Jeanette Nielsen Runs Table In Consolation

Salem: LaBrasseur

A huge field of 198 peggers, satisfied with a free breakfast from the host Comfort Suites motel, courtesy of director Paul Hatcher and the motel, settled in for some spirited pegging...and it was Richard LaBrasseur, Scio, OR, zipping to the win. Sporting a Texas-size black leather hat with silver hat band, complete with rawhide ties, LaBrasseur was the spitting image of the old west. This time around, it was not "aces and eights" but jacks and fives as he garnered the win, 196 MRP's, and a nifty \$1,200. Master Don Smith (OR) scored a 29-hand in the playoffs (the ACC's 4th this cribbage season), and very nearly took it all, finishing 2nd. Dan Marsh (OR) and Master Dot Mickow (WA) finished 3-4. Jim Crawford (CA) nailed down a nice 37 18/22 +213 to take qualifying honors.

Newly-crowned Master Jeanette Nielsen (OR) ran the table in the 138-player Consolation. Winning 8 of 9 (19 8/9 +146) in the qualifying round, she continued on to nail down the win in the playoffs as well. John Furler (OR) is knocking on the door for his Grand Master, and a 2nd place finish netted 84 MRP's. Dan Freeburg (OR) and Bruce Gentry (WA) finished 3-4.

With the largess of the Comfort Suites, and Hatcher's expertise and great paybacks, another record crowd was on hand for this event.

The cards were hot as some six 28-hands were scored...and Bob Price scored a very rare 29-hand in doubles play.

But for Life Master Jim Hornbacher (WA), the cards were like ice, as he scored a rock-bottom 12 GP card (winning 6 of 22). He had an oriental dinner after play, and his fortune cookie read: "Try something new!"

And something new was Master Beverlee Honeycutt's Consolation qualifying score. In an ACC first, she qualified by winning 4 of 9 games (all four wins were skunks).

NEVADA CRIBBAGE

Gilkeson in Reno Loch in Las Vegas

Nevada is fast becoming the cribbage capital of the ACC, as two events have been hosted recently in Las Vegas, in addition to the two semi-annual tournaments played in Winnemucca to complement the three majors played at the Sands in Reno. In mid-November the annual Veteran's Day Classic in Reno was followed a week later by the inaugural Las Vegas Open. Both events drew sizeable crowds.

Reno, November 8-10: The Annual Veteran's Day Classic, once again, drew a huge crowd with some 282 peggers in action. Bryant Gilkeson, pegging on his home turf, sizzled to the championship and brought home a whopping 252 MRP's. This huge win will propel Gilkeson among the nation's MRP leaders in the early going this cribbage year. Sue Edwards, pegging out of Denver, finished 2nd, and earned 196 MRP's. Two California peggers finished 3rd and 4th...Aljean Simpson and Boyd Horne.

Canadian Doris Sanders (Edmonton) was smoking in the qualifying round, posting a nifty 38 19/22 +158. This score is unusual as no skunks were scored (two skunks each way is average).

190 peggers played the Consolation and Alaskan John Dolloff came home the champ. With the new MRP system for Consolations, Dolloff carted home 112 MRP's for the win. He nipped Edgar Hanson (CA) in the title match. Hanson took home 84 MRP's for 2nd. Master Darrell Hunstad (CA) and Dean Bauman (OR) finished 3-4 (and 60 MRP's each). Wes Summers (CA) won 8 of 10 to cop qualifying honors.

A highlight of the meet saw Beverly DeWitt, Red Bluff, CA, score the ACC's 5th 29-hand this cribbage season...and she picked the right event to do the trick. This 29 paid a cool \$1,000 from the Sands, plus another \$100 from the ACC.

And, as usual, the Sands rolled out the red carpet for the players and the veterans benefitted from the entry fees. Bill and Dorthalee Irons, with help from a hard-working staff, continue to pack 'em in at Reno's twice-a-year veteran's benefit.

Las Vegas, November 15-17:

The Castaways Casino and Hotel played their inaugural event, hosting 112 players from throughout the USA. Master Bob Loch, pegging out of Henderson, NV came home the winner and pocketed a nifty \$1,400 (and 146 MRP's). One-Star Wayne Steinmetz (WI) came close and settled for 2nd (\$1,000). Steinmetz had an event to remember as he also picked up the Super Q. Kurt Bloeser (AZ) finished 3rd (and qualified tops...37 17/22 +287) to bring home 125 MRP's (aggregate). Local Pat Hendsch finished 4th.

John Bourgon is tough on his home turf as he nailed the 85-player Consolation, nipping Norm Nikodym (CA) for the win. One-Star Duane Toll (WI) and Les Sumner (NV) finished 3-4. Lowaine Pruett (OR) may well have earned her Master rating by taking qualifying honors (16 8/9 +27).

With 142 peggers in action, Wasielewski picked up a whopping 196 playoff points, \$1,200, and bragging rights galore. Grand Master Don Tofte (WI) also scored a bundle of MRP's with his 2nd place finish (147) and \$800. Paul Kilkelly (IL) and Everett Gier (MI) nailed down 3-4 (and 105 MRP's each).

Master Doug Henderson (WI) topped the Q with a nice 36 17/22 +210...and a 50 MRP take.

A sizeable Consolation (85 players) saw Daryl Halopka (WI) come away the winner, nipping Life Master Todd Schaefer (MN) in the final playoff match. Master Jim Huser (WI) and Tom Koncan (IL) finished 3-4. Huser was also the top qualifier with a 16 8/9 +90.

26th Annual Chrabaszcz Tops Dante Club

Life Master Emil Chrabaszcz, Ware, MA, is at it again. This time around he nailed down the win at the 26th Annual Dante Club Open, besting some 116 peggers and taking home yet another 147 MRP's to add to his lofty lifetime total of well over 7,500!

Life Master Frank Corrado (CT) is no stranger to the winner's circle, and he took home 2nd...and 105 MRP's. Life Master Charlie Rapoza (MA) and Richard Andrew (NH) finished in the 3-4 slot, and garnered 70 MRP's.

Director Tom Fiorini scored a whopping 12 for 12 grand slam (24 12/12 +174) in the qualifying round and just knew he would be the top qualifier. Wrong! Along came Mike Misluk (CT) with a 25 11/12 +211 card! Fiorini earned 55 MRP's and Misluk took home 60.

One-Star Phyllis Schmidt (MA) won 7 of 8 (16 7/8 +127) in the 58-player Consolation qualifying round to take honors, but it was Walter Brideaux coming home the winner in the playoffs. Master Bob Cunningham (MA) finished 2nd, followed by Life Master Phil Martin (CT) and Roger Bouchard (CT) in 3-4.
