.

The following data was complied by Jim McDonald (MA-1236), co-director of the Villager Tournament

in the years 1996-2001. The total number of games played was 8,976, of this total the dealer won 56.4% and the non-dealer 43.6%. However the biggest advantage to the dealer was in the number of skunks given. The dealer gave 372 skunks (64.2%) and the non-dealer 207 skunks (35.8%). So it really is an advantage to having the first deal.

This committee feels that there is enough luck in the game of cribbage, therefore the cutting for deal should be abandoned and we should go to the alternating odd-even deals in the main and consolation qualifying deals.

This method offers each player equal opportunity to take advantage of their own deal. This committee will be presenting a proposal to the BOD at the Grand national in LakTahoe in October, 2002.




