Charlie Williams left Raleigh for Las Vegas in 1994, but he returned to home-base Raleigh this year and began cribbage play after a 10-year layoff. And play he did! Undefeated heading into the final match with Grand Master Joy Barnes (FL), he lost his first match to her, but in the final with both players having suffered a lone loss, Williams cards came alive and he took home the championship. Shawn Hudson (NC) vowed not to eat his "lucky muffin" until he lost, ran to 3rd place. Dot Davis, after having suffered a loss to Hudson, reached over and smashed his "lucky muffin" and that ended his streak, as Barnes nailed him in the next match. Davis (NC) has played in 30 consecutive Opens (after having watched her hubby in the 1st ever). 5th and 6th went to Dennis Lillo (VA) and Bill Whiting (VA), and Andy Hulcher (VA) and Larry Gould (NC) taking 7-8 in this 193-player event.

Life Master Peter Setian (MA) nailed the Consolation, nipping Hugh Berry (VA) in the final playoff match. Jane Cannizzaro (VA) and Ray Meinert (VA) finished 3-4. Berry had a great weekend, celebrating his 76th birthday, earning his Master rating, and taking O honors.

Director Catherine Perkins fielded the usual satellites that help make the National Open so attractive. The winners:



Patenaude not only qualified tops in this 80-player event, but waltzed home the winner in the playoffs as well. His last playoff matched pitted him vs. Hall 'o Famer Phyllis Schmidt (MA) and he prevailed for the win. Schmidt carted home 105 MRP's, keeping alive her slim hopes for yet another All-American award. She will represent the Easterm Region in the upcoming All-Star game in Reno this February. Lynn Babbitt (RI) and Life Master Bill Shoemaker (CT) finished 3-4...and 70 MRP's each.

Mark Soule (ME) won the 48-player Consolation, nipping John Brennan (MA) in the final playoff match. Grand Master Joyce Vanelli (MA) and Sue Cousens (ME) finished 3-4. Brennan was also the event's top Q player with a nifty 18 GP card.

Director Laurie Rancourt hosted a High Roller event, taken by One-Star David Clemmey (MA). Rookie of the Year Jerry Hardy (ME) finished 2nd. Rancourt also reported that Jeanette Verzillo and Jeannine Dubois scored that elusive 28-hand.

With a perfect field of 64, no byes were awarded. Tom Fiorini (MA) took home 2nd, followed by Jerry Hardy (ME) and Jeannine Dubois (MA) in the 3-4 slot. With yet another high finish, Hardy easily earned the ACC's annual "Rookie of the Year" award. Joan Fletcher (CT) had the hot hand in the Q round, scoring a great 36 17/22 +166 card.

Emily Medeiros (MA) won the 30-player Consolation, with Laurie Rancourt taking home 2nd. Master Sharon Schaefer (WI) and Life Master Sharlene Medeiros (MA) finished 3-4. Schaefer was also the events top Q player with a great 19 9/9 +169 grand slam.

Director Harry Palmer hosted a Saturday night doubles match, won by Al and Sharon Schaefer, Slinger, WI. He also reported that Tom Fiorini scored the meet's only 28-hand.

Bill Jenson Devil Mountain Champ

Grand Master Bill Jenson (CA) zipped to the win at the recent Devil Mountain Caper, Antioch, CA, on July 18. With 90 peggers in action, Jenson added yet another 147 MRP's to his lifetime ledger. Life Master Jackie doppelt (CA) nailed down 2nd, followed by Grand Master Harold Sontag (CA) and Grand Master Ross Njaa (CA) in the 3-4 slot. Sontag also took O honors with a nice 35 GP card.

Life Master Steve Reynolds (CA) won the 44player Consolation with Rod Foy (CA) taking 2nd. Master Cy Madrone (CA) and Ben Holder (CA) finished 3-4. Master Goldia Rager (CA) scored a 15 GP card to take Q honors.

And after paying out grand prizes for 32 St. Croix events, Lindner felt that it was his turn to receive some benefits from all his hard work. This time around a whopping 224 players descended on Turtle Lake for some pegging action...and for those famous perks the casino pays for 24-28-29-GS play.



Life Master Al Miller (NH) is getting close to his One-Star rating by finishing in the 3-4 bracket with One-Star Larry Samet (MA). Life Master Bob Drukman (MA) took Q honors with a 36 16 +199 card.

Medeiros reported nary a 28 or 29-hand showed in this event. No Consolation was played.

Bob Clark Nails Truckee

Grand Master Bob Clark (CA) earned All-Americam honors in 1998, and he continues to be a force on the boards as he won the 74-player Truckee River Classic, played in Kings Beach, CA on July 10. Life Master Jones Hom (CA) was Clark's last victim, but, nevertheless, Hom carted home yet another 105 MRP's. Life Master Roland Hall (CA) added another 70 MRP's, zipping to well over 2,000 earned this cribbage year by finishing 3-4. Gordon Brown (CA) also finished in this bracket. Ross Walter (CA) took Q honors with a 24 GP card (14 games).

Master Art Fisher (CA) took home the bacon in the 42-player Consolation. Grand Master Mary Ryan finished 2nd (and was top qualifier with a 13 GP card, 7 games). Director Ron Morgan (CA) and co-director Greg Schleusner, both Life Masters, took home a 3-4 finish.

Tournaments? The ACC Has Them!

National Statistician and Treasurer Bob McCabe informs our membership that we had a record number of sanctioned tournaments in the 2004 year. Some 176 Main Events were played, with 17,777 participants. This averages out to 101 players per event. 159 sanctioned Consolations were played with 10,559 players for an average of 66.4 players per event.

Cribbage fever, catch it! The tournaments are out there nationwide!

Cribbage Junior

My six-year-old son Evan loves to play games. When he was five, I invented a new game called "Cribbage Junior" to help him garner interest in cribbage.

"Cribbage Junior" is a simplified version of its parent game. After the low cutter wins the first of the alternating deals, four cards are dealt to each player. The pone cuts and the dealer turns the card, receiving two points for a jack. There is no crib and no pegging. Each player counts his/her hand. 15s, runs, 2/3/4 of a kind, & nobs are counted. Due to short attention spans and the desire to play multiple games, only 31 or 61 points are required to win the game (the total must be declared before the game begins).

In a 61 point game, a skunk is accomplished when the losing player has 45 or fewer points.

This is a great game for the youngest aspiring cribbage players. Since there's no strategy involved (strategy, in my opinion, is too advanced for even the brightest five- or six-year-olds), even a kindergartener can skunk his father (or mother). My son did it twice in a row and frequently reminds me of it!

"Cribbage Junior" has improved Evan's arithmetic skills, increased his confidence, and helped him start a love for a game he'll hopefully enjoy for the rest of his life. It has also given us yet another way to enjoy our time with each other.

Rule of the month review:

A single card, which has been released by the fingers, is considered played, whether or not the count has been announced. It may be retrieved only if it would cause the count to exceed 31.

If the dealer exposes more than one card in turning the starter card, the top card becomes the starter card and pone has the right to see any other exposed card(s) before they are replaced in the pack.

Rule Book Update

I did not keep separate expense records for the clubs and these are the numbers as close as I can come: The total cost (postage, boxes, and other supplies) to ship the 5,375 rulebooks was about \$670. To send I rulebook costs \$0.60 and two \$1.06. By using Media Mail (Book rate) the average shipping costs per rulebook was 12 1/2 cents.

Summary:

A total of 247 packages were sent (a total of 5,375 rulebooks). Thanks to the GR clubs who responded to my email request and sent in a combined order for their club members. This effort saved the ACC an estimated \$1,500. A total of 103 clubs ordered a total of 2,989 rulebooks. Another 95 rulebooks were previously ordered by individual club members and included with the club order.

Note for the CW: The cost of rulebooks will be \$1 until the ACC Open next February. Rulebooks can be obtained from most BOD members, the three regional tournament commissioners, and the Membership Secretary.


