

# 211 On Pacific Coast...Site Of GN XXIV Dennis Misenar Cops Oregon Coast

The Chinook Winds Casino, Lincoln City, Oregon, was abuzz with peggers the last weekend in April as some 211 peggers descended on this site for some serious pegging. And when the pegs were laid away on Sunday afternoon, only Dennis Misenar, pegging out of Bremerton, WA, was left standing undefeated. Misenar took home 196 MRP's, the winner's trophy, the Super Q, the winner's four-figure check, and bragging rights galore! Another Washingtonian took 2nd...Mike Pendras. Bob Bartoch (CA), a member of the Western Region All-Stars last year, took home a 3-4 finish with Life Master Jim Gogolin (OR).

Newly-inducted Hall 'O Famer Paul Hatcher (OR) took Q honors with a very nice 37 17/22 +232, and with a third-round finish is getting very close to his Two-Star rating.

Master Jeanne Jelke (WA) is posting great numbers this cribbage year and she took home the win in the 128-player Consolation. Master Chris McComas (WA) is among the leaders nationwide and continues to score well this cribbage year, taking 2nd this time around. Master Bud Ferrigno (OR) and Helen Henderson (WA) finished 3-4. Life Master Bill Wakeman (CA) took Q honors with a grand slam 18 9/9 +149 card.

Director Rollie Heath promises ample playing room for the GN, and players unfamiliar with the Chinook Winds will be impressed with the facility sitting on a hill overlooking the Pacific Ocean, complete with the usual casino action and great dining areas.

#### Sharlene Mederios Wins Again! Maine Spring Fling Draws 84

Life Master Sharlene Medeiros (MA) is at it again. This time around she nailed the Maine Spring Fling, played at Portland, ME on April 24. With 84 in the field, Medeiros picked up yet another 147 MRP's and has winged it over the 1,100 MRP mark for this cribbage year, and throws her hat into the national championship race as well. The last victim of her hot run was Jean Gates (NH). Gates picked up 105 MRP's for the 2nd place finish. Pauline Hawkins (NMbr) and Stanley Mullins (NH) finished 3-4, and garnered 70 MRP's each. Lynn Babbitt (RI) had the hot hand in the Q round, scoring a nice 23 11/12 +196 to easily take honors.

Elijah White (ME) took home the marbles in the 40-player Consolation, nipping Robert Fitzgerald (CT) in the final playoff match. Paul Chadburn (ME) and Carolyn Bird (ME) finished 3-4. Fitzgerald was also the high Q player, scoring a grand slam 8/8 +129 card.

Director Susan Cousens reported William Shoemaker (CT) won the High Roller (Charlie Finley was 2nd), and the Doubles event was won by Russ Glidden & Dwight Keirstead. Cousens reported nary a 28 or 29-hand showed.

Joe White Champ At Regency Lakes III

Joe White (FL) came home the winner at the third edition of the Regency Lakes Open, played at Coconut Grove, FL on May 1. With 32 in the field, no byes were in the playoff round, and White zipped to the win by besting Grass Roots Statistician Kristy Haught (FL) in the final playoff match. The win came with 70 Master Points for White, and Haught garnered 42. Esther Rolfe (FL), and Ray Wanke (FL) finished 3-4. Gina Daesch (FL), wife of director Joe Daesch, took Q honors with a 22 10/12 +147 (45 MRP's).

Richie Lang (FL) took the 21-player Consolation win, with Paula Aberle (FL) in 2nd. Steve Campanale (FL) and Bob Chevalier (FL) finished 3-4. Campanale also was the top Q winner with a 15 7 +107 card.

A highlight of this event saw Veronica "Von" Sosh (FL) score the ACC's 26th 29-hand this cribbage season and earned \$100 from the ACC for this gem. 26 in a year ties last year's mark for 29-hands. The next 29 hand scored this season will establish a new high, and with two months play remaining, the new mark will surely be established.

It was a battle of two veteran peggers, ages 85 and 90! Rowley (90) edged the young whippersnapper Julian (85) for the title, making this very likely the oldest combined finalists of all time. Rowley took home 147 MRP's for the win, but Julian, after qualifying tops (38 18/22 +222) took home an aggregate 170 MRP's and throws his hat into the ring for yet another top-ten All-American finish this cribbage year.

Patrick Donahue (IL) took home 3rd, followed by Dale Rohm (WI) in 4th. Each garnered 70 MRP's.

The top ten have their work cut out for them, and a visit to the podium at the Chinook Wind's Awards Banquet this September will be well earned.

# TIP of the month Crazy Eights!



Ben Holder (CA) and Life Master Steve Reynolds (CA) finished 3-4, and each carted home 70 MRP's each.

Pat Farris (CA), Grand Master Evelyn Gilmore (CA), and David Echeberry (CA) finished 2-3-4. Echeberry was also the top Q player with a 15 7/7 +123 grand slam. Director Bruce Forbes reported Dennis & Neva Jacobs won the Friday doubles event, and Heidi Glashan scored the meet's only 28-hand.

Dealing the Cards: The pone shall not reach for or touch the cards before the distribution is completed, except to use the hand or arm as a backstop to prevent cards from falling off the table while being dealt.

AN UNUSUAL HAND in the Chehalis-Centralia Cribbage Club DON WANTA of Toledo produced a bit of excitement when he scored crib's rarest 20-point hand. The Toledo Terror held 2-2-2-9 and found that elusive fourth deuce to tally 20-points. On this night, the hand was worth \$35. This hand is rarer than a 28-pointer, as folks will often hold the 2-2-2 with a card other than the nine. They might hold 2-2-2-A or 2-2-2-3 even though 2-2-2-9 is worth eight points as a starter. Conversely nobody is likely to hold 5-5-5 with a card other than X-pointers if they have the larger card available. In the Chehalis-Centralia Cribbage Club, 2-2-2-2-9 shows once in each

10,888 deals and a 28-hand shows once in each 9,667 deals. And this hand does not occur this frequently in general play where there is no incentive to hold. Since we offer \$25-\$50 for it, we increase the frequency rate. This is the sixth time a player has collected for that elusive 2-2-2-9 in this group. When's the last time you scored this beauty and how many points did you take? Now you know why we call him the Toledo Terror

At Club #318's last meeting in Holmes, PA, they had their first 28 hand. Eric Conroy was dealt four 5's. A king was cut making Eric very excited. Unfortunately for Eric that was the only hand he had all game. He didn't win the game, but the 28 prevented a skunk. Since our club is so new he didn't win much money either. A 28 pays half the skunk jar. At the time of Eric's 28 hand, there was \$4 in the jar. So Eric took home \$2 from the jar!

Club 109 in Stoughton, MA connects with the RED SOX. During a recent interview with Terry Francona, manager of the World Champion BOSTON RED SOX, he was asked how he relaxed in the clubhouse. He replied," I like to play a little cribbage". That was all Doris Perkins (MA 226) had to hear. She collaborated with club member Bill Inglis (MA 1908), who makes and sells custom boards and pegs, to make a special board for Terry. Bill produced a beautiful cribbage board in RED SOX colors, with pegs to match. He donated this board, which was sent to Terry as a gift from club PT 109. Doris sent it, including some ACC info, to the RED SOX office. Three days later, after just returning from a Texas road trip, Terry Francona called Doris to personally thank her, Bill, and the club for the beautiful and thoughtful gift. He was going to try out the board that afternoon. As busy as he was he took the time to call Doris. A classy response from a classy guy. Go SOX Go.

New from Club 150 in Vista, CA. This was the Pacific Coast Pegger's final session of the season: Barb Sacic and Ray Lanoue are 95 wins and 94 wins for the season going into the last night of the season, and no one else is in the race. Barb has an 11 (5W) point card for the night, but Ray comes through with a 12 (5W) point card. Sheeesh! 9 sessions, 81 games played and they are dead tied for 1st place. Now we go to games won for the tiebreaker. Barb had a one win game advantage over Ray going into the final night, 44/43. Final tally: 49/48. Barb takes the 04/05 Club Champion by a tie breaker one game win margin and gets the nice set of (pewter) club championship "skunk" pegs for her efforts. Congrats to Barb.

The fun was only just beginning. We have a hihand traveling can that everyone throws a buck into, and usually the last 24 of the night wins. There always seem to be 5 or 6 players collecting from the hi-hand can. 23 of our 24 players for the night are in the side pot for the hi-hand can, which was a nice, little side pot. 1st game, 1st hand: Ann Nichols holds Q-5-5-5, and up jumps a 5 for the cut card, bingo! 28 hand right out of the box. I nudge Ann...."very nice Ann, you won't have to worry about any 24's taking your hi-hand can away from you now". Alas....she loses the game by 8 pts to visitor Ed Wozniak. 2nd game, second street: Nicki Newvine holds 10-5-5-5 -you guessed right, up come the case 5 for the second 28. Nicki has no trouble in putting away the game win (50 pts). Poor Ann holds the can for less then 2 games and has to give it up to Nicki. Harold Shane becomes Nicky's victim by the 50 spread, and if that isn't bad enough getting shell-shocked by a 28 hand, Harold plays Director Roy Cook the very next game and loses by a 58-spread pt margin. (Harold will get his licks in later) 3rd game, Judy Gilbertson is sitting on Nicki's immediate right, nudges Nicki and very politely, says, "Nicki, would you please pass the can". Unreal, holding K-5-5-5, here comes the 5 again as the cut card and the THIRD 28 hand of the night in the first 3 games.

Alas (again), Judy loses the game by a whopping 20 points to Ann Flaherty after scoring her 28. HEY..........As Director, I would like to lodge a complaint. 28 on my left.... 28(s) to my right, what happened to mine? AHA, I get it, IT IS LADIES NIGHT. Now the weird: Remember poor Harold? The "Special-Hand" of the night was called out as the "first 24" wins the side pot. Harold Shane, along in the 7th game

calls over to me and asks, "Roy, has anyone scored a 24 yet"? I answer, "Nope, not yet, the special-hand pot is still there." Harold answers back and says, "I just had one."

Harold Shane scores the first, and only 24 of the evening, that I know of, and walks off with the \$\$ for the special hand of the night. The only tournaments that I know of that score three or more 28's in one session, are usually the ones in Reno and it usually takes all 22 games to do it, not 9. Actually, 3 in this case. As De Lynn Colvert would say, "Cribbage Fever, catch it"

Club 89 in Springfield, VA, as many clubs do, has a "high hand can" to which most contribute a buck. The can gets passed around to all the "Cribbage Critters" many times during each session as a "24" is usually enough to have possession for awhile. The magic is to be the last one holding it in order to claim the contents. During a recent session we had an odd number of players, which slowed up the play, and we were down not only to the last game being played but to the last hand of the evening. The holder of the can was waiting patiently and had every reason to think that the contents were his as is usually the case at this point in a session. You guessed it! Lorraine Heredeen was the pone, 24 out, and turned up the starter card for this great hand. Unfortunately the dealer pegged out but she got the can and also points. This points out that Yogi Berra was right when he said, "it ain't over till it's over".

Club #91 (Grand Rapids, MI) has a history of close finishes for club champion, but this year saw the closest finish ever. Going into the final weekly tournament of the year, challenger Pat Beaudin had a seemingly safe lead of 22 GPs over last year's champion, Jim Blough. Jim could win the championship only if Pat got no points and if Jim had a grand slam with five skunks. Pat obligingly won only five games and worried and fretted as Jim racked up victory after victory in the kind of night we all dream about: a grand slam and 21 GPs. In the end, however, this was not quite enough, as Jim finished the season a single point behind Pat! While this superb card gave Jim bragging rights for the night, ultimately his victory was bittersweet. As Jim put it, "My best night of cribbage ever wasn't quite good enough." Congratulations to both our new champion, Pat, and Jim for a great year and for providing the rest of us with some of the best end-of-year cribbage theatrics


