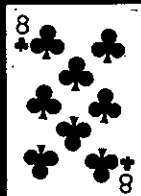
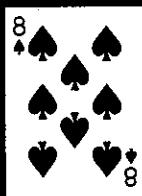

Rollie Heath Benefit

Fernandez Wins Reno's Independence Day

Grand Master Cres Fernandez (CA) is in the hunt for All-American honors this cribbage year, and he made a giant leap towards that goal by winning the 19th Annual Independence Day Classic in Reno on July 4. With a sizeable 230 peggers in action, Fernandez took home a whopping 200+ MRP's, running this year's tally to well over 1,300...and an excellent chance at earning yet another All-American team honor. Todd Malmgren (OR) came close in this huge match, and took home 147 MRP's for finishing 2nd. Steve Reynolds (CA), no stranger to All-American honors, finished 3rd, followed by Bill Jensen (CA) in the 4th place slot.

But the player who had the hot hand this cribbage weekend was Rollie Heath (OR). He began play on Friday night, and took home the bacon with a 8/9 card (\$640), continued on to take qualifying honors on Saturday (38 GP card), and took home first in Saturday's High Rollers event (\$650). His run was of the 2-day variety, losing early on in Sunday's playoffs, but, nevertheless, the hall was buzzing at his earlier scores.

Charles Sladek very nearly ran the table in the 154-player Consolation. He took Q honors with a great 28 8/10 +189, and finished 2nd in the playoffs. But it was Jim Crawford (CA) coming home the winner in the playoffs, keeping alive his quest for top ten honors this cribbage year. He is at the 1,300 MRP mark and has an excellent chance at earning All-American.

Don Brown (CA) captured the Last Chance event (16 GP's) and DeLynn Colvert, Bryan Gurden, Mary Gladish and Debra Lucas scored that elusive 28-hand. The Sands awards \$1,000 for a sanctioned 29-hand during Saturday's qualifying round, but no player had the good fortune to score one and garner that grand prize. But Rollie Heath dealt a 29-hand to Heidi Glashan (CA) in Friday night's opening action. Alas, no \$1,000 from the Sands, no \$100 from the ACC either, as this hand was one day early. This hand played by Glashan spoiled Heath's card (only loss in the 9 games), but, nevertheless, he managed to lose by only two points.

Players showed from throughout the USA and Canada, many in the hunt for MRP honors. Only Fernandez and Crawford made significant gains, and the race remains up for grabs for top-ten honors.

Bill and Dorthalee Irons, Roberta Huff and a bevy of volunteers, once again, did a great job in managing the huge crowd. The Sands, as usual, had coffee and cakes available three days running, and provided great buffets on Saturday and Sunday. And as for Bill Irons, he will celebrate his 80th birthday when the 20th Annual Veterans Day Classic is played on November 12-14. For his long and dedicated service to cribbage, America's players should attend and wish him the best of all his birthdays...he has earned this gratitude.

Jim Langley Wins Portland Finale

Two-Time National Champion Jim Langley (CA) came alive in the Portland (OR) Summer Open, winding down the ACC's season by winning this 149-player event. Down 0-2 to Four Star DeLynn Colvert (MT), Langley roared back to win three in a row and take the title...and \$1,000, 196 MRP's and bragging rights galore. One-Star Roy Hofbauer (WA), denied a run at top two when Colvert played three kings in succession (9 points) deep on 4th street with the score at 2-2 in a final four match, nevertheless finished 3rd by edging Nancy Lorenz (OR) in the 3-4 match. Hofbauer and Lorenz earned 105 MRP's each. Debra Lucas (NV) took the Q action with a 35 GP card. The field was evenly matched and the competition fierce as some six 26 GP cards made the finals, one a 26 12/22 card!

A large Consolation event (108 players) saw local Master Todd Anderson take home the bacon. Steve Hofbauer (WA) finished 2nd, followed by Life Master Rollie Heath (OR) and Life Master Jim Hornbacher (WA) in the 3-4 slot. Life Master Jim Gogolin (OR) took Q honors with a 17 8/9 +95 card.

James Morrow Takes Inaugural Emerald Valley

It was very nearly the Duane Toll Benefit event at the recent inaugural Emerald Valley Open, played in Springfield, OR in mid-July. Two-Star Duane Toll, on an unprecedented run this cribbage year, very nearly hogged all the action. Only James Morrow, pegging out of Sunnyside, WA, halted Toll's run by taking home the final playoff match...and the championship. With 116 players in the field, Morrow netted 147 MRP's. Toll, in finishing 2nd, also took Q honors with a whopping 41 GP's, netting yet another 180 MRP's, running this year's tally to a record 2,472. And he has one event to play...the Portland Open the last weekend of this year's cribbage action. Life Master Jim Hornbacher (WA) and Glenna Little (WA) finished 3-4.

The 80-player Consolation saw Dan Marsh (OR) come home the winner, nipping One-Star Paul Hatcher (OR) in the final match. With yet another 60 MRP's in his ledger, Hatcher is making a late-season run to earn All-American honors. Four-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT) and Nancy Lorenz (OR) finished 3-4. Sue Pisha (OR) took Q honors with a 16 GP card.

The host Elks club served a tasty meal on Saturday, and provided a reasonable bar to boot. The playing hall was ample and well-lighted, making for a grand inaugural event in Springfield.

Roland Hall Steady MRP Player

Roland Hall (CA) has been tattooing the boards for the past three years. He earned Master in 2002, Grand Master in 2003, and Life Master in 2004. That is a great run, making him the first ACC player to turn this trick.

Successful Saturday Open Bob Turcotte Takes Saturday Open

Bob Turcotte (MA) was among the 104 peggers who attended the Saturday Open in Nashua, NH on June 26. Bob came into this tournament on somewhat of a roll: (1) having saved his little dog from choking to death a few days earlier, and (2) turning in an antique Rolex watch he had found while golfing, for which he was amply rewarded. Before play began, he was even heard mumbling to himself, "I'm feeling lucky; I could win this thing!"

And, indeed, he did. After finishing 3rd in the Q round (30 MRP's), he faced Master Jack Marani (MA) in the finals, and came out on top, picking up another 147 MRP's. Robert Chevalier (OR) and Life Master Frank Corrado (CT) finished 3-4. Master Bob Cunningham (MA) was the high qualifier (20 9/12 +126).

In the 54-player Consolation, Master David Campbell (ME) edged Dennis Allen (MA) before heading off to Baltimore (with several other players) for the Summer Special. Paula Abele (MA) and Two-Star Phyllis Schmidt (MA) finished 3-4. Walter Brideau (CT) took Q honors with a nice 16 7/8 +126.

Directors Henry and Paula Bergeron want to thanks everyone who helped make this tournament a success. They had thought that this would be a one-time affair, but with the large crowd, they have already decided to hold it again next year, June 25, on the Saturday after Father's Day. Turcotte said he'll be back to defend his title, as he walked out the door with the winner's trophy tucked firmly under his arm.

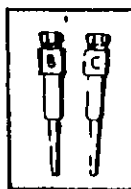

Director Scott Kooistra fielded his usual satellite games. The winners: Friday: Wayne Steinmetz; Saturday: Larry Holtan; All-Events: Wayne Steinmetz (62 GPs); 28-hand: Martha Fingleton.

Condensation Board of Directors Meeting Reno, February 5, 2003

All members present. Final clocks from Sands distributed to BOD members. No corrections to last meeting's minutes. Shimp discussed Audit-On-Line Access of Bank Account. Deferred to McCabe to review.

Perkins discussed Compensation Committee actions, insofar as webmaster compensation was concerned. BOD voted to ask for volunteers. Rules for new Rule Book discussed and agreed upon. Dave Aiken helped in editing, re-writing, and suggestions. Bids to be mailed to Colvert for action. Jostens Printing in CA low bidder. 10,000 books to be printed and sold for \$1 each for six months, then \$2 would be charged.

Rollie Heath reported contracts signed for GN in Lincoln City, OR (Chinook Winds Casino). Kathy Blough to head up consumer show in Columbus, OH June 24-June 27, drawing 16,000 attendees. Show features game manufacturers and event rooms, featuring bridge, chess, etc.

Julian reported insurance rates would rise to \$2,400 or so, changed policy to State Farm for \$1,122. McCabe presented Financial Report, showing operating loss of \$12,070. Cash reserve of \$124,210. McCabe expects improvement in FY 2004, and foresees loss in \$5,000 range.

Webmaster position discussed, with Internet cribbage. ACC picked up 32 new members in internet events, with most players ACC members. Mike Schell and Bob Milk leading the way in internet play.

Edge TV made pitch to televise ACC Open in 2005 and 2006, and a contract would be presented to the ACC at a later date.

Tom Gallagher (WI) interested in hosting GN in Green Bay in 2006, and made tentative bid.

Bernard reported two members suspended, and one under consideration.

Rein discussed TOC. 2005 and 2006 TOC and ACC Open will be played at the Sands in Reno.

Rein distributed an "Oath of Office" for each BOD member to sign, will be published in Cribbage World prior to nominations for election to BOD.

Bickford's committee's proposal to charge sanctioning fee for Consolation events (if player did not play Main) defeated.

David O'Neil updated BOD on GN XXIII in Atlanta. Rooms to be \$77 (group rate) with \$2 a day parking fee.

Colvert discussed "Rookie of Year" award, and will be awarded unless voted otherwise in future.

Julian formed a restructuring committee to explore Shumate's proposed Southwest Region. Further study will be presented to the BOD for action.

Barrett conducted vote for Hall of Fame. No nominees received required votes.

Meeting adjourned, next meeting: September 17, 2004 in Atlanta.

The tournaments have been played, the numbers are in the mill, and National Statistician Bob McCabe will be burning the midnight oil to get the final numbers to *Cribbage World* for early publication in the September issue.

Stay tuned for September's *Cribbage World*.

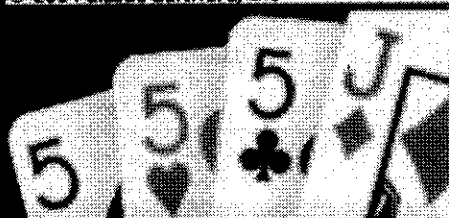

Rule of the month review

Players shall lay their cards face up on the table and announce the value of the card. As each successive card is played, the cumulative total count shall be announced.

Cards played must be positioned so that the identity of the previously played cards are clearly visible. Cards may not be turned over before all cards of both players have been played and pegged.

Grass Roots Registration

Grass Roots Registration for the 2004 - 2005 season will be much easier thanks to a great suggestion made by Gary Sumner of Club 164. The Club Director or Club Statistician of each club is encouraged to print Grass Roots Report 2b sometime in August. This report lists all Club Members, addresses, phone numbers and email addresses. Club members verify or change the data on the report, initial to the left of their name and pay their \$5 Grass Roots Registration fee. If possible, club members start paying their fee sometime in August so that the Club Director may send it to the Regional Statistician as early as possible in September. Club Directors should cross off those members who do not register using report 2b. After the initial submittal of Report 2b, the individual registration forms will be used for those members who join later and also for all new club members.

Increase Grass Roots Membership:

Those clubs desiring to increase their membership should try to reestablish contact with former members and ask them to come back. Perhaps they had a good reason to stop playing during the last few seasons. Maybe they would rejoin if asked. It's certainly worth a try! Another method is to pay a \$10 bounty to any current member who brings in a brand new player. Club 245 in Grants, NM does this. The bounty is paid when the new member joins both the ACC and Grass Roots.

REVIVING OUR VOLUNTEER CRIBBAGE ORGANIZATIONS

With best intentions, from Mel Ashley, Club 82, Monterey, CA

Assumptions:

1. Most clubs wither and/or die when too few leaders and volunteers exist.
2. New membership is not constantly pursued and wooed. TIPS: Tried and true: 1. Activities and programs for every meeting should be planned in advance for the whole year. They should be generic, not specialized and dull.
2. ADVERTISING must be ongoing: Newspapers, TV, Flyers or Posters,
3. VISITORS are romanced, not ignored.
4. NEWSLETTER to members letting them know what they missed and pumping them

up to attend the next one.

5. Make phone calls to members who miss more than one meeting to inquire if all is well. is well. "Have you been ill? We've missed you."

6. Business reports are virtually eliminated. Announcements are short. Most "stuff" can be published in the newsletter and add a few lines to the weekly statistics for the club

7. DELEGATE! Most members do not feel they can "lead"! Or they don't want a long-term commitment. But they would be happy to do a small, or one-time chore. (Pass out cards; set up boards, keep some records, etc.) Get to know your members and ask them to do a task you think they would be perfect for. When they feel needed or useful it becomes "their" club instead of "yours." I think something like this could be sent to all Club Directors. Then they could follow up with specific coverage of one point at a time - giving practical suggestions and contributing things their club does or have tried.

Some Uniqueness

Eighteen cribbers from the various South Puget Sound Crib Clubs gathered recently for an unofficial 9-game crib tournament with unique results. First and second places were both 12 points with 5 wins; third through sixth place (we paid 1/3) were all 11 points with 5 wins. When was the last time 12/5 won first place in YOUR club? This is the same group that, about a year ago, played some 323 games of cribbage in two back-to-back 9 and 5-game unofficial tournaments without a 24 hand making an appearance, thereby dictating that during this most recent tournament the "last 24-hand" award was given for the last "21-hand" of the tourney, and the "last 21-hand" designation did pass around quite a bit more so this time.

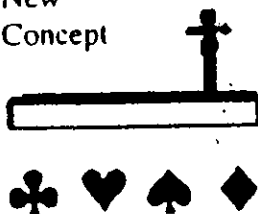

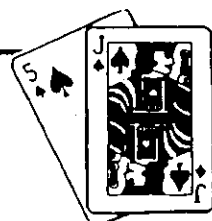
