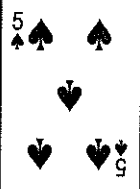
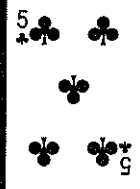

Stone Tops In Winnemucca

The cribbage grapevine works quite well, thank you, as some 184 peggers descended on the small north-central Nevada gambling town of Winnemucca on April 5-7. The Winnemucca Classics, sponsored by the Winner's Casino, sports a great playing hall, reasonable rooms, pastries galore, and great paybacks...and this combination is proving popular with America's peggers.

This time around (7th Annual), it was Dick Stone, Red Bluff, CA, coming home the winner, edging Master L. M. "Mike" Stier (AK) in the final playoff match. Stier loves this event, as he finished 1st last September. Grand Master Roy Banducci (CA) and Marcel Dumont (NV) came home 3-4.

Jerry Keuter (ID) roared home in the qualifying round with a great 39 17/22 +263 to easily take qualifying honors (and 65 MRP's).

A great crowd (132) stayed for the Consolation, and it was veteran Grand Master Jim Gogolin (OR) edging Master Mike McDaniel (WA) for the win. One-Star Paul Hatcher (OR) and Tom Chew (CA) finished 3-4. Hatcher's high finish keep him among the leaders in the annual MRP race.

Robert Drukman Tops Eastern States

Life Master Robert Drukman, East Bridgewater, MA, added another 147 MRP's to his lofty lifetime total by winning the recent Eastern States Championship. Drukman nipped Master Bob Kaplan (MA) in the final playoff match, but Kaplan's high finish zipped him to his Grand Master rating in this 126-player event. Joan Fletcher (CT) and Barbara Barbour (CT) came home 3-4.

David Statz (NH) scored a superlative 24 GP's in the 12-game qualifying round to easily take honors.

With 68 players in action in the Consolation, it was Master Bruce Brown (MA) bringing home the bacon. Master Larry Harmon (CT) came home 2nd, followed by Grand Master Doris Perkins (MA) and Master Syd Lampke (MA) in 3-4. Dwight Christiansen, a newly crowned Life Master from Monroe, CT, took qualifying honors with a nice 16 GP card (8 games).

Director Bill Medeiros reported that Emily Medeiros (MA) earned her Master rating. He also reported that David Harper (MA) and Pat Llewellyn (MA) scored that elusive 28-hand. No 29's showed.

Ben Holder Wins In Georgia

It was Ben Holder (CA) all the way at the recent Atlanta Classic. He topped a field of 61 peggers and carted home 105 MRP's, the top prize...and bragging rights. His final match pitted him vs. Curtis Lien (FL) and his cards stayed hot for the win. Jerry McGhee (GA) and Master Dave Ritchey (FL) finished 3-4. Chuck Dolge (NC) won 15 of 20 (35 15/20 +217) to easily take qualifying honors.

45 players were in action in the Consolation and perennial winner Frank Danielski (FL) took home the win. He adds another 45 MRP's to his lofty lifetime 8,200+. Jerry Russell (GA), David Foxwell (GA), and Danny Bennett (VA) finished 2-3-4. David O'Neil (GA) won 8 of 9 to take honors in the qualifying round.

Director Bobby Stuart reported O'Neil won the Friday warm-up game; Frank Podjun the Saturday game, and Gene Bradshaw the Last Chance. David Smith (GA), Bobby Stuart (GA), and Oscar Wifladt (FL) scored 28-hands.

Another Life Master...Rollie Heath (OR)...took home 2nd and both players keep their hat in the ring for All-American honors. Malmgren garnered 147 MRP's and Heath scored an aggregate 145. Master Jim Keeling (WA) and George Stanton (WA) finished 3-4...and 70 MRP's each.

Master Harold Buckley (AB) has been rolling lately, and this Canadian took top-qualifying honors with a nifty 35 15 +278.

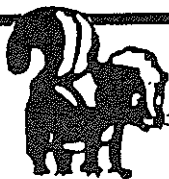
Keith Forrest's 29-hand in doubles was a rare one (5 cards dealt). He has scored an amazing seven 29-hands (lifetime).

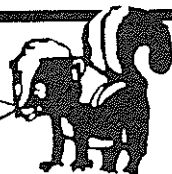

Toll Zips to Zumbro Win

One-Star Duane Toll, Franklin, WI, zipped to his 13th Main Event Win at the Zumbro Open, played in Zumbrota, MN on March 24. And he has won 13 Consolations as well, as this veteran ACC player continues to rack up MRP's. This time around, he nipped Bill Witts (MN) in the final playoff match for the win in this 130 player event. Toll took home 196 MRP's and Witts tallied 147. Witts is a newcomer to ACC play, and put up a good match with the formidable Toll, in addition to his qualifying round play.

Larry Holtan (MN) and Master John Williams (MN) came home 3-4. Holtan was last year's winner and very nearly repeated again this year, falling two matches short.

80 peggers played the Consolation, and Grand Master Bob Sommer (MN) nailed down the win...and yet another 63 MRP's. Sharon Pedersen (MN) finished 2nd (45 MRP's), followed by Master Mike Burns (MN) and Mike Jacka (MN) in the 3-4 slot. Barney Baird (MN) hit all 8 winners in taking qualifying round honors (18 8/8 +154).

The First Annual Raleigh "Power Peggers" March Madness Classic was named after players in the local Raleigh GR club who refer to themselves as "Power Peggers." The original "Power Pegger" is Master Bernard Whitfield, winner of the National Open in 1998. The low card in the 70-player Friday Early Bird was awarded a book on how to play cribbage...and you guessed it! Bernard Whitfield came home with two wins (10 game match) and won the book. To top that, he managed to win one game of 10 in the Consolation.

The cards were hot in the early going of the Main Event. First, Kevin Tymko (NC) scored a 28-hand, quickly followed by the ACC's 9th 29-hand this cribbage season, scored by Robert Wenzel (NC). Grand Master Ron Morgan (CA) scored yet another 28-hand before lunch, helping propel him to a 2nd place finish. But Frank Carter (NC) came home the winner in this 88-player event. Not only did he win the top prize,

but garnered the most skunks in his favor and took half of the skunk bank. The other half of the skunk bank went to Master Bobby Stuart (GA) for having the most skunks and the lowest card. Master Jeff Raynes (NC) and Robert Milk (VA) finished 3-4. The high qualifier in the Main Event was Master Jack Howsare (VA) with a nice 37 17/22 +216.

In winning this event, McDonald garnered a whopping 196 MRP's, a four-figure winner's prize, and bragging rights. His last match pitted him vs. Ed Peterson (OR) and he was not to be denied. Peterson had a great run and netted 147 MRP's. He was not wearing his famous T-shirt and may have led to his demise ("Beer...Not Just a Breakfast Drink"). Tom Butler (OR) and Rod Taylor (OR) nailed down the 3-4 slot...and 105 MRP's each.

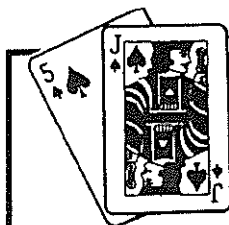
Grand Master Jack Shumate (CA) finished in the 5-8 bracket, scoring 70 MRP's keeping him among the leaders nationwide.

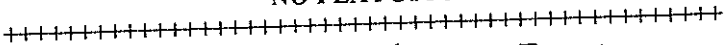

On The Money!

Nielsen needed exactly 40 MRP's to earn Master, and scored a great 34 GP card in the qualifying round...and that is exactly 40!

Morse scored a combined 92 MRP's by going into the 3rd round. Ne needed but 91 to earn Life Master.

Teamwork

Harold Buckley (AB) had completed his 22-game qualifying round at the Washington State Open (Sunnyside, WA) and tallied a nice 35 GP card. Meanwhile his spouse, Marion, was playing Hal Lamon (WA) the 22nd game, and Lamon had 33 GP's in the bank and it looked like he had a sure skunk in the offing. But Marion pulled it out and sneaked across the skunk line to preserve her hubby's top score! Both Buckley and Lamon had 35 GP cards, but Buckley's was a tad higher.

Alternate Deals? A Rebuttle!

In last month's CW, a proposal was presented to alternate deals on an odd-even game basis, thereby giving each player an equal number of deals at each sanctioned event.

The committee advocating this practice, quoted accurate statistics that I completely agree with, as well as a number of other statisticians, most notably the late Allan Lichty (Iowa). We all agree the dealer has a 56-44 advantage, and I'm sure Jim McDonald's stats on skunks are in the ball park also.

But, this committee left out one glaring statistic to support the "unfairness" of cutting for the deal. The glaring omission? The committee failed to report the odds of winning the deal, or losing the deal by cutting. Any mathematician worth his salt will tell you that when you cut for deal, your odds are dead even you will win the cut, or lose the cut! Nothing could be fairer than that. Each player has a 50-50 chance of dealing! The committee's suggestion that this is not fair is simply hogwash!

Our great game has a rich heritage, and cutting for the deal is part of that heritage. I get a kick out of cutting for the deal, as it is suspenseful and exciting. Some days I will win more than my share, and other days I will lose more than my share. But I will wager my stack of trophies that at the end of the year, my numbers will be dead even (within 1%). George "Ras" Rasmussen is a great numbers whiz, and after some 720 games analyzed he won the cut for deal 363 times and his opponent won 357...a 50.4% to 49.6% edge to Ras...and he is an expert cutter! Me? Well, I'm not so skillful, so my guess is that I would win 49.6% of the cuts for deal!

In summary, if it ain't broke, don't fix it! I would hate to have every game begin with skewed advantages, or disadvantages! When I play George Bickford, I want a fair shot at winning the cut for deal! He is just too damned good to let him have the deal unchallenged! Nor would I covet a game I won with an unchallenged deal.

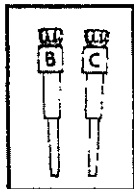
