


Reno: Njaa

262 Support Vets in Independence Day Classic

The usual large crowd was on hand in Reno for the Independence Day Classic, and this time around Master H. Ross Njaa, Salinas, CA bested the 262 peggers in the field. In winning, Njaa zips to the 1,000 MRP mark for this cribbage year, and is in the running for All-American honors. The win came complete with \$1,700, 252 MRP's...and bragging rights.

Helen Railsback (NE), using her trademark six-shooter pegs, very nearly took it all, finishing 2nd (\$1,400) and the 196 MRP's earned gave her Life Master (unofficially). Egon Koch (BC) finished 3rd (\$1,100) and Mike Leonard (CA) took home 4th. James Muller (CA) took qualifying honors with a very nice 40 19/22 +267, taking home the top "Q" prize.

With 184 in the Consolation, Life Master Steve Reynolds won yet another (4 Mains, 4 Consolations, lifetime) and came home with another 84 MRP's. Master John Furler (OR) finished 2nd, followed by Grand Master Jackie Doppelt (CA) and Gordon Reid (BC) in 3-4. Harry NG (CA) won 9 of 10 to take qualifying honors (21 9/10 +226).

Bill and Dothalee Irons, Roberta Huff, and staff had the Sands buzzing from Friday night until late Sunday afternoon with cribbage action. On Friday, it was Richard Williams, Carson City,

NV taking home \$725 in the Early Bird action. Saturday night, Three-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT) took the High Roller. Late Sunday afternoon Tom Mills (CA) scored a great 21 9/9 +198 to nip another Grand Slam by Mary K. Ryan.

The cards were hot three days running, with six 28-hands being scored: Anne Sheeran, Etta Brownlee, Arne Anderson, Steve Reynolds, Mary Ryan, and Robert Magnuson. Sheeran's 28-hand continues her recent torrid streak of scoring these gems.

Many players were on hand in hopes of earning top-ten honors. One-Star Harry Palmer (MA) picked up 70 MRP's with a 9th place finish, and runs his yearly tally to 1,260...and a virtual lock on a top-ten spot. Hal Lamon (WA), Bill Hutchinson (CO), and Njaa all made moves upwards to keep their hats in the race.

The Sands, with the ever-present Barbara Woodward, once again rolled out the red carpet for the players, furnishing coffee and cakes three-days running, in addition to two great buffet lunches. This large crowd attests to the fact that the Sands is the cribbage capital for the ACC. And the Veterans benefitted from the player's in this annual affair.

Donna LaFleur Cops Maine Open

Charlie Finley Scores First-Ever 29

With a sizeable 118 players in action, Grand Master Donna LaFleur, Bristol, CT, zipped to the win, and very nearly earned her Life Master as well. And Grand Master Dick West (MA), with a 2nd place finish, is also nearing his Life Master. Beanie Pitcher (ME) and Life Master Dwight Christiansen (CT) nailed down the 3-4 bracket. Christiansen also topped the field in the qualifying round with a great 26 11/12 +262, earning a whopping 165 MRP's (aggregate) to add to his lofty lifetime total.

With 50 peggers in action in the Consolation, Carl Palmer (ME) took home the action, nipping Bob Lewis (ME) in the final playoff match. Donnabeth Morton (ME) and Maysel Huston (ME) finished 3-4, as local players took all top four spots. Life Master Paul Gallagher (MA) won 7 of 8 in the qualifying round to take home the top Q spot.

Director Laurie Owen had a High Rollers, won by Cindy Veradt (ME), and a doubles match, copped by Louis Manter and Moyle Evans (ME).

A highlight of the match saw veteran Grand Master Charlie Finley (CT) score his first-ever 29-hand...and the ACC's 18th this cribbage season, earning Finley a nifty \$100 bonus from the ACC.

County Fair Action

The Lassen County Fair, booth 13, will have cribbage challenge matches on tap this July 17-21. The Susanville Grass Roots Club (CA) is in action drumming up new members in this mid-summer event.

1,790 Entrants Shumate Cops Grass Roots National

With a whopping 1,790 participants, it was Grand Master Jack B. Shumate III, Crescent City, CA, coming home the winner. Shumate won 16 of 18 games, with four skunks to chalk up 36 GP's +317 to easily take honors. The win came with a \$550 winner's check...and bragging rights galore in the ACC's largest event of the year.

Three players garnered 34 GP's with Life Master Sharlene Medeiros (MA) winning 2nd with a 34 16/18 +278. Leonard Goodman (CA) had a 34 15/18 +237 to take 3rd. Joseph Bellini (MA) took 4th with a 34 15/18 +230.

Tournament Director Annett Eiffert reported 24 28-hands were scored, earning each player a \$25 bonus. Twelve players nailed a 9-game grand slam to also earn a \$25 bonus. A grand total of \$15,780 was paid to the players. Some 91 clubs hosted a Grass Roots National Tournament, with some 133 Grass Roots clubs participating.

Eiffert also reported that about one-third of the clubs entered their scores electronically (accgrassroots.org) which helped immensely with processing the scores. She hopes all clubs will be up to speed with this process next year. Eiffert also expresses her thanks to her home River City Peggers (CA) club and especially to Pat Russell for their help with the enormous volume of score cards.

Wong Tops In Hawaii

With a small, but spirited crowd on hand, it was Roy Wong (HI) winning the June edition of the Hawaii Open. Charlie Rodgers (HI) finished 2nd, followed by Len Wahlig (IL) and Mel Vios (HI) in the 3-4 slot. Vios also took qualifying honors with a nice 18 9/12 +112 card. He carted home 41 MRP's, aggregate. He also scored the meet's only 28-hand. Winner Wong took home 70 MRP's...and an invitation to the upcoming Tournament of Champions in Reno next year.

Erik Locke Tops Peggin' Miners

Erik Locke is one of the ACC's youngest peggers (he still has hair on his head), and he zipped down I-5 to Yreka, CA from his Grants Pass, OR home and nailed the 58-player Peggin' Miners Classic. His final playoff match pitted him vs. Master Jim Broadhurst (OR) but he prevailed for the win. Broadhurst set the pace in the qualifying round with a 34 14/22 +192. Master Jerold Montgomery (CA) and Life Master Jim Gogolin (OR) finished 3-4.

The Consolation saw a bevy of players in this year's MRP race clawing for those coveted points. Master Herschel Mack (CA) won the playoffs, followed by Master Don Brown (CA) in 2nd (Brown also qualified tops: 16 7/9 +139). Master Roland Hal I (CA) and Life Master Ras Rasmussen (WA) finished 3-4. All four of the top finishers are in the hunt for All-American honors this cribbage year.

Fisher...Again!

In late May, Master Art Fisher, Seaside, CA, won his first ever Main Event, winning the Nipomo Open (CA). And, once again, Fisher has come home the winner! This time around he took no prisoners, as he qualified first (38 18/22 +232) and roared home the winner as well at the **13th Annual Devil Mountain Cribbage Caper**, played in Antioch, CA in late July. In winning this 106-player event, Fisher garnered yet another 207 MRP's (aggregate), the winner's purse, and a trophy board. Grand Master Heidi Glashan (CA) took 2nd, followed by Dennis Gage (CA) and Mike Hurley (CA) in the 3-4 slot.

Three-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT) came alive in the 62-player Consolation, scoring 20 8/9 +164 to take qualifying honors, but Gordon Brown (CA) won the playoffs going away, nipping this year's national champion One-Star Bob Julian (WI) in the final playoff match. Julian added another 80 MRP's to his untouchable 1,800+ total for this cribbage year. Mike Leonard (CA) and newly-crowned Life Master Bill Wakeman (CA) finished 3-4.

Laurie Kenny, Seattle, WA, was the only player in the house that could cool off Three-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT), and cool him off she did...3-0 in the final playoff match to cop the inaugural 128-player NW Washington Open in Everett, WA on July 12-14. Colvert had qualified with his highest score in some 21 years of ACC pegging (42 18/22 +374), and continued his roll in the playoff round as well. Newly-crowned Life Master Jack Moritzky (WA) has been on a roll lately, and knocked down 3rd place, followed by Master Mike McDaniel (MT) in 4th.

A sizeable 86 players played the Consolation and Life Master Roy Hofbauer (WA) took home yet another win, edging Mary Ann Ginnard (WA) in the final playoff match. Helen Henderson (WA) and Rosemary Hendricks (WA) finished 3-4. Paul Roy (WA) scored a 17 7/9 +133 card to take qualifying honors.

New Master Rating Points Effective August 1, 2002

The American Cribbage Congress's Board of Directors voted unanimously at last January's BOD meeting to make modifications to the Master Rating Point system, effective August 1, 2002.

In the Main Event, a slight change was made to award the qualifying round of a one-day 12-game event five extra points for each Game Point scored by the top 1/8th of the field. This change was made to give the one-day event MRP's comparable to those available in 22-game two-day tournaments. This change will benefit the Eastern Region, as 12-game one-day events are common. The Central and Western Regions favor the two-day events.

The major change to the system is the Consolation event. The playoffs will now sport a 4 + 4 system (replacing the 3 + 3 system). This change will reward Consolation playoff players a 25% increase in playoff points. Playoff points will be scored as follows:

4 - 12 - 24 - 40 - 60 - 84 - 112 - 144 - 180

National Statistician Bob McCabe analyzed our MRP rating system, and found our new system (before the above changes were incorporated) rewarded about 5% less than the system that was replaced about five years ago. These changes address this shortfall, and points will now be awarded in a more equitable way.

Wikstrom Resigns BOD Post

Bob Wikstrom, Port Orchard, WA, has resigned from the ACC's Board of Directors, effective June 24, 2002.

Bob's service to the ACC was outstanding. He served as Executive Vice-President, Policy with his recent efforts including up-dating the ACC's Manual. In addition, his efforts included being chairman of the election committee, and serving on a multitude of other committees. The ACC doffs its hat to Bob for a job well done.

Lea Hornbeck Appointed to Board of Directors

Lea Hornbeck, Washougal, WA, has been appointed to fill the vacancy created by Bob Wikstrom's resignation from the ACC's Board of Directors.

Hornbeck is a veteran player and has had previous Board of Director's experience, having last served on the 1999-2001 BOD. Hornbeck is a Master player, and is nearing his Grand Master rating. He has much tournament experience and is a welcomed addition to the BOD.



Instead of a best 4 of 7, with skunks counting 2 games, the match is now decided by the first to earn 8 points, with a skunk counting 3 points, and a win 2 points. This change ensures at least a 3-game match.

Schmidt keeps her hat in the ring for top-ten honors by taking home yet another 105 MRP's for the 2nd place finish. Linda Brent (MD) and Henry Bergeron (NH) nailed down the 3-4 slot...and 70 MRP's each. John Campanella (MA) won 11 of 12 in the qualifying round to easily take qualifying honors (40 MRP's).

With 58 players in the Consolation field, Walt Brideau (CT) came home the winner, nipping Life Master Bill Shoemaker (VT) for the title. Frank Signa (MA) and Bob Turcotte (MA) finished 3-4. Signa was also the event's top qualifier, scoring a nifty 8 for 8 grand slam (16 8/8 +87).





Anne Haller Cops Cascade







Short Version of Grass Roots Regulations

Local Tournaments

GR Season begins on September 1st and ends May 31st.

The regional statistician must receive the final reports, registrations, and award forms by the 7th of June.

General You must be a member of the ACC to join the GR and your ACC & GR membership must remain active to participate and receive points and especially as of June 30th thru July 31st when points are posted.

The ACC Grass Roots program shall be governed by the cribbage rules of play, and the Code of Ethics, as contained in the official Rule Book of the ACC. Procedures for further processing may be obtained from a member of the BoD.

A player can play an opponent twice, but not consecutive games against the same opponent in local play. An automatic win may not be awarded when playing the 'dummy' or sit out.

GR Rating Points are awarded to the top 20% of the total number of members and visitors playing in an official tournament. Only Game Points are used to rank, therefore, anyone tied for the last position will receive GR Rating Points. Clubs are assigned to one of 3 **Divisions**, for their National Rating Point **Standings**- without regard to geography, based on the number tournaments that they play during the GR playing season. They are divided into 5 **Regions** geographically for Statistical workload.

Membership Categories - "**Members**" are players that are current members of the ACC & GR. They can earn points in the Grass Roots. Dues are to be collected on first official tournament. Anyone joining last month of season carries over for following year. "**Visitors**" are ACC & GR members of another ACCGR club. "**Guests**" are new players who are not members of the GR - this can be ACC members too. They are allowed to play twice before joining. "**Youths**" - ACC & GR members under 21 years of age. Permitted at the discretion of individual Club Directors subject to individual state regulations. May earn Grass Roots Rating Points and awards only - no cash.

Transfers - Are permitted from one club to another once before Feb 1st. They will lose points for YTD in losing club but retain for lifetime.

GRNT & GRRT The "Official" Regional or National Play must be with the first club they play with if more than one club gets together as members are not bound to play with their local club. **Guests** are not permitted. GRRT (Regional) is conducted before Jan 31st. GRNT (National) is conducted between February 1st and May 31st. A Player may play any one opponent up to three (3) times but not consecutive games during the 18-game format.
