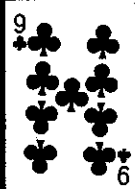
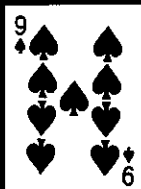

AMERICAN CRIBBAGE CONGRESS

National Open: Frank Reddy

The ACC's cribbage year for 2003 rang down with a bang as Frank Reddy, pegging out of Winthrop, MA zipped to the win at the recent National Open in Raleigh, NC...and very nearly earned his Grand Master to boot. With a huge crowd of 220 peggers, Reddy brought home 196 MRP's and bragging rights for this prestigious match. One-Star Bill Medeiros (MA) nailed down 147 MRP's for a 2nd place finish to add to his lofty 10,000+ MRP's. Andy Hulcher (VA) and Life Master Rob Medeiros (MA) finished 3-4. Medeiros' high finish propelled him to All-American team honors, as he finished the year with 1,482 MRP's and 6th place nationally. Rita Jewett (NC) and Chuck Yeomans (VA) nailed down 5-6, followed by Life Master George Bickford (MA) and Dick Corbin (NC) in the 7-8 slot.

Norm Vierda (MI) ran the table in the 142-player Consolation. He qualified tops with a 17 7/9 +126 to take Q honors and zipped to the playoff win as well. None other than Life Master Bob McCabe (WI) took home 2nd, adding to his lofty MRP lifetime total (9,000+). Last year's "Rookie of the Year" David Campbell (ME) and veteran Life Master Ray Boesel (WI) finished 3-4. Jerry Gooden

(NC), Life Master Helen Bolstad (CA), Keith Widener (NC), and Alan Wright (VA) finished 5-8. Widener's high finish was not quite enough to earn All-American honors. Nevertheless, Widener had a great season.

Director Catherine Perkins and crew sported their usual bevy of satellite events. The winners:

Director Perkins reported that four of the top eight were from Massachusetts. Players from throughout the United States and Canada make this last stop of the cribbage year a popular one, and, as usual, was played at the luxurious North Raleigh Hilton.

All-American Team Named

Western Region Winds Down Record Season DeLynn Colvert Tops 188 in Portland

Three-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT) has zipped to a win at the Portland Summer Open three times, as this last-ditch season-finale Western Region event has been very kind to Colvert. The first two Summer event wins propelled Colvert to National Championships (1986 and 1998), but the third time only gave him a 3rd place finish. His march to the title was a tough one, with two matches with Two-Star players, one match with a One-Star, and two matches with Life Masters. His cards remained hot throughout, and Colvert took home 196 MRP's, running his final tally for this cribbage year to 1,672...and 3rd place.

One-Star Paul Hatcher (OR) nailed down the 1998 Consolation event in Portland to earn a share of that year's title, and, once again, he was in the thick of the action all weekend, finishing 2nd (147 MRP's), and winning the High Roller. Life Master Todd Malmgren (OR) and Bill Bishop (CA) finished 3-4 and took home 105 MRP's each in this 188-player event. Recently crowned One-Star Roy Hofbauer (WA) showed his expertise in the Q round and posted the top score (41 18/22 +270) for an excellent 75 MRP's.

A large crowd (136) stayed for the Consolation and Debra Lucas, a local pegger, zipped to the win. This is only her 2nd sanctioned event, ever, and a great win, bringing home some 112 MRP's. Her final playoff match was no easy match as she was pitted vs. the streaking Life Master Rollie Heath (OR). She prevailed for the win. Heath carted home 84 MRP's and has him knocking on the door for a berth on this

year's Western Region All-Star team. Laurie Kenny (WA) and Jim Bailey (OR) finished 3-4 (and 60 MRP's each). None other than Two-Star Duane Toll (WI) took Q honors with a 16 7/9 +129 and he will head up the Central Region's point race.

Ira Deutsch (CA) needed four MRP's to earn his Grand Master, and he easily managed that trick in the Consolation event.

Director Tim Julkowski let it all hang out in the season's finale, and satellite events galore were played. The winners:

The playing hall was abuzz as play started on Friday afternoon, and in the very first hand of this Early Bird action, Ruth Fraker (CA) yelled out "28-hand" and the game was on. A few hands later Cathy Rendon also scored a 28! Julkowski reported record crowds at every satellite event as the 2003 cribbage season rolled down the curtain in the Western Region with a spirited finale.

10 Wins... and Qualified!

Richard Wardenburg (CA) is always in the news lately, and again, his play at Antioch, CA (Devil Mountain Caper) in mid-July raised eyebrows. In an almost unheard of qualifying round, Wardenburg managed to win 10 of 22 games...but he qualified! He won 7 of those 10 wins via a skunk, and his 27 10/22 barely made the playoffs.

Mini-Editorial Blind Draw Regulations

From time to time I have heard complaints about blind draws for seating being conducted behind closed doors, leading players, rightly or wrongly, to speculate the drawings are not fair.

The American Cribbage Congress's rules are quite clear on this matter. Players will be seated by blind draw (one exception: Peer Event in CT where seating is by peer numbers). I urge all tournament directors to allow players to draw for their seating, even though this may cause time problems as game time nears. But that is far more desirable than having players, with a paranoid bent, complaining about what may, or may not, have happened behind closed doors.

David Clemmey Takes Dennis Cousens Memorial

Life Master David Clemmey finished the 2003 cribbage season on a high note, nailing down the win at the 108-player Dennis Cousens Memorial (Maine Open) on July 13. With the 147 MRP's earned Clemmey zipped to 1,365 MRP's...and 3rd in the Eastern Region. He missed All-American honors by a scant 3 MRP's, as Cres Fernandez (CA) came home with 1,368...and 10th. Clemmey is named to the All-Eastern Region team, however. He is also knocking on the door for his One-Star rating.

Author John Chambers (see ad this issue) finished 2nd, followed by Bruce Hassan (CT) and Jeanette Verzillo (MA) in the 3-4 slot. Veteran Life Master Al Dinwoodie (RI) scored a 24 GP card (12 games) to easily take Q honors.

National Tournament Commissioner and Life Master George Bickford (MA) won the 62-player Consolation, edging Chris Cook (NC) in the final playoff match. Life Master Bill Shoemaker (CT) and Grand Master Frank Corrado (CT) finished 3-4. Corrado was also the top qualifier with a 15 GP card.

Directors Laurie Owen and David Campbell sported a doubles match, won by Louis Manter and Moyle, and 2003 All-American Rob Medeiros took home the top prize in the High Roller. Owen and Campbell also reported Tom Clark, Bob Cunningham, and Bob Turcotte scored that elusive 28-hand, but no 29's showed.

19

19 is a no-no number in cribbagemland, but in 2002 and 2003, that is the number of sanctioned 29 hands scored. The odds being 216,580 to 1 in scoring this rare hand, it is amazing how these numbers play out from year to year. It proves the old law of averages is alive and well.

And if it wasn't for Duane Toll (WI) scoring two of these gems this past season, 2003 would be an off year.

[The record year? 2001! Some 23 were scored.

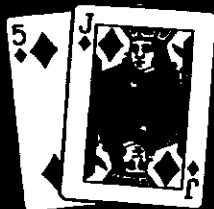

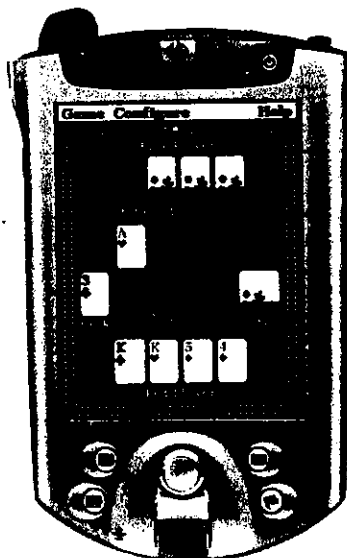

Devil Mountain Caper Jesse Jarrell...Again!

Two-Star Jesse Jarrell knocked down his 13th Main Event win (lifetime) at the recent Devil Mountain Caper, played in Antioch, CA on July 18-20. With 110 peggers in the field, Jarrell picked up yet another 147 MRP's to add to his lofty 17,000+. His last playoff match was no easy pickings, as he had Master Les Sumner (NV) to deal with. And Sumner has been streaking during a late-season drive for honors. Sumner finished the season with 1,203, and very nearly earned All-American status. He was also the top Q player (36 16/22 +221) and carted home an aggregate 155 MRP's to wind down this cribbage season in style. Basil Rudnick (CA) and Grand Master Roland Hall (CA) finished 3-4. Hall's 70 MRP's were frosting on the cake, as he waltzed to 2nd place in the national point race...and All-American honors.

68 peggers played the Consolation, and 1998 All-American Bob Clark (CA) zipped to the win. Charlie Dunn (CA) finished 2nd, followed by Dennis Johnston (CA) and the hard-charging Two-Star Bob Julian (WI) in the 3-4 slot. Julian earned 1,468 MRP's this cribbage year, and finished 7th, earning All-American. Jim Crawford (CA) scored a nifty 17 8/9 +133 to take Q honors.

Director Mary Gladish sported a full array of satellites.

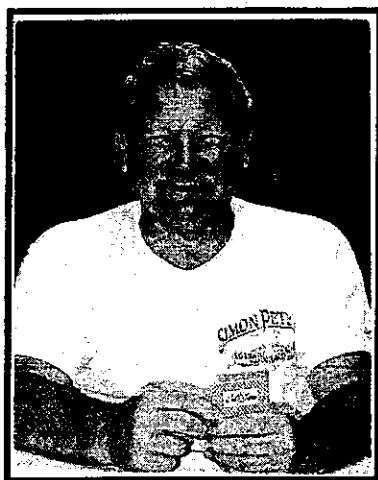

James Morrow Tops Masters Mid-Week

Sunnyside is a small farming town in Central Washington, but in early August it was the cribbage capital of the Northwest. Director Bob Brumley's invite for mid-week action drew some 42 players to a spirited event that was won by local James Morrow. Californian Jim Crawford nailed down 2nd, followed by Life Master Jim Hornbacher (WA) and Dan Marsh (OR) in the 3-4 slot. Marsh was also the meet's top Q player, coming home with a nice 34 15/22 +205 and an aggregate 82 MRP's for the mid-week action.

It was Ron Morgan's birthday and this California Life Master qualified tops in the 36-player Consolation, and zipped to 3rd in the playoffs as well. But Paul Roy (WA) nailed down the win in the playoffs, edging Norm Nikodym (CA) in the final playoff match. Nikodym is knocking on the door for his Master rating with this high finish. Bryan Bordenik (WA) finished in the 3-4 slot with Morgan.

A highlight of this meet saw first-time player George Gannon deal Carl Heath the ACC's first 29-hand this cribbage season.

Director Brumley reported the team winners: Sharon Hejtmánek, James Morrow, and Bob Hurst. He also reported great paybacks, with 102% paid to the players.

The big one seemed to keep slipping away, until he nailed the Sunnyside Summer Classic bigtime. With 66 players on board, McComas zipped home with 147 MRP's and easily turned the 2,000 MRP mark to earn Master. Veteran pegger George Mackie (WA) finished 2nd, and is closing in on his Grand Master with this high finish. Master Jeannette Nielsen (OR) edged Life Master Ron Morgan for 3rd. Morgan finished 4th.

Warren Endicott (WA) was the hot Q player, scoring a 35 16/22 +188 to take honors.

Two-Star Harry Palmer (MA) wound down a long stay in the Northwest by qualifying tops (18 8/9 +186) in the Consolation, and finishing 2nd in the playoffs to kick off the new year with MRP's in the bank.
