

eggy Cunningham Takes Consolation

Master Mike McDaniel, pegging out of Helena, MT, ran a steady run of good cards to the championship at Grand National XXI, played at Kings Beach, CA on Oct. 3-6. Down 0-2 to One-Star Joe Bernard (IL) in the best 3 of 5 final, McDaniel asked for a new deck...and proceeded to run off three wins in a row to cop the championship, \$3,500...and 252 MRP's. Bernard's 2nd place follows a second at the National Open earlier this summer, as he is finding breaking into the winner's circle frustrating, to say the least. Second was worth \$2,000, and he took home yet another 196 MRP's to add to his lofty 14,000+ lifetime total.

Grand Master Bruce Wridge (OR) is no stranger to high finishes in large events as he won the 1996 JPW/ACC Open (\$10,000), and he still is on the winning track by taking home 3rd in this event. Wridge nipped Jack Wilfladt from faraway Yellowknife, Northwest Territories in the 3-4 bracket. Both players took home 147 MRP's (\$1,265 & \$1,000).

Life Master Frank Danielski (WI) bested the field of 410 peggers in the qualifying round with a superlative 38 18/22 +261 (60 MRP's).

Peggy Cunningham, Phoenix, AZ zipping to the Emily DeHuff and many other volunteers win. With the new scoring system, Cunningham conducted an outstanding event. Now on to GN

Newcomer Jere Huyck (NH) took home the winner's trophy at the 2nd Annual Daniel Webster Open. Along with the first prize of \$908.02 came 196 MRP's as 142 peggers showed to make this event one of the largest in New England. Grand Master Frank Corrado (CT) came in 2nd in a very close best of five finals. One-Star Harry Palmer (MA) and Master Dennis Cousens (ME) finished 3-4. Palmer picked up yet another 135 MRP's, running his lifetime talley to 15,027...and the ACC's 3rd Two-Star rating.

Carl Palmer (MA) scored a grand slam 25 12/12 +185 to easily earn qualifying honors.

In the 78-player Consolation, it was a battle of Life Masters as Dave Clemmey (MA) edged Henry DeLong (MA) in the final playoff match to win the title. Master Emily Shwartz (MA) and Robert Provost (FL) took 3-4.

Highlights of the tournament were the introduction of the Eastern All-Regional stars. They were honored by their peers with a large sheet cake with their names and last year's MRPs on it. Dave Campbell recorded the only 29-hand (the ACC's third this cribbage year). Wilma MacDonald (MA) earned her Master rating (awaiting verification by Bob McCabe, ACC Statistician). Books were given to the lowest scores in the Main and Consolation and a cribbage board and pegs were awarded.

Pencil this event in for next year: September 7, the Sunday after Labor Day.

With the new Consolation scoring system, DeLong took home 84 MRP's. Steve Brescia (MA) finished 2nd and earned 60 MRP's. Master Ann Somers (MA) and Life Master George Webb (MA) finished in the 3-4 bracket and earned 40 MRP's. Director Al Miller reported the cards were a tad cold, as no 28 or 29-hands showed.

Govenor Cops Wine Country Ladonna Govenor, a Master pegger, pegging on her

Ladonna Govenor, a Master pegger, pegging on her home turf (Napa, CA) on September 14, won the Wine Country Open championship, besting some 75 peggers in the field. With the win, Govenor took home 147 MRP's, and adding 50 more for a 2nd-high qualifying card, netted some 197 MRP's.

1999 All-American team member Master Wes Summers (CA) finished 2nd, followed by the streaking Master Cres Fernandez (CA) and Life Master Bill Wakeman (CA) in the 3-4 bracket.

Jim McKnight (CA) topped the field in the qualifying round with a 26 12/14 +165 (50 MRP's).

42 players played the Consolation and Dennis Macrina (CA) won his first-ever ACC event by beating director Master Roland Hall (CA) in the final playoff match. 

American Cribbage Congress Hall of Fame

Hall of Fame Nominating Criteria

- 1- All nominations for the American Cribbage Congress Hall of Fame must be submitted in writing to the Chairman of the Balloting Committee.
- 2- An individual nominated for the American Cribbage Congress Hall of Fame must meet the following *mandatory* criteria:
 - A- be a member in good standing of the ACC for seven (7) consecutive years or have been a member for a minimum of five (5) consecutive years until death intervened.
 - B-have displayed and complied with the rules of ethical play.
 - C-have displayed and complied with the standards of good sportsmanship.
- 3- In addition, to be eligible for nomination, a candidate is required to meet at least three (3) of the following *optional* criteria. He or she must have:
 - A-promoted the game of cribbage and/or served the American Cribbage Congress by specific acts or as specified in the written nomination.
 - B- established his/her expertise by being rated a Master player or higher.
 - C- established his/her expertise by being rated a Bronze Award recipient or higher in Grass Roots competition.
 - D-served as a Tournament Director, or Co-director, of an ACC sanctioned tournament for a minimum of five (5) years. E-served as a Grass Roots Director, or Co-director, for a minimum of five (5) years.
 - F- served as a member of the Board of Directors of the American Cribbage Congress for a minimum of four (4) years.
- 4- Any exceptions to or exemptions from the above criteria must be initiated by a current member of the ACC Board of Directors.

Hall of Fame Balloting Procedures

- 1. Publish annually in the November issue of Cribbage World the criteria for nominating individuals to the Hall of Fame. Declare that nominations are currently being accepted and must be in written form limited to one (1) page to the Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee of the ACC, postmarked no later than December 10 of that year.
- 2. The Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee will review all letters of nomination received for compliance with the nominating criteria and submit those letters to the ACC Hall of Fame Committee.
- 3. Voting will take place at the Board of Directors meeting held in conjunction with the JPW/ACC Open Tournament in Reno. NV. All attending current ACC Board members have voting rights and each eligible nominee will be voted on by the Board.
- 4. Each nominee will be notified of the results of the balloting applicable to him/her. The President of the ACC or the Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee will notify in writing any members who are elected to the Hall of Fame. Induction, if any, will take place at the Grand National Tournament and Awards banquet later that year.


...And Art Fisher IS Hot!
