

## Norm Nikodym Wins Oregon Coast

With the Pacific Ocean as a backdrop, and the Chinook Winds Casino as the playing hall, about all a player could hope for was a win at this 236player event. And Norm Nikodym, a Master Pegger from Ontario, CA did just that. He zipped home the winner, taking home the winner's \$1,800 and the \$220 Super Q prize as well. To top that he nailed down 196 MRP's to run this year's talley to well over 500. Master Bill O'Malley (OR) is famous for his trophy boards, and he took one home for himself by finishing 2nd. Grand Master Crez Fernandez (CA) earned All-American honors last year and he throws his hat into the ring once again by finishing in the 3-4 slot and has zipped to the 900 mark for this cribbage year. Bill McCuen (OR) also finished 3-4. O'Malley also took Q honors with a nice 36 17/22 +183 and was rewarded with an aggregate 197 MRP's for this event.

Another huge crowd played the Consolation (156) and perennial front-runner Life Master Bill Wakeman (CA) came home the winner, besting Nancy Hawkins (WA) in the final playoff match. Master Jeanne Jelke (WA), in the hunt for national honors this cribbage year, finished 3-4, as did Master Todd Anderson (OR). Canadian Egon Koch (Master) took the Q action with a nice 18 8/9 +159.

This event always draws a huge crowd, even with severe competition from a popular cruise played the same weekend. And directors Rollie Heath, Bernie Nelson, Jeanne and Roy Hofbauer, always have a full slate of satellite events. The winners:

With a whopping 162 players in the field, Thomas Shea (MA) came home the winner at the recent Ocean State Classic, Pawtucket, RI, and earned 196 MRP's to boot. His last match was a tough one with Roland Hall (CA), the nation's frontrunner in the annual MRP race. Hall, a Grand Master, garnered another 147 MRP's and is zipping along steadily piling up MRP's in his race for honors this cribbage year. Two Veteran Life Masters finished 3-4...George Bickford (MA) and Bill Shoemaker (CT). And yet another Life Master took Q honors...John Rooney (MA) (22 10/12 +189).

It was almost the Emily Shwartz (MA) show in the 88-player Consolation as this Master pegger nailed the qualifying round (16 7 +133), and finished 2nd in the playoffs, netting a nifty 75 MRP's for this great run. But Master Joseph Beauregard (RI) came home the winner in the playoffs. Life Master Dick West (MA) and Paul Batterson (CT) finished 3-4.

Director John Chambers reported three 28-hands showed: Robert Tervo, Janet Bruscato, and Al Kelley. And once again, Chamber's expertise in managing tournaments resulted in yet another large crowd.

With 25 players in action in the Consolation, it was Von Sosh (FL) winning going away. He nipped Ray Canero (FL) in the final playoff match. Bob Chevalier (FL) took Q honors (14 7 +31) and finished in the 3-4 bracket with Alice Haught (FL).

Three-time All-American Wayne Steinmetz (WI) was up to the challenge at the recent Milwaukee Challenge. In besting the 145-player field, One-Star Steinmetz took home yet another 196 MRP's to add to his lofty lifetime ledger (12,000+). Grand Master Joe Aird (MI) nailed down 2nd and is getting closer to earning his Life Master with this high finish (147 MRP's). Master Tony Danihel (WI) and Life Master Todd Schaefer (MN) finished in the 3-4 bracket and each added 105 MRP's to their lifetime talley.

But for the current MRP race, the big news was Two-Star Duane Toll's (WI) superlative qualifying round score. He nailed a 42 18/22 +310 (80 MRP's) keeping him on top of this year's leaderboard.

Grand Master Doug Henderson (WI) zipped to the win in the 85-player Consolation, nipping the streaking Jim Crawford (CA), a Master pegger in the race for honors this cribbage year (900+), in the final playoff match. 
If you have current email capability, notify Hassett to add your name to his data base (Membership@Cribbage.org). If you do not use email you will receive the normal postcard notices.

In addition to all the other "off the radar" occurrences of the weekend, an unusual pairing happened in both the Main and Consolation playoffs. In the Main tournament, Tom and Joe Edwards (Waukegan, IL-I THINK), father and son, met in the first round. Son Joe prevailed. In the Consolation playoffs, Keith and Zach Widener played off in round one. This time, age and experience trumped youth and enthusiasm, as father Keith went all the way to win the event. Held on alternate Thursdays, these events can accommodate 96 players, divided into three mini-tournaments each with its own 32bracket. Donald E. plaver (+ LoneStar ), one of our most experienced Internet TDs, directs these tournaments, which place extraordinary demands on the online host. Beginning in May, double elimination tournaments are moving to alternate Mondays. Come check them out, and allow a little extra time since you could play in as many as eleven bestof-three rounds if you win!

Counting the double elimination events, April saw fifteen different ACC Internet Cribbage tournaments, and for the second consecutive month, ACC members won every one of them! 
