## ★ Langley Wins Reno Earns One-Star

Is this 2001 being re-played? In 2001 Jim Langley, Red Bluff, CA, roared home in the late spring and summer to set a new ACC record for Master Points in one year (2,245)...and in 2003 he is back at his old tricks. He nailed a huge win at the Reno Independence Day Classic (272 peggers), earned his One-Star, and solidified his hold on first place this cribbage year, bigtime! His totals for the year are 2,045, some 200 short of his record, and he has events to be played before the season winds down on July 31.

Grand Master Sharon Hejtmanek (MT) had Langley in her sights in the final playoff match, owning a 2-1 lead (best 3 of 5), and dealing from 17 out to salt the match away. But Langley's streak prevailed, as she dealt herself a double-blank hand, allowing Langley to sneak in for the win. The final game saw Langley score a 20-hand on 4th street to keep his winning streak alive.

Sue Edwards (CO) and another streaking pegger...Harry Palmer, a two-star pegger from MA, finished 3-4. Palmer zips into the thick of the top ten race with this high finish. Master Egon Koch loves Reno, and continues his fine play with a top-qualifying 39 17/22 +343.

A huge crowd (180 peggers) stayed for the Consolation and One-Star Paul Hatcher (OR) broke a long slump with the win. Bruce McGillivray (CA), Master Bryant Gilkeson (NV) and Beverley Dewitt (CA) finished 2-3-4. Carl Ludtke (AZ) topped the

large field with a nice 9 for 10 (20) to win the top Q prize.

Bill and Dorthalee Irons, and Roberta Huff had their usual Friday game, won by Judy Calder (Canada) and a Saturday High Roller event was copied by Grand Master Darren Black (OR).

Grand Master Roy Banducci (CA) scored a 28-hand on Friday night, but that elusive 29-hand, worth \$1,000 in Saturday's sanctioned play, failed to show.

The Sands has been sporting a late Sunday game, and this time around it was Life Master Rollie Heath (OR) taking home the Last Chance prize.





## Jim Langley Repeats As National Champion

Jim Langley, Red Bluff, CA, had another year to remember as he has unofficially zipped to well over 2,000 MRP's for the year, and it is mathematically impossible for his closest pursuers to overtake him. He put his game in overdrive the past few weeks, winning three Main events and a Consolation, plus other high finishes to salt away the 2003 Championship. And to put frosting on the cake, he earned his One-Star rating this cribbage year as well.

It appears that Master Roland Hall, Napa, CA, has the inside track for the bridesmaid position, posting a win at Ventura, CA in early July, running his tally to the 1,500+ range. From that point on a bevy of players are making bids for the ten top spots and All-American honors. They are: Three-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT), Grand Master Mike McDaniel (MT), Two-Star Duane Toll (WI), Two-Star Bob Julian (WI), Two-Star Harry Palmer (MA), Life Master Rob Medeiros (MA), One-Star Wayne Steinmetz (WI), Master Cres Fernandez (CA), Grand Master Sharon Hejmanek (MT), Life Master David Clemmey (MA), Keith Widener (NC), Life Master "Ras" Rasmussen (WA), Grand Master John Furler (OR), and Life Master Ron Morgan (CA) all are playing one last match to get those last minute MRP's that will propel them to the All-American team.

2003 was a record-breaking year for scoring MRP's, partly due to the new scoring system for Consolation events (25% more MRP's), our player enthusiasm was also at a fever pitch for those in the hunt. Many were seen playing coast-to-coast in search of this honor.

## Slight Change at Winnemucca

The upcoming Winnemucca Fall Classic (Sept. 19-21) has made a slight change in their program. No playoffs will be held on Saturday night as advertised, Playoffs will begin at 8 AM on Sunday.

## McComas 0-10

Chris McComas (WA) has racked up 800+ MRP's this cribbage year, but he wants to forget the High Roller event at the Cascade Classic in Redmond, OR. He went 0-10! Ouch!

## WESTERN REGION WRAP....

**Alberta Mid-Week, Spruce Grove, AB, June 12:** One-Star Larry Samet was a long way from his Massachusetts home, and he tried to wrestle the crown from local Keith Gillies, but Albertans are tough on their home turf, and Samet settled for 2nd in this 52-player event. Director Doris Sanders had the players playing in a barn on the outskirts of Edmonton, and Harold and Marion Buckley's hospitality featuring cookouts made out-of-towners welcomed. Another stellar player...two-star Duane Toll (WI)...finished in the 3-4 bracket with Grand Master Sharon Hejtmancik (MT). Both players are in the top-ten race. Newly-crowned Herschel Mack (CA) topped the field in the Q-round with a nifty 24 11/14 +171. Life Master Jim Hornbacher (WA) ran the table in the 48-player Consolation, taking Q honors and winning the playoffs as well. Herschel Mack finished 2nd, followed by Audrey Hatto (AB) and Ron Saik (AB) in 3-4. Grand Master Betty Johnson (WA) won the Early Bird, and Bruce Denend (WA) took the High Rollers. Shawn Smith (AB) won the Last Chance. Bud Kessler score the meet's only 28-hand.

**Alberta Open, Edmonton, AB, June 13-15:** Linda Piro (AB) and Herbert Schaar (AB) were tough on their home turf, turning aside a bevy of Americans in this 85-player event. Piro took the crown and Schaar finished 2nd. Master Ron Logan (MT) and Lori Gunderson (AB) finished 3-4. Eleanor Arnold (BC) won 18 of 22 to easily take Q honors (38 18/22 +297). Two-Star Bob Julian was sporting a \$70,000 loaner Lincoln from a fellow cribbage player, and this unprecedented generosity inspired him to win the 60-player Consolation. Master Bob Wikstrom (WA) finished 2nd, with Master George Rodriguez (MT) and Jack Lycklama (AB) taking 3-4. Doris Harper (AB) took Q honors with a nice 17 8/9 +50. Satellite winners were Jack Lycklama, Bruce Pomeroy & Estellita Ells (DBLS), Duane Toll, Anton Ficko, and Erik Drazek. Ron Logan took the Super Q, and the team of Samet, Hofbauer, Toll and Julian took home the bacon. In an oddity, Irene Lamoureux scored two 28-hands in the main event, and Ed Sharun, Dale Bjork, and Jack Wifladt also scored this gem. Director Buckley reported players from 4 provinces and the NW Territories, in addition to 10 states nationwide.

**Cascade Classic, Redmond, OR, June 13-15:** Beverly Bliss blistered the boards in the Q-round and came home the winner in the playoffs as well as this Vale, Oregon pegger took home a whopping 207 MRP's for this outstanding effort. Jeanne Jelte (WA) was the last victim of this fine run, and took home 2nd. Jim Seufert (OR) and the streaking Grand Master Mike McDaniel (MT) took 3-4 in this 104-player event. McDaniel is in the hunt for top ten honors. Bill Devine (OR) won the 66-player Consolation, edging Jim Taylor in the final match. Taylor earned Master with this high finish. Leon Scott (OR) and the ever-present One-Star Jim Langley (CA) finished 3-4. Life Master Clair Morse won the Early Bird, and the doubles were taken by Dot Mickow and Sue Pisha. Master Lynn Gillespie won the High Rollers, and Three-Star DeLynn Colvert took the Saturday night action. Ann Haller and Bill Jones scored 28-hands, but no 29's showed. Director Liz Stockdale directed a well-run event.

**California Championship, Santa Rosa, CA, June 14:** 1998 All-American Bob Clark, a Master pegger from Walnut Creek, CA zipped to the win at this 80-player event, edging Master Ira Deutsch (CA) in the final playoff match. Mike Hurley (CA) and Life Master Steve Reynolds (CA) finished 3-4. Larry Williams took the Q prize with a 29 13/16 +177. Don McSkimming (CA) won the 40-player Consolation with Ben Holder (CA) taking 2nd. Jim Aleschus (CA) and Master Roland Hall (CA) finished 3-4. Hall's high finish all but insure him a spot on this year's All-American team. Grand Master Ross Njaa (CA) won 8 of 9 to take Q honors. George Momaney (CA) scored the meet's only 28-hand. Avon Ray is the director of this annual affair.


**Truckee River Classic, Kings Beach, CA, July 6:** The big guns from the Central and Eastern Region beat up on the Western players at this annual affair. Two-Star Duane Toll (WI) won this 56-player event, and another two star player...Harry Palmer (MA)...took home 2nd. Life Master Jones Hom (CA) and Master Bryant Gilkeson (NV) took 3-4. Palmer also scored the top Q score, and took home yet another 105 MRP's in his drive for top ten honors. Master Les Sumner (NV) won the 38-player Consolation, edging Pete Stemler (NV) in the final playoff match. Life Master Greg Schleusner (CA) and Master Valerie Sumner (NV) finished 3-4. Master Ira Deutsch (CA) won 6 of 7 to take Q honors. The Saturday night game was won by Mike McGammon, highlighted by Bryant Gilkeson's 28-hand. Ted Fuller scored an unbelievable five 24-hands during the Consolation qualifying round (7 games). At the St. Croix Casino in Wisconsin, that would be worth a cool \$125 bonus! Director Ron Morgan is also a Board of Director's member, and ran a top-notch event.

The top qualifier in this 130-player event was Life Master Lloyd "Gabby" Kraft (WI), and he won honors by a single spread point...33 15 +133. Jacka had a +132.

Perennial winner Two-Star Bob Julian (WI) took the Consolation (84 MRP's), edging Sharon Schaefer (WI) in the final playoff match. With 72 in action, Schaefer carted home 60 MRP's. Julian's fine run keep his hopes alive for yet another All-American award, an amazing feat, considering a long, cold spell beginning this year's action. ## Necktie?





The 2003-2004 season is almost here! Isn't it amazing how fast the summer goes by? I have a request for Grass Roots players. You will soon be filling out your Grass Roots Registration forms for the new season. They are reviewed by your Club Director and mailed to your Regional Statistician. They are then forwarded to the Grass Roots National Commissioner. The data on these forms is used all season long for reference and to clarify and solve problems. Many forms are received with incomplete information or are unreadable. Please try to **legibly print** your information. List your two digit state code when writing your ACC number. You know where you live but there are thousands of these forms and if you do not list the state code then someone else has to research the information and write it on your form. The same for your telephone number. Please list the area code.

## 2002 - 2003 Grass Roots Awards

During the past season we had **32 29 Hands, 383 28 hands, and 184 Grand Slam Scorecards**. These totals include the regular nine game tournaments plus the GRRT and GRNT. Each of us is fortunate if we've received even one of these awards! There were a total of 599 Grass Roots awards plus the Bronze and Silver Awards. I think we owe a BIG thanks to our Award Committee! **Todd Schaefer** and **Diane Waite** have spent many hours processing the paperwork and distributing the certificates and pins to our members.

## Grass Roots National Tournament

The 2003 GRNT is complete! A BIG pat on the back is in order for the volunteers who put these results together. Thank you to the 140 Club Directors and Statisticians, who worked so hard to run the tournaments, collect the entry fees, compile and proof the results and mail in all the pertinent data.

Our new GRNT Director is **Tom Bombaci Jr. of Club 245 in Grants, NM**. There were 1,850 official players from 140 Grass Roots clubs participating. Tom compiled, proofed, corrected, paid, mailed results and in general spent many volunteer hours to make the GRNT a success.

After Tom completed his tasks, **Kristy Haught** who is our National Statistician also spent many hours proofing and downloading the results. The last day our clubs were allowed to play their GRNT was May 31<sup>st</sup>. **Tom and Kristy** finalized the numbers and Tom had the results and checks in the mail prior to the end of June. All those records and so much work yet they still managed to provide us with the results in less than 30 days. A great job by two very hard workers! A suggestion was made and approved by the **Grass Roots Board of Volunteers in February 2003 in Reno** that will provide the results much earlier for the 2003 - 2004 season. The GRRT may be played between September 1<sup>st</sup> and December 31<sup>st</sup>. The GRNT may be played between January 1<sup>st</sup> and April 30<sup>th</sup>. This will give the GRNT Director the entire month of May to compile the results allowing the data to be incorporated into the Grass Roots reports by the end of the season. We will not have to wait an extra month for the final Grass Roots rankings since this will also allow the National Statistician to get the seasonal results out earlier. It will also take some of the pressure off Joan Rein when she compiles the list of players eligible for Tournament of Champions (TOC) invitations.

## 2003 Results

The GRNT top player this year was **Willie Evans (WA 66) playing out of Club 39 in Richland, WA**. Willie had a great 37/16/+385 scorecard, which included five skunks! His other accomplishments this season were: Club 39 Champion with 209 Gamepoints; finishing 23<sup>rd</sup> out of 1,454 in Region II (NW USA and British Columbia); and 84<sup>th</sup> (top 2%) out of 4,385 players in Division #1. (Clubs playing between 25-36 tournaments.) Well-done Willie!

**Marlene Stack (WA 1185) of Club 266 in Everett, WA** scored a 28 hand in the first nine and again in the second nine! Talk about a good day!! Way to go Marlene!

**Don Kunz of Club 202 in Boise, ID** provides us with some pointers about **DUPLICATE CRIBBAGE**. Eight stations are set up...each with a board and a hand dealt to each side of the board..... The remaining deck is off to the side...to get the cut card the players just turn over the top card..... Players discard from their hand to the crib and turn the cut card. (crib is determined by cut.) Players draw a number to be assigned to the station..... Once the play on the game has finished.... they return the cards to the location they found them (six face down with the cut card face down on the remaining deck). Players pickup their boards and move to the next station (to the right)..... and do this for eight stations.... score has been kept for each station by each player..... At the end of eight hands the player with the most holes towards the 121 is declared the winner..... The scorecards can be reviewed to compare same hands and pegs advanced to determine the skill level. Example: If one player makes 1'2 on a certain hand and another player advances 16 holes on the same hand..... a degree of skill or non-skill is indicated..... We intend to try this out at one of our Boise summer sessions. Feedback is welcomed. *I know nothing about Duplicate Cribbage so if you are familiar with it, please send me some feedback and I'll print it in this column... Tom*

Her play was curtailed in recent years, but the "old timers" will remember her with affection.

## Shuffling

I have enjoyed greatly the competition and games within the ACC but have found one major sore spot that seems too common within every tourney I have played in. My challenge is with how the majority of ACC members shuffle cards. I have hesitated having this discussion with anyone in the past because I am somewhat sympathetic of why I think this happens, but I believe most players do not properly shuffle the cards. I believe the reason why is that most players are of an age that does not permit their hands and fingers to function comfortably to do so. The rule states that players are to mix the cards atleast three times. Although the rule does not define "mixing", I assume that means to riffle the cards by holding half the deck in each hand and allowing each half deck to fall in a manner that mixes them. When many players do this, large chunks of the deck fall at once and they are basically keeping the cards in a sequence they were already in. Others do this in large chunks within their hands. However they do it, the cards are often not truly mixed at all. The easiest solution to me when I have a problem is to utilize my option of shuffling the cards myself and giving the deck back to the dealer to either shuffle a final time or often they ask me to just go ahead and cut. However, many players are offended by me doing this and I rarely do it because I don't want to upset the player. This past weekend, I was even accused by a newer member who wasn't familiar with the rule that allows me to shuffle complained that I tried to steal her crib. But even if I do it, I never have done it more than once in a game. But it is sickening to see the same run combinations in their hands deal after deal. Maybe I am making more out of this than I should. I know you have studied the statistics of the game and may have a theory that you can share with me that eliminates this common frustration or maybe we can improve the game by coming up with a more defined rule or just bringing this subject to the forefront of the minds of others resulting in discussions that leads to better shuffling. Although I previously mentioned that I believe most don't do this intentionally, there are a few that I believe that do not shuffle the cards well in an attempt to gain an advantage. For those that don't do it intentionally, and simply because of arthritis or bad hands can't riffle the cards in a traditionally manner, maybe they could adopt the method of shuffling that David Campbell uses where he splits the decks within his hands and loosely mixes each half within one another.




