# Winnemucca Draws 186!

# Mike McCammon Tops In Nevada

The word is out. Winnemucca, with the Winner's Casino offering bargain hotel rates and a great playing hall across the street (Winnemucca Convention Center), is fast becoming one of America's favorite cribbage stops. This time around a whopping 186 players showed for the 9th Annual Winnemucca Classic...and Mike McCammon, Sparks, NV, came to play. He took home the top prize...and 196 MRP's! McCammon is famous for supplying cribbage tournaments playing cards from the Silver Legancy in Reno (he is the Legacy's floor manager), and for his largess, the cribbage gods have rewarded him with a huge win. Four-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT) finished 2nd and had his best overall event in years, scoring 222 MRP's, keeping his hat in the ring for honors this cribbage year. Phyllis Roderick is a Master pegger (OR) and she nailed down 3-4 finish, as did Jerold Montgomery, another Master pegger from California, Colvert also took O honors with a 41 19/22 + 305.

118 stayed for the Consolation and it was Master Lynn Gillespie (WA) walking away with the trophy (and 84 MRP's). Master Harry Ng (CA) took 2nd, followed by Keith Blackman (OR) and Grand Master Willie Evans (WA) in the 3-4 slot. Blackman is very close to his Masters, and may very well have earned this title at this meet. Grand Master David Gilkeson took Q honors with a 18 8/9 +125.

Jack Perkins scored his first-ever 29-hand in the Friday Early Bird, and, in another oddity, Rex Paddock dealt a 28-hand to his opponent on Friday...and on Sunday he scored one for himself. Gambling? No one could top Mary Gladish scoring a Royal Flush in the Let It Ride game at the Winners. She collected a cool \$6,000 for that hand!

Tamara Reichel and the Winners rolled out the red carpet for the players, furnishing coffee, tea, hot chocolate and sweet rolls three-days running...and the event awarded first-class trophy boards to boot!

# Sharlene Medeiros Rolls On, Nails Eastern States

Life Master Sharlene Medeiros began a hot streak at this year's ACC Open in Reno, continued on to set the all-time high for a 22-game qualifying round in Green Bay (46 20/22 +501), and she is still rolling along with one of the hottest runs in ACC history. Her latest escapade has her running the table at the recent Eastern States Championship in Shrewsbury, played on April 4. She not only qualified tops with an outstanding 28 GP card (12 games), but rolled on to win the playoffs as well, netting a whopping 252 MRP's in this 106-player event. She vaults among the leaders in the annual MRP race with this great run, standing at the 1,500 mark.

Elijah White (MA) was the last victim of Medeiros's run, taking home 2nd. Two-Star Harry Palmer (MA) is also in the race for honors this cribbage year, finishing in the 3-4 bracket with Life Master Rob Medeiros (no relation to Sharlene), also in the race for honors this year.

Life Master Paul Gallagher (MA) took home the bacon in the 52-player Consolation. Guy Spezzaferro (MA) finished 2nd, followed by Master Harvey Glass (CT) and Master Bruce Brown (MA) in the 3-4 bracket. Glass also scored a nice 17 GP card to take Q honors.

Director Bill Medeiros reported Cindy Veradt scored the meet's only 28-hand. No 29's showed. Carl Deyette (CT) unofficially earned his Master rating...and Medeiros reported the event went well even after a late site change and playing on Palm Sunday.

# Chuck Barnes Takes Haines City Inaugural

Chuck Barnes (FL) got the Haines City Inaugural off and running by taking home the championship on the 4th of April. With 84 peggers in action in Kissimmee, FL, the win came complete with 147 MRP's...and bragging rights. His last match pitted him vs. Joe Lewis III (FL) and he prevailed to take the title. Lewis scored 105 MRP's for finishing 2nd. Bernie Chiasson (FL) and Jack Ledbetter (FL) nailed down a 3-4 finish (and 70 MRP's each). Joy Barnes (FL) is nearing her Grand Master by taking Q honors (33 15/22 +231).

Master Betty Schaeffer (FL) took home the win in the 54-player Consolation, nipping high-qualifier (16 8/9 +123) Gene Bradshaw (GA) in the final playoff match. Paula Abele (FL) and Ed Craren (FL) took home a 3-4 finish.

Director Raymond Wanke reported that John Groz scored his first-ever 29-hand in the 8th game of the main event, earning Groz \$100 from the ACC for this 19th 29-hand this season. Russ Perkins scored a 28-hand as well. He also reported that Paula Abele won the Friday event, Steve Campanale won the Saturday game, and John Pfenning scored a grand slam 7/7 to win the Last Chance. Wanke also reported he was stunned by the large crowd in this inaugural event.

# Emilio Perez Zips To Illinois Open Title

Grand Master Emilio Perez (IL) kept honors in his home state by winning the recent Illinois Open on March 7. With a nice field of 101 peggers, Perez took home 147 MRP's to tack on to his lifetime ledger. Ginger Nelson (WI) came home 2nd...and 105 MRP's, followed by Mike Grage (IL) and Life Master Bob McCabe (WI) in the 3-4 slot. McCabe's high finish leave him a scant three points short of earning his One-Star rating. Grand Master Bob Chase (MN) took the Q action with a nice 35 17/22 +174 card.

Two-Star Duane Toll (WI) ran the table in the 62-player Consolation, taking the Q prize with a 19 9/9 +119 grand slam, and winning the playoffs as well, adding 84 MRP's to his nation-leading MRP total (1,500). Vickie Lindner (WI) took home 2nd, followed by Tim Smith (MI) and Grand Master Les Kvien (IL) in the 3-4 bracket.


# Larry Waller South Dakota King



# Cut For Deal... Or Alternate Deal?

Given that the debate over alternating versus cut for deal is over. I set out to determine if there were a difference if any in terms of averages between the two tournament modes. The result was CRIBAVGS, a program that computes probabilities of cut wins, games won, skunks, and game points in any tournament. I used 22 as the parameter for number of games played, plugged in the others, and compared the results for an average player (qualifies one time in four) to an expert (qualifies about three times in five) and came up with some interesting numbers.

An expert winning the cut 16 times will win 13 games or more 70% of the time compared to 60% of the time in an alternating deal tournament and 50% of the time with 6 cut wins. An average player will win 13 games or more 37%, 26%, and 18% of the time respectively. Using exact values and averaging the 16 cut and 6 cut wins (whose probabilities are identical) results in a negative difference of .3% compared to 11 cut wins for the expert and a positive difference of .6% for the average player.

My conclusion is that cut for deal indeed benefits the average player. Anyone who wishes a copy of CRIBAVGS and information on the other parameter inputs I used can obtain them from my web site, halscrib.com

These membership concerns have been taken from a recently published "RAS" newsletter."

For the first time since the inception of the Chehalis-Centralia Cribbage Club, attendance has become a concern. Winter quarter attendance for 2003/2004 was down by 200 players. During the Winter Quarter 2002/2003 we had 545 players. This past Winter Quarter we had 345. When looking at the membership roster, here are the contributing factors. Average age of our club members is much greater than it was in the fall of 1996. Many of our members came in at that time and have remained dues-paid members. In prior Marches, club membership has reached 60 members. Not so this March. Well for the first time, we have to consider recruitment of new members. Think about some ways we might be able to do this and how you might be able to support our efforts. This will be a major topic at the next Advisory Board Meeting. What are your thoughts?"




