AMERICAN CRIBBAGE CONGRESS

Dave Clemmey Rolling In New Hampshire

In last year's pegging action Life Master Dave Clemmey, Mansfield, (MA) scored 1,365 MRP's...and missed the All-American team by a scant three Master Points (Cres Fernandez scored 1,368...and 10th place). However, the 2004 cribbage year may be a different story as Clemmey nailed the 146-player New Hampshire Open bigtime! He qualified tops (23 GP's) and zipped to the playoff win as well and garnered 246 MRP's and he is off and winging in the new cribbage year.

Grand Master Earle Remington (RI) nailed down 2nd (and 147 MRP's), followed by Barbara Bouchard (ME) and Life Master Paul Gallagher (MA) in the 3-4 slot (105 MRP's).

Master Syd Lampke (MA) very nearly duplicated Clemmey's feat as he qualified tops (16 GP's) in the 66-player Consolation and finished 2nd in the playoffs. Only Master Joe Beauregard (RI) could halt his streak, and by winning Beauregard took home the top prize, 84 MRP's and bragging rights. Life Master George Bickford (MA) and Tom "Tossie" Shea (MA) finished 3-4.

Director Al Miller reported two 28-hands were scored...Frank Corrado in the Main Event and Kevin DeCoteau in the Consolation. The large crowd attests to Miller's expertise in running events. He is also the ACC's Testing Examiner in the Judges program.

Schnabel Takes Peach State

Local Tim Schnabel kept honors in his home state by winning the Peach State Classic, played in Jonesboro, GA or September 6 & 7. He had his work cu out for him in the final playoff match as he was pitted vs. veteran Grand Master Henry Douglass (NC) in the final playoff match, but his cards remained hot for the win. Question: did Schnabel buy into Douglass's famous winner take all pool Or did Douglas keep the pool all for himself? Cathy Perkins (NC) finished in the 3-4 slot and is nearing her Granc Master rating. She was destined to take GN XXII two weeks later. Jay Fortunate (SC) also finished in the 3-4 bracket in this 44-player event. Keith Widener (NC) topped the O round with a 30 15 +99.

Bobby Stuart (GA) is also nearing his Grand master by winning the 34-player Consolation. Charles Dolge (NC) took home 2nd, followed by Bill Cooper (GA) and Frank Podjun (GA) in 3-4. Cooper was the event's top Q player with a nice 15 7/9 +126.



Three players have also topped the 500 mark...Four-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT), Master Chris McComas (WA)(unofficially) and Two-Star Duane Toll (WI)(unofficially). Robert Wingo (IL), Grand Master Larry Hassett (OR), are among 11 peggers who have 300 or more MRP's in the bag. The 2004 race is heating up, with a record number of events on tap which should make for yet another exciting run for the roses.

Al Moy Nails Wine Country

With 82 players in the field, it was Al Moy (CA) coming home the winner at the recent Wine Country Open, played at Yountville, CA on September 13. His last playoff match pitted him vs. All-American Cres Fernandez (CA) and he prevailed for the win. ..and 147 MRP's. Rod Foy (CA) and Grand Master Mel Ashley (CA) took home 3-4. Grand Master Annett Eiffert (CA) took the Q action, winning 10 of 14 (24 10 +92).

Evelyn Gillmore (CA) recently earned her Grand Master and she proved it no fluke as she qualified tops in the 47-player Consolation, and zipped to the playoff win as well, netting yet another 84 MRP's (aggregate). Rodney Rideau (CA) finished 2nd, with Grand Master Boyd McDonald (CA) and newly-crowned Grand Master Bob Clark (CA) in the 3-4 slot.

Director Roland Hall featured a Grass Roots Regional on September 14. The winners: Shannon Schwarz (29 13) Cheryl Van Scyoc (26 12) Jesse Jarrell (24 12) Lorraine Lowther (23 11)

Hall also reported three 28-hands in the Main Event: Manley Masousek, Roland Hall, and Les Sumner.

Questions

New member Varne Kimmick (NM) has questions about our terminology in *Cribbage World*. They are:

What is a MRP? MRP's are Master Rating Points. You earn points two ways. First, if you qualify in the top 1/8 of the field, you will earn points (charts are available). The top 25% qualify for playoffs and all qualifiers earn MRP's as well. Charts are available for the playoffs as well.

What is a "Q" pool? A Q pool is an optional pool that players may play. The top 1/8 are usually the winners, but this ratio is under the control of the tournament director and may vary. Check out the rules before you play.

What are Life Masters, Grand Masters, etc? The American Cribbage Congress rates players by their lifetime MRP's. 2,000 MRP's will earn a Master, 4,000 a Grand Master, 6,000 a Life Master, 10,000 a One-Star, 15,000 a Two-Star, 20,000 a Three-Star, 25,000 a Four-Star, etc.

Chuck Sladek Sizzles at Sizzler

The Solano 29ers September Sizzler saw Master Chuck Sladek (CA) sizzle to the winner's circle, besting another sizzling player...Jim Crawford (CA)...in the final playoff match. Crawford had qualified first, winning 10 of 14 (25 10 + 248). Master Richard Wardenburg (CA) and Jay Sorenson (CA) took home 3-4 in this 96-player event.

Roger King was king of the 58-player Consolation as this Grand Master nipped another Grand Master (Herschel Mack, CA) in the final playoff match. Bill Johnson (CA) and Beverly DeWitt (CA) finished 3-4. Grand Master Ross Njaa (CA) won 7 of 9 to take the Q action.

Director Julie Mack-Felkins reported that only Marilyn Anderson could score a 28-hand. She reported a rare 52-point hand (pegging, hand and crib) was scored by Pat Farris (CA). Tom Nohrden (CA) was the unlucky opponent of this monster hand. Felkins also admonishes our membership to always check the deck before play, as a deck in play at this event contained 53 cards of weird combinations (2 aces of clubs, 2 7 of clubs, 3 3 of clubs, etc.). Especially check casino cards that have been donated, as many were in play in six-deck chutes, or a variety of other combinations.

Rodgers Tops at September Hawaii

Charlie Rodgers (HI) came home the winner at the 21-player September issue of the Hawaii Open. Richard Kodama (HI) finished 2nd, followed by Jerry Price (HI) and director Tsarkie in the 3-4 bracket. No Consolation was played.

New Rule Book Being Finalized

A new rule book will be published and the changes will go into effect beginning with the 2005 cribbage year (August 1, 2004). The changes are minor and are mainly a clarification of existing rules. One major rule change will forbid cutting the deck before discards are laid away.





Fast action by Ratso Roderick (OR) and Ron Logan (MT), plus a hurried 911 call by Sharon Hejtmanek, had Paddock revived and whisked to a local hospital in record time. Paddock had reportedly suffered an aneurism near his spleen and was in serious condition.

Braach's win gives him a foundation towards a "Rookie of the Year" award, and joins June Pafford (WY) as a first year winner. Braach's final match was a tough one, as he was pitted vs. Grand Master John Furler (OR), but his cards remained hot and he prevailed for the win. Top qualifier LeRoy Sabe (MT)(39 17 +344) and Patti Dahms (OR) finished 3-4...and took home 105 MRP's each.

Some 70 peggers played the Consolation and All-American Sharon Hejtmanek, a local pegger, took home the bacon...and 84 MRP's toward another run for the roses. Chris McComas (WA), fresh from earning his Master rating, is off and winging this cribbage year, nearing the 400 mark in the early going, and he took home 2nd. James Morrow (WA) and Daulph Plummer (OH) finished 3-4. Last year's All-American Mike McDaniel (WA) topped the Q action with a nice 16 GP card.



Grass Roots Registration Forms

You fill these forms out when you start playing the new season every year, right? What are they used for? Who does what to them? Last season there were approximately 4,100 players signed up to play in Grass Roots Clubs around the USA and Canada. After everyone fills them out, these 4,100 forms are given to the 164 Grass Roots Club Directors who sort them alphabetically by last name, check them for accuracy, make needed corrections and fill in any missing information. The Club Directors send them to the four Grass Roots Regional Statisticians who do essentially the same thing and also sort them by club, verify and enter missing ACC numbers. They make sure that all the players have paid their \$4.00 fee and mail the forms & money to the Grass Roots National Commissioner who reviews the forms and keeps them on file. All of the above volunteers are utilizing the data on the forms for various things and are referred to all season long at one time or another. This is why it is very important for each of us to make sure the form we fill out is printed legibly and as completely as possible.

Yes! The amount of Grass Roots Rating Points that you make on individual games can really make a difference! On October 4th Club 271 in Albuquerque, NM had thirty-three players in attendance. Four players ended the day with eight wins. Two of them had the following scorecards: Gus Frohlich (NM 44) a visitor from Club 245 in Grants, NM ended the day with an 18/8/+136 card and Shirley Kramer (NM 69) from Albuquerque finished second with an 18/8/+135 scorecard. That determined the difference in first and second place prize money! The lesson here is take every point you can get. The individual points may not seem critical at the time but they could make a big difference in the final totals!

Club 214 is in Topsham, ME. They have a prize payable to any player giving four skunks. After almost a year, one of their members got it and won \$165 on the same night he had a Grand slam scorecard. This lucky individual was Roger Talbot ME 138. He had a total of 22 game points for nine games. His spread points were +169. Roger started off by skunking his first three opponents and the last one. The card gods were definitely with him.

It was a strange night when Hermiston, Oregon's Club #2 played their second tournament. Larry Walton had a good night and won 8 games for a nice 16 card and first place. Second place was up for grabs with several of the total of 9 players in the hunt. As it turned out Gene Miller, Ken Capper, Keith Blanckman & Denny Edwards all wound up with 12 points & Denny Edwards all wound up with 12 points of the players received points. That meant that 56% of the players received points. There were only 2 skunks all night both by Denny Edwards giving him 12 with 5 wins.
