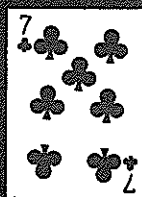

Jeanne Hofbauer Tops Oregon Coast Classic

Life Master Jeanne Hofbauer, the Washougal (WA) Queen of Cribbage, has done it again! For the sixth time she has won a Main Event tourney...and this time around it was a whopper. The 226-player Oregon Coast Classic awarded Hofbauer another 196 MRP's to add to her lofty 7,600+ (lifetime) tally...and a shot at earning a spot on the Western Region's All-Star team to boot. Her last match was a tough one, as Master Laurie Logan (AZ) and spouse Ron were both hot. Hofbauer's cards prevailed for the win, however. Logan took home some 147 MRP's and a sizeable 2nd place check. Master Ron Logan (AZ) took home 3rd, followed by Grand Master Bill Wakeman (CA) in 4th. Kent LaRue (CA) nailed the Q-Pool with a nice 38 17/22 +257.

144 peggers stayed for the Consolation and it was Mike O'Malley (OR) nailing Three-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT) 2-0 for the title. Master Lynn Gillespie (WA) and Master Ross Njaa (CA) finished 3-4. Cy Madrone (CA) earned his Master by zipping to a 20 9/9 +149 qualifying round score.

Game 13 in the Main Event was a lucky one for Debbie Goucher (CA). Would you believe she scored the ACC's 13th sanctioned 29-hand this season...in game 13!

Directors Jeanne and Roy Hofbauer, Rollie Heath, and Bernie Nelson had all events on time and well managed and fielded a full array of satellite events.

Julian Cops June St. Croix Takes MRP Lead

One-Star Bob Julian (WI) made a giant stride in his quest for a 4th National Championship by winning the huge St. Croix Classic in Turtle Lake, WI on June 9. With some 200 players in the event, Julian carted home yet another 221 MRP's (aggregate) to run this year's MRP total to well over 1,600 and a commanding lead over his nearest competitors. His final match pitted him vs. first-time qualifier Ben Witz (WI), and his cards remained hot for a 3-0 win. This is Julian's 2nd win at Turtle Lake (Aug. 1998) and becomes the first two-time winner of this event. Witz garnered 147 MRP's for his fine showing. One-Star Joe Bernard (IL) and Life Master Roger Wilson (CO) nailed down 3-4. Bob Joslin (MN) carded a nifty 38 17/22 +264 to take qualifying honors.

Life Master "Moose" Biegler (WI) scored a Grand Slam 19 9/9 +179 to take tops in the Consolation qualifying round (and a \$100 bonus from the St. Croix Casino), but it was Sharon Pederson (MN) taking the playoff action. Grand Master Bill Sperry (MN) nailed 2nd, followed by Ruth Zimmerman (WI) and Myron Schmidt (MN) in the 3-4 slot.

In an oddity, Mark Wenzel's Saturday night Grand Slam edged Emil Lubinski's Grand Slam by a single spread point (+158 to +157!). In another strange twist, Betty Angier's 29-hand occurred in the very first game on Friday night. Jeanne Wauters lost her first Friday game by 44, then won 8 in a row to cop the \$550 first place prize. Grand Master Jim Ready (MA) placed 3-4 in the April Classic, and came back for a 2nd try. This time around he finished in the 9-16 bracket. One-Star Joe Bernard (IL) had only 10 GP's at the lunch break, but roared home with 21 GP's after lunch to qualify with 31 GP's...and zipped to the 3-4 slot in the playoffs as well.

Lindner reported the St. Croix Casino added a whopping \$10,000 to the prize fund (a record). If you want to play in the August event, you must sign up early.

Bob Julian Wins Three In Row!

Nugget Classic (CA), St. Croix Classic (WI), and Jim Arblaster Open (FL)

On page three, this issue, describes the St. Croix Classic win that vaulted One-Star Bob Julian (WI) to the National MRP lead for this cribbage year. Last year's MRP race was won by Life Master Jim Langley (CA), and he attained honors in record-setting fashion by winning three large events in a row in early spring 2001. That feat seemed unlikely to ever happen again, but Julian has duplicated Langley's three-in-a-row feat by winning the Nuggett Classic (Paradise, CA), the St. Croix Classic (Turtle lake, WI), and the Jim Arblaster Open (Altamonte Springs, FL). A winner on June 2, June 9, and June 16! This astounding run netted Julian 600 MRP's, and stretches his MRP lead to well over 500 over his nearest competitors (Steinmetz and Colvert), and has put this year's championship virtually in his bag.

Nugget Classic: Julian nipped Les Kovach (CA) for the win in this 88-player event. And this followed his top qualifying round score (35 17/22 +135), netting 192 MRP's to begin his run. Bryant Gilkeson (NV) and Tom Lewis (NM) finished 3-4.

Mike McCammon (NV) won the 46-player Consolation, edging Master Cres Fernandez (CA) in the final playoff match. Master "Ratso" Roderick (CA) and Gordon Brown (CA) finished 3-4. Jim McKnight (CA) won 8 of 9 to take qualifying honors.

Holder had an unusual week...he scored three 28-hands, one of which vaulted him into the Friday's winner's circle. Director Jerry Moore handed Julian the first of his three consecutive "nuggets" and directed a first-class event.

Jim Arblaster Open: In an astounding run, Julian completed a three week run by winning the 92-player Jim Arblaster Open on June 16. The field in this event's playoffs were all outstanding players, and Julian's ride to the top took him through Grand Master Sharlene Medeiros (MA), One-Star Harry Palmer (MA), One-Star Duane Toll (WI), and Life Master Doug Page. Paul Howard (FL) topped the field in the qualifying round to take honors (and 76 MRP's, aggregate).

In the 64-player Consolation, Howard Terry (VA) qualified 4th and took the playoff action to net 75 MRP's in a fine run. Jack Broderick (FL), Renay Corren (FL), and Gina Daesch (FL) took home 2-3-4. Sue Brokowski (FL) qualified tops (grand slam) and netted 33 MRP's for the weekend.

Bill Medeiros Earns One-Star Rob Medeiros Wins June Jamboree

First it was Bill Medeiros, Shrewsbury, MA, zipping to 10,000 MRP's...and the ACC's 15th One-Star rating. Next it was Rob Medeiros, Dorchester, MA, zipping to the win in this 50-player June Jamboree event (W. Springfield, MA). These two players are not related, but their names keep appearing at the top of the cribbage ledger. Master Bruce Brown (MA) finished 2nd, followed by high-qualifier Bob Milk (VA), and Tony Mascolo (CT) in the 3-4 slot.

A small, but expert, crowd played the Consolation. Shawn Jordan (MA) won this 19-

player event, followed by Mike Misluk (CT). One Star Phyllis Schmidt (MA) and One-Star Bill Medeiros (MA) in the 3-4 slot.. Medeiros was also the event's top qualifier.

A highlight of this event saw David Clemmey (MA) score the ACC's 14th 29-hand this cribbage year...and a nice bonus of \$100 from the ACC. Jim McDonald (MA) scored the meet's only 28-hand. Brenda Palmer hosted this event, and will be in the co-director's chair once again for the West Side Summer Sizzler, played July 20-21 in West Springfield, MA.

Steinmetz Takes Potawatomi Earns One-Star

The streaking Wayne Steinmetz, pegging out of Milwaukee, won the 100-pegger Potawatomi Peggers Pow Wow in Stevensville, MI on May 19. Steinmetz is in the hunt for this year's National Championship and the 147+ MRP's from this event keeps his hat on the ring. And he also reached the 10,000 MRP (lifetime) plateau to earn the ACC's 14th One-Star. Gerald Butts (MI) came close, but could not match Steinmetz's run, taking home 2nd...and 105 MRP's. Life Master Don Flesch (WI) and Ev Gier (MI) finished 3-4. Richard DePouw (MI) scored a nifty 27 16/22 +254 to garner the Q-Pool action.

Another DePouw (Steve) won the 64-player Consolation, with Master Jim Blough (MI) finishing 2nd. Marge Schoolland (MI) and John Dawes (IN) finished 3-4. Life Master Al Schaefer won 8 of 9 to take qualifying honors.

With a sizeable 92 palyers on hand, it was Walt Brideaux, pegging out of Newington, CT coming away the winner. His final playoff match pitted him vs. the formidable One-Star Harry Palmer (MA), and his cards remained hot for the win. Palmer, in the hunt for National Top-Ten honors garnered yet another 105 MRP's and zips to the 1,000 mark for this cribbage year. Master Ann Somers (MA) and Bob King (CT) nailed down 3-4. Harvey Glass (CT) won 9 of 12 to take qualifying honors (19 9/12 +94).

With 46 peggers in action in the Consolation, it was Carl Deyette (CT) nipping Grand Master Joan Morrison (MA) in the final playoff match. John Campanella (MA) and Mike Misluk (CT) finished 3-4. Morrison was also the event's top qualifier, posting a 167 +111.

Director Bill Richmond reported nary a 28 or 29-hand showed.

Rob Medeiros Cops Villager

Grand Master Rob Medeiros (MA) is at it again. This time around he nailed the 88-player Villager Open in Sturbridge, MA on June 9. Ex-Grand National king Louis Caccia (MA) finished 2nd, followed by Master Bob Cunningham (MA) and Life Master Al Miller (NH) in the 3-4 slot. Miller has earned well over 9,000 MRP's in his career and moves into the 20th spot, lifetime in ACC action.

David Statz (NH) zipped to a stellar 35 GP card (22 games) to take qualifying honors.

With 44 in the action in the Consolation, perennial winner Life Master Dwight Christensen (MA) came home the winner. The final playoff match pitted him vs. the hot-running Jim McDonald, a Master pegger from Monson, MA. McDonald won the Early Bird event, topped the field in the Consolation qualifying round, finishing 2nd in the playoffs as well. Life Master Phil Martin (CT) and Jane Cannizzaro (NY) took home 3-4.

Director Jerry Bernier reported that Bruce Page and Brian McDonald scored that elusive 28-hand, but no 29's showed. He also reported that Bruce Brown and Bob Turcotte teamed to win the Saturday doubles action.

Newly-wed Dan Freeburg (OR) and Life Master Roger Wilson (CO) were hot on the recent Alaskan Cruise and paid for their sojourn by winning big-time!

First, it was Freeburg nailing the Alaskan Cruise Championship by winning the 44-player Main Event. He nipped Wilson in the final playoff match, but from that point on, Wilson was unstoppable, finishing high or winning match after match.

Ruth Fraker (CA) and Master Sharon Hejtmanek (MT) finished 3-4. Master Roberta Nelson had the hot hand in the qualifying round, scoring a 25 GP card (14 games), picking up 45 MRP's for the fine effort. Dan and Robin Freeburg copped 2nd and 3rd in the Q, and helped with their honeymoon expenses.

The Consolation saw 40 peggers in action, and it was Wilson winning the event, and scored an aggregate 199 MRP's on the cruise, including a 4th place finish in Juneau's "Our Turn" Special. I would think, in order to support your statistical conclusion, you would also need to keep track of how many times each individual won the cut in a 22 game match to determine just how many times a pegger DID or DID NOT win first deal, and the consequent unfairness thereof, as you state, and I'd believe over the course of many tournaments, out of 1,000 games, I would probably win the cut 500 times, +/- 5 or 10 times, and that would probably become the opposite during the next 1,000 games.

Please don't take steps such as this to take ALL the luck out of our game. The LUCK we may or may not have for that weekend is one of the fascinating elements to the game.

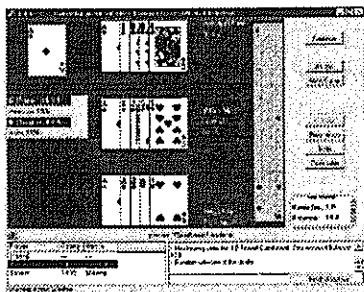

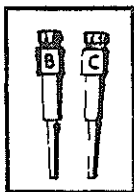
Unbelievable Start

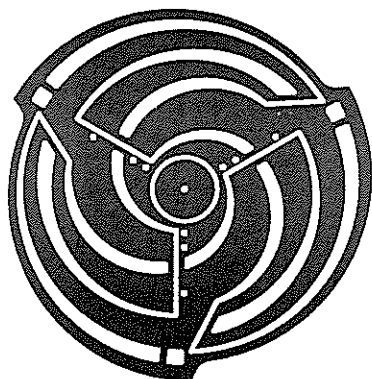

Grass Roots Update

The Grass Roots Program is alive and well. I know you have not heard much from the GR in the last year or two. But we are busy getting things back in order. It has taken some time and we have come across some interesting things.

We have added new clubs during the year. Some have become active while others are still working on getting going. And, yes, we have lost some as well. But we are still growing.

Some of the biggest issues I see are: **Grass Roots members without ACC memberships.** Because the Grass Roots is the hometown component of the ACC, they must be members of the American Cribbage Congress before they can join the Grass Roots. **Guests playing more than twice without becoming members of the GR:** they are allowed to play only twice as guests. And they must be GR members if playing in the National or Regional GR Tournaments. This also applies to current members of the ACC who are not members of the Grass Roots. **ACC memberships expiring during the GR year:** if a player's ACC membership has expired during the year his points will not count in the calculation of his GR points. He may find himself as a guest and if this situation is not promptly corrected can create problems throughout his club(s). Members who thought they got points can actually lose them. As with the ACC, the GR will allow a short period of time for renewal in all fairness, but when that time is up they will no longer be members.

The last two years has been difficult for the Statistician and Directors to recognize those who have been delinquent. This is changing. They will be able to see before they become delinquent in the future.

Over the summer we will be cleaning up the clubs, removing players who have not played this year or have only played once or twice, guests and visitors. This has to be done during the off-season. Players must remain in the system if they played and others were awarded points. We will also be making some functionality changes to the program that should make input a little easier.

I want to thank all the Statisticians, Club Directors, Commissioners, and especially Kristy Haight, National Statistician, for all their hard work this year and last. Without you, we never would have made it.

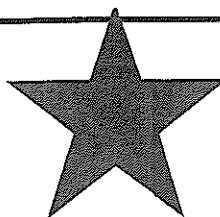

Alternating Deals - Much to do about nothing!

There is a lot more involved to winning the game than getting the first deal. What are the percent of the games were won based upon; 1) getting the first deal with no other factors involved (average hands); 2) the player got "good" cards and/or the cuts (above average hands); 3) their opponent got poor cards (below average hands), 4) did both players get above average hands, 5) did both players get below average hands, and 6) was there a difference in the skill levels of the players that affected the outcome of the game? None of these factors have been considered in any of the "studies" quoted by those proposing a rule to require alternating deals.

The odds of winning the cut are 50%. As listed in the April issue of the CW, the player dealing first wins 56.4% of the games, the non-dealer wins 43.6%, and 6.5% of the games resulted in a skunk. Please note: Something (luck?) causes the non-dealer to win 340% MORE than the advantage of having the first deal.

The above numbers were used to generate information for 100,000, separate 22-game qualifying rounds (2,200,000 games) and cutting for the deal has a zero affect on the number of games won, 94.8% of the time. 2.6% of the time, alternating deals gave an advantage and 2.6% of the time; cutting for deal gave an advantage.

Fairness is a nebulous term with fair being defined in the "eyes of the beholder". Some think alternating deals is fair, others think the cut for the deal is fair. I do not believe one version of fair is any fairer than the other version of fair.

The system is not "broken". Leave it up to the tournament director (as we do now) to use which method to use for determining who deals first. Support the tournaments that play the format you like, if none are around, start one.

For those that complain about the losing the deal, please remember, based upon the "odds" (ignoring the skill level), if you lost every cut for deal in a 22 game qualifying round, you still should win 10 games with one skunk for 21 games points. If you have less than 21 points, face it, you had bad cards. Conversely, if you win every cut for deal, you will win 12 games (one a skunk) and have 25 games points. If you have more than 25 game points, the force was with you.

Bottom line: No matter how you cut it, to qualify, you have to beat the odds.

Rules Are Rules

At a recent tournament a player failed to make sure his opponent had written the correct score and signed the card. He had won a skunk by 36, but the card his opponent had signed was a loss by 30. Cross-checking revealed the error, and he was dinged down to a 30-point win, thereby losing his 3-GP skunk. There were witnesses to the fact that he had won by a skunk, but the chief judge, nevertheless, ruled a 30-point 2 GP win. Rules are rules. Check your card!

Alternate Deals

There are many arguments against cutting for deal. They range from the theoretical to the practical.

The mathematical arguments distinguish between the short run - one or a fixed series of cuts, and the long run - a mathematical ideal of an infinite series of cuts.

1. The process of cutting for deal always provides exactly a 50% chance of winning only if both players have available to them exactly the same cards. This can only happen if the deck is entirely reshuffled after Player X cuts or if the top and bottom 4 cards are temporarily set aside and the remaining cards reshuffled and the top and bottom cards interchangeably restored to their positions before Player Y cuts. The expediency of not reshuffling is unfair as Player Y has a reduced deck from which to cut. Depending on the composition of the remaining cards, Player Y MAY have less than, greater than, or exactly a 50% chance of winning the cut. The process is fair in the long run but not in the short run.

2. Assuming a 50% chance for a single cut, in a series of 8, 12, or 20 games the chances that Player X will win 50% of all cuts is 70/256 (27%), 792/4096 (19%), and 46189/1048576 (4%). The longer the series of cuts treated as a unit, the less likely it is that Player X will win exactly 50% of all the cuts.

3. The chances may not be exactly 50% of winning a cut with a used deck. In the past 6 months, in two different ACC regions, I personally encountered a marked deck and a reconstituted "euchre" deck. In both cases, the decks were replaced. There always will be a lingering doubt in my mind as to the fairness of cutting a used deck.

4. If Players X and Y win their playoff matches, they are forbidden from using the same deck when cutting and playing in the next round. "Mechanics" or "card sharks" are a fact of life in any card-game organization. Given the importance of winning the cut, I would not want my opponent to wonder if I possessed cutting skills. The human factor should be removed from determining first dealer.

Let us adopt a process whereby each player is guaranteed of being first dealer exactly 50% of the time. I see nothing exciting about losing all 8 cuts in a series of 8 games.

The numbers cannot be recorded until they are received from the tournament directors.

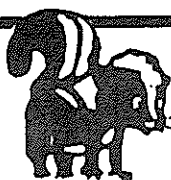
Cribbage World begs our tournament directors to make a big effort to report their events promptly...then our reporting will be far more timely. This is especially important as our cribbage year winds down July 31.

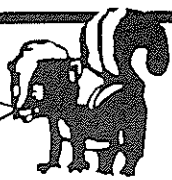

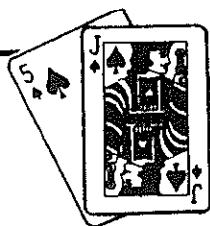
