The 7th Annual Eau Claire Classic drew 128 players and directors Alan Lindner and Vickie Long furnished 80 pounds of cheese, with sausages and crackers (compliments of Grassland Dairy, Greenwood, WI), in addition to a full array of breads and pastries.

But the feast did not slow down Ginny Danielski, a Grand Master from Little Chute, WI. She came home the winner in a spirited final match with Life Master Al Schaefer (WI)...and picked up her first Main Event win in 12 years! Coloradans Roger Wilson (Life Master) and Bill Hutchinson finished 3-4 and took home 70 MRP's each. Todd Schaefer (MN), a newly crowned Life Master, sizzled to a nifty 37 17/22 +253 in the qualifying round to take honors (and another 55 MRP's).

With 88 peggers in action in the Consolation, it was Dan Taylor (MN) taking home the bacon (and a trophy clock). Dan Pluff (MN) finished 2nd, followed by Life Master Deb Kvien (IL) and Bob Brown (WI) in the 3-4 bracket. Albert Podevils (WI) won 8 of 9 to take qualifying honors (17 8/9+130).

Laurie Owens Cops October Extra

Laurie Owens, pegging out of Bowdoin, ME, bested a sizeable feld of 98 peggers at the October Extra, played in West Springfield, MA. Her final match was vs. Master Tom Clark (NH), and she came homethe winner, taking some 147 MRP's, the top prize...and bragging rights. Clark took home 105 MRP's for the 2nd place finish.

Grand Master John Rooney (MA) and David Statz (NH) finished in the 3-4 bracket. Rooney also took qualifying honors with a nice 27 11/12 +284 and scored an aggregate 135 MRP's for his great run.

Life Master George Bickford, the ACC's National Tournament Commissioner, copped the 54-player Consolation, adding some 45 MRP's to his lofty lifetime total (7,400+). Nelson Bakken (CT) took 2nd (30 MRP's), with Harry Camyre (MA) and Grand Master Peter Setian (MA) in the 3-4 slot. Bakken won 6 of 8 (with three skunks) to take qualifying honors (15 6/8 +114).

Director Phyllis Schmidt reported two 28-hands...George Webb (MA) and Joan Fletcher (CT). Fletcher also donated 2 sets of pegs and acribbage board (winners: Sharlene Medeiros, Paula Bergeron, and Ford Jewer). Malcolm Enos also donated a set of pegs (won by Joe Beauregard).

Worthless 28-Hand Clarified

In December's Cribbage World, an article stated that Milt Goodman held a "worthless" 28-hand, since his opponent was in hole 120 with first count.

Henry Bergeron (NH) writes that he is confused, as well as others, since the ACC awards a 28-hand a certificate, and a 29-hand \$100. These awards are for sanctioned-event hands, and the players are given the award even if the hand is not counted during play, as in this case.

However, Cribbage World did not indicate Goodman's 28-hand was in a non-sanctioned satellite event, therefore, it was, indeed, worthless. Well almost worthless...there is some joy in looking at that gem and drooling a bit before throwing it into the deck (in disgust).

He arrived a day early (Thursday) at the Chinook Winds Casino, and he had a preview of things to come. He came away with a whopping \$16,000...and settled into play a little cribbage. And play he did! He won the Main Event, and the Super "Q" to boot. He was beaming earto-ear the entire weekend. With 194 players in the field, Miotke came away with 196 MRP's (and additional qualifying points), and bragging rights galore. In his glorious run, he also scored a 28-hand (Main) and won four prizes in the raffle!

Master John Furler (OR) also had a weekend to remember. He qualified tops (38 18/22 +218) and came home 2nd in the playoffs, netting a nifty 207 MRP's. Hazel Weichseldorfer (WA) has paid her dues, and she came home 3rd in this large field (and 105 MRP's). Master Dave Gilkenson (OR) took home 4th.

A huge field of 136 peggers played the Consolation, and Doug Jansen (OR) zipped to the win, edging Master Dot Mickow (WA) in the final playoff match. Grand Master Bernie Nelson (OR) and Life Master Jim Hornbacher (WA) finshed 3-4. Hornbacher's cards come alive in Consolation events lately.

Tournament of Champions, JPW/ACC Open On Record Pace

Jim Rein (MN) reports that the upcoming Tournament of Champions, an event by invite only, is taking entries at a record pace, and it appears this year will be a record-setting event. Last year, Dale Kochenburg, San Jose, CA, took the grand prize...\$7,900!

The deadline for entry is January 11. This issue may arrive too late to inform those procrastinators. But for the rest of the nation's elite peggers...see you in Reno!

And the following JPW/ACC Open will also have a huge field participating. Last year, the event hosted a whopping 1,014 players, with Virgil Dulin, Fayetteville, NC coming home the winner...and carting home \$10,000! This event follows on the heels of the Tournament of Champions, with the opening bell slated for 8:30 AM on Saturday (Jan. 26). Don't be late! The deadline for entry is January 18!

The entire gala weekend kicks off with the All-Star game on Thursday night (6:30 PM, Jan. 24). This heated match is always a close one, pitting the top eight players from each region vs. the other two regions (a 16-game match). This will be the 12th Annual All-Star Game. The Eastern and Central Regions have won four matches, while the Western Region has won three. Last year the Central squad won the tightest match of all, winning with a 68-60 score. Life Master Bill Medeiros captains the Eastern Squad, with Life Master Wayne Steinmetz leading the Central team. Record-setting Life Master Jim Langley will captain the Western squad in what appears to be a toss-up event.

The semi-annual Board of Directors meeting takes place on Thursday morning, and members of the ACC are welcomed to attend. This meeting will be the inaugural meeting of the new BOD, as the initial scheduled meeting at Grand National XX in Richmond was cancelled due to the turmoil caused by the September 11 terrorist attack.

With 122 players in the field, McDonald copped 147 MRP's for winning, and Brown took home 105 for 2nd. Laurie Owen (ME) and Master Louis Petosa (CT) each garnered 70 MRP's for a 3-4 finish. Newly-crowned Master Jim Cundy (RI) scored a great 24 GP card in the 12-game qualifying round and took home 50 MRP's for the effort.

Board of Director member Dwight Christiansen picked up a win in the 64-player Consolation to add to his 5,700+ lifetime MRP's, edging Brian McCoy (MA) for the title. Jean Gates (NH) and Bob Boulris (MA) finished 3-4. Stan Plachowicz (MA) scored an 8/8 18 GP grand slam in the qualifying round.

Director Sharlene Medeiros reported an early bird doubles match was played on Saturday, with One-Star Phyllis Schmidt teaming with "Izzy" to take the win. She also reported that Life Master George Webb scored the meet's only 28-hand. Medeiros had the Christmas spirit, as she gave every player a holiday bag with ornaments and candy cane. and a 24-hand table was well-stocked with 50 gifts.

Robert Van Gorder Yankee Classic Winner

Robert Van Gorder, Bristol, CT, came to play at the 114-player Yankee Classic, played at Tolland, CT on November 18. He nailed the win, picking up 147 MRP's, the top prize, and bragging rights. His last match pitted him vs. the formidable Grand Master Dick West (MA) and he prevailed for the win. West added yet another 105 MRP's to his lofty lifetime total (5,000+). Don Graveline (MA) and Master Lou Petosa (CT) finished 3-4 (and 70 MRP's). Robert Fitzgerald (CT) scored a 21 10 +158 card to take qualifying honors.

Some 56 players stayed for the Consolation and it was Master Pat Frattallone (CT) coming home the winer. Denis Lunn (CT) took 2nd, followed by Larry Harmon (CT) and Master Joan Morrison (MA) in the 3-4 slot. Michael Jones scored a 15 7 +77 card to take the top spot in the qualifying round.

Director Phil Martin reported two 28-hands...Pat Frattallone and Dennis Caprigno.

Al Miller Has Suggestions

Al Miller, the ACC's Testing Examiner submits four suggestions for improving tournament play.

- 1-All tournament directors should become certified as judges. In many events, the finalists and the tournament director are among the few remaining in the playing hall, and if a judging call is made, there may not be a certified judge present.
- 2-The ACC should have a working agreement with a card manufacturer or dealer. And this agreement should be publicized so that all tournament directors can easily purchase new cards.
- 3-A listing of indivduals who have cribbage boards for loan (no charge), for those events who are short of boards.
- 4-Playoff charts that may, or may not be re-used should be available for directors of events.

Al, I feel that all of your suggestions are well worth the effort to implement. The cribbage "grapevine" works wonders in locating cribbage boards, but a list available from Tournament Commissioners might be helpful. As for playoff charts, the Western Region has "blueprint" quality charts available from Paul Hatcher. The ACC should look into mass-producing these with easy access for all directors. Hopefully, we will discuss these suggestions at the upcoming BOD meeting.


Championship.

First, the Game Points (45) edged previous record-holder Jeanne Hofbauer's (WA) score of 44 20/22 +317, and he also topped James Langley's +400 set last year in Winnemucca, NV. This is the top score ever recorded in a 22-game qualifying round in the ACC's 21-year history.

And to complete this entire display, his wall is adorned with various bumper stickers, posters, awards, and he even has a "Cribbage Lane" street







Fantastic Pinish


Russell Adams (MN) reports a fantastic finish to the Jesse James Consolation event in Northfield, MN on November 18.

Waite was 22 points from game. She very nearly conceded the match, but she held the 5-10-J-Q of hearts, so she played on.

To make a long story short, Hirschman held 4-6-6-Q. A king of hearts was cut giving Waite an 18-hand, and Hirschman still held his two points. The pegging: 6-16-26-31 (2 for Waite); 6-16-20-30 (one for Waite). Hirschman pegs his two and is in the stink hole. Waite pegged 3, scored her 18 and flopped a blank crib! Both players are now in the stink hole. Next deal, Waite pegs with a 2 lead, Hirschman plays an 8 for "10"...and Waite lead, Hirschman plays an 8 for "10"...and Waite pilys a 5 for "15" and game!
