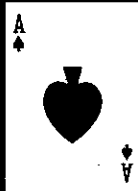
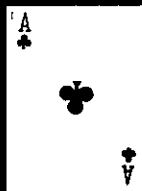

Record 244 At Lincoln City, OR **Chinook Winds: Bob Diefenbach**

In mid-December some 244 peggers descended on the Chinook Winds Casino in Lincoln City, OR for some spirited pegging. With the rain, wind, and hail buffeting the Oregon Coast, the players were warm as toast in the casino, and the pegging was also toasty...especially for Bob Diefenbach from nearby Newport Beach. He began the weekend's pegging by zipping to the Early Bird win (\$445) and continued on to take the Main Event title as well (\$1,615). This grand run netted some 196 MRP's and bragging rights galore. Two-Star Duane Toll (WI) came very close, losing 3-2 in the final match, but with the 147 MRP's earned has vaulted to the National MRP lead, standing at the 900 mark for this cribbage year. The final game saw Diefenbach needing 12 to win with first count, holding 4-J-Q-K (all diamonds), and cut the ace of diamonds to win going away! Life Master Jim Gogolin (OR) nipped Grand Master Mel Ashley (CA) by a single point to finish 3rd (\$1,000), Ashley took home 4th (\$700). Life Master Todd Malmgren was smoking in the qualifying round, and posted a high Q score (39 17/22 +245), netting 65 MRP's for the card.

Steve Harding (CA) and Millie Moritzky (WA) banged heads for the Consolation title with Harding barely coming home with the win 2-1. Jim Bailey (OR) and Keith Blackman (OR) finished 3-4. Bill

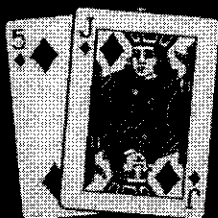
O'Malley (OR), fresh from a win a week earlier at the Seven Feathers event, continues his run by posting a grand slam 19 9/9 card to take Q honors.

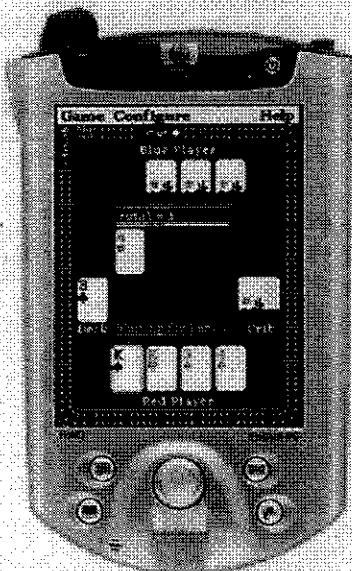

Toll has 900 MRP's in the bank as we hit into the new year, with seven month's play remaining.

In the Eastern Region, Two-Star **Harry Palmer** (MA) and One-Star **David Clemmey** (MA) are battling for the lead, with both players over the 700 mark (unofficially). Life Master **Bob McCabe** (WI) is hot on Toll's heels in the Central Region, while out west a bevy of players are in the hunt for honors. Grand Master **John Furler** (OR), Four-Star **DeLynn Colvert** (MT), newly-crowned Master **Jim Crawford** (CA), Life Master **Ron Morgan** (CA), and Grand Master **Roland Hall** (CA) are in the 600-700 range. Many other peggers are but a stone's throw behind. The race is on. Cribbage fever, catch it!

John Delinsky Red Hot at Charm City Classic

It was John Delinsky's weekend at the recent Charm City Classic, Laurel, Maryland on November 8-9. This Bowie, Maryland pegger blistered the boards all weekend, beginning with taking the Friday Early Bird and continuing on to take Q honors in the Main Event, and if that were not enough, zipped to the championship in the playoffs as well. This run netted Delinsky 197 MRP's (aggregate), and bragging rights galore.

Keith Widener, (NC), a newly crowned Master, has a recent history of close finishes. He took 2nd this time around, just missed earning All-American honors last year, and just missed being elected to the Board of Directors. But 2nd isn't all bad as he took home yet another 105 MRP's in his run for the roses this cribbage year. Nancy Roncetti (PA) and Norm Herbert (MD) took home 3-4, with each player earning 70 MRP's.

Jeff Raynes (NC) recently earned his Grand Master and he proves it was no fluke by taking the 56-player Consolation. Loren Wakeling (VA) finished 2nd, followed by Linda Brent (MD) and Scott Harker (PA) in the 3-4 slot. Joyce Bryant (MD) took qualifying honors with a grand slam 18 9/9 +158.

Director Steve Sattler reported Trevor White scored the ACC's 7th 29-hand this cribbage year, netting White \$100 for this sanctioned gem. Sattler also reports the satellite winners:

Jerry Hardy, Phillips, ME, is in the driver's seat for Rookie of the Year honors. He recently won his 2nd sanctioned event this cribbage year. Earlier (August 10) he won the New England Inaugural, besting 114 players.

Brenda Palmer Tops 124 at Yankee Classic

Life Master Brenda Palmer (MA) came to play at the annual Yankee Classic. With some 124 peggers in action at the Rockville, CT Elks, Palmer carted home yet another 147 MRP's to add to her lifetime ledger (8,500+). Her last playoff opponent was the formidable Life Master Bob Drukman (MA) and she prevailed for the win. Drukman took home 105 MRP's for 2nd.

Sharlene Medeiros, another Life Master, and Laurie Owen-Rancourt (ME) finished 3-4. Mike Misluk (CT) scored a 17 8 +147 to take Q honors.

Director Phil Martin reported that Master Bob Fitzgerald scored the ACC's 9th 29-hand this cribbage year, and will be awarded \$100 from the ACC for this gem.

Perry Stump Tops In Florida

The South Florida Open was won by Perry Stump, pegging out of Edgewater, FL. Stump's win, with 89 players in action, netted 147 MRP's and the South Florida Crown. David Ritchey (FL) very nearly earned his Grand Master by taking home 2nd. Joe Daesch (FL) and Garey Herter (FL) finished 3-4. Don Pilcher (FL) scored a 33-GP card to take Q honors.

Ray Poirier (FL) ran the table in the 58-player Consolation. He took Q honors with a great 19 GP card, and roared home the winner in the playoffs as well. Chuck Barnes (FL) was the last victim of Poirier's run. Nevertheless, 2nd place (of 58) is a great run as well. Bill Cooper (GA) and Eric Gorrell finished 3-4.

With 132 players in the field, Stoa netted 196 MRPs, and Chase came home with 147. Life Master Bob McCabe (WI) is having a fine season and finished in the 3-4 bracket with Paul Carberry (MN). McCabe has over 500 MRP's in the bank this season, and is zeroing in on his One-Star rating. Dave Yaeger (MO) was rolling in the Q round with a nice 38 18.22 +235 to take honors.

Keith Widener (NC), a member of last year's Eastern All-Regional team, is at it again, as he was the Consolation's top qualifier (18 8/9 +135) and very nearly won the playoffs as well. He finished 2nd as the Central All-Regional team's Wayne Steinmetz (WI) zipped to the win in the final playoff match. Widener is a newly-crowned Master and Steinmetz is a One-Star. LeRoy Johnson (MN) and One-Star Warren Sondericker (WI) finished in the 3-4 bracket. Sondericker is nearing his Two-Star rating, standing at 14,800.

Internet Cribbage Program: Cribbage Cup Event Debuts

On December 1, the ACC held the first of its online Cribbage Cup tournaments, which feature a combined format similar to that used on the Tournament Trail. Players are divided into six-player groups for a round-robin qualifying round, with winners of three or more games advancing to single elimination playoff matches. As luck would have it, the Finals in this inaugural event came down to two Grass Roots clubmates: Bob Iacopi and Dale Kochenburg of San Jose, CA. Iacopi drew 5-J-Q-Q from eight points out in the last game to triumph over the two-time TOC winner Kochenburg. Cribbage Cup events will continue on alternate Mondays at 7:30 PM EST (4:30 PM PST). Join us, and let us know how you like this experimental format.

Our Thursday night and Saturday afternoon single elimination events remain popular. The November 8 tournament, which attracted 80 players, was won by Ronald Ralston of Iowa, who prevailed over ACC Webmaster Paul Gregson in the best-of-three Finals. Gregson had previously drawn the first 28 hand in ACC Internet history to win his Semifinal match. Ralston's victory underscores the appeal of the ACC's new Internet Cribbage Program for those who live in locales with limited over-the-board cribbage activity.

ACC Internet tournaments are held at MSN Games by Zone.com. Other Internet hosts sites are being researched for possible future events. Henry Douglass's \$20 One Winner Pool tops \$200,000, 10,000 Entrants

For players on the cribbage circuit, Henry Douglass's \$20, one-winner pool is a familiar part of events when Douglass makes an appearance.

Douglass recently confided to *Cribbage World* that he recently signed on the 10,000th entrant (Jack Ledbetter, Ft. Walton Beach Open, November, 2003). Douglass also noted his pools have topped the \$200,000 mark in entry fees.

The largest winner to date? Al Miller (NH) won some \$3,100 at the 1993 National Open in Raleigh, NC. The smallest pot was won by Andy Wroblewski (NJ) at the GR Regional in Greensboro, NC.....\$180!

And how has Douglass fared at his own pools? He has won 8 times and split the pot twice in some 241 tries. His largest win was at the Grand National in Plymouth, MA (\$1,120).

Douglass has run this pool in 16 states, Mexico, Canada, and on cruises. (He notes that, yes, he will accept tips!)

John Stamschror, Cribbage Board Legacy

I would like to inform you that my father, John Stamschror, passed away on November 16, 2003. He had fought his way back from the diagnosis of lung cancer 4 years ago, was diagnosed with congestive heart failure about 11/2 years ago and then the first week of November of this year he found out that his cancer had returned. He died less than 2 weeks after the diagnosis.

John really enjoyed playing cribbage and going to the tournaments. He was proud of his accomplishments of being a Grand Master, I believe twice? I'm not sure of the exact titles, but I know he had 2 huge cribbage board trophies. He gave the trophy that he earned while living in Waukesha, WI to a grandson that lives in Milwaukee. The other trophy was earned while living with us in Minnesota and he gave it to my oldest daughter, his 12 year old granddaughter. He taught them both how to play the game. My daughter looked forward to playing with him and she felt pretty proud when she beat him for the first time this past October. I often wondered if he "allowed" her to win, but he kept saying that she earned it on her own.

John knew many people from playing cribbage and the tournaments. He got his brother, Charlie Stamschror from California, interested in playing and together they attended several tournaments these past couple of years.

Our great friend TEDDY KAHN scored it in the crib twice. Unbelievable but true! This hand occurs once in each 8,208 deals. Frequency is almost exactly the same as for a 28-hand. And that pup paid \$45! That was a boost since I won two games all night and was working on a string of pearls until game six

Funny thing is that their skills as well as their personalities show up on different days.
