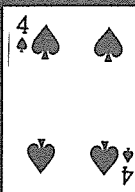
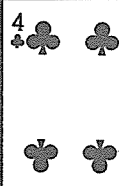

Home Field Advantage **Rozmairek Tops MGM**

With a whopping 294 peggers in action at the recent MGM Open in Green Bay, WI, it was local peggers taking home all the top spots in this annual cribbage shootout. Mike Rozmairek led the charge by taking home the championship...and 252MRP's as well. Another Green Bay pegger...Richard Pigeon...nailed down 2nd (and 196MRP's). Master Max Steplyk, Pleasant Prairie, WI took 3rd, and yet another Green Bay pegger, Clarence Charles, copped 4th.

Louie Kamps (WI) scored the meet's top qualifying card...a nice 37 +375 (55 MRP's).

118 peggers stayed for the Consolation and it was yet another Green Bay pegger (Peter Boerschinger) winning the event. Master Jerry Fischer (WI) is zeroing in on his Grand Master by taking home 2nd, followed by Master Nicky Kniech (WI) and Sandra Stroup (IL) in the 3-4 slot. Darrell Tease, Green Bay, scored a whopper in the qualifying round...a superlative 19 +185 (9 games).

Directors Tom Gallagher, Bob Miller, and Jerry Lemke, as usual, had a full slate of satellite events. And Green Bay is famous for a huge Friday Doubles match. This year's event drew 234 teams (468 players). The satellite winners:

This event raised \$2,000 for charity, and sported many new young players. Two 28-hands were scored...Tom Schumacher in the Consolation, and Jerry Sprangers in the Friday High Rollers.

Director Gallagher noted that this was the event's 22nd annual, and was played on 2-22-02. The directors were pleased with the large turnout. The host Midway Hotel was buzzing for three days running, as cribbage is THE game in February in Green Bay.

Kraft Tops In St. Paul

Life Master Lloyd Kraft, pegging out of Seymour, WI, came to play at the recent Capital City Classic in St. Paul, WI. With a huge crowd on hand (151 players), Kraft came home with yet another 196 MRP's to add to his 6,800+ (lifetime) total. His final playoff match pitted him vs. Ginger Grogan (MN) and his cards stayed hot for the win. Grogan carted home 147 MRP's for her 2nd place finish. Grand Master Bob Sommer (MN) and Nick Severson (MN) took home 3-4...and 105 MRP's each. Severson scored a 28-hand to aid in his run for the roses.

Local Ed Balcer was smoking in the qualifying round, winning 17 of 22 (39 17/22 +266) to easily take honors. Balcer earned 65 MRP's for this high finish.

82 players stayed for the Consolation, and Tim Kunst (MN) edged Mike Burns (MN) for the win in the final playoff match. Grand Master Bob Hanes (IA) is nearing his Life Master by finishing in the 3-4 slot with One-Star Warren Sondericker (WI). Local Dave Yaeger won 8 of 9 (17 8/9 +134) to top the field in the qualifying round (18 MRP's).

Director Todd Schaefer puts on a well-run show in St. Paul and has the usual satellites. The winners:

Life Master George Bickford, W. Springfield, MA, was smoking at the recent Shawn's Special in Woonsocket, MA on February 24. With 110 players in action, he nailed the 12 game qualifying round with an excellent 22 GP card (40 MRP's), and came home 2nd in the playoff round, netting yet another 105 MRP's to run his lofty lifetime numbers to well over 7,700.

But it was Bill Richmond from Newington, CT taking home the bacon...and the championship, netting 147 MRP's, bragging rights, and the top prize. Paul Gifford (NH) and Master Bob Cunningham (MA) finishing 3-4.

Life Master George Webb (MA) came home the winner in the 53-player Consolation, nipping yet another Life Master (Bill Medeiros) in the final playoff match. Both Webb and Medeiros have topped the 9,000 MRP mark (lifetime), and they continue to pile up points. Charles Martin (RI) and John Campanella (MA) finished 3-4. Paul Musard (RI) posted a nice 14 GP card (8 games) to take qualifying honors.

But on Valentine's Day, he decided to do some pegging in his own behalf...and took home the championship at the 5th Annual Minnesota Valentine Special, played in South St. Paul on February 10.

With a record 116 peggers on board for this event, Lindner took home a nifty 147 MRP's to go with the winner's prize. Greg Ulberg (MN) nailed down 2nd, followed by Myron Schmidt (MN), and Grand Master Les Kvien (IL) in the 3-4 slot.

William Carlstrom won 13 of 14 games in the qualifying round to easily take honors (27 13/14 +218).

With 68 peggers in action in the Consolation, local Tony Ayriss came home the winner, edging Dave Ross (MN) in the final playoff match. Grand Master Frank Trojan (MN) and Master Jerry Fischer (WI) finished 3-4. Babe O'Gorman (MN) scored a grand slam 8/8 to take qualifying honors (17 8/8 +137).

Director Jerry Gruber reported that Lindner was aided by the Main Event's only 28-hand in his run for the roses, and Jim Rein (MN) scored a 28-hand in the Consolation. He reported he was pleased with the record turnout for a one-day event.

With a sizeable 148 players in the field, Brault walked away the winner, besting Wayne Hittle (MA) in the final playoff match. Brault carted home 196 MRP's and Hittle garnered 147. David Statz (NH) and Life Master David Clemmey (MA) finished 3-4.

In the 12-game qualifying round, Bob Medeiros (MA) was smoking. He nailed a very rare 12-game grand slam (with 2 skunks) and with his 26 12/12 +201 took home a 60 MRP bonus.

A field of 76 players played the Consolation, and Grand National XIV champ Louis Caccia (MA) came home the winner. This Grand Master carted home 63 MRP's for the effort. Another Grand Master finished 2nd...Cindy Veradt (MA), followed by Paula Bergeron (NH) and Grand Master Joyce Vanelli (MA) in the 3-4 slot.

Director Pat Llewellyn had a doubles match that was won by Sue Cousens and Barbara McPhee. Shirley Blatz and Shawn Jordan finished 2nd, followed by Pat Llewellyn and Dick Closson in 3rd.

The cards were hot in the sanctioned events. Dick Closson, Topsham, ME, scored the ACC's 8th 29-hand, and takes home the \$100 bonus for this sanctioned gem. Five 28-hands were scored, with Shawn Jordan nailing two of them. Wayne Tyler, Dave Campbell, and Wayne Hittle also scored these 15,028-1 hands.

Director Pat Llewellyn reported she was pleased with the turnout, and thanks GR club 161 for their help in running the show. With all the volunteers that pitched in to help, Llewellyn wrote, "You would have to say that the Tri-Valley was perfect!" At least, Richard Brault would say so!

He trained for the win at the local Grass Roots club's tables and the practice paid off bigtime! His final match pitted him vs. Al Haseman (IL) and Stankus was not to be denied. Dave Strahl (IL) and Richard Dane (WI) finished 3-4 in the field of 100 peggers. Hall-of-Famer Bob Madsen, fresh from a trip to Mesa, AZ, clobbered the field in the qualifying round, scoring a nice 35 17+213, adding yet another 45 MRP's to his 5,500+ lifetime total.

Another Hall-of-Famer and Life Master Syl Lulinski (IL) topped the field in the Consolation's 53-player field to take honors, but when the playoffs had wound down, only Life Master Martha Fingleton (WI) remained undefeated. With four month's play remaining, the pace is quickening, with many players within shouting distance, and a hot run may very well propel a player to an All-American finish!

To All Members of the American Cribbage Congress

A committee has been appointed to make recommendations to the ACC Board of Directors about dealing practices.

The ACC has always promoted fair play to all tournament players. For example; Ed Horigan developed a new MasterPoint system and presented it to the board for review. Not all board members or players agreed to the changes at first, but through time it became the standard; because it was fair and reasonable. The ACC rulebook was adopted to establish fair play and to eliminate controversy and confusion during play. In addition, a few accomplished players have studied the game, compiled various kinds of statistics, and some even published books. These authors and statisticians have chosen to share valuable information to help players become more knowledgeable and skillful about the game.

Most, if not all, competitive players look for fair advantage over their opponents. It is our responsibility as board members, tournament directors and members to examine statistical facts and exercise our best judgement relevant to fair play during tournaments.

Certain methods of play have become the norm, simply because nobody has offered a reasonable alternative to change them. However, when new evidence is presented it must be given fair examination and then acted upon if it benefits all players and does not violate the rules, charter, or spirit of the American Cribbage Congress.

The following data was compiled by Jim McDonald (MA-1236), co-director of the Villager Tournament

in the years 1996-2001. The total number of games played was 8,976, of this total the dealer won 56.4% and the non-dealer 43.6%. However the biggest advantage to the dealer was in the number of skunks given. The dealer gave 372 skunks (64.2%) and the non-dealer 207 skunks (35.8%). So it really is an advantage to having the first deal.

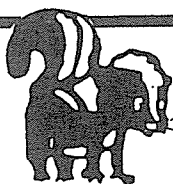

This method offers each player equal opportunity to take advantage of their own deal. This committee will be presenting a proposal to the BOD at the Grand national in LakTahoe in October, 2002.

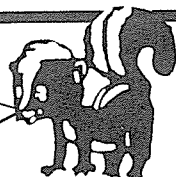

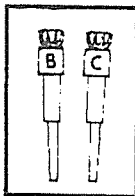

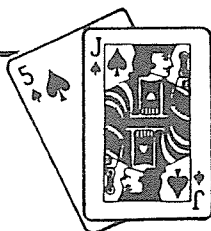
