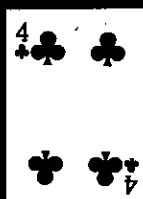

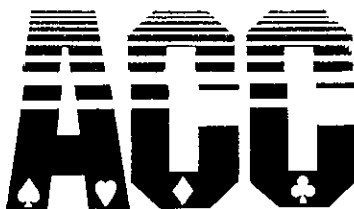
722 In Action Friday Night

Ray Fredin Cops MGM

Green Bay's MGM-Oneida Open was jumping on Friday night, February 25! Some 722 peggers were in action, with 612 playing doubles and 110 hitting the boards in a High Roller event. With perks galore (\$25 for 24-hands, \$200 for 28-hands, and \$500 for 29's) the pegging was intense and spirited. The duo of Charles Jaussent (WI) and Al Sihunk (WI) took home the win in doubles (\$1,600) and Dave Rozek (WI) copped the High Roller, beginning his weekend of pegging some \$1,550 richer.

On Saturday morning, the pegging for honors began with a huge 448-player crowd, with "24-hand" being called out on a regular basis, and a few 28-hands (15 in all) also being paid out. When the pegs were laid away in the late afternoon, Life Master Pat Barrett (WI) earned his first-ever high qualifier honor with a great 39 18/22 +282 card. Play then shifted to Saturday night singles and doubles, with Arnold and Melanie Hielsberg (WI) taking the doubles action, and One-Star David Clemmey (MA) winning the singles. And the chorus of "24-hand" continued into the evening.

Playoffs began in earnest on Sunday morning with 112 qualifiers. Sunday afternoon saw Ray Fredin, Ishpeming, MI nailing down the win, picking up 252 MRP's, \$3,500 and a beautiful trophy clock. His last match was with none other than Grand Master Jim Fabian (IN), still basking in his good fortune in Reno where he nailed two royal flushes back to back to take home \$16,000+ ...and his run of luck continues attested to this high finish (another \$2,300). Brad Behm (WI) and Pete Heesakker (WI) nailed down a 3-4 finish and picked up 147 MRP's each.

An even 200 players played the Consolation and after the 9-game qualifier, Myles Mariette (MI) came home with the top Q score...a great 20 GP effort. But local Larry LaGassie, a newly-crowned Master player, took home the win in the playoff action. Veteran Life Master Lloyd "Gabby" Kraft (WI) took 2nd, followed by two One-Star players in the 3-4 bracket... David Clemmey (MA) and Bob McCabe (WI).

Want to score a 29-hand? The MGM Consolation event is the place to play. Last year Lyle Lund (MN) scored two 29's in consecutive games, and this year a whopping three 29's were scored: John Kolbe, Gerald Butts, and Les Kvien did the trick. Each earned \$500 plus \$100 from the ACC for these gems.

28-hands? The MGM produced yet another abnormal run, they were scored by: Mary Herrmann, Steve Lang, Richard Ontto, Ken Knutson, Wayne Thompson, Bob King, Jr., Dennis Pokorney, Randy Bremmer, Aggie Mikulsky, Jerry Gruber, Brian Begotka, Bob Chase, Byron Hewitt, Danielle Smith, and Jeff Lui. Each received \$200 for this hand.

Directors Tom Gallagher and Bob Miller reported that \$153,300 was paid out in prizes and perks, and another \$2,000 was raised for charity via a raffle and auction. In addition, the Oneida Casino furnished an outstanding playing area, and the entire complex is first-class. Mark your calendars for next year's action, scheduled to be played March 3-4-5, 2006.

The Shimps have owned this event that past three years.

Two-Star Joe Bernard (WI) has a winter home in Mesa, and had home-field advantage in zipping to the 54-player Consolation win. Veteran Life Master Boyd McDonald (CA) took home 2nd, followed by Dale Rohm (WI) and Jim Jeffers (WI) in the 3-4 slot.

Jordan, Shoemaker Say "Almost!"

Ken Maffei Cops Shawn's Special

With an even 100 players in the field, it was Ken Maffei, pegging out of Walpole, MA, coming home the winner at the recent Shawn's Special, played at Medway, MA. David Statz (NH) finished 2nd, followed by Life Master Phil Martin (CT), still on a roll after his 2nd place finish at the JPW/ACC Open in Reno, and Eliah White (ME) in the 3-4 slot.

Director Shawn Jordan won the first 11 games of the 12-game qualifier, but John Brennan won the 12th game, denying Jordan a grand slam. Jordan, nevertheless, had the top Q score (25 11/12 +188). And the same scenario took place in the Consolation qualifying round as Life Master Bill Shoemaker won his first seven games of the eight-game round, but failed to get his grand slam, losing game 8. He was also the top Q player (16 7/8 +112) and finished 2nd in the playoffs. Life Master Donna LaFleur (CT) won this 54-player event, with Rick Montague (MA) and Life Master Dick West (MA) finishing in the 3-4 bracket.

Director Jordan reported Larry Samet, Holli Umbrianna, and Harold Cook all scored 28-hands, but no 29's showed.

Bob DeAngelo Still Rolling

Bob DeAngelo (VA) scored a 29-hand at Reno's mammoth JPW/ACC Open in early February and he continues to roll on. He was top qualifier (36 16/22 +195) at the recent Charlottesville Open (VA) and rolled to the playoff win as well. With 59 players in the field, DeAngelo took home a nifty 155 MRP's to add to his lifetime ledger. Joyce Bryant (MD) finished 2nd, followed by Todd Champagne (NC) and Master Jack Howsare (VA) in the 3-4 slot.

40 players played the Consolation and it was Jan Viands (VA) running the table, taking Q honors with a nice 19 8/9 +179 and winning the playoffs off well. Keith Miller (NC) finished 2nd, with Bob Moore (VA) and Sandra Shrum (VA) taking home 3-4.

Every Ten Years? **Phyllis Schmidt** **Tops Jim Lynch Memorial**

With the Tournament of Champions still fresh in her memory, Phyllis Schmidt (MA) has captured yet another event...the Jim Lynch Memorial (formerly Tri-Valley Open). This win had a special written all over it for Schmidt, as she had won 10 years ago (1995), and with this 14th sanctioned Main Event win, soars to Two-Star territory, becoming the 6th ACC player to attain this high rating.

Life Master Bob Drukman (MA) finished 2nd and he is inching in on his One-Star rating. He took home yet another 105 MRP's for this high finish. Two One-Star players finished 3-4...David Clemmey (MA) and Larry Samet (MA). The cream certainly rose to the top in this event, and is the first time ever that the top four spots went to One-Star players. Wayne Tyler (MA) took Q honors with a great 24-GP card (55 MRP's).

John Brennan (MA) was smoking in the 64-player Consolation. He nailed down Q honors with a 16-GP card, and came home like gang-busters to win the playoffs as well. Laurence Connelly, Sr. (MA) was the last victim of Brennan's run and took home 2nd. Walter Brideaux (CT) and Robert Fitzgerald (CT) finished 3-4.

Director Pat Llewellyn played a doubles match on Saturday night and, once again, it was Phyllis Schmidt and Izzie Pearlman taking home the win. Stel Gasparoni and Brian McCoy scored 28-hands, but no 29's showed.

Liz O'Connor Lynch gave a marvelous talk about her late husband and how he loved the game and the wonderful people he played. The players gave her a standing ovation! This event was named in his memory.

And all this when the scheduled playing hall was not available, and a last-minute replacement playing site was found. Lisa Spellenberg (CA) was the last victim of Rowe's run. Lynn Baldwin (AK) and director Darlene Stier (AK) finished 3-4 in this 35-player match.

Steve Yates (AK) won the 23-player Consolation with Chuck Berg taking home 2nd. Lynn Baldwin (AK) and Glenn Clifford finished 3-4. Clifford was also the meet's top qualifier, with a 14 6/9 +112 card.

Dick West Tops Seven Hills

Life Master Dick West (MA) was king of the hill at the recent Seven Hills Open, played in Auburn, MA on March 6. He nailed down the win in this 78-player match, edging Don Graveline (MA) in the final playoff match, taking home the marbles and 147 MRP's. It was pre-ordained for West to win as this was his 56th birthday! Graveline took home 105 MRP's for 2nd. Rick Montague (MA) and Robert Wahlgren (MA) finished 3-4. Charlie Booker (CT) scored a 21 10 +88 to take Q honors.

With an even 50 players in action in the Consolation, Master David Statz (NH) took home the win. Frank Sigda (MA) finished 2nd, followed by Walter Ballou (RI) and David Goyette (MA) finished 3-4. Lynn Babbitt (RI) scored a 15 7 +115 card to take Q honors.

Director Jeanette Verzillo reported the cards were hot as five 28-hands were scored: Dwight Christiansen, Frank Sigda, Don Graveline, Nicholas Cheung, and Sigda again (in the Consolation).

SPORTSMANSHIP

On page 5 of ACC rule book under the Code of Ethics the following practice is considered unacceptable and grounds for suspension or expulsion: "Initiating a violation of the rules for the purpose of gaining an advantage, whether gained or not, even though the rules specify a penalty for the violation" As the chief judge for several years for the Tournament of Champions and JPW Open in Reno, it's readily apparent that many of our more experienced players have never read the Code of Ethics or choose to ignore them. The ACC rules are supposed to protect players, especially new ones, from unscrupulous individuals. However, our rules are being used by experienced players to win games. Some Examples.

Picking up the front peg. Our experienced players know never to touch their front peg and it's second nature with rare exceptions. Newer players often do this accidentally or sometimes on purpose to take an add on peg like a GO.

Pegging backwards. Again, with rare exceptions, only newer players are caught by this rule.

False claim of the game. Originally designed rule to prevent unscrupulous players from taking more points than they had to claim a game, especially against a newer player that wasn't watching what the opponent pegged that closely. However, this rule is now used by experienced players to "punish" novices who make over pegging mistakes at the end of the game.

As a long term ACC player, I'm guilty of using the rules to win games and/or gain an advantage. Over the years, my perspective has changed and I would like to challenge all members of the ACC to do the following:

If a player picks up their front peg and both players agree where the peg was, don't call a judge but just put the peg back where it was and continue the game. Same with pegging backwards. Stop a player from going the wrong way and if you both agree where the pegs were, put them back and continue the game. A player false claims a game or just over pegs and you know it was because of difficulty counting a hand and not trying to cheat, then just let them move back the one, two or maybe 5 holes to where they belonged and continue the game with no penalty.

At the recent TOC and JPW Open, Dwight Christiansen made a plea for volunteers to help recruit new players into the ACC. However, many of the new players we get are "burned" by our rules and never come back. Let's win our games with superior play and good luck, not by playing the rule book.

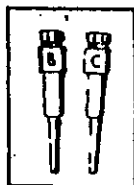

The usual suspects

Mark Van Dyke (*loosespokes1135*) continues to lead in both IRPs and tournaments played, notching yet another victory on February 5, his sixth of the year. The Grand Haven, MI pegger still has 18 official tournaments to add to his tally before the season ends in July.

Dorothy Westerlund (*ACC1139L2*) Sherwood, OR a Life Member of the ACC notched her second win in as many months. Better watch out for her if she ever starts playing ACC Internet Cribbage "full-time". She has 147 IRPs in only eight tournaments for an average of over 18 IRPs per event! Contrast that to our leader Mark Van Dyke at 9 IRPs/event, or Donald Olney at 10 IRPs/event.

Congratulations to David Hardy (*bluenoser1313*) of Spring, TX for his first ACC Internet Cribbage victory. Ditto for David R. Smith (*DAVESC89*) of Acworth, GA.

Rule of the month review:

Cutting to determine the Starter Card: Only after both players discard to the crib shall the pack be cut by the pone to determine the starter card. If the starter card is turned up by the dealer before he or she discards to the crib, the starter card is returned to the pack, the dealer then discards to the crib and reshuffles the pack, and the pone cuts the starter card.

Club 306 in Folsom, CA. recently had a couple of exciting matches. *Club 306 used to play in El Dorado Hills but now plays in Folsom*) On 2-9-05 **David LeBoeuf** and **Sue Sirianni** went head to head looking for a Grand Slam scorecard, both having won the first 8 games. The winner was David who skunked Sue on the final game. He ended up with a 22/9/+226 point card. 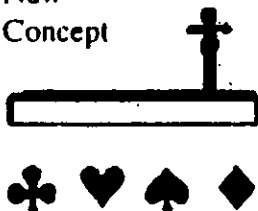
