

Pat Llewellyn Scores 2003's First 29!

Bob Cunningham Tops NE Peer

Bob Cunningham, pegging out of Ashland, MA, earned his Master rating in last year's action...and he has roared out of the gate this fledgling cribbage year by winning the large (142 player) New England Peer Championship on August 25. With 196 MRP's for the win Cunningham is among the leaders as cribbage year 2003 kicks into gear. Armand Hamel (MA) finished 2nd, and copped 147 MRP's and he too is out with the leaders. Life Master Rob Medeiros (MA) and Holli Umbrianna (MA) each took home 105 MRP's for a 3-4 finish. Louis Manter (ME) took qualifying honors with a great 37 17/22 +223 card (and 55 MRP's).

With 62 players in action, the Consolation win went to Life Master Phil Martin (CT). He nipped newly-crowned Master Emily Shwartz (MA) in the final playoff match. Jane Cannizzaro (NY) and Vicki Soule (ME) nailed down the 3-4 slot. Floridian Jim Lunder won 8 of 10 in the qualifying round to take the "Q" prize as this Master pegger continues his fine play.

The highlight of this event saw Master Pat Llewellyn (MA) score the ACC's first 29-hand this cribbage year (August 1, 2002 through July 31, 2003) and takes home a nifty \$100 bonus for this gem.

Director John Chambers hosted a Friday singles game, copped by One-Star Bill Medeiros (MA) and a Saturday doubles match. Mary Murphy (MA) and Charlie Finley (CT) took that action. Chambers also reported three 28-hands were scored: Bill Cooper (GA), Earle Remington (RI), and Fred Desnoyers (MA).

Once again, Chambers' event drew a large crowd, attesting to his expertise in managing cribbage matches. The Eastern Region is off and winging in style this cribbage year.

Wardenburg Cops September Sizzler

Master Richard Wardenburg, Grass Valley, CA, zipped over to Fairfield, CA for the September Sizzler...and he sizzled right on through to the championship. Gordon Brown (CA) came close in this 108-player event, but he fell to Wardenburg's run in the final playoff match. Life Master Ron Morgan (CA) and Master Ervin Bentz (CA) finished in the 3-4 bracket.

Helen Bolstad (CA) earned her Life Master in the last match (Raleigh) last year, and she begins the new year on a high note by taking qualifying honors...a nice 25 11/14 +230.

With 70 players in action in the Consolation, it was Bill Johnson (CA) taking home the top prize...and 84 MRP's (new 4+4 format). Life Master Greg Schleusner (CA) finished 2nd...and scored the ACC's 2nd 29-hand this cribbage year, earning \$100 from the ACC for this gem. Master Jerold Montgomery (CA) and Master Tom Nohrden (CA) finished 3-4. Dennis Macrina (CA) scored the top card in the qualifying round (17 8/9 +169).

Highlights of this event saw One-Star Bob Julian (WI) score a 28-hand, and Mary Gladish (CA) earned her Life Master with a 2nd round win in the Main Event. Harold Sontag earned Grand Master by qualifying in the Consolation. 2001 National Champion Jim Langley (CA) brought a first-time player (Bill Johnson) and he won the Consolation. *Cribbage World* surmises that Langley had Johnson well-trained for his inaugural sanctioned competition!

Julie-Mack Felkins and Scott Milo ran a first-class one-day event, attested to by the large turnout.

Steinmetz...Again!

For the past two seasons One-Star Wayne Steinmetz (WI) has been burning up the track, earning two All-American awards, and scoring at very nearly every stop. And this year begins with nothing new! Steinmetz won the 110-pegger Madison Masters on August 31, picking up yet another 147 MRP's and he is off and winging in the new year's action.

Master Tony Danihel (WI) came close, but could not stop Steinmetz's run and took home 2nd (105 MRP's). Bonnie Halopka (WI) and Master Jim Huser (WI) finished 3-4. Master Douglas Henderson (WI) scored a nice 29 GP's in the 14-game qualifier to easily take honors. This high score netted Henderson 65 MRP's!

Hall of Famer Martha Fingleton (WI) won the 75-player Consolation, and with the new MRP scoring for Consolations netted a nice 84 MRP's. This Life Master stands at 9,500+ over a long and colorful pegging career. Don Reinfeld (WI) finished 2nd, followed by Tootsie Adams (WI) and Doris Henken (IL) in the 3-4 slot. Daryl Halopka (WI) scored 17 GP's in the 9-game qualifying round to win "Q" honors.

Director Ginger Nelson reported four 28-hands: Doug Page, Kristina Rouse, William Dayton, and Marty Crawford. This unique one-day event drew a sizeable crowd, as Wisconsin continues to be one of cribbage's hotbeds of play.

Ken Cochlin Tops Sunnyside

Life Master Ken Cochlin (WA) earned All-American team honors in 1993, but in recent years he has curtailed his play. But at the Sunnyside Summer Classic (WA) he roared back to life by winning this 68-player event. He nipped Master Douglas Rose (WA) in the final playoff match to bring home 147 MRP's. Rose garnered 165 MRP's (aggregate) for 2nd. Canadian Harold Buckley is working on his Grand Master rating, and he is knocking on the door with a 3-4 finish. Don Kueter (WA) also finished in this bracket. Rose was the meet's high qualifier scoring a nifty 38 17/22 +235 (60 MRP's).

The locals mopped up the Consolation event with Bob Brumley winning this 42-player event, nipping the hot-running Life Master Rollie Heath (OR) in the final playoff match. Local James Morrow not only finished 3rd, but was the event's high qualifier (19 8/9 +147) to take home an aggregate 84 MRP's. Shannon Ells (ID) finished in the 3-4 bracket as well.






One-Star Bill Medeiros Cops Richmond Classic

Members of the Richmond Cribbage Club captured seven championships in last year's cribbage tournaments and the locals hopes were high that these winning ways would continue in the 2nd Annual Richmond Classic on August 17.

However, it was not to be as two Massachusetts peggers took home the Main and Consolation titles. Bill Medeiros (MA), the ACC's 15th One-Star player, swept Randy Skaradek (MD) in the Main event finals and took home 147 MRP's for the win plus 35 for his 4th place qualifying round score for an aggregate 182 MRP's to kick off the new cribbage year in style! Skaradek garnered 105 MRP's in this 78-player event. David Lambeth (NC) and Tom Brent (MD) finished 3-4, taking home 70 MRP's each. Dave Lancet (NJ) qualified tops with a 23 11/12 +81 score in the 12-game round. This year, this 12-game round (only) has been modified to award players an extra 5 MRP's, giving Lancet 50 MRP's (45 last year).

The 59-player Consolation event found the top two qualifiers battling it out for the championship. Andy Hulcher (VA) of the host club and One-Star Harry Palmer (MA) finished 1-2 in the qualifying round (Hulcher scored (16 7/8 +152), but Palmer prevailed in the playoffs, getting off to a quick start in the 2003 MRP chase. Ron Reece (VA) and Master Jeff Raynes (NC) finished 3-4.

Directors Janet Meinert and Rick Allen are busy scheduling the next tournament in Richmond, the Virginia Championships, for January 11-12, 2003. Mark your calendars for some spirited Virginia action!

In winning, Shumate garnered 147 MPR's, and begins the new cribbage season on a high note. Lee Rutledge (CA) was Shumate's last playoff match, and in finishing 2nd, Rutledge took home 105 MRP's. Ed Bloom (CA) is nearing his Grand Master with a 3rd place finish, and Jim Markowitz (IA) also finished in this 3-4 bracket.

2001 national champ Jim Langley (CA) topped the field in the qualifying round with a 32 GP card (22 games). This top card indicates a tough field in attendance. A 32 rarely makes the top score.

With 52 players staying for the Consolation, Bob Lippert (CA) came home the winner, nipping Roy Kaufman (CA) in the final playoff match. Ralph Beck, came a few miles north from his Eureka, CA home and nailed the Humboldt Bay Classic in Arcata, CA on August 11. With 86 players in action, the win netted Beck 147 MRP's...and bragging rights for the locals. Beck also took home the All-Events prize in a close match with Jim O'Roak (OR), winning that event by 9 spread points.

Beck and Master Bryant Gilkeson (NV) had a close playoff match for the title, but Beck Prevailed. Gilkeson took home 105 MRP's for 2nd. Master Roland Hall (CA) scored an even 900 MRP's in last year's action, and is off and winging again with a 3-4 finish. Grand Master Boyd McDonald (CA) almost did it again (low non-qualifier), but the cribbage gods came to his rescue by letting him qualify with a 26 GP card (very rare), and he zipped to a 3-4 finish as well.



George Taylor Supports Alternate Deal

Master George Taylor, Bradenton, FL, wrote *Cribbage World* a lengthy letter supporting the alternate deal concept. Some excerpts:

"...cutting for deal is inequitable and the only controlled unfair procedure in tournament cribbage."

"...*Cribbage World* and all the books compiled on cribbage have statistically outlined the extreme advantage of being the dealer..."

"...in all sports competition alternating is integral..." (tennis, baseball, football, poker, bridge, etc.)

"I have been shown how easy and convenient it is to determine how the cut will go."

"ACC...point leaders have been suspended for unethical practices. Could rigged cuts for deals have been a factor?"

"If I win 16 cuts in a 22-game tournament, and qualify for the playoffs, it does not give the satisfaction of having a skillful accomplishment in light of the extreme advantage winning the cut for deal offers."

Unbelievable!

Bruce Pomeroy (ID) is still in a state of shock after winning all 22 cuts for deal in the qualifying round at the Coeur d'Alene Classic at Worley, Idaho on September 14. With the "extreme" advantage of this feat, was he the meet's top qualifier? No. He won 11 and lost 11, for a 22 GP card. It takes more than a cut for deal to have a hot run. Incidentally, the odds of winning 22 cuts in a row are roughly four million to one!

And On the Other Side of the Coin...

Life Master Jim Hornbacher (WA), playing at the Coeur d'Alene Classic, kept track of his winning the cut for deal in the 22-game qualifying round. He won the cut for deal 13 times...and won all 13 games! He qualified easily and finished 2nd in the playoffs.

This argument could go on forever. At this same meet I had a good run of winning the deal (cutting six aces in 22 tries, and won roughly 75% of the cuts for deal). Did I qualify high? No. I had my worst score in 22 years of sanctioned pegging! I scored a paltry 14 GP's Ugg! Ed.

Emil Lubinski Grand Master

As the American Cribbage Congress kicks off its 23rd year, **Emil Lubinski**, Minneapolis, MN, has earned the ACC's 173rd Grand Master rating. He earned his 4,000th MRP at the August edition of the St. Croix Classic in Turtle Lake, WI, and has been certified by National Statistician Bob McCabe.

Mary Gladish (CA) and **Harold Sontag** (CA) are awaiting certification for Life Master and Grand Master after earning MRP's at the September Sizzler in Fairfield, CA.

Grand National XXI

As *Cribbage World* goes to press, America's cribbage players are converging on Kings Beach, California to participate in Grand National XXI's festivities and pegging action.

According to directors Jack Shumate III and Emily DeHuff, the event looks to be a good one. With beautiful Lake Tahoe as a backdrop, GNXXI will be an event to remember. A record number of Masters, Grand Masters, Life Masters, and One-Stars will be presented their awards, as well as the All-American team, and All-Regional teams. Grass Roots awards are also on the agenda.

Three of the ACC's members will be officially inducted into the Hall of Fame: Rit Alkas, Phyllis Schmidt, and Joe Bernard. And Larry Hassett will receive the President's Award for his efforts above and beyond the call of duty.

Look for complete results in November's *Cribbage World*.

Next year's Grand National XXII will be played in Sioux Falls, South Dakota, at the Oaks Hotel with Scott Kooistra being the host director.

Last year Ron Logan won GNXX in Richmond, VA, played despite the horrific 9-11 disaster. Nevertheless, 236 players showed. This year's GNXXI is projected to field 500 or more players.






