Reno, Nov. 7-9: On Friday, players from throughout the United States and Canada converged on the Sands Hotel and Casino for some spirited Veteran's Day Classic pegging. In the "kick-off" doubles match, Ted and Denise Fuller from nearby Sparks, NV came home the winner...and began the weekend in style with the \$1,150 winner's purse.

The next day a great crowd of 326 peggers (up some 50 players from the previous year) began play in earnest. After the 22-game qualifying round, Dave Paulson (CA) came home the top Q winner with a nifty 36 16/22 +224 card (50 MRP's). However, the playoffs had MasterTony Montooth, Palo Alto, CA come home the winner taking home another 252 MRP's to add to his lifetime ledger, and a nice 4-figure winner's check. One-Star Paul Hatcher (OR) copped 2nd (196 MRP's), followed by Gerd Langkau (CA) and Victor. Struminger (GA) in 3-4.

With 224 peggers in the Consolation action, Milton Goodman (CA) scored a superlative 21 9/10+211 to easily cop the Q action, but it was Charles Dolge (NC) winning the playoffs. Gerry Klein (BC) finished 2nd, and Goodman completed a great event by taking 3-4. Rich Baird (OR) also finished 3-4. Saturday night's High Roller saw Charlie Dunn (CA) take home \$825 with the win. Sunday's Last Chance was won by Pam Pomeroy (CA) with a 16 8/9 +98 (\$400).

Once again, the Sands proves to be the cribbage capital of the USA with yet another large crowd. Barbara Woodward and staff rolled out the red carpet for the players, furnishing coffee and cakes three days running in additional to sumptuous buffet lunches. The Veteran's also benefitted from the event and were on hand to assist in scorekeeping.

Las Vegas, Nov. 14-16: The Las Vegas Open II played to a much larger crowd (150) than the inaugural event last year. Kicking off the event, it was One-Star Larry Samet (MA) taking the Early Bird action, followed by Grand Master Larry Phifer winning the High Roller.

The next day, Jim Huser (WI) walked away the top Q winner (and is nearing his Grand Master) with a 35 GP card. The playoffs saw perennial All-American Harry Palmer (MA) take the win, giving this Two-Star player yet another 196 MRP's (and is among the leaders this cribbage year). Life Master Don Flesch (WI) finished 2nd (and 147 MRP's).

The Consolation was won by the streaking Jim Crawford (CA), as he, too, is among the leaders this cribbage year. Rodney Rideau (CA) finished 2nd. A highlight of the meet saw Rosemary Hendricks win a playoff game, needing 28 with first count (all or nothing) and she hit the 28-hand! And that was her 2nd 28 of the weekend!



Tom Briski Takes Dells

Tom Briski of Fon du Lac, WI outlasted all 148 players to win the Wisconsin Dells Classic held October 24-26. Tom's opponent in the finals was Arlene Barrett, fresh from receiving her ACC Master Award at the GN in SD. Arlene held a 2-1 advantage in the finals and lost game 4 in the stink hole! Neither player had ever won a sanctioned ACC tournament but Briski took off in game 5 to win his first tournament, 196 Rating Points and \$1250. Placing 3-4 were Cyril Schmidt-WI & Bob Kilev-WI.

Mike Burns-MN held the hot cards in qualifying with a 35(16)+223 (22 games). A playoff oddity was noted as the top 7 qualifiers ALL lost their first playoff matches!

Don Flesch-WI topped all 80 players to win the Consolation Tournament. Emilio Perez-IL placed a close 2nd. Dianne Gurney-WI & Pat Upton-MN placed 3-4th. Newly elected BoD member Bob Milk-SD was the high qualifier with a nice 17(8)+109 (9 games) card.

Two 29 hands...0 28 hands!!! When is the last time you heard of two 29 hands in one tournament and no 28's? It happened at the Dells when Tom Briski held a 29 during Saturday night's play. No awards for this but it sure was an omen for Sunday. Then, during the Main Tournament playoffs Mona Wahlig-IL popped a 29 hand against John Hiland! It was exactly the same cards as Briski held...555J of spades, cut the 5 of spades. Mona won the game but lost the match. No 28's were held all weekend.

Tom Newland Runs Table at Pacific Coast



WORLD'S LARGEST CRIBBAGE PROMOTION

Seattle-area Grass Roots Cribbage Clubs promoted cribbage in a big way from September 5th through 21st at the Western Washington Fair in Puyallup, WA. This is the fifth largest fair in North America and the largest west of the Mississippi River.

Grass Roots volunteers promoted cribbage in a unique way over that 17-day period. They challenged visitors to a game of cribbage. Certificates were awarded the winners and information relative to ACC/GR cribbage program was distributed. Over 3,000 games of cribbage were played with fair visitors and approximately 700 walked away with one of those certificates. Over 4,000 ACC brochures, "Cribbage Anyone?" were distributed.

Approximately 4000 completed an entry form to be eligible for one of eight customized cribbage boards donated by the local clubs. Names were drawn the final day of the fair. Several who won those crib boards were from the Federal Way/Tacoma area.

It should be noted that the National Directory of GR Cribbage Clubs was available for use of those from other areas. Visitors to the fair come from every state in the union, Canadian provinces, and other foreign lands. Information was given as to club location, playing schedule, contacts, etc. regardless of how distant the club might be from the Northwest. The primary purpose was to promote cribbage and to create a public awareness of organized cribbage wherever located.


Over 120 volunteers hosted the display and promoted cribbage during this huge event. Some drove nearly two hours one-way to participate. This has been a highly successful promotion attested to by the proliferation of GR cribbage clubs in the area and by the hundreds of new members added to the ACC membership rolls since 1996. Lead Away From Cut Card DeLynn Colvert

When playing all-out defense, and you are the nondealer and leading the first card in the pegging sequence, lead away from the cut card.

For example, a queen is cut, and you hold 5-6-7-J. Lead the 7. If an 8 was the cut card, lead the Jack. Try avoiding leading into a powerful hand, as a couple of extra peg points in that situation could very well be fatal.


