Bill Irons Birthday: High Q Score **Vets Day: Glenn Scott**

The Sands Regency in Reno was abuzz with But when the playoffs had wound down, it was peggers celebrating Veteran's Day with some spirited cribbage action. The play began in earnest on Friday night as a huge field played for the doubles crown. Two Oregon veterans nailed down that win (Paul Hatcher and Rollie Heath) and this duo took home a whopping \$1,100 to kick off play for the weekend. A highlight of this event saw Charlie Dolge (NC) score a very rare 29-hand (only 5 cards are dealt to each player in doubles). Alas, this gem was a day early and did NOT earn the \$1,000 offered for a 29-hand during qualifying round play on Saturday.

312 peggers kicked off the Veteran's Day Open on Saturday morning, and when the action wound down after the 22-game round it was Bruce Sattler (MD) taking home the top score with a superlative 40 18/22 +275....and his Grand Master rating to boot! After two rounds of playoffs on Saturday night, play continued bright and early on Sunday. Klamath, CA's Glenn Scott zipped to the win, nipping Life Master Mel Ashley (CA) in the final playoff match. Scott took home 252 MRP's (and \$1,900) and Ashley added 196 to his lifetime ledger. 2004 All-American Cres Fernandez (CA) and Boyd Horne (CA) finished 3-4.

Master Bill Irons (NV) was celebrating his 80th birthday, and nailed down his own birthday present by topping the 214-player Consolation field. He staff ran their usual well-run event, attested to scored a great 21 9/10 +155 card to take honors. by yet another large crowd.

William MacDonald (CA) standing alone undefeated. His last playoff victim was Richard McNeil (OR). MacDonald garnered 112 MRP's for being tops, and McNeil took home 84 MRP's for 2nd. Life Master Greg Schleusner (CA) and Marilyn Gaudreau (MA) finished 3-4. A highlight saw Cy Madrone (CA) score a 29-hand in the 4th game of the qualifying round to earn \$100 from the ACC for a sanctioned 29hand, but it was a day late to earn the Sand's \$1,000 29-hand bonus. Madrone also lost the game by a single point.

A High Roller event was played on Saturday night and Life Master Mary Herrmann (CA) scored a nifty grand-slam (199/9) to take home the top prize.

In addition to the two 29-hands, five peggers also scored that elusive 28-hand. They were: Glenn Scott, Mary Gladish, N. E. Thornsberry, Richard Frost, and Carol Henderson.

Once again, the Sands (and Barbara Woodward) rolled out the red carpet for the players, furnishing coffee and cakes for the weekend, in addition to an excellent Saturday buffet. The Sands added \$2,500 to the prize fund as well. Bill and Dorthalee Irons, Roberta Huff, and

With door prizes galore adding to the gala event, it was Canada's Linton Walker taking home the top prize (\$580), scoring a 17 7/9 card.

Irons has been the ringleader in organizing cribbage play at the Sands, having his first event played in the early 1980's, and continues to host popular events at the Sands twice-yearly. The Sands also hosts the granddaddy of all cribbage events with the Tournament of Champions and the ACC Open in early February. Some 1,000 players are on board for these events, vying for the \$10,000 top prize paid to the ACC Open champion!

Tom Maresh Tops Illinois Open

With 111 players in the field, Grand Master Tom Maresh (WI) zipped home the winner at the Illinois Open, played at Crystal Lake on November 5. Another Grand Master, Doug Henderson (WI) finished 2nd, followed by Jerry Newhouse (WI) and Ken Mueller (IL) in the 3-4 bracket. One-Star Frank Danielski (WI) topped the field in the Q round with a nice 37 16/22 +220 card (55 MRP's).

George Stankus (IL) took home the win in the 67player Consolation, nipping veteran Life Master John Hiland (WI) in the final playoff match. Dave Drew (IL) and Grand Master Don Brown (CA) took hoime a 3-4 finish. Alice Korn (IL) won 8 of 9 to take the Q action (18 8/9 +152).

Director Marvin Lang fielded Friday and Saturday night games, with Brenda Carson (MI) winning Friday, and Patrick Grage (IL) winning Saturday's action. Lang also reported that Larry Collins, Dave Drew, and John Kolby scored 28-hands. No 29's showed.

LaGassie earned his Master rating (the ACC's 589th) with this high finish. Donna Aird (MI) topped the field in the Q round with a great 36 GP card (50 MRP's).

Old pro Warren Sondericker (WI) added to his Two-Star lifetime ledger by winning the 71-player Consolation, nipping Master Karen Bouffiou (WI) in the final playoff match. One-Star Martha Fingleton (WI) and Grand Master Alan Lindner finished 3-4. Dale Rohm's 15 GP card took Q honors.

Director Eugene Mikulsky reported Paul Kilkelly won the Time Passer on Friday, and Doug Henderson took home the top prize in the Friday night game. LaGassie added icing to his cake by also winning the Saturday Night Special in his tune-up for his high finish on Sunday, netting him his Master rating. Jerry Gruber of Minnesota & John Syftestad of Wisconsin placed 3-4 in the playoffs. Doug Munneke had a huge weekend as he was the top qualifier in the main with 37(18)+166, won the Friday night tournament with 17(8)+120 and placed 1st in the All-Events pool with 62 points. Munneke won an astounding 26 of 31 games between Friday night & Saturday's qualifying good for take home pay of \$2200 for the weekend, before the main tournament playoffs!







One of the best things about ACC Internet Cribbage is its geographical reach, and this column often publicizes the success of players from such far-flung places as Newfoundland, Wyoming and Saskatchewan, where there is little organized over-the-board cribbage. Participating in ACC Internet Cribbage has always been a great way to meet members from interesting places all over North America, and now we can add France to the mix.

Yes, for the first time, an ACC tournament has been won by a player sitting in Europe, as Andy Roland (muesli64), playing from La Croix Valmer in the French Riviera, won the Saturday, October 23 Pegging Pals single elimination event, the first such victory by a player not residing in the Western Hemisphere. Roland topped the 62 player field by prevailing over Hawaii's Elana Kobayashi (NinjaNin) in the Finals. The eleven-hour time difference between these two players connecting from opposite sides of the planet must have set another record for sanctioned cribbage. Globalization has truly come to the ACC.

While our tournaments are reaching farther and farther around the world, our Top Ten is spinning in place, with eight players, including the seven highest ranked ones, returning from last month's list. Mark Van Dyke (loosespokes1135) had one of his patented breakout months (see Cribbage World, August 2004), winning one tournament and reaching the Semifinals in two others to take the lead with 360 Internet Rating Points (IRPs). John Schafer (netview85) of Battle Creek, MI is right behind him with 342 IRPs. Scott Buhrow (MrB_IA218) of Louisville, KY rounds out the 300 club with 323 IRPs.

Ronald Ralston (rdr1231) of Hartford, IA and Kelly Ann Burgar (lil_thummper) of Edmonton, AB are the newcomers in the Top Ten, with Rodgers, Allen, Fetchel, Partain and Olney retaining their honor from September. All are quality players that always seem to be in the Internet Championship race.





Rule of the month review:

Pegging out to win the game

A player should peg out into hole 121 to complete a game. However, if a player performs an action similar to any of the following, it shall be considered equivalent to pegging out or reaching the game hole. (1) Recording the game as a win on a scorecard. (2) Placing their peg into one of the game record holes. (holes used on some boards to record the number of games won.) (3) Advancing a game-record peg. (See Rule 8.10(3) b, c, and d for details.)

Grass Roots National Tournament (GRNT) Guidelines: By Now all of the Grass Roots Club Directors should have received a package on conducting your GRNT. Some reminders:

 The GRNT is an 18 game GR tournament that is highly desirable but not mandatory.

 This tournament may ONLY be played between January 1st and April 30th 2005.

3) The cost is \$11.00 for an official tournament entry and \$3.00 if it is an unofficial entry. Players must inform the hosting Club Director which it is.

 Club Directors need to make certain that all the participants have paid both their ACC Membership fees and Grass Roots Registrations prior to the start of the tournament.

5) All scoreshects, tournament reports, award certifications and money must be sent to the GRNT Tournament Director. He is also the person you contact with ANY questions. If you have only one Jack in your hand as non-dealer, how should I play the hand?

By Ras Rasmussen (WA)

Might be a good lead from your hand. Then you're rid of it on the opening play. The danger represented by the trap of a single Jack is considerable. The jack is considered by most to be the second most available card to trap in cribbage. Only the five is more frequently trapped. Other cards that pose danger when held singly are the ace and deuce. A lone three or four can sometimes lead to trouble at end of pegging sequence as well. Take a good look at your hand. Maybe that dangerous single ought to be tossed to crib. You're not likely to do that with the fivespot to your opponent crib, but might consider that for sure with a lone ace, deuce, or trey. If you didn't put in crib, consider leading it even if the five. The risk of holding one of these singles is much greater to the non-dealer although it is possible for dealer to be trapped as well.




