TOC: O'Malley JPW/ACC: Sommer

Reno's Sands Hotel and Casino was a sight to behold the last weekend in January. As far as the eye could see cribbage players were in action. Some 950 descended on the playing halls for some four days running beginning with the 13th Annual All-Star game on Thursday night (won by the Eastern Region...see story inside). The pegging was intense as players from throughout the United States and Canada were in competition for the years' largest prizes (The Sands added some \$10,000 to the prize fund).

On Friday morning some 512 players began a 16-game qualifying round in the by invite only Tournament of Champions. And it looked like it might be a repeat performance from last year by One Star Larry Samet (MA) as he qualified tops with a 30 14/16 card (\$1,200). But he fell in the early going in the playoffs, leaving the large pot in the final match for Mike O'Malley, Salem, OR and Tim Morrisey, Centralia, WA. O'Malley prevailed 3-2 to take home \$8,000. Morrisey walked away with \$6,000 for 2nd. One-Star Duane Toll (WI) finished 3rd (\$4,150) and Master Bill Hutchinson (CO) took 4th (\$3,000). No Master Points were earned, as this is NOT a sanctioned event (invite only).

Director Joan Rein sports a "Cribbage Bowl" in lieu of a TOC consolation, and a huge 546-player field hit the boards in this 12-game high-card

match. Bob Joslin (MN) won 11 of 12 with three skunks to cop the grand prize (\$1,600). Steve Palmer (OR) finished 2nd (\$1,400), followed by Scott Nordlund (MN) and Master Charlie Parker (MN) in the 3-4 slot.

After Friday's smoke had cleared, the granddaddy of all cribbage matches...the JPW/ ACC Open...began action bright and early on Saturday morning with a huge field of 950 peggers in play. After 22 grueling games, David Williams (MN) came home with the top score (39 17/22 +266) and took home the Q prize of \$1,500. One-Star Warren Sondericker (WI) is this meet's only two-time winner, and it appeared he was on track for a third title, leading Bob Sommer (MN) 3-1 in the best of 7

match. But Sommer nipped Sondericker in game 5, and used a 4th deuce peg at the skunk line in game 6 to draw even at 3-3. Game 7 saw Sommer pull into the lead early, and holding a 3-4-5-5 at the 85 mark, cut a 3 to salt the match away, taking home the \$10,000, some 315 MRP's and bragging rights galore. Sondericker earned \$6,000 for 2nd, and 252 MRP's to run his lifetime talley to the 14,000 mark.

John Dawes (IN) and Milt Goodman (CA) came close to the grand prize, but settled for a 3rd place tie...and \$3,200 each.

The second largest event of the year is always the JPW/ACC Open Consolation, and this time around a whopping 750 peggers were in action. Two months ago Beverlee Honeycutt (OR) astounded the cribbage world by qualifying with a 4-win card (all four wins were skunks), but this time around she made sure. She scored the top card (18 8/9 +178) to take honors. At 9 PM Sunday night Life Master Charlie Finley (CT) put the last peg in the winner's hole to take the playoff win, and he wearily put the \$2,000 in his wallet and headed home. Darrel Unruh (OR) took his \$1,400 2nd money and headed home as well. Mike Haggerty (SD) and Bob Turcotte (MA) finished in the 3-4 slot. Finley earned a whopping 180 MRP's for the win, as the new Consolation scoring system bumps the playoff numbers by 25%.

Directors Scott Kooistra, Roy and Jeanne Hofbauer reported nine 28-hands in the Main event, and another two 28's in the Consolation. With approximately 275,000 hands of cribbage played one 28-hand was scored every 25,000 hands, far less than the odds of 15,028 to one.

Scores of volunteers aided Rein, Kooistra and the Hofbauers, and this well-run show continues to be the cribbage year's glorious match. The gathering of the clan results in renewing old friendships...and some hot sideline games. And, as usual, the Sands and Barbara Woodward rolled out the red carpet for the players, furnishing coffee and cakes three days running, in addition to tasty buffet lunches.



Players came from far and wide for the big match of the year. The toughest trip was made by Jack Wifladt, Yellowknife, Yukon Territory. Travelling down the Alaska highway in January is not a fun trip, but this trip was especially tough. Wifladt's diesel truck blew an engine in a remote stretch, and after a long delay, and a 150 mile tow, he abandoned his truck and took a bus to Edmonton, then flew to Reno. The engine repair cost? A cool \$10,000+!

Henry and Arlene Carle (AK) flew in from Istanbul for the match, and claim honors for coming the greatest distance.

Martha Fingleton, a Hall of Famer from Wisconsin, finally qualified in the JPW/ACC Open. She had failed in the previous 17 tries.

Bill and Sharlene Medeiros (MA) had the fanciest duds by far. They both wore striking red and black outfits fit for a king...or queen.

Bill O'Malley (OR) and Mel Ashley (CA) undoubtably had the toughest match. Ashley won the first game by 7 pegs, but the next four games saw the games decided by one point! Four consecutive stink hole games, three won by O'Malley! He continued on to win the TOC! Close shave!

H. Ross Njaa (CA) won \$800 and splurged by buying two solid gold pegs (\$350). He will NOT play with them. They will be mounted and framed at his home.

Walt and Tana Conell (MT) played a 5-number keno game (good for the entire weekend), and were surprised during supper by seeing all five numbers called. Two nights free lodging was given by the Sands (at a later date).

Canadians love Reno. 26 players from Alberta were in the field.

CW editor DeLynn Colvert drove 2,000 trouble-free miles to get to this match and was one block from the Sands when he was stopped and chewed out by a bicycle cop for failing to see a pedestrian step off the curb on the other side of the street. Whew! No ticket, just chewed out! He reported he was amused at the hard-pedaling cop with his tiny red and blue lights flashing chasing his car! Damn! A red light ruined the escape!

Fiorini...Again!
On November 24 Tom Fiorini nailed down a win at the 116-player Yankee Classic, an on January 19 he has come home a winner once again! This time around, he won the 120player Super Lite Classic in W. Springfield, MA. The double win vaults Fiorini among the leaders in the Eastern Region and he stands at the 400 mark as this season hits the halfway mark. And he had to do it the hard way, as his final playof opponent was Life Master Paul Gallagher (MA). In a hard-fought match, Fiorini won 3-2. By placing 2nd, Gallagher races to the 6,400+ mark (lifetime). Another Life Master...Paul Drukman (MA)...took home a 3-4 finish with Master Bruce Brown (MA), and he has reached well over the 7,500 MRP mark (lifetime).

Brian McDonald (MA) topped the field in the qualifying round, winning 10 of 12 with a skunk (21 10/12 +128), to take Q honors.

Some 68 peggers played the Consolation and it was Life Master Brenda Palmer (MA) winning going away...and she has reached 8,269 MRP's (lifetime). She nipped Charlie Booker (CT) in the final playoff match for the win. John Cross (MA) and Michael McKay (NY) finished 3-4. Larry Harmon (CT) scored a grand slam 8/8 with a skunk to take the Q prize.

Directors Charlie Finlay and James Law reported Pat Frattalone (ČT) and Mike Jones (CT) scored that elusive 28-hand, but no 29's showed. This event is one of the longer running matches in New England.

Fran Ward Cops 12th Annual Virginia Championship

With several former winners in the field Fran Ward, Cary, NC came home the winner at the recent Virginia Championship in Richmond, VA. He edged Howard Terry (VA) 4-2 in the final match to record his first tournament win, earning 147 MRP's in this 68-player event. Terry, who qualified 5th, took home 140 MRP's.

Master Marvin Lewis (VA) qualified tops with a 37 16/22 +296 card, but was denied his chance to duplicate his 1998 championship as he and Master Russ Perkins finished 3-4. Lewis picked up 125 MRP's and Perkins nailed down 90 (aggregate) to edge ever closer to his Grand Master rating (3,685, lifetime).

A field of 50 played the Consolation and it was Steve Sattler (MD) all the way. He qualified tops (17 8/10 +133) and won the playoffs as well to record his first sanctioned win. Sattler bested 1992 Consolation winner Phil Babcock (VA) in a close championship match. Curtis Barbour (NC) and Ron Reece (VA) finished 3-4.

This match is always hard-fought and played at a brisk pace. The West finally had the top scorer in the 13th edition... Three-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT) (25 12/16 +126).

Lulinski writes, "I have appointed Martha Fingleton to be another member of the Rules Committee. Her vast experience as a player and judge will be of great assistance toward our formulation of another good rule book, just as we accomplished in 1998."




Chris McComas Teaches Cribbage

More for our newer Players!

Under the Grass Roots Rating Point System, players are nationally recognized for both current year and cumulative lifetime achievement. Grass Roots members are eligible to earn 28-Hand, 29-Hand and Grand Slam Awards while playing as a member in their own club or as a visitor in another club. Players must have a current ACC and Grass Roots membership.

Current Year Awards

28 Hand - Certificate
29 Hand - Certificate/Award/Pinette
Grand Slam Scored - Certificate/Pinette

Champion and Runner-ups in each of the three divisions - Award

The top 10% of the rated players in each of the 3 divisions will receive an invitation to the Tournament of Champions (TOC)

What are Divisions? Division #1 clubs play 25-36 tournaments per season. Division #2 clubs play 14-24 tournaments per season and Division 3 clubs play 13 or fewer tournaments per season. All of the clubs are encouraged to play a GRRT and a GRNT Tournament. This provides the opportunity for everyone to participate in a major tournament without the expense of leaving home.

Grass Roots National Tournament (GRNT) and Grass Roots Regional Tournament (GRRT) Champion - TOC invitation.

Club Champions - TOC invitation

GRNT and GRRT Tournaments only will receive the cash awards below in addition to the awards mentioned above.

28 Hand or Grand Slam - \$ 25 29 Hand - \$100 Bronze Award - 1,000 Rating Points Silver Award - 2,500 Rating Points Gold Award - 4,000 Rating Points

Those members who have reached 1,000 Rating Points or higher are also awarded a permanent, yearly invitation to the Tournament of Champions

OK! Now you know all the Grass Roots Awards. Next question is how do you earn these rating points?

In order to earn points, a player must be a member in good standing of the ACC and Grass Roots and participate in official tournaments in their "home" club.

Official tournaments: In addition to all other requirements, the 9 game tournaments must consist of a minimum of 6 or more members and visitors. The 18 game GRRT and GRNT must consist of 8 or more members or visitors. Unofficial tournaments have no affect on the number of tournaments played, or the "official" standings. They are considered practice sessions and may be rescheduled for a date not later than May 31st of the current season.

Grass Roots points (equivalent to the number of your earned gamepoints) are awarded to the top 20% of the total number of <u>members</u> and is based on the total number of members and visitors playing in an official tournament Normal rules of rounding apply $(14 \times 20\% = 2.8 \text{ or } 3)$ Only Game Points are used to rank the players. When two or more players tie for the last position, all tied players will receive GR Rating Points

Note: GR Rating Points for the GRRT and GRNT Tournaments are awarded by the Tournament Director and are based on the top 20% of players from all the clubs participating in the tournament. These points are combined with the points earned during the regular nine game tournaments and are part of the computation to determine club rankings.

Please help new our new Members!

Many new members play slower than most of us do. Perhaps we are playing too fast without realizing it. Give them a break and teach them the fine points of the game. They are playing with a bunch of folks they have never seen before, most of whom play faster than they do. The idea here is to acquire and retain new players and not to scare them off by setting standards that they are unable to meet in their first few sessions at your club.

Last season Grass Roots had one hundred seventy six Grand Slam scorecards; three-hundred-ninety-three 28 hands; and twenty-four 29 hands. For that reason please do not submit grand Slams or 28s for publication unless there are unusual circumstances involved such as more than one in a single tournament or if the event had some special significance. There is just not enough space in this column to mention every 28 hand or Grand Slam Scorecard!

One of those unusual circumstances happened in Club 271 - Albuquerque, NM on November 9, 2001. Max Condiotti (NM 75) threw two 5s in his crib. His partner Walter Wesselman (NM 70) threw in a King - 5. You guessed it, the case 5 was cut to give Max a 28 crib!

Fran Ward (NC 110) of Club 58 in Raleigh, NC is on a roll! On January 12th he won the Virginia Championship Cribbage Tournament. The very next day at his home club, Fran scored a Grand Slam Scorecard in regular Grass Roots play. His first three games were skunks including one over his club director Cathy Perkins (NC 110) That's no way to treat a lady! A big well done for Fran who is on the roll that we all wish for!

The Christmas party for Club 156 in Sunnyside, WA turned out to be a great day for Barry Morrow (WA 726) who recorded his first ever Grand Slam Scorecard. Barry came in with a great 19/9/+181. The first of many we hope!

Club 100 in Napa, CA reports that Dennis Gage (CA 1142) thought the prize money for the last 24 hand of the night was his. Not Quite! On her last hand of the night, Cheryl Van Scyoc (CA 1638) was dealt 3-3-3-9. The case 3 was cut giving Cheryl the pot. She also collected money from the special hands fund for a four of a kind 24 hand that also moved her into second place for the night. That individual hand was worth \$62. Way to go Cheryl.

New leader in Club 120: Elliott Havitz (WI 1902) has replaced Bill Johnson (WI 2328) at the half way point of the season. Elliott leads Bill by a mere two points. The top seven players are within six points so the lead could easily swap each week!

John Sturdy is rock steady! John made his 3rd appearance this season with a super 18/8 +153 to top all 20 players in week #18. John's only loss came in game #2 to Club 120 past champion Jerome Tork. (WI 71)

Five time Club 120 Champ Patrick Barrett doesn't like the cold weather but his cards heated up in week #19 as he topped all 21 players for his 3rd win of the season. While only a 15/7 +61 and did not break any records it was a shade better than the competition!

Some Ladies don't like Pearls! Doris Sanders (AB 257) of Club 261 and a very good supporter of Club 293 in Edmonton, Alberta, collected a complete set of pearls with a minus 177 spread on November 27th. Three weeks later on the 18th of December Doris came back with a vengeance and got a Grand Slam with a great 19/9 +146! These two Alberta clubs do not allow visitors to share in their Grand Slam Pool so it cost Doris \$264! As of mid-January, Doris and Ron Saik (AB 350) are tied for the lead in their GR club.

Club 295 recently held their GRRT Ray Desormeau (MI 1070) led the club with a fine 33/18/+241 scorecard and Mike Ardelean (MI 997) came in second with a 27/18/+65.

Another tie! George Mackie (WA 210) and Bryan Bordenik (WA 1257) of the Sea-Tac Peggers (Club 148 in Federal Way, WA) scored a 15/7 + 121 card on January 22nd. Both had 128 plus points and 7 minus points. While George and Bryan shared 2nd and 3rd place, Marlene Cook (WA 1860) made an end run around them and scored 18 game points to win the tournament! Bryan is currently the player to beat in this club and retains first place with 95 game points so far this season.

The thirteen participating players had 23 skunks, and players were actually standing in line to honk the skunk horn! This is approximately a 20% ratio. Does anyone know what the skunk record is in GR for a nine or eighteen game tournament? In New Mexico we'd call that a Skunk-O-Grande' evening!

Club 299 is a new club and they had five officers complete the ACC judge test in January 2003. You Central Pointers better not make any mistakes, big brother (and sister?) are watching. Let the arguments begin!

Club 273 in Marysville, CA is growing and is off to a good start in the new year! January 8th was their first tournament of 2003 and they started with fifteen members, which was up from last season when they finished with nine members. Playing Cribbage on the Internet?

Many of our Grass Roots players also play cribbage on the internet. There are many different sites in which to play such as www.GameColony.com; The Zone, Yahoo, Pogo and a multitude of others. While playing in these sites, you are not playing against a computer program but against other live players all over the world. Some sites are better than others, and some sites seem to overload their program with a larger than average number of high hands. The site preference is entirely up to the individual. It is a good place to practice, so give it a chance when you have time.

Ray Kimberley (IL 888) from Chicago tells us of a game he played online in Pogo. He was dealing and needed eight holes to win. His opponent needed eighteen holes to win and had first count. Ray threw 4-4 in his crib and kept 9-9-9-10 in his hand. A two was turned up. Pone led an 8, Ray plays the 10 figuring since he had 3 nines it was a pretty safe play. Pone played the case 9 for a run of 3 and a go. Ray leads a 9, pone plays a 6 for 15-2. Rays' 9 played for 24; pone plays a 7 for 31-2! Ray gets a point for last card. Pone has pegged eight holes and then counts a 10 hand to win the game. Ray says if he had played a nine on the first lead he would have won. I have to tell you that given the same hand, I think most of us would have played the 10 on the 8 lead. Conversely. If it was me, I would have tossed the 4-10 to my crib and kept the 4-9-9-9 for a guaranteed go and a six count.




