

# Pas Pasmussen Promotion Champ! John Furler Wins Washington Championship, Joins MRP Race

Director Ras Rasmussen once again pulled out all stops in promoting his Washington Championship, played in Centralia, WA, January 7-9. With sponsores galore, the raffle table was overflowing, and 24-hand (and other prizes) were in great supply. And the prize fund was more than fair. All this largess brings players from far and wide, and this time around some 196 players were in action over the three-day weekend.

None other that Two-Star Jesse Jarrell (CA) kicked off the weekend by taking the Early Bird action. Friday night's High Roller and Doubles drew large numbers, and with a whopping 38 players in the High Roller, it was Bill Wakeman taking home the top spot. But Bob Oriet's (OR) Q-money was the top prize, as Wakeman did not play this sideline. The Doubles saw Hal and Joyce Lamon (WA) come away the winners, besting a large field. Saturday night saw Don Overton (WA) win 8 of 9 to take that action.

But the Main Event went to Life Master John Furler (OR) and he is making this his year to shine. He had not won a sanctioned event for years, and this is his 2nd win in short order. His MRP's put him among the leaders nationwide, as ACC play hits the half-way mark this cribbage year. Roger Warnock (WA) took home 2nd, followed by Carolyn Blackman (OR) and Ron Boule (OR) in the 3-4 slot. Ron Gustafson (WA) posted a great 38 16/22 +268 score to easily take O honors.

The Consolation drew 128 players, and it was Life Master Jones Hom's turn to shine as he posted a superlative 20 9/9 +143 grand slam in the qualifying round. But when the playoffs had wound down, it was Rick Pierce (OR) standing alone with the top trophy. He edged Master Chris McComas (WA) in the final playoff match. McComas has been hot in Consolation play the past few months, and very nearly took home another one. Master Dean Bauman (OR) and Bob Page (OR) finished 3-4.

This event was followed by a 44-player Cry Baby, won by Rick Westerman (WA). Director Rasmussen paid a bonus \$50 for 28-hands, and George Mackie (WA) and Two-Star Duane Toll (OR) cashed with their 28-gems. Rasmussen also reported that over 100 sponsores donated over \$11,000 in cash, merchandise, and services, making him the undisputed king of promotion in the ACC.

Heitmanek Blisters Portland

Sharon Hejtmanek, a Life Master from Missoula, MT, and a member of the ACC's Board of Directors, did some directing of traffic on her cribbage board the entire weekend at Portland's (OR) Winter Open. And it was a one-way street in her favor as she nailed the High Roller on Friday night, and rolled to the championship on Sunday afternoon, besting some 152 players in the process. Her run was one of the best this year in the Main Event playoffs, knocking off Four-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT) 3-0 to kick off the action, then bombing One-Star Roy Hofbauer 3-0 (with two skunks), and continued on to win 3-2 over local Gary Wegener, with yet another skunk in the deciding game. With the 196 MRP's, Heitmanek zips to the 500+ mark for this cribbage year. Wegener took home 147 MRP's for his fine showing. Grand Master Annett Eiffert (CA), in a rare sojourn to Oregon, finished 3rd, followed by another Grand Master...Darren Black (OR) in 4th.

Two-Star Bob Julian (WI) showed his expertise in the qualifying round, as this four-time national champ took Q honors with a nifty 37/22+240 card.

One-Star Ras Rasmussen (WA) won the 96-player Consolation and zips to the 800 MRP mark this cribbage year, putting heat on the leaders in the national race for honors. Erik Locke (OR) finished 2nd, followed by two hot peggers... Grand Master Rex Paddock (MT) and Life Master Jack Moritzky (WA) in the 3-4 slot. Moritzky joins Rasmussen at the 800 mark for this cribbage year. Monica Newton (OR) took Q honors with a nice 19 8/9 +207.

Master Jim Crawford (CA) is clinging to his national MRP lead, as he continues to pile on MRP's at very nearly every stop; adding to his glorious Grand National win in Atlanta in September. He stands at well over 1,000 as players hit the home half of this cribbage season.

Six players are hot on his heels: One-Star Ras Rasmussen (WA); Life Mster Jack Moritzky (WA); Life Master Dwight Christiansen (CT); Life Master John Furler (OR); One-Star Bill Medeiros (MA); and Master Jason Shumate (CA). They are bunched at the 700-800 mark. From that point on it is a real dog fight for top ten honors with One-Star Paul Hatcher (OR), Two-Star Duane Toll (OR), Grand Master Herschel Mack (CA) and Grand Master Jack Shumate III (CA) hanging but a whisker behind the leaders.

Another great run for the roses is in the offing, with many players still in the hunt with six months to go...and cribbage events galore are still on tap.

Grand Master Jeff Raynes (NC) very nearly took it all, but settled for 2nd...and 105 MRP's. David Foxwell (GA) and Ron LaPointe (FL) nailed down a 3-4 finish. Life Master Sharlene Medeiros (MA). once again, was the top Q player, scoring a nice 32 15 +188 card.

Steve Angier (GA) was smoking in the 56player Consolation. He nailed a 9/9 grand slam (209/9+157) and very nearly won the playoffs as well, finishing 2nd. Lou Gardner (GA) cooled off Angier and won this event. Sandy Lewis (FL) and Fred Desnoyers (FL) finished 3-4.

Director Bill Cooper reported that Master Keith Widener (NC) won the Friday Special, and Virgil Dulin (NC) took home the bacon in Saturday night's action. In the Friday Early Bird Larry Phifer (NC) scored a 29-hand, a day early for the ACC's \$100. Life Master Dwight Christiansen (CT) scored a 28-hand in the Main Event.

Cooper also reported that this 5th annual event raised \$250 for the Savannah Boys Club...and he gives thanks to all that helped run this event. He also noted that Lindsay Peever unofficially earned his Master rating.

## TIP of the Month

Should I lead the larger card from A-4 or 2-3 couplets?

### By Ras Rasmussen (WA)

Since there is always a distinct chance that opponent will be holding 10-pt cards with one or more fives, play for the fifteen-two. Lead the larger card of the five point couplet. Dealer cannot chance dropping the five on a 4 or 3 lead. Have to admit there is a chance with the A-4 couplet to score the 15 by playing the Ace first as many players will make the count eleven on any lead if they have the cards to do so. My preference remains the four-spot as the lead. In leading the smaller card, an experienced player will drop the five spot and deprive you of the 15 for 2. Do you see the difference in dropping a five on the ace or deuce lead as compared to dropping the five on the 4 or 3 as a lead?


### Pam Pomeroy Tops Winter Solstice







<u>Cribbage</u>

By Tom Lewis The game of Cribbage has been around a long, long time and has changed very little along the way. The game is frustratingly simple on the surface but can prove deceivingly complex upon analysis. Sir John Suckling invented the game in the early 1630's in England. Sir John was born in 1609 into rather comfortable circumstances. His wealthy father was Secretary of State to King James I. His father died when Sir John was a child and at the age of 18, he inherited a sizeable fortune, which he spent freely upon travel, women and gambling. At 21 he was knighted by King Charles I. Sir John had a gift for words, and his poetry made him a favorite with the king. As luck would have it, his poetry did not become popular but he is remembered as the originator of cribbage! At the time there existed two card games called Noddy and One and Thirty. He combined these two games and added his own spin to these existing games. He called his new game Cribbidge and that became a favorite at Piccadilly. As time progressed, the name of the game evolved to Cribbage. Sir John was elected to parliament in 1640. He was later implicated in a rescue attempt of Thomas Wentworth, a political prisoner, from the Tower of London. The rescue plot was exposed and Sir John fled to France. The last heard of poor Sir John was that after his funds ran out, he committed suicide by poisoning in 1642 at the ripe old age of 33. (Many thanks to DeLynn Colvert, President, American Cribbage Congress)

The American Cribbage Congress (ACC) is an international organization dedicated to the game of cribbage. There are almost 7,200 members in the United States and Canada. The ACC conducts organized tournaments all over the nation all year long. There are 170 local clubs that play on a weekly basis in cities and towns. These are called "Grass Roots" clubs and are made up of cribbage players from the local area. There are two such clubs in New Mexico. The Albuquerque club (Sandia Peggers Cribbage Club) plays every Saturday morning from 9AM-12:30PM in the County Communications Center (CCC) at 10401 Holly NE which is just off the NE comer of Paseo del Norte and Eubank NE, Mr. Bud Lake, Director of the CCC and Sharon Foley have generously made their conference room available to the local club. The other New Mexico cribbage club is located in Grants, NM (Mt. Taylor Cribbage Club) and plays on Monday evenings at 6PM. There is also some interest on starting a cribbage club in Las Cruces, NM if additional players can be found in that city.

Preliminary discussions have been held with the Albuquerque Public School System (APS) to establish basic cribbage classes for fifth graders. This will teach the youngsters a wonderful game and will greatly enhance their math skills since cribbage is a game where no scores are written down and counting is done entirely in the players' head.

### ACC Internet Cribbage Van Dyke still in first place

As our season rounds the halfway point, Mark Van Dyke (loosespokes1135) continues to set the pace, with 524 IRPs through the end of December. Behind him lurk Donald Olney (olney\_1147) and Scott Buhrow (MrB\_IA218). Though they trail Van Dyke by 69 and 108 IRPs respectively, these men hold one advantage: they have played in fewer tournaments, and thus have more rated tournaments available to play in.

You see, participants in ACC Internet Cribbage only receive IRPs for the first 100 tournaments they play in each season. This creates a fair and reasonable basis for the annual Internet Championship competition, and discourages team play and ratings tampering. Once players reach their annual quota, they are welcome to continue playing—and their tournament victories will enter the permanent ACC record—but they will no longer earn IRPs. This means that Olney and Buhrow, or someone else, might catch up to Van Dyke once the season wraps up.

The IRP quota system is modeled after our Grass Roots program, which limits official play to the maximum annual tournament allotments for each Division. It's like a professional sports league, in which the annual standings gauge performance based on everyone playing the same number of matches.

### Rule of the month review:

There are occasionally times when the distribution of the cards is incorrect. In these cases, pone's hand, dealer's hand or the crib have too many or too few cards. If this happens, leave the cards as they lay and call a judge. After speaking with both players and observing the cards, the judge will go to the rulebook to determine the action to be taken. These actions are listed on pages 15 and 16 of the rulebook.
