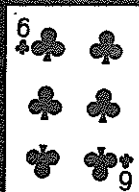

McNurlen, Kooistra Nail St. Croix Classic

The 21st St. Croix Classic was a sellout once again as some 220 peggers shoe-horned into the St. Croix Casino's conference room for some serious pegging. With every 24-hand worth \$25, and other perks totaling to \$9,400 for the weekend's play, the sellout is no surprise to our nation's peggers. This time around it was Dennis McNurlen from Grinnell, Iowa nipping One-Star Scott Kooistra (MN) in the final playoff match for the championship and taking home the big enchilada, complete with 196 MRP's. Kooistra is well-known for his high finishes in huge events, and the 2nd place spot comes as no surprise. He runs his lifetime MRP total to over 11,000 with this high finish.

Dennis Ulberg (WI) and Grand Master Jim Ready (MA) had great runs, finishing 3-4, and bring home 105 MRP's each. In the qualifying round, Derald Feda (MN) scored a great 39 18/22 +221 to easily win honors.

With 136 players in action in the Consolation, it was Bonnie Halopka (WI) zipping to the win, edging Jim Weires (MN) in the final playoff match. Florian Sowinski (CA) and Grand Master Todd Schaefer (MN) finished 3-4. Schaefer continues his long run of high finishes at Turtle Lake.

One-Star Warren Sondericker was the star of the Consolation, as he scored the ACC's 12th 29-hand for this cribbage year, and combined with the casino's \$500 bonus, took home \$600 for this gem. To continue his run, he also scored a grand slam 20 9/9 +169, to earn yet another \$100 bonus.

Director Alan Lindner had the usual Friday and Saturday night games. The winners: Friday: David Gustafson 19 9/9 +128 (\$600) Saturday: Ken Szabla 19 9/9 +142 (\$650) Grand Slams: Gustafson, Szabla, John Charwell, Sondericker (\$100 each) 24's: 290 @ \$25 each 28's: Hogen, Fales, Pasiuk, Kufahl, Patrin (\$250 each) 29: Sondericker (\$500 + \$100 ACC)

Dick Ogden (IA) was playing his first St. Croix event ever and his first hand on Friday night was a 24...and a startling start (\$25)! Joan Rein (MN), at last count, had scored six 24-gems. Kooistra finally nailed a 24...after a drought of some 125 games.

Director Lindner urges players to sign up early for these classics, as they are selling out recently. The largess of the casino, plus other amenities, make these events very popular with America's peggers. The next Classic will be played June 7-9 in Turtle lake.

Hal Lamon Takes Mid-Columbia

Hal Lamon, Auburn WA, took home the championship in Montana last October, and scored yet another win at the Mid-Columbia Open in Hood River, OR in mid-April. This event sported a record 136 players and netted Lamon yet another 196 MRP's, vaulting him to the 700 mark for this cribbage year....and a shot at earning a spot on the Western Region's All-Star team. Master Diane Harvey (OR) came close, but settled for 2nd....and 147 MRP's. David Imholt (OR) and Keith Blackman (OR) took home 3-4.

Larry Hassett, the ACC's Membership Secretary, is nearing his Grand Master by scoring a superlative 40 18/22 +181 in the qualifying round. This score, one of the best this cribbage year, netted Hassett 70 MRP's.

A sizeable field of 92 players stayed for the Consolation and Master John Furler (OR) came home the winner, nipping Graeme Gossett (OR) in the final playoff match. George Stanton (WA) and Grand Master Bruce Wridge nailed down 3-4. Glenna Little (WA) won 8 of 9 with two skunks to take honors in the qualifying round.

Don and Marylin Hilton hosted a bevy of satellite events. The host American Legion provided tasty lunches and a reasonable bar, and combined with the Hilton's expertise, made for a very successful event, attested to by a record crowd. Hood River is on the Columbia River, and were enjoying a "Bloom Festival" as the apple orchards and other flora put on quite a blossom show.

Fred Bascom Wins 31st World Championship

Fred Bascom, Redding, CA, has been chasing the World Championship title for over a decade and his persistence paid off by winning the 31st edition of the World Championship, played in Quincy, CA in early May. Bascom's final playoff match pitted him vs. 1988 World Champ Jim Wilson, Chico, CA, and his cards remained hot for the win. Bascom pocketed \$1,200 for the win, and Wilson took home \$800. Neither player are ACC members.

Some 68 players stayed for the Consolation and it was Grand Master Heidi Glashan (CA) nipping One-Star Bob Julian (WI) for the win. Julian's 45 MRP's keep him near the top in the annual run for the roses.

Co-director Taborski reports that dwindling attendance has caused the Rotary Club to discontinue the long run of this event next year. After 31 years, the Quincy Fire Department will host this event in a new format. It will not be sanctioned by the ACC, and a portion of the entry fee will go for fire department equipment. This event has been the granddaddy of Western Region events, and had a long and colorful history. The American Cribbage Congress wishes the fire department well in their new format, and perhaps they will have their event sanctioned in the future.

Malloy Wins Colorado Winter Open

Randy Malloy from nearby Westminster won the 70-player Colorado Winter Open, played in early April in Denver. Troy Thorson, another Westminster player, took home 2nd, followed by Ken Muroya (CO) and Bob Barron (CO) in the 3-4 slot. Jim Brinthall (CO) posted a nice 35 16/22 +184 to take qualifying honors.

Veteran Bob Fletcher (CO) nailed the 42-player Consolation, edging Bob Diehl (CO) in the final playoff match. Sue Edwards (CO) and Louis Dupuis (CO) finished in the 3-4 bracket. Bill MacMillan from Cheyenne, WY had a 18 8/9 +131 to take the top Q prize in the qualifying round.

Director Roger Wilson hosted a Friday and Saturday night game. The winners: C. "Pink" Pinkerton (WY), Roger Wilson (CO). 28's: Don Christensen, Blanche Edwardson, Betty Davis (Fri.). In a novelty, both sanctioned 28-hands occurred within two minutes of each other.

Steinmetz Makes MRP Move Mick Michaelis Classic Draws 130

Life Master Wayne Steinmetz, Milwaukee, WI, is on the prowl for his first National Championship as this two-time All-American ran the table at the recent 130-player Mick Michaelis Classic in Marinette, WI. Not only did Steinmetz take qualifying honors (36 GP's, 22 games) but roared home the winner in the playoffs as well. This grand run netted 246MRP's, and vaults him among the leaders as this cribbage year hits the final stretch. His last victim was Dale Rohm (WI) in the final playoff match. Rohm carted home 147MRP's for a great tournament. Master Max Steplyk (IL) and Clyde Cornell (WI) took home 3 and 4...and 105 MRP's each.

With 80 peggers in the Consolation, It was Grand Master Joe Aird (MI) taking home the bacon (and 63 MRP's). Lee Tesch (WI) took home 2nd, followed by One-Star Warren Sondericker (WI) and Cyril Schmidt (WI) in the 3-4 slot. Tesch was also the top qualifier (15 GP's, 9 games).

Harry Palmer Wins Huge Ocean State Classic

One-Star Harry Palmer has thrown his hat in the ring for the annual run for the National Championship by winning the huge Ocean State Classic on May 5. This event, played in Pawtucket, RI, drew a whopping 178 players, netting Palmer a bushel of MRP's (196), and runs his yearly tally to well over 900. Palmer has won four All-American team awards, and is on track for number five.

Paula Bergeron (NH) had a great tourney as she qualified first (21 10/12 +176) and very nearly won it all, taking second in the playoffs as well. This great run netted Bergeron 182 MRP's and she wings it over the 400 mark for this cribbage year. Brenda Rivet (RI) and John Campanella (MA) finished 3-4, and took home 105 MRP's each.

A large field played the Consolation (92) and it was newly-crowned Life Master Sharlene Medeiros (MA) showing the field how to play as she won going away! Jack Puleo (MA) finished 2nd, followed by Barbara Barbour (CT) and Charles Truett (MA) in the 3-4 slot. Elizabeth Kelly (RI) won 7 of 8 (one skunk) to take qualifying honors.

Director John Chambers reported the cards were hot, as four peggers scored 28-hands. They were: Vicki Soule, Shawn Jordan, Irene Charette, and Robert Tervo.

Chambers sports a modest entry fee and no Q-pool, and continues to draw large crowds to his events.

Record Host

Once again, Grand Master Bernie Nelson and spouse Sophie opened their beach home to travelling peggers at the recent Oregon Coast Classic in Lincoln City, OR.

They were hosts to some eleven peggers...and they chose them wisely. The top three finishers were house guests...Jeanne Hofbauer, Laurie Logan, and Ron Logan (with 226 players in the field). It was the home cooking and the salt air that carried the day for these three peggers!

The July issue of *Cribbage World* will feature this event.

Campbell Cops Vetterline Memorial

Dave Campbell, pegging out of Parsonfields, ME, came to play at the 104-pegger Ken Vetterline Memorial in Westbrook, ME on April 28. He nailed down the win, and took home 147 MRP's...and bragging rights. Life Master Sharlene Medeiros (MA) took 2nd, and vaults among the Eastern Region's leaders with the 105 MRP's earned for this high finish. Master Mike Azevedo (MA) and Jim Martin (MA) finished 3-4 (and 70 MRP's each). Master Ann Somers (MA) won 10 of 12 (23 10/12 +151) with three skunks to easily take qualifying honors.

48 players stayed for the Consolation and it was Malcolm Enos (NJ) taking home the top spot, followed by Grand Master Zeke Veradt (MA), Bob Turcotte (MA) and Varney Charron (ME) in 2-3-4. Turcotte also took qualifying honors (18 8 +115).

Directors Susan and Dennis Cousens reported Bill Medeiros and Dennis Caprigno won the doubles event and that Lorraine Brown, Sharlene Medeiros, and B. J. Thuotte scored that elusive 28-hand. No 29's showed. Last year's champ, Louis Manter (ME) had his cards go "south" this year, and posted the low card of the meet. Cribbage fever, catch it...you never know what to expect!.

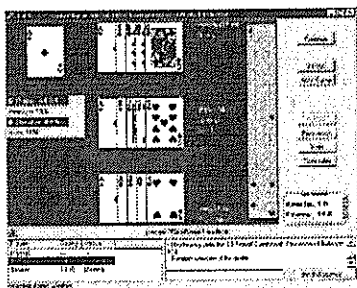

The Grass Roots program had a busy year. In addition to the 21 29-hands listed, some 131 players recorded Grand Slams (9/9). The odds of a 29 are 216,580 to 1. The odds of a Grand Slam? 512-1, skill levels being equal. 28-hands? A whopping 301 were recorded in Grass Roots play. At 15,028 to 1 odds, a quick check of mathematics indicates Grass Rooters played about 4,523,428 hands of cribbage this past season. That is one huge number of games being played by America's peggers in the ACC's Grass Roots program.

Royal Ann?

Roy Kaufmann (CA) writes *Cribbage World* and would like to know what a "Royal Ann" is. CW will go out on a limb and call a 1-6-7-8 flush hand, with an ace cut, for a 17-point hand.

A "Raggedy Ann" is a normal 1-1-6-7-8 13-point-hand (any of the 5 cards cut will do the trick). A "Raggedy Andy" is a 2-2-6-7-8 for a 11-point hand (any of the 5 cards cut).

Trick Play?

When the dealer deals himself seven cards and the mistake is not discovered until after the pegging is completed, I feel that the dealer's hand and crib should both be excluded from the count. This, I think, should discourage enterprising souls from giving themselves a better hand with seven cards than with six. If you deal yourself a 12 or 10 hand with possibilities, why not throw three cards in your own crib. This happened to me in a tournament. I have no way of knowing or proving larcenous intent, but some sort of penalty would keep the contestants on the straight and narrow.

Peter, the rule as pertains to a dealer having the correct number of cards, with too many (5 or more) in the crib after the starter card is turned is as follows:

Section 4 (d) (2) Play stops at time of discovery and any points pegged during play are retracted. Hands or crib with the correct number of cards are counted in the proper order. Hands or crib with the incorrect number of cards are dead.

This means the dealer, if this is done on purpose, forfeits the points pegged (average dealer's pegging is 3.8) and forfeits his crib (4.8 average) for an average loss of 8.6 points. Losing 8.6 points by dealing yourself seven cards and hoping for a large hand is probably a losing proposition. However, I can see the possibility of wanting to kill the pone's pegging by this devious method (deep on 4th street). This scenario certainly deserves the attention of our Rules Committee. To thwart this from happening, keep a sharp eye on your opponents crib, and if in doubt, physically spread out the crib hand and count the number of cards discarded before cutting the starter card. If too many are there, the dealer re-deals with no penalty. Ed.
