

221 In Raleigh Palmer Tops National Open

One-Star Harry Palmer, a 4-time All-American from West Springfield, MA, made it a 5-time event by taking home all the marbles at the National Open on July 28. His last match pitted him vs. another One-Star player...Joe Bernard (IL)...and Bernard had a single loss in this double-elimination event. Bernard prevailed in the first match, and with the championship on the line at one-loss each, Palmer breezed home 4-0, taking home 196 MRP's (plus qualifying points) and easily earned his 5th All-American team honors. Bernard has a long-history of high finishes at the National Open, but the top prize has eluded him.

John Campanella (MA) and Roger Bouchard (CT) came home 3 and 4 in this sizeable 221-player event. This event is a double-elimination format, with 8 GP's needed to win (skunks counting 3, a win 2).

150 players gave it a 2nd try in the Consolation using the ACC's standard 9-game qualifying-round format. And Linda Brent, Centerville, MD, scorched the boards with a 22 9/9 +227, posting one of the best 9-game scores of the year. Malcolm Enos prevailed in the playoffs, nipping Janet Viands (VA) in the final playoff match. Grand Master Henry Douglass (NC) and Larry Gould (NC) finished 3-4.

Director Catherine Perkins and crew sported a bevy of satellite events. The winners:

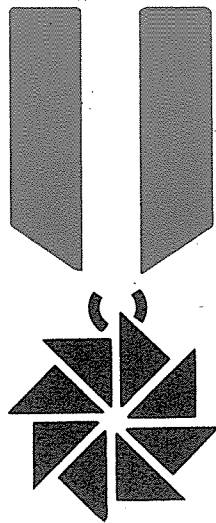

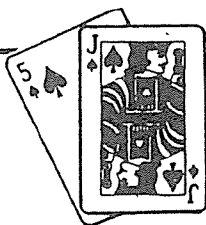

Robert Chevalier Cops Portland Summer

Robert Chevalier was a long way from his Dennisport, MA home in late July. He was pegging at the Portland Summer Open in Oregon...and peg he did! He copped the 156-player event, and more than paid for his trip west. He also carted home a whopping 196 MRP's to top off his season's play. Life Master Roger Wilson (CO) took home 2nd, and added a few more MRP's (182 aggregate) to his All-American tally. Skip White (ID) and Life Master Rollie Heath (OR) finished 3-4, and each took home 105 MRP's. Heath tacked on another 20 MRP's in the qualifying round...and he needed every single point. He finished the season with 1,078, edging Bill Hutchinson's 1,067 for the 10th and final spot on this year's All-American team. Hutchinson (CO) finished in the 9-16 bracket, and needed but another playoff win to move into All-American territory.

One-Star Paul Hatcher (OR) missed the All-American team by a whisker, qualifying tops with an excellent 37 17/22 +263, and finished in the 17-32 round. Two more playoff wins would have propelled Hatcher to All-American status.

Lee Bodkin (OR) nailed the 112-player Consolation, with John O'Shea (WA) taking home 2nd. John Galbreath (WA) and Master Denny Edwards (OR) finished in the 3-4 bracket. Les Sumner (NV) topped the field in the qualifying round with a nifty 18 GP card. Jack Shumate III qualified 2nd and finished in the 5-8 bracket and netted 36 MRP's...just enough to earn his first All-American honor. He finished the season 8th with 1,117 MRP's.

Russell Adams Nails Lewis & Clark, Earns One-Star

Veteran pegger Russell Adams, pegging out of Minneapolis, has been one of the ACC's star performers for many years, and at the recent Lewis & Clark Classic, he came home a winner yet again! But this win was special. He earned the ACC's 16th One-Star rating (10,000 MRP's). His last playoff match for the championship was no breeze as he had to get by Grand Master Bob Chase (MN). Adams prevailed for the win...and One-Star! Two South Dakotans finished 3rd and 4th...John Bakeberg and Bob McGuire. Master Connie Staven topped the field in the qualifying round with a nice 35 16/22 +140 in this 124-player event.

With 88 peggers in action in the Consolation, Helen Railsback (NE), sporting her pistol pegs, zipped to high qualifying honors (16 7/9 +111) and finished 2nd in the playoffs to easily earn the ACC's 79th Life Master rating. But Richard Frost (WI) came home the winner, and, he too, is knocking on the door for his Life Master. Master Lyle Lund (MN) and veteran Life Master Bob McCabe (WI) finished 3-4. McCabe has scored well over 8,000 MRP's in his long and illustrious career.

Director L. M. Stier reported that Jim Sizemore and Lonnie McGowan won the Friday night doubles match.

Dan Hansen Tops In Boise

Dan Hansen, Bend, OR, earned his way into the upcoming Tournament of Champions by winning the Les Bois Classic in Boise, ID on July 21. With 38 players in the field, Hansen took home 105 MRP's...and bragging rights. Mike Edwards (ID) finished 2nd, followed by John Swett (IL) and Life Master Jim Hornbacher (WA) in 3-4. Swett was also the meet's top qualifier...32 16/22.

A bare minimum field of 18 peggers played the Consolation and it was Alan Baze (ID) winning the event. Bob Herrmann (OR) finished 2nd, and was also the top qualifier. Jeanne Jelke (WA) and Gary Hohstadt (ID) finished 3-4.

It was Mel Vios (HI) winning the July edition of the Hawaiian Open, with Richard Kodama (HI) finishing 2nd. Creighton Lee (HI) and Fred White (HI) finished 3-4. Kodama also topped the field in the qualifying round (21 10/12 +99). Director Tsarkie keeps 'em pegging under the palm trees.

Lee Norris Tops New England Inaugural

Life Master Lee Norris (RI) is tough on his home turf and he came home the winner at the New England Inaugural, played at Woonsocket, RI on August 11. With 112 players in action, Norris kicks off the new cribbage year with a bang, taking home 147 MRP's, running his lifetime tally to well over 6,400...and a spot at the top of the leaderboard in this fledgling cribbage year. His final playoff match was no easy matter, as he went head-to-head with another Life Master...Rob Medeiros (MA). Two Master peggers finished in the 3-4 bracket...Larry Harmon (CT) and Emily Shwartz (MA). Grand Master John Rooney (MA) scored a great 12/12 grand slam (24 12/12 +165) to easily take qualifying honors. An extra 5 MRP's have been added to a 12-game round, beginning this cribbage year, giving Rooney 55 MRP's, instead of 50 as in years past.

An even 50 players stayed for the Consolation, and with the new 4+4 playoff MRP's in place, it was Master Ann Somers (MA) taking home 60 MRP's for the win. Last year's action would have netted 45 MRP's. Master Pat Frattalone (CT) carted home 40 MRP's for 2nd (vs. 30 last year). Grand Master Frank Corrado (CT) and Life Master Dave Clemmey (MA) finished in the 3-4 bracket. Life Master Paul Gallagher (MA) scored a grand slam 8/8 +97 to top the field in the qualifying round.

Director Bill Medeiros reported that a single 28-hand was scored by Rick Montague (MA). No 29's showed.

It's Official! Bob Julian 2002 National Champ!

It's official! National Statistician Bob McCabe has released the final stats for the past cribbage year, and One-Star Bob Julian, Milwaukee, WI has won hands down! With a great run in June, Julian nailed three consecutive events in the Western, Central, and Eastern Regions that salted away the championship. He finished the cribbage year with 1,930 MRP's, and adds yet another championship to his ledger, standing at four (lifetime).

Three-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT) hit a brick wall the last three months and finished with 1,542, barely nipping the hard-charging One-Star Harry Palmer (MA). Palmer nailed the huge National Open as the season rang down and zipped to 1,536...and 3rd place on this year's All-American team. This is Colvert's 17th All-American team honor, and runs his ACC-leading lifetime MRP tally to 22,898.

Wayne Steinmetz (WI) had another stellar year, and earned his One-Star rating, and took 4th with 1,392 MRP's. This is his 3rd All-American team honor. He finished 2nd last year. Life Master Roger Wilson rang down the year with a bang. In June and July he nailed the boards for some 600+ MRP's and zipped to the 5th spot on this year's All-American team.

The next five places on the team featured a real dog fight. The final event in Portland decided if Life Master Rollie Heath (OR), Bill Hutcheson (CO), One-Star Paul Hatcher (OR), or Life Master Jim Langley (CA) would grab the 10th and final spot on the team. Heath posted a high finish in Portland and nailed down 10th. 6-7-8 and 9 were extremely close, with Herschel Mack (CA) taking home 1,127 MRP's to earn his first All-American honor...and 6th place. David Campbell (ME), in his first full year of play, astounded the cribbage world by scoring 1,122 MRP's and All-American honors. He finished 7th. Grand Master Jack B. Shumate III (CA) finished 8th with 1,117 MRP's to earn his first All American as well. He is director of the upcoming GNXXI in Kings Beach, CA...and he will be on stage to receive his honors. Master H. Ross Njaa (CA) won the huge Independence Day Classic in Reno in late June to zip to the 9th spot (1,094). He, too, earns his first All-American honor.

Cribbage Year 2002 was a great success, with a record number of tournaments for ACC players. For those that caught "cribbage fever" there was an event almost every week. Once again, Bob Julian set an amazing pace and was in action on a regular basis in all three regions. His play was outstanding, attested to his out-distancing himself from the rest of the pack. And now on to cribbage year 2003!

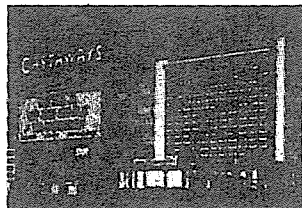

Strange Hands in Raleigh

The National Open (and other cribbage matches, for that matter) always seem to produce some strange hands...and games. Two unusual hands were reported in Raleigh.

The first saw Rick Bryant (MD) cutting a 5 for a 28-hand on 4th street. Oops, his opponent used the 5 for a nifty 22-point hand, and with first count wins the game...and match. Bryant was unable to count his 28-gem. The 5 cut cost him the match (but gave him a 28-hand!!)

Life Master Rob Medeiros needs 11 points, with first count, and is dealt A-A-A-2-2-J. His opponent is dealing and needs four pegs to win. After much deliberation, Medeiros holds the A-A-A-J, hoping for a A-3-4 cut. Almost unbelievably, the 4th ace is cut. Medeiros leads an ace, with a jack response. Medeiros plays his 2nd ace for "12." Opponent plays another jack for "22." Medeiros plays his 3rd ace for "23," and is a "go." At this point it appears Medeiros has the game in the bag. He leads his jack, but, ugg!!, his opponent is holding a king and queen for a run of 3, and a go for 4...and game! Holding four face cards, hoping to score four pegs is a difficult task...but cribbage can be a weird game, attested to by this hand.

In Portland, I needed 5 points to win, with my opponent needing 8 to save a skunk. Holding 2-3-10-K, and cutting a 6 gave me a scare. I needed a skunk in this final qualifying game to have a shot at qualifying. I breathed a sigh of relief when Bev Honeycutt said "go" and I played my cards out for the point I needed. She had three cards remaining...and they were all jacks...10-20-30 for 9 and over the line with points to spare! Such is cribbage! Ed.

Believe It Or Not!

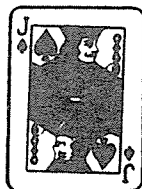
At the Portland Summer Open, Director Tim Julkowski had contracted Don Grieve to make a 29-hand trophy, just in case someone scored this gem. In game 22 (final game) of the qualifying round, Grieve was playing Jerry Blackman (OR), and would you believe he dealt Blackman a 29-hand!!! And the five was a spade...which matched his award's five of spades! For Grieve to deal this hand to anyone was a 433,600 to one shot (the exact suit of the award), but if Blackman was the specific player in his mind, with a blind draw in the 156-player event, the odds now go up to 134,279,600 to one that he would deal this hand to Blackman in the 22nd game!

Strange Hand In Everett

And speaking of strange hands, how about this one: Roy Hofbauer (WA) holds a club flush (3-5-J-Q). Donald Smith (OR) also holds a club flush (2-6-7-8). The 5 of spades was cut, giving both players a 14-point hand. This strange hand was played in Everett, WA.

Smith Again!

Don Smith is in the thick of the action once again. This time around, he left his club after an evenings pegging and he noticed a car with a young lady following him on his 4-mile trip home. When he parked his car at his house, the young lady got out of her car and said she noticed his ACC bumper sticker, and that she loved to play cribbage. Smith gave her a copy of *Cribbage World*...and directions to his Grass Roots club. Who says bumper stickers don't work?

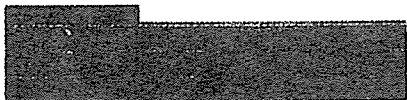

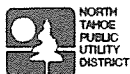

Check The Scorecards!

Don't let this happen to you! Do we need a rule change? Tough lesson to learn! Two people play a game of cribbage. The winner fills out his card accurately. The loser fills in zero for game points, so far so good! The loser fills in the spread points in plus column...first mistake! Cards are exchanged and initialed, second mistake, the winner did not check the opponent's entries.

Later in the day, maybe when the loser is adding his card, he changes that zero to read "2", third mistake. This card should have been taken to a judge, fourth mistake. Cards are now cross-checked and a ruling is made, this game is disqualified. The winner is knocked out of the qualifying round! The loser still qualifies, just 2 points less. Is this fair? He had altered his card without a judge checking both cards. A second choice could have been in the cross-checking. The unaltered card could have been assumed to be the correct card. Unfortunately assuming is not good practice. Do we need a rule that says in a case like this the unaltered card is correct? Do we need a rule that any altered card without a judge making the alterations be checked to correspond to the unaltered card? This is unfortunate the winner was penalized even though his card was unaltered and correct.

The lesson: ALWAYS CHECK YOUR OPPONENT'S CARD BEFORE INITIALING!

Shirley, This situation has happened in the past. When a player does not check for his opponent's accuracy in recording the scores, including the right column for spread points, the penalty can be severe as in your case. Our ad hoc rules committee will be notified via this article about your concerns. Perhaps the rule can be modified to penalize the player that alters a card without a judges signature. A word to the wise for all our ACC players ...check the card before signing! Ed.

Bragging Rights?

Cribbage Players are serious about their game. For example, in last month's CW, Bill Wakeman (CA) was reported to have earned the ACC's 74th Life Master, and Ron Morgan (CA) as having earned the ACC's 75th Life Master.

Wrong. Ron Morgan earned his Life Master some 2 1/2 hours before Wakeman. This occurred at the Oregon Coast Classic in Lincoln City, OR on Sunday, May 12. Cribbage fever, catch it...and remember, bragging rights are important!

Membership Required?

At the ACC's Board of Director's meetings, a never-ending controversy exists about whether to allow non-members to play sanctioned events.

Membership Secretary Larry Hassett is a computer buff, and he puts the argument to rest. He analyzed the three regions, and found that the Central Region had 55 non-members playing in this year's play, 26 non-members played in the Eastern Region, and a paltry 22 played in the Western Region. 14 more had unknown addresses. This is the analysis of some 153 tournaments averaging roughly 120 players each. Some 18,000 players played in sanctioned events, and only about 100 were non-members. And *Cribbage World* bets many of this 100 will join at a later date after enjoying sanctioned play.

Too Fast On The Draw

Out west it used to be important to have a "fast draw!"

But for Kent LaRue, Crescent City, CA, he was a tad too fast. In warming up for Sunday's sanctioned action at the Mount Bachelor Challenge (Bend, OR), LaRue nailed a 29-hand! This would have been worth a cool \$100 a half-hour later. Keep on pegging, Kent!

Whining Rights?

Cribbage World asked One-Star Paul Hatcher (OR) to keep a tally of cuts for deal in a 1,000 cut sample, and he agreed.

He won the cut for deal 484 times, and lost the deal 542 times (1,026 sample) for an average of 47.2% in his favor.

He writes CW: "Although the study shows that I am at a disadvantage in winning the cut, I do **not support the elimination of the cut for deal**. I do not see any difference in cutting for the deal and cutting for the starter card for each hand. If you eliminate one, you should eliminate both and only play a four-card hand instead of five cards. Many factors go into who wins a game of cribbage...the cut for deal is just one of them."

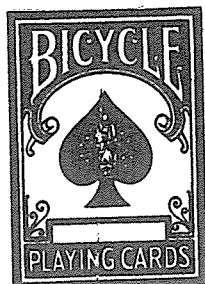
Others include:

- 1-Seating assignment (easy or tough players)
- 2-Great run of cards
- 3-Bad run of cards
- 4-Starter card, helping or hindering
- 5-Skill level of players

I couldn't agree more, except I still maintain the cut for deal odds are dead even...50-50! Ed.

Grand Master Robert Sommer, Excelsior, MN, won the August edition of the St. Croix Classic in Turtle Lake, WI...and has the national MRP lead as cribbage year 2003 hits the road. With a whopping 210 peggers in action, Sommer picked up 196 MRP's for the win, in addition to a sizeable winner's check (\$1,600) and bragging rights. Diane Gurney (WI) hauled in 2nd...and \$1,200, in addition to 147 MRP's, and she, too, is off and winging this new cribbage year. Grand Master Bill Sperry (MN) and Master Darrell Hunstad (CA) finished 3-4. Both players took home 105 MRP's.

And did you know that Norm Wright (WI) won the National Championship in 1983? Indeed he did, and this veteran Master pegger can still pick 'em up and lay 'em down, as he qualified tops with a nifty 36 17/22 +237 score.

Newly-crowned Life Master Jack Moritzky (WA) made his first sojourn to this event, and he paid his expenses, plus, by winning the 152-player Consolation. Master Ron Sather (MN) took 2nd, followed by One-Star Duane Toll (WI) and Master Shelly Vadnais (MN) in the 3-4 slot. Jeanne Wauters (WI) just missed a grand slam by one game in the qualifying round (worth \$250) but, nevertheless, took honors with a 18 8/9 +116.

Director Alan Lindner reported yet another hefty payout of perks. Some \$8,375 was given for 24-hands (\$25 ea.) and 28-hands at \$250 each. No 29's showed as well as no grand slams.

Co-director Vickie Long went to lunch after 12 games and had scored only 11 GP's. But she came back with a vengeance, winning 10 in a row, and qualified 8th with 33 GP's...and finished in the 5-8 bracket. Never give up!

These St. Croix Classics continue to draw full houses, attested to by the 210 in attendance this time around. Director Lindner reports that in the 23 events played at this facility, some \$180,000 has been paid in perks. In addition, this Casino offers players many other amenities, including a great Saturday buffet lunch. Enter this event early if you want a spot.

TIP

Question:

When holding a 5-5-5-10-J-Q, what do you discard to your crib? The 5-5 or the J-Q?

Answer:

The J-Q!

Ras Rasmussen (WA) is the ACC's number's whiz in residence, and he has analyzed 100 samples of each discard. His tally has the 5-5 discard scoring an average 11.3 in the hand and an average 8.28 in the crib for a total of 19.58 points combined.

The J-Q discard averages 16.56 in the hand and 4.26 in the crib for a combined average total of 20.82.

This makes the J-Q discard better by some 1.24 points. This is just one more reason Ras is ranked 20th (lifetime) in the ACC, standing at 8,663 MRP's as the 2003 season gets under way.

And don't forget, holding three 5's gives you a shot at scoring that whopper 10-card-5-5-5-5 peg when your opponent holds the case 5 (and three large cards)...a 21-2 edge the first time through to 31! Ed.

Grass Roots Has New Rules For GRRT and GRNT events

Grass Roots Commissioner Joan Rein polled the Grass Roots Board of Volunteers and with a vote of 5-1 voted to charge \$3 for anyone playing in a GRRT or GRNT event. This way the player can designate where they wanted to play officially, and then play as often as they like elsewhere. This would not be discouraging play and a player could still play by the rules and regulations set forth. No one would need to ask for special privileges.

Rein has recently published a new Grass Roots Organization, Policy and Guidelines Manual that will be reviewed by the ACC's Board of Directors.
