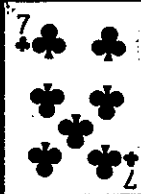

Eastern Region Wrap

Pegging in the springtime in the Eastern Region has produced a bevy of events as this cribbage year winds down, with the National Open (Raleigh) and 2nd Year-In Extra (W. Springfield, MA) culminating the ACC's 25th year in the Eastern Region. May and June saw spirited action on the East Coast.

Ocean State Classic, Pawtucket, RI (May 1): Jeanette Verzillo, Millbury, MA, came home the winner in this sizeable event (136 players). Her last playoff match was vs. Thomas Shea (MA) and she prevailed for the win, earning 196 MRP's and bragging rights galore. Master Nelson Bakken (CT) and Shirley Sanford (CT) finished 3-4. Sanford also scored the meet's only 28-hand. Mike Misluk was the top Q player with a nifty 24 11 +177 card. One-Star Bill Medeiros (MA) copped the 72-player Consolation, nipping Master Paul Batterson (CT) in the final playoff match. Charlie Truett (MA) and Life Master Paul Gallagher (MA) finished 3-4. Rose Chase (RI) took qualifying honors with a 157 +160 card. And as usual, director John Chambers' events always draws large crowds, attesting to his tournament directing skills.

North Carolina Open, Greensboro, (May 13-15):

Willie Evans (WA), fresh from earning Life Master was a long ways from his Richland, WA home, but he copped this event for the 2nd time in a row. With 78 players in the field, Evans garnered yet another 147 MRP's and is approaching the 1,000 MRP mark in a great year of pegging. Phil Vierela (NC) took home 2nd (and 105 MRP's), followed by Howard Terry (VA) and Michael Burham (GA) in the 3-4 slot. Master Jim Lunder (FL) took Q honors with a 35 16 +224 card. Lou Gardner (GA) won the 64-player Consolation, nipping Master Peter Lerch (NC) in the final playoff match. Sharon Liotta (VA) and Rick Allen (VA) finished 3-4. Liotta was also this event's top Q player with a grand slam 20 9/9 +177.

Douglass also reported a nifty hospitality room, complete with strawberry shortcake and brunswick stew...and he promises more of the same at the upcoming National Open in Raleigh in July.

Western Massachusetts Classic, W. Springfield (June 5):

Max Rosenburg, pegging out of Agawam, MA came home the winner in this 84-player event, besting Ken Patenaude (MA) in the final playoff match. With the win, Rosenburg took home 147 MRP's and Patenaude garnered 105. Master Louis Petosa (CT) and Joe Beauregard (RI) finished 3-4. Both players are nearing their Grand Master rating with this high finish. Grand Master Joyce Vanelli (MA) scored a great 21 10 +170 to take Q honors. One-Star Larry Samet (MA) took home the win in the 50-player Consolation, adding to his 11,600+ lifetime tally. Master Sue Cousens (ME) nailed down 2nd, followed by Master Roger Bouchard (CT) and Life Master Rob Medeiros (MA) in the 3-4 bracket. Marilyn Gaudreau (MA) scored a 147 +79 to earn the top Q position. Director Phyllis Schmidt reported that Mark Soule, Woolrich, ME scored the ACC's 27th 29-hand this cribbage season, and he will go down in history as having scored the one-year record-breaking 27th 29-gem. Charles Rapoza (MA) and Mike D'Elena (RI) scored 28-hands.

25th Connecticut Championship, Rockville, CT (May 22):

Life Master Bill Shoemaker (CT) came home the winner for the 2nd time in this event, and this win was a tough one, as his last playoff match was with newly-crowned Two-Star Phyllis Schmidt (MA), but he prevailed for the win and tacked on yet another 147 MRP's to his lifetime tally. Tom Fiorini (MA) finished in the 3-4 bracket and was also the event's top Q player (22 10 +143), scoring an aggregate 115 MRP's. Life Master Frank Corrado also finished in the 3-4 bracket. Master Harvey Glass took home the marbles in the 46-player Consolation. Nancy Wanke (TX) finished 2nd, followed by Lynn Babbitt (RI) and Mark Soule (ME) in the 3-4 slot. One-Star Larry Samet scored the top card in the Q round...a nice 147 +74. Director Bill Richmond reported Pete Marcroft and Tony Mascolo scored 28-hands. Main winner Shoemaker and Consolation winner Glass are both members of the Connecticut GR 26 club, as the championships were kept on home ground. Richmond also reported the players were appreciative of the spacious playing hall and the fine lunch.

Life Master Jack Shumate zipped to the win in the mid-week **Blue Water Classic** besting Tom Langford (CA) in the final playoff match. Bruce Pomeroy, the ACC's "King of the Road" finished in the 3-4 bracket with Jim Waldvogal (CA). Another "King of the Road" is Life Master Jack Moritzky (WA) and he is in the hunt for All-American honors this cribbage year. He did not hurt his chances by scoring the top Q card (38 16/22 +331...60 MRP's).

Front runner Two-Star Duane Toll (OR) is keeping the pressure on national co-front runner Jim Crawford (CA) by winning the 28-player Consolation. Veteran Life Master Bernie Nelson (OR) finished 2nd, with Moritzky and Craig Ferguson (TX) in the 3-4 slot. Ferguson also took Q honors with a nice 17 7/9 +95 card.

Record Crowd David Gilkeson Takes Diamond Mountain

Last year's Diamond Mountain Open played in Susanville, CA, drew 96 players. Rules

In the May issue, Roger Wilson had an article addressing sportsmanship. In the June issue there were two responses, one praising him, the other vehemently opposing him. I am somewhere in between those extremes.

I think I understand the intent of Mr. Wilson's article, and while I agree with much of what he said, consider this:

Some years ago, I had a new player as an opponent. We were still on 1st street when he overpegged a hand by two points.

I pointed out the error, and he corrected his peg. Believing it was an honest mistake on his part, I did not take the two point penalty. I ended up losing the game—by two points!—and I finished out of the money. Had I won that game, I would have finished 2nd or 3rd.

I try not to let that happen to me anymore.

I don't attempt to intimidate or fluster a new player in hope of causing an error (which is what I think Mr. Wilson was opposing). But if my opponent makes an error, I will take the penalty to which I'm entitled. If that constitutes "rule bashing", then I am guilty.

Randy, I agree with Roger Wilson's call for common sense rulings when it is obvious a player had no intent to cheat. But I also agree with you in enforcing an over-pegging penalty. The most common way to cheat is to "pack wood" and it is amazing how many players fail to catch this. In penalizing these players they may get the message it is not a profitable gamble to fudge on the pegging. Ed.

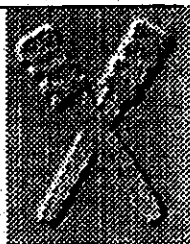

Rule of the month review:

Mixing the hand with other cards:

If a player mixes his or her hand with the crib or pack before it is counted and pegged and before the opponent confirms the count, the player forfeits the count of the hand. If the crib is involved and the dealer mixes the crib with the pack, the dealer forfeits the crib count.

Submitting items for the Grass Roots Corner: If you send your stories to me by email I can edit and copy them into this column. If you send them to me by "snail mail" I can still use them but I have to retype the entire story by hand.

Grass Roots Fees: The \$5.00 Grass Roots (GR) Registration fee that club members pay is only for the September through May GR season. No GR fees are required for summer play. Club Directors will collect this fee when players attend their first tournament of the new season. Some clubs, in an effort to get this task completed early will start collecting the fee in late August and then submit as many as possible at one time in early September.

Grass Roots Club Directors and Statisticians should email Joan Rein, Roger Wilson and their Regional Statistician with any changes to their mail and email addresses, playing locations or updates to other club information.

Club 110 in Honolulu, HI has just finished their 04-05 Grass Roots season with a rather unusual tournament! In their final tournament they had 13 players! 7th place was a 6/3 minus 18 while 13th place was a 6/3 minus 87! We do have our share of wacko finishes and beating up on each other! Equally validated by our Grand National top card of 24/12.

Club #91 (Grand Rapids, MI) has a history of close finishes for club champion, but this year saw the closest finish ever. Going into the final weekly tournament of the year, challenger **Pat Beaudin** had a seemingly safe lead of 22 GPs

over last year's champion, **Jim Blough**. Jim could win the championship only if Pat got no points and if Jim had a grand slam with five skunks. Congratulations goes out to **Lin Bixby of Club 222 (Truckee / North Lake Tahoe Sharks)** who won the club's Grand Slam Pot of \$275.00 and tournament winnings of \$33.00 for a total of \$308.00 for the weekly tournament. With a winning card of 19 and 130 spread points, Lin had an amazing final game leaving her opponent in the stink hole. Outstanding pegging!

Summer season starts for Club 227 in Laguna Woods, CA. Club 227 is a Division 2 club and finished their 2004-2005 Grass Roots season on March 16th after playing 24 GR tournaments. As the summer session started, so did the excitement! After playing Cribbage for over 40 years, **Paul Yellon (CA1255)** scored his first ever 28 hand on May 25th! Paul had never scored a 28 hand prior to this and has yet to attain a 29 hand! In two successive hands and one crib Paul scored 50 points. *(I know what Paul is doing. He's saving his 29 hand for the 2005-2006 season!...Tom)* **Ken Slama** scored a 30 game point scorecard at his former club in Washington during the Grass Roots National Tournament (GRNT). Alas, it was Ken's unofficial entry so he didn't earn any GR rating points or prize money! Laguna Woods has picked up three new players at the

Michael compiled, proofed, corrected, paid, mailed results and in general spent many volunteer hours to make the GRNT a success. After Michael completed his tasks, **Kristy Haught** who is our National Statistician also spent many hours proofing and downloading the results. The last day our clubs were allowed to play their GRNT was April 30th. **Michael and Kristy** finalized the numbers and Michael had the results and checks in the mail prior to the end of May. All those records and so much work yet they still managed to provide us with the results in less than 30 days. A great job by two very hard workers!

2005 Results

The top GRNT player this year was **Patty Echard (NV 585)** playing out of **Sierra-Nevada Club 11 in Reno, NV**. Patty had a very nice 36/16/+299 scorecard, which included four skunks! **Joseph White (FL 1361)** a member of **Club 241 in Palm Beach, FL** placed second with a 35/16/+232. 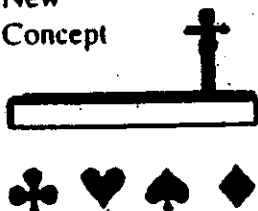

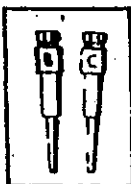
