194 Attend Tourney Big Cahuna Tops Winnemucca

George Neujahr is known by his friends in Watsonville, CA as the "Big Cahuna!" And indeed he was at the recent Winnemucca (NV) Spring Classic. With a whopping 194 players in the field, he avoided disaster after disaster in the playoff rounds and emerged the champion, taking home a handsome trophy, \$1,800 and 196 MRP's to boot. Master Richard Wardenburg (CA), fresh from a win at the River City Classic (CA), very nearly repeated, and took home 2nd. Dennis Phillips (CA) and "Ras" Rasmussen (WA) finished 3-4. Rasmussen's high finish keep him in the national MRP race as this season winds down.

Master Angelo Torrise (CA) posted one of the highest qualifying round scores this cribbage year...a superlative 43 19/22 +364! And that is an 85 MRP effort!

Another large crowd (146) played the Consolation and it was Grand Master Wayne Glashan (CA) coming away with the win, and 112 MRP's. Life Master Clair Morse took 2nd, followed by the streaking Grand Master John Furler (OR) and Gregg Ginocchio (CA) in the 3-4 slot. Vaida Stevens (CA) posted a nifty 18 8/9 +124 to take Q honors.

Brenda Palmer Takes Eastern States

Life Master Brenda Palmer, W. Springfield, MA, won her 7th sanctioned Main Event at the Eastern States Open in Shrewsbury, MA on April 6. With a sizeable 114 peggers in action, Palmer added yet another 147 MRP's to her lofty lifetime total (8,500). Joan Fletcher (CT), noted for her cribbage novelties, this time around finished 2nd, adding 105 MRP's to her ledger. Gene May (MA) and Bob Fitzgerald (CT) finished 3-4. Fitzgerald earned his Master rating with this high finish. Life Master Bob Drukman (MA) scored 21 GP's in the 12-game qualifier to take Q honors.

Master Roland Hall was a long way from his California home as this pegger is in the national title hunt. He made the trip a rewarding one as he took the 58-player Consolation. The 60 MRP's earned keep him at the top of the leaderboard nationwide. Walter Brideau (CT) finished 2nd, followed by Master Pat Frattalone (CT) and Master Fred McGibney (NH) in the 3-4 bracket. Life Master Henry DeLong (MA) topped the field in the Q round with a nice 15 GP card (8 games).

Director Bill Medeiros reported that Kirk Hobbs scored the meet's only 28-hand. No 29's showed.

Dave Schwartz Alaska Champ

A veteran field of peggers were at it in Anchorage, AK on March 8 & 9 pegging for the Alaska Championship, and when the pegs were laid away only Dave Schwartz (AK) remained unbeaten in the playoffs. With 41 players in action, Schwartz took home 105 MRP's, in addition to bragging rights. Sam Derendy (AK) finished 2nd, with Arlene Carle (AK) and Mark Desinger (AK) finishing 3-4. Robby Robinson (AK) scored a nice 37 GP card (22 games) to easily take Q honors.

Pat Felcyn ran the table in the 28-player Consolation, taking Q honors (16 GP's - 9 games) and winning the playoffs as well. Grand Master Mike Rowe finished 2nd, followed by Cliff Bond (AK) and Duane Person (AK) in 3-4.

Director Heather Brean reported nary a 28 or 29-hand showed, but the pegging, nevertheless, was intense.

Beginning with a win at the High Roller game (\$950) on Friday night, this Spokane (WA) pegger continued on the next morning (and afternoon) to take top qualifying honors in the Main Event (36 17/22 +276). To top that off, on Sunday he rolled to the Championship to sweep this event bigtime. His take? Well over \$2,200! His MRP take? 197! LeRoy Sabe (MT) had never played in a final four, and he very nearly took it all. With the score at 3-3, Pinkley needed 7 and held 1-2-3-Q, and cut a 10-card for the win. Sabe took home 105MRP's for his effort. Grand Master Phil True (WA) is rolling this cribbage season, and this veteran pegger took home 3rd, and is nearing his Life Master with this high finish. Pat McNulty (MT) finished 4th in this 120-player event.

Wayne Wyman (MT) won this event last year, and this time around settled for the Consolation crown. Canadian Dennis Misenar took home 2nd in this 76-player match. Life Master Ron Morgan and Jim O'Roak (OR) finished 3-4. Randy Eells (ID) scored a nifty 16 GP card to take Q honors.

It would have been worth \$400 a game sooner! And as usual, Sharon Hejtmancik sported a great raffle, and 24-hand prizes were in abundance. In the Master Point race, McDaniel (WA), Langley (CA), Toll (WI), and Colvert (MT) all scored a few points and remain in a virtual deadheat for the national lead.

Tetrault Takes South Shore

George Tetrault zipped over from New Hampshire on March 23 to play in the South Shore Open, Canton, MA, and he zipped back home the winner! With 102 players in the field, Tetrault took home 147 MRP's...and the grand prize to boot. His last match pitted him vs. Reggie Toussaint (NH), and he prevailed for the win. Grand Master Louis Caccia (MA), winner of Grand National XIV in Plymouth, MA, still has the touch as he finished in the 3-4 bracket with Hall o'Famer and One-Star Phyllis Schmidt (MA). Grand Master John Rooney (MA) took the Q prize with a nifty 24 11/12 +176 card.

Rookie of the Year (2002) David Campbell (ME) is still rolling along, taking home top Q honors in the 50-player Consolation...and finishing in the 3-4 bracket in the playoffs as well. But it was Grand Master Joyce Vanelli (MA) winning the playoff action. She nipped Bob Fitzgerald (CT) in the final match. Fitzgerald may well have earned his Master rating with this high finish. Jim Lynch (MA) also finished in the 3-4 bracket with Campbell.

The T&T boys (Tetrault & Toussaint) are best friends and drove over from New Hampshire together. Did George (winner) buy Reggie (2nd place) dinner on the way home? At least it was a happy car enroute home. Director Jim Ready reported nary a 28 or 29-hand showed, but it was, nevertheless, a very competitive match.

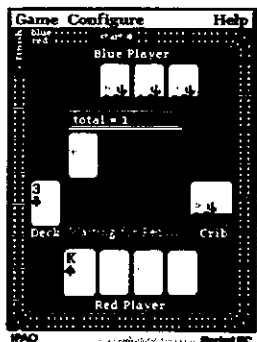

Rob Medeiros Tops Blackstone

Life Master Rob Medeiros, Dorchester, MA is at it again. This time around he nailed down the championship at the Blackstone Valley Open in Norwood, MA. With 114 players in the field, Medeiros took home 147 MRP's to add to his lofty lifetime total (6,900+). His last playoff win was vs. veteran Master Pat Llewellyn (MA). Llewellyn was rewarded with 105 MRP's for finishing 2nd. Master Harvey Glass (CT) and Emily Shwartz (MA) finished 3-4.

Life Master David Clemmey (MA) continues his roll this cribbage year by taking Q honors with a nice 22 9/12 +138. This added yet another 45 MRP's to his tally this year, keeping him among the leaders in the Eastern Region.

In the Consolation, it was another Medeiros (no relation) taking the action. One-Star Bill Medeiros came home the winner in this 64-player event, adding some 60 MRP's to his ledger (10,600+). Janine Bradley (MA) finished 2nd, with Marc Cinelli (MA) and Master Dorothy Boreham (MA) in the 3-4 bracket. Ray Valas (MA) was the top Q winner with a 16 7/8 +141.

Director Shawn Jordan reported Armand Hamel and John Brennan both scored sanctioned 28-hands. No 29's showed.



Duane Toll, Bob Julian Earn Two-Star

Duane Toll, Franklin, WI, travelled to Montana for some pegging action at the Montana Open on March 30 and was rewarded by earning the ACC's 4th Two-Star rating (15,000 Master Points). His lifetime point total has been confirmed by National Statistician Bob McCabe.

One week later, Bob Julian, Milwaukee, WI, was in action at the Mick Michaelis Classic in Marinette, WI, and he unofficially earned the ACC's 5th Two-Star rating.

Joe Bernard (IL), Phyllis Schmidt (MA), and Warren Sondericker (WI) have all topped 14,000 and are ranked 6, 7 & 8.

Mary Beth Carney Tops In New York

Mary Beth Carney, Springfield, MA, came to play at the recent Western New York Open. She not only qualified tops (36 16/22 +180) but roared home the winner in the playoffs as well. This outstanding run netted Carney 155 MRP's (aggregate), the winner's trophy, and New York bragging rights big time. Larry Tropede came home 2nd, followed by Bob Upton (MI) and Master J. B. Blough (MI) in 3-4.

Paul Eichler (NY) copped the 39-player Consolation top spot, edging Carol Draper (MI) in the final playoff match. Brenda Carson (MI) and Bill Kraatz (NY) finished 3-4. Kraatz also took Q honors winning 7 of 9 (17 7/9 +117).

Director Nelson Wheaton reported that not only did Carney win all the marbles in the Main Event, but she also teamed with Joan Fletcher (CT) to win the Doubles event. And Kraatz, in addition to a fine Consolation showing, came home the winner in the Early Bird event. Wheaton also reported that nary a 28 or 29-hand showed. The players were treated to that never-ending Niagara Falls in the background, helping make this long-running event a popular one.

Widener Remains Hot, Takes Atlanta

Keith Widener, Clemmons, NC, continues his hot streak by taking home the championship at the recent Atlanta Classic. In topping the 50 peggers in attendance, Widener took home yet another 105 MRP's, and continues to lead the Eastern Region with well over 800 MRP's in the bag. He also keeps his hat in the ring for national honors with the win. Judith Gallagher (GA) finished 2nd, with Terry Trogstad (GA) and Linda McSpadden (GA) finishing 3-4.

Grand Master Larry Phifer (NC) won 14 of 20 to take Q honors (30 14/20 +159), as he continues to pile up MRP's.

It was almost a David Foxwell show in the 40-player Consolation. Foxwell qualified tops with a grand slam (19 9/9 +126) and finished 2nd in the playoffs, picking up an aggregate 64 MRP's. Master Jeff Raynes (NC) took home the top prize...and 60 MRP's. Lou Gardner (GA) and Shane Lewis (VA) finished 3-4.

Director Bobby Stuart reported Master Joy Barnes (FL) won the Early Bird event, and Master Bernard Whitfield copped the Saturday night action. Judith Gallagher (GA) scored the meet's only 28-hand.

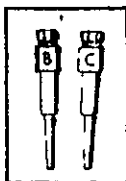

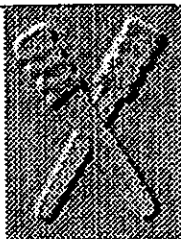

Survey?

In the March 2003 Grass Roots column I requested a survey on clubs that share or do not share their Grand Slam pots with members from other clubs. The results were to be in the column this month but will now be in the June issue due to the lack of response. So far I have received input only from the following 10 clubs out of a total of 163: 23, 82, 111, 229, 257, 261, 271, 290, 293 and 295. May 10th is my deadline for the June issue of Cribbage World.

Important: If you are a member of a Grass Roots Club and you sometimes play with another club, be sure to let them know that you should be entered into their member list as a visitor and NOT as a guest. If a paid up member has been entered as a guest instead of a visitor, it creates a lot of extra work for your Regional Statistician and/or the National Statistician to go into the website and make the corrections.

Award Certification Forms Testing: Club Directors in Region IV only (AZ, CA, CO, HI, NM and NV) may now submit their Award Certification forms for 28 or 29 hands and Grand Slam Scorecards by email to the Region IV Statistician. It is important that all the information requested on the form be filled out with the exception of signatures. You may also still use the postal service to send the forms but then you need the signatures. The method you use to submit the award certifications is up to you. This is a test and if successful will be adapted next season for all clubs.

Ras Rasmussen belongs to the Chehalis-Centralia (Club 232) and provides a Cribbage newsletter containing a wealth of information that will certainly help to improve your game. It is primarily about Club 232 but it also contains a wealth of other tactical information. If you prepare a newsletter for your club, many of the tips and the strategy included may be incorporated into your own clubs' newsletters. If you would like to be on email distribution for this newsletter, contact RAS at ras@localaccess.com. RAS

makes an excellent point in his April 9th Club 232 newsletter, and I quote: "Let's promote cribbage every chance we get as the wonderful game it is. Organized cribbage provides an opportunity to play tournament-style crib at home, provides an avenue for inexperienced players to improve their personal game by regular exposure to quality players, offers a social experience with a favorite game which often leads to lasting friendships, and allows local participants the opportunity to compete for Regional and National awards and recognition. If you like playing cribbage at home, you'll love organized cribbage."

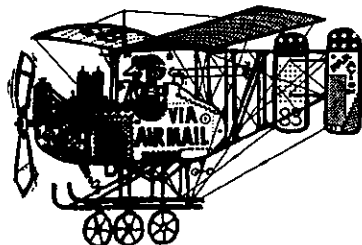

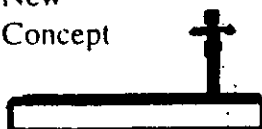

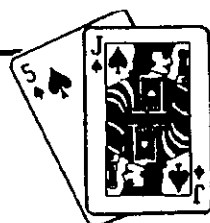
