AMERICAN CRIBBAGE CONGRESS

32nd Event At Turtle Lake Sondericker Wins 11th

Director Alan Lindner once again hosted a huge crowd at his 32nd run for the roses at the St. Croix Classic in Turtle Lake, WI. And this time around it was newlycrowned Two-Star Warren Sondericker (WI) coming home the winner for the 11th time in a sanctioned Main Event. In besting the 204 peggers in the field, Sondericker added yet another 196 MRP's to his lofty 15,000+ lifetime talley. Vern Ness (MN) nailed down 2nd and took home a sizeable check plus 147 MRP's. Dennis Ulberg (WI) and Master Sandra Stroup (IL) finished 3-4 (and 105 MRP's each).

One-Star Scott Kooistra (MN) posted the meet's best qualifying score...a nifty 36 16/22 +229, adding 50 MRP's to his 11,000+ lifetime score.

Jerome Tork (WI) won the 126-player Consolation, nipping Life Master Alan Schaefer (WI) in the final playoff match. Master Bob Joslin (MN) and Grand Master Don Patrin (MN) finished 3-4. Grand Master Cathy Perkins was a long way from her NC home, and she paid for the trip by taking qualifying honors (178/ 9 + 142).

Director Lindner sported his usual satellites, with all events coming with the usual perks. The winners:

In addition, the casino prepared a wondeful buffet lunch and provided coffee, juice, and soda for the entire tournament.

Lindner reported Bob Milk (VA) very nearly earned his Master by finishing in the 2nd round...and 1.996 MRP's! And James Ready (MA) lost in the third round, just 14 points short of Life Master.

Rumor has it that Sondericker and Tork celebrated their wins with a 5-mile jog around Turtle Lake (to keep their minds in shape). Linder also reported that Saturday's play was celebrated with a Hawaiian theme, with many players sporting flashy shirts and outfits. All players were greeted with a "lay" of flowers to wear for the day. And what was the celebration all about? It was the oneyear anniversary of the St. Croix Tent Tournament!

Ken Cochlin Tops In Spokane

Ken Cochlin (WA) is a Life Master who was a threat to win at any time in the 1980's in the Western Region, but in recent years he has curtailed his pegging to a few events a year. But he is still a threat to win as he did just that at the recent Spokane Valley Open in late May. Gerald Klein was one of a bevy of Canadian players and this Kelowna, BC player took home 2nd, followed by Dale Weilep (WA) and Walter Shulhan, another Kelowna player, in the 3-4 slot. And yet another Canadian took Q honors...Grand Master Harold Buckley (35 15/22 +219). With 121 players in action, Cochlin garnered 147 MRP's and, combined with the Super Q prize, took home well over a four-figure prize.

80 peggers played the Consolation, and it was Edwin Weilep (WA) taking home the top prize. Tom Brown (MT) finished 2nd, with Master Lynn Gillespie (WA) and Grand Master Rex Paddock (MT) in 3-4. Master Daulph Plummer (OH) took Q honors with a grand slam 18 9/9 +139.

Thank God he finished in the 5-8 bracket and spared the peggers a mooning. He did garner 56 MRP's and zips among the leaders in the MRP race, giving him an excellent chance at earning his 7th All-American honor.

Jerry Fischer Wins Carter Classic

Grand Master Jerry Fischer, Colby, WI, nailed the 96 peggers in the field and took home the championship at the recent Carter Classic, Carter, WI. His last match pitted him vs. Jim Pokomey (WI) and his cards remained hot for the win. Fischer garnered 147 MRP's and Pokomey took home 105. Grand Master John Hiland (WI) and Paul Kilkelly (IL) finished 3-4. Kilkelly unofficially earned his Master rating with this high finish. Life Master Gene "Moose" Biegler (WI) took the Q action with a nice 36 GP card (50 MRP's).

Life Master Bob Sommer (MN) won the 68-player Consolation, nipping One-Star Bob McCabe (WI) in the final playoff match. Karen Bouffiou (WI) and Albert Podevels (WI) finished 3-4. Bouffiou is very close to earning her Master with this 3rd place finish...and may very well have it in the bag. Fran Froelich (WI) scored a 16 GP card (+108) to take the Q action.

Edmonton, Alberta was buzzing with cribbage action in early June, with a Mid-Week Open, and the Alberta Open played on the weekend. Two-Star Duane Toll (OR), in a dedicated drive to win the National Championship this cribbage year, salted away the Mid-Week win, running his talley for the year to a record-breaking 2,288 MRP's. Local Kelly Ann Burger, in her first-ever sanctioned event, very nearly took it all, falling to Toll 3-2 in this 36-player event. Master Sue Edwards (CO), fresh from a double win on the Mexican Cruise, finished 3-4 with newly-retired Master Bob Gromek (NV). Local Clem Cloutier took Q honors with an excellent 38 18/22 +203.

Hal Mueller (Hal's Crib) was a long way from his Ontario, Canada home and he paid for his trip by winning the 24-player Consolation. Life Master Roger Wilson (CO) finished 2nd, followed by Two-Star Bob Julian (WI) and Grand Master Sharon Hejtmanek (MT) in the 3-4 slot. Hejtmanek also took Q honors with a 16 7/9 + 144 card.

Benton Harbor, Michigan was a disaster area on May 21-22 as a severe storm knocked out power for some 30 hours. With a cribbage match under way, the host hotel rigged up two portable generators to furnish lighting for the event. For a time, all went well, but carbon monoxide from the generators seeped into the playing hall, and all players had to be evacuated, and qualifying round play continued in the swimming pool area. This distraction did not bother Brenda Carson (MI) as she zipped to the top score of 39 17/22 +321.

But in the playoffs it was David Aiken (MI) coming home the winner, no doubt aided by the cribbage gods for his help in getting the ACC's new Rule Book off and running by preparing the camera-ready copy. With 86 hardy peggers on board, Aiken copped 147 MRPs and the grand prize! Director Jeff Shimp is a Life Master and he came home 2nd, followed by Joe Daly (MI) and veteran Two-Star Bob Julian (WI) in the 3-4 slot.

Master Keith Widener travels far and wide for his cribbage, very nearly earning All-American honors last year, and this time around he nailed the 38-player Consolation. His last opponent was Hall of Famer Martha Fingleton (WI) and he prevailed for the championship. Widener earned 60 MRP's for 1st and Fingleton took home yet another 40 for 2nd to add to her 10,400+ MRP lifetime total. One-Star Wayne Steinmetz (WI) and Bob Milk (IN) finished 3-4. Grand Master Doug Henderson (WI) won 7 of 9 (15 7.9 +102) to take Q honors.

Director Shimp had to cancel the Saturday night game due to the power failure, but the Friday game was won by Wayne Steinmentz. Shimp also reported the Keith Widener, Marge Schoolland, and Bonnie DeMoulpied all scored that elusive 28-hand. No 29's showed. But Carol Draper showed bigtime with her cookies, much to the delight of all the players. She is know far and wide as "the cookie lady!"

The power failure and ensuing portable generators very nearly came to disaster with the carbon monoxide fumes seeping into the room, sickening several players. Old man Murphy is always lurking to cause problems, but carbon monoxide is a new one for cribbage players.



Richard Pierce Takes Mt. St. Helens

Richard Pierce, pegging out of Springfield, OR, nailed down the win at the recent Mt. St. Helens Classic, played at Longview, WA. With 110 peggers in action, Pierce garnered 147 MRP's, the winner's purse, and bragging rights for winning this 2nd annual event. Steve Harding (CA) came close, but settled for 2nd (and 105 MRP's). Veteran Master pegger Edwin Park (OR) and Two-Star Duane Toll (OR) finished 3-4. Toll's 70 MRP's keep him well in front of the pack nationwide this cribbage year. Master Rosemary Hendricks (WA) easily took Q honors with a superlative 39 18/22 card (65 MRP's).

The Consolation played to 80 players and it was Four-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT) winning this event, keeping alive his hopes for a top-ten finish. Bryan Bordenik (WA) took 2nd, followed by Carol Boule (OR) and Glenna Little (WA) in the 3-4 bracket. Little's fine finish was embellished by her top qualifying score...a nice 9/9 grand slam, netting her an aggregate 61 MRP's.

Life Master George Bickford came to play at the Western Massachusetts Classic, played in West Springfield on June 4. Not only did he nail the Q round (21 10/12 +122) but came home the winner in the playoffs as well. With an even 100 players in the field, Bickford added yet another 187 MRP's (aggregate) to his lofty 8,700+ lifetime talley. His last victim in the playoffs of this hot run was Master Joe Beauregard (RI) (who earned 105 MRP's). Jeff Del Santos (RI) and Frank Sidga (MA) finished in the 3-4 bracket and earned 70 MRP's each.

With 105 players in this event, Toll garnered yet another 147 MRP's to add to his 2,000+talley in the current season. Matti also was the meet's top Q player (25 11/14+176) and scored an aggregate 150 MRP's for this outstanding run.



Grand Master Bob Kaplan (MA) ran the table at the recent Crazy Crabby Cribbers, played in Shrewsbury, MA on June 13. Not only did he take Q honors (24 GP card), but he came home the winner in the playoffs as well, scoring an aggregate 202 MRP's in this 82-player event. Life Master Charley Rapoza (MA) finished 2nd, and garnered yet another 105 MRP's to add to his lofty lifetime talley. In an oddity, both Kaplan and Rapoza travel together to many tournaments, including this one. Master Pat Llewellyn (MA) and David Statz (NH) finished 3-4.

Some 36 peggers played the Consolation, and it was Master Carl Deyette (CT coming home the winner. Tom Fiorini (MA) was the bridesmaid, with Life Master Phil Martin (CT) and Life Master John Rooney (MA) coming home in the 3-4 slot. Rick Montague (MA) took Q honors with a nice 17 GP card.

Two players scored 29-hands. The second time this cribbage year two have been scored at a meet (Lyle Lund scored two at the MGM Open in Green Bay). Al Miller (MA) and Mike Azevedo (MA) pulled off this long-shot hand, worth \$100 from the ACC.

Duane Toll Sets MRP Record

Two-Star Duane Toll has set a new one-year MRP record. He has tallied some 2,292 MRP's! He took home the championship at the Alberta Mid-Week event, played in Edmonton, AB on June 9-10. This event was Toll's 39th of the season, as he has made a determined effort to capture this year's crown. Toll, recently retired from Chrysler Corp., has moved to Sutherlin, OR and will be playing his cribbage in the Western Region. His All-Star team status will keep him on the Central Region's squad for the upcoming All-Star event in Reno this coming February, 2005. The majority of his MRP's were earned pegging out of the Central Region in 2004.

Toll appears to be an odds-on favorite to take this year's action, with only Grand Master Roland Hall (CA) within shouting distance (2,000 MRP's). Four-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT) stands at 1,800+, followed by Life Master Sharlene Medeiros (MA) (1,500+), Life Master Ron Morgan (CA) (1,400+), and nine other players who have topped 1,000 for this cribbage year. They are: Two-Star Harry Palmer (MA); Master Jim Crawford (CA), Life Master Robert Medeiros (MA); Two-Star Warren Sondericker (WI); One-Star Paul Hatcher (OR); Grand Master John Furler (OR); Grand Master Cres Fernandez (CA); Jerry Hardy (ME); and Master Tony Danihel (WI).

With 14 peggers over the 1,000 mark, the projected total needed to earn All-American status is 1,250 or so. Nine other peggers have topped 800 and have an outside shot at top-ten honors if they can finished the season on a hot streak.

Cribbage is getting more competitive yearly, and playings trying to earn All-American honors must keep their suitcases packed and moving, attested by Toll's projected 45 or so events to be played this cribbage year.

New Regulations For Nevada

Barbara Woodward informs Cribbage World that the Sands, and all of Nevada's casinos, will be subjected to new regulations concerning promotions (including cribbage). These new regulations will increase paperwork for all involved. This new law goes into effect on January 27, 2004...just in time for our huge Tournament of Champions and JPW/ACC Open meets.

Woodward reports that the good news out of all this is that the Sands will furnish her with a new computer to aid in the management of all the numbers required by the State of Nevada.

Rule of the month review
The pone shall not reach for nor touch the cards before the distribution is completed except to use the hand or arm as a backstop to prevent cards from falling off the table while being dealt.

In my May '04 column I stated that cards thrown in the crib may not be picked up again. That is not correct. I must have been too near the ice cream freezer when I wrote that! I apologize. Rule V.I.c. states: "Prior to the turn of the starter card, if only one player discards to the wrong side of the board, that player is permitted to retrieve the card(s) and re-evaluate the selection."

Towards the end of many Grass Roots seasons, the question comes up as to how the club championship is determined in the event of a tie. Grass Roots points are awarded and officially recognized for the regular nine game tournaments and the eighteen game GRRT and GRNT. In the event of a tie, both players will get a Club Champion Award and an invitation to the Tournament of Champions (TOC). Some clubs choose to have separate champions that do not include the GRRT and GRNT.

Youth Cribbage I would like to write an article about our junior members and about all of the young people who play cribbage. I am particularly interested in those of you who have taught the younger generation to play and their personal experiences while learning. Any suggestions you have would be most welcome. How young were they when they were introduced to the game? Were they receptive to learning Cribbage when they were very young? What do you consider a good age to start teaching our younger folks? Dave Suhr of the Boise Peggers GR 202 was crowned CLUB CHAMPION for the 2003-2004 season. Dave won both six months periods. He played in 31 of the 36 tournaments, with a win/ loss percentage of .613. Along the way Dave won \$422.00 in prize money, with a GR rating of 205 and administered 27 skunks to his fellow combatants.

News from Club 58 in Raleigh, NC Our club had a real horse race this season. Bernard Whitfield last year's club champion pulled into the lead in late March and stayed there until the end. However, he had a slump over the final six weeks and on the last week, tournament #36 five other players all had a shot at the championship...

Bernard decided he'd fix them all and played to a grand slam 20 on the final night to clinch the championship for two years in a row. Alas for two years in a row he also had thedubious honor of being the person who received the most skunks, (27)

The 2003/2004 Grass Roots season has concluded at the Chehalis-Centralia Cribbage Club. Attendance set a record low for the club. In the 2002-2003 season, total attendance for all events was 1,602 players. During 2003-2004, total attendance was 1,181. That's 421 players down! That means a loss to the treasury of \$421. The only money that gets to the treasury is \$1 per player in attendance. That has impacted the number of benefits offered to club members. No free-for-all this year. We have had one event in prior years where the base entry fee was paid from treasury. No free-lunch for club members at our National Tournament segment. National bonuses for members were paid from the skunk pot, reducing that balance so that no Unlimited Editions have occurred since. We have eliminated our donation to the Moose Lodge of 25 cents per player per quarter. If attendance continues at low levels and it appears summer numbers will be very small, we will continue to reduce benefits. Treasury balance of \$323.83 will allow us to cover quarterly Awards Program costs for the spring period. Let's hope that our investment in a Fair Booth at Southwest Washington Fair will give us a boost in membership numbers. We do have 48 members at this time, which is down from 63 in the prior year.

ON THE POSITIVE SIDE

We had four players finish the season with more than 200 rating points as compared to one in the prior season. Those who scored more than 200 were GEORGE RASMUSSEN of Centralia 269, DON BAKKO of Shelton 234, GARY RASMUSSEN of Chehalis 234, and CHRIS MC COMAS of Castle Rock 204. AL NELSON of Tumwater also scored an impressive season total of 167. Based on those figures, which are still unofficial, GEORGE "RAS" has won his third club championship in eight seasons of play. Who were the other winners? DAN CARR won 1997-1998 and 1999-2000. ROSEMARY HENDRICKS won the championship in 1998-1999. CHRIS MC COMAS became the first to win consecutive season in 2001-2002 and 2002-2003. Nine persons have won Silver or Bronze Awards in the Chehalis-Centralia Cribbage Club. Club Director "RAS" has carned the Silver Award and has a lifetime total of 2,992 rating points. Believe that is eighth highest total in Grass Roots Program. Not bad for a kid that joined in 1990. Those who have won the Bronze Awards as members of our group are: SHERRI ALBRECHT of Olalia, DAN CARR of Shelton, ROSEMARY HENDRICKS of Rochester, WESLEY KNUTH of Centralia, TIM MORRISSEY of Centralia, AL NELSON, and DICK WINSLOW of Napavine. We have three more in the wings that could surge to Bronze with a moderate to strong season in 2004-2005. The following have point totals in excess of 800: DENNIS LAMPERT 867, MARY HERRING 826, and DON BAKKO with 804.

Club 34 in Denver CO had a close race for the Club Championship that went right down to the final tournament. Prior to the last night, Robert West (CO 421) had 225 gamepoints; Roger Wilson (CO 221) had 219 points and Bill Shirland (CO 61) had 212 points. Bill had a 12 card bringing him to 224 points. Roger also had a 12 card bringing him up to 231 points. Unfortunately the crib gods did not help Robert and he finished the season with 225 points. Robert was the club champion last season and just missed repeating this season. Roger won his first five games and looked like a shoo-in to be the champ. Then he lost three in a row, setting up a nerve racking final game of the season. He was not in a great 4th street position but received a nice crib to put him within ten points of going out. He was dealt Jacks of hearts and diamonds, a ten, and a five. Looking very good at this point, a 3 was cut but fortunately it was red giving him Nobs. Roger won the game by pegging a single point and having Nobs. The club championship was decided by a single Nobs cut!

Club #120 News Arlene Barrett is #1!

14 years of play breaks down to about 518 nights of Grass Roots cribbage or 4900 games or so and Arlene Barrett has been in the running each and every year but never claimed the top spot. 
