Susan Chambers Wins Oregon Coast Classic at Chinook Winds

The Chinook Winds Casino was buzzing with cribbage players ... and pool players the first weekend in May, as some 275 cribbage players were in action in the downstairs bingo parlor, and 800 pool players were smacking balls in the upstairs conference rooms. Both groups had a great weekend, but the best weekend of all went to Master Susan Chambers (Albany, OR) as she walked away with the cribbage championship, besting Jim Jackson (OR) in the final match 3-0. Chambers took home \$1,800 for the win and 252 MRP's, and Jackson carted off \$1,400 and 196 MRP's. Jackson was beaming from ear-to-ear, as this was his first finaltwo finish. Master George Mackie (WA) finished 3rd and is nearing his Grand Master with this high finish. Life Master Clair Morse finished 4th.

Co-director and Life Master Jeanne Hofbauer (WA) smoked the boards in the qualifying rounds with a superlative 41 18/22 +248, barely edging Life Master Jim Langley's 40 GP card. Langley (CA) picked up yet another 100+ MRP's (aggregate) and winged it to a nation-leading 1,538 MRP's.

A huge Consolation event followed with 192 (Saturday night peggers in action. When the pegs were laid away at 5 PM Sunday, it was Chris McComas (WA) the champ, picking up some 112 MRP's for the win. 

With 172 players in the field, Medeiros added yet another 196 MRP's to his lofty lifetime total (7,000, lifetime) and vaults among the leaders in the Eastern Region. Dave Campbell (ME), Rookie of the Year last year, is still at also, and with a nifty 2nd place finish (147 MRP's) will also move up among the leaders. Armand Harnel (MA) and John Brennan (MA) finished 3-4 and took home 105 MRP's each.

And in a heartbreaker, Mitch Glass was asked to join the ACC before play, but he procrastinated. You guessed it, he scored a rare 29-hand. Alas, no \$100 from the ACC. He promptly joined after play.

Willie Evans, a Grand Master from Richland, WA, was smoking at the recent Greater Hermiston Open (OR) on April 26. He broke a 23-year record by scoring a 46 19/22 +476 and now lays claim to the ACC's all-time top 22-game score.

The 22nd game was a heart-stopper. Evans was playing Jan Caldwell (OR) and was 18 points short of winning with first count. Caldwell stood at 19 short dealing. Evans picked up a 1-4-5-9-9-K, all diamonds except for a 9 of clubs. He held 1-4-5-9 (flush) and discarded the 9-K. His best cut would be the 6 of diamonds...and you guessed it, up it came for a 14-hand. Evans pegged 2, and needed 2 pegs the next deal to win, and he pegged exactly 2 for the record score.

Master Emilio Perez (IL) scored a 45 19/22 +477 card two years ago, but Evans topped him by an extra skunk (8 skunks vs. 7 skunks) to claim the record. Feast your eyes on this record score to the right:

Wayne Steinmetz (WI), Harry Palmer (MA), Bob Julian (WI), Rgb Medeiros (MA), Robert Sommer (MN), Frank Danielski (WI), Warren Sondericker (WI), Rollie Heath (OR), David Clemmey (MA), and Douglas Henderson (WI) are all in the hunt. Almost all are veteran, highly ranked players. Predictions are that some 1,200 MRP's will be needed to earn All-American honors in this tight race. Many other players are but one major win away from the pace. This is one of the best races in ACC history. Cribbage fever, catch it!


