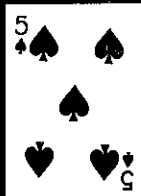
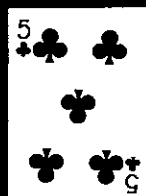

Jim Langley Tops Winnemucca

2005 is an odd year, and One-Star Jim Langley (CA) plays his best in odd year play. He won the national title in 2001 and 2003. It may too late to take home all the marbles this year as Jim Crawford is setting a torrid pace, but Langley has a shot by winning the recent Winnemucca Spring Open, besting some 162 players in the process. The win came with a four-figure check and 196 MRP's, giving Langley a chance to earn All-American honors once again. Winona Johnson (OR) won her first 9 games in the qualifying round and continued on to take 2nd (and 147 MRP's). Jerry Hahn (OR) is nearing his Grand Master rating by taking home 3rd, and "Pink" Pinkerton (WY) took 4th after qualifying 2nd with a 38 GP card. Grand Master Bryant Gilkeson (NV) took Q honors with a slightly higher card than Pinkerton (38 16/22 +250). Life Master John Furler (OR) is among the leaders this cribbage year, and he tacked on yet another 110 MRP's with a 5-8 finish, and zips to the 1,000 MRP mark, with four months play remaining.

A nice crowd played the Consolation (102) and Life Master Roland Hall (CA) came away the winner, besting another Life Master (Bill Wakeman, CA) in the final playoff match. Pete Douroux (CA) and Bob Bartosh (CA) finished in the 3-4 bracket. Douroux also scored the ACC's 22nd 29-hand, earning \$100 from the ACC for this gem. Master Jason Shumate, on a roll this cribbage year, set the pace in the Q round with a great 19 9/9 +146 grand slam.

This event saw three ACC players unofficially earn their Life Master rating: Herschel Mack (CA); Rex Paddock (MT); and Harvey Honeycutt (OR).

Mick Michaelis Classic Draws 155 Bob Julian Rolling

Marinette, Wisconsin was the home of one of cribbage's finest players...Mick Michaelis! Mick earned some 13,562 MRP's before his untimely death several years ago. He was also elected into the Cribbage Hall of Fame, having earned the respect of players nationwide. A tournament in Marinette has been named in his honor, the "Mick Michaelis Classic" and is played annually. It was fitting that another recently inducted member to the ACC's Hall of Fame should win this year's event. Bob Julian, a Two-Star player from Milwaukee came through as champion, earning yet another 196 MRP's, vaulting him to the top of the Central Region's MRP list for this cribbage year. His last match was a tough one, pitted vs. Life Master Al Schaefer (WI), but Julian prevailed for the win. Schaefer, nevertheless, took home 147 MRP's and a nifty 2nd place purse. Nate Selk (WI) and Grand Master Eugene Mikulsky finished 3-4, and garnered 105 MRP's each. Mike DuFresne (WI) smoked the boards in the Q round, scoring a nice 38 18/22 +249 card to take honors.

A sizeable Consolation (93) saw Life Master John Hiland (WI) take home the marbles, nipping Tom Winter (MN) in the final playoff match. Master Pete Kufahl (WI) and One-Star Frank Danielski (WI) finished 3-4. Clarence Charles (WI) took Q honors with a grand slam 19 9/9 +122 card.

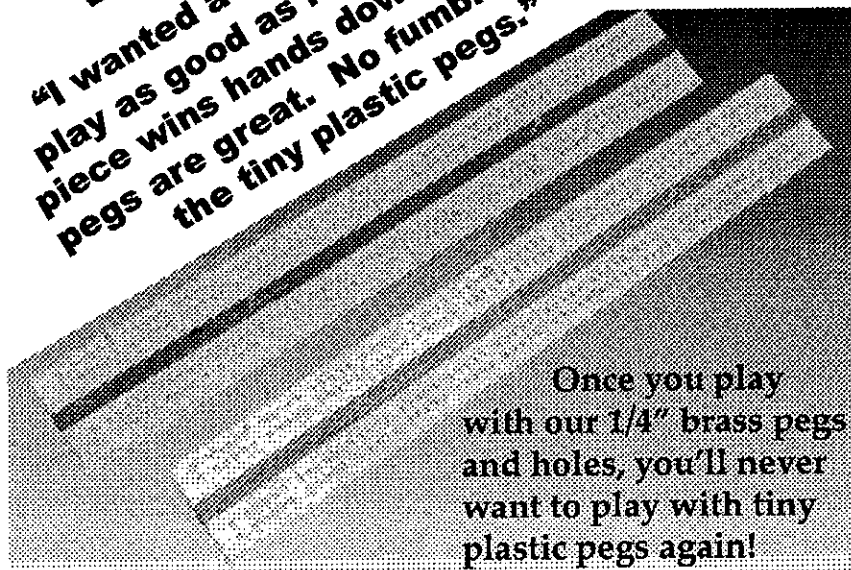

His last playoff match was a tough one, as he was pitted vs. Bill Medeiros, a One-Star player from Thorndike, MA. In fact, the other three top four finalists were all One-Star players. Phyllis Schmidt (MA) and Sharlene Medeiros (MA) finished 3-4 in this star-studded final. Bill Medeiros was also the meet's top Q player with a 35 16/22 +212...and Sharlene was but a stone's throw behind, qualifying 2nd.

With 36 in action in the Consolation, it was Phil Lococo (ON) all the way, as he nailed the Q round with a nice 17 8/9 +104 and won the

playoffs as well. And yet another One-Star player came home 2nd...David Clemmey (MA). Jeanette Verzillo (MA) and Life Master J. J. Rooney (MA) finished 3-4.

Director Nelson Wheaton reported Joan Fletcher won the Early Bird, and the Doubles event was captured by Shawn Jordan and Ken Patenaude. Shawn Jordan and Chet Fickes scored that elusive 28-hand, but no 29's showed.

Master Pat LaBrasseur (OR) and Larry Pisha (OR) finished in the 3-4 bracket...and took home 105 MRP's each. Master Bill O'Malley (OR) took Q honors with a great 38 18/22 +252 card (60 MRP's).

Master Chris McComas (WA) took home the 86-player Consolation title, besting Life Master Heidi Gashan (CA) in the final playoff match. Director Ray Wanke reported players from six states descended on the Best Western Motel on April 1-3 in Kissimmee, FL, and with some 88 peggers in action, every event was won by the local Grass Roots 276 club members. Club 276 had 29 of their 67 members in action, and the home field advantage was astounding, to say the least.

Grand Master John Groz began the onslaught by winning the Friday Night Special (with a grand slam), followed by Rosa Jensen winning the Saturday night event. Jerry Burgess won the Sunday Last Chance.

But the Main Event went to local Herve Danis and he took home 147 MRP's for the win, and bragging rights galore. Danis nipped Dan Fournier (FL) in the final playoff match to take home the win. Life Master Doug Page (WI) and Ken Jensen (FL) finished 3-4. Chuck Barnes (FL) scored a nice 36 17/22 +255 to take Q honors.

Local Dan Niebauer won the 54-player Consolation in his first-time ever ACC event, nipping Scott Bailey (FL) in the final playoff match. Mike Maiden (FL) and Bob Chevalier (FL) finished 3-4. "Easy" Ed Craren (FL) took Q honors with a great 18 8/9 +147 card.

JoAnne Costa scored the ACC's 24th 29-hand this cribbage year in the Consolation. She takes home \$100 from the ACC for this gem.

Director Wanke reported an unusual lunch. The Best Western does not serve meals, so he engaged a "Kitchen on Wheels" to serve lunch in the motel's parking lot, and he hopes to have this as an annual service. He also reported an impromptu Doubles event was played Friday afternoon, and this event will also be added to his future tournaments.

The March issue saw Kathy Tsark (HI) winning this 19-player event the hard way. She was down 0-2, then won 3 in a row to cop the win. Mel Vios (HI) took home 2nd, followed by Ray Sakai (HI) and James Kahue (HI) in the 3-4 bracket. Kahue was the meet's top Q player....winning 9 or 12.

Winning Percentages

I read Adrian Levy's article in the crib world about winning %, and as one of the people mentioned who has a worse winning % but more points I thought I'd reply with my two cents...

Adrian, I read your comments in CW and first of all thanks for mentioning my name; It's always nice to be associated with those players (except Bob Clark of course). I think there are several reasons why winning % isn't the best indicator of Grass Roots points, although it's a pretty good one.

1) There are too many games over the course of the season that don't matter. For example, if I'm playing my 9th game and I've already lost 4+ games in the first eight then it doesn't matter if I win or lose, because the Grass Roots points system doesn't reward that, so I personally just play as fast as I can to get to my car and get home. Because of this, a better stat to keep track of is your winning % in games where you haven't yet lost 4 games on the night.

2) There are certain times when it benefits you to lose a game. Let's suppose Steve Reynolds and I are battling for the club championship, and he's just finished his night with a 13 card. I've got an 8 card and I'm out of it, and I'm playing you and you've got a 12 card. Well, if I lose then you finish with a 14 card and ahead of Steve. Now I'm not saying I lose that game on purpose, but I'm certainly better off if I do.

3) Winning 5 games two weeks in a row is a .556 winning percentage, but it gets you no grass roots points. Winning 7 games one week and none the next is a .384 winning percentage but it gets you 14 Grass Roots points. So really bad nights count the same as mediocre nights, for nothing.

Lastly, the 36 weeks of a single Grass Roots season don't make up a very big sample. I'd guess that if you played for 10 years and won 60% of your games each year you'd win the club championship a considerable number of those times, but you certainly couldn't expect to do it every year.

Heavy Hitters, Cold and Hot Streaks

Concerning the article from Adrian Levy I thought I may be able to clear the confusion Mr. Levy has concerning winning percentages, hot & cold streaks, Grass Roots Rating Points, etc.

First of all winning 60% (13 of 22 with 1 skunk) or more on a regular basis will usually qualify you for main tournament playoffs but it normally takes 66% (6 out of 9) or greater in Grass Roots or consolation play to earn rating points or qualify for the playoff round. That is just the way the numbers seem to work on a fairly regular basis. Of course percentages of an entire Grass Roots season cover a lengthy amount of games, 360 to be exact. Winning 60% of the time will earn a player an undetermined amount of points due to the structure of the system. For instance a player may win 6 out of 9 games (66%) but due to the fact that only the top 20% of all players receive rating points each night the 12 point card (without any skunks) may not be in the top 20% due to a group of higher cards that same night. The following week a player may only win 5 games (55%) but have 2 skunks and place that card in the top 20% that week and receive those 12 rating points. The system we use in Grass Roots play is fair and awards points for those who do the best in their club that night. An overall winning percentage of 60% is something to be proud of but no guarantee of points or cash on a regular basis.

Your question about fluctuations for players winning & losing streaks can be answered in a word, absolutely! That is a factor which is unavoidable. It seems as if there is a select group of players who qualify & win on a fairly consistent basis. Is there a trick to it or an easy answer, no. I learned a long time ago that streaks are part of the game and you must ride out the bad ones and the good ones will come. I have first hand experience of streaks from the past two tournaments. I won 15 of 22 games in the main at Reno and was eliminated 3-0 in the playoffs. I won 18 of 22 at Green Bay and was eliminated 3-0 in the playoffs as well. That's a 75% winning percentage in the qualifying rounds and 0% in the playoffs...now that's streaky! Good luck with your streaks Adrian.

Van Dyke and Rodgers top another record month

After spending several months clinging to a 10-20 IRP lead, Mark Van Dyke (*loosespokes1135*) continued his Winter breakout, riding a 195 IRP March, including one Cribbage Cup and two Single Elimination victories, to a comfortable lead. Although Mark is approaching his annual quota, his will be a tough mark to beat as the season runs its course. Amazingly, March 2005 is not even Mark's personal best. He amassed 198 IRPs back in June 2004, which bumped him from middle-of-the-pack to an eventual All Internet finish.

Despite all this, our March 2005 player of the month is Charles Rodgers (*KALEKA1*), who returned from a four-week absence to notch 204 IRPs, including two Single Elimination victories, as well as one Second and one Third Place finish. That's enough to give him a slight edge over Battle Creek, MI's John Schafer (*netview85*), who racked up almost 100 IRPs himself this month. Schafer has consistently been in the top three all season. Although both these players will need a dramatic finish to catch Van Dyke in their last dozen sanctioned tournaments, they've both demonstrated that they're capable of it! Next in line is Donald Olney (*olney_1147*) of Carlevalle, SA, who seems to have the Canadian division wrapped up, and could still make a run at Second or even First place if he stays hot down the stretch. Olney still has 24 tournaments left to go this season.

Internet Statistician Don Ellis (+*LoneStar_*) reports that our open Single Elimination events set another ACC record for average tournament participation with 89.15 players per event. That's 1,159 total players! Of these ACC members accounted for 609, or 52.55% of the overall participation. For individual tournaments, we set not one, but two attendance records. Saturday, March 19th saw 105 players in a tournament hosted by Don himself—despite missing a number of regulars that were at a live tournament—beating our old sanctioned record of 102. Then, on the last day of the month, Tournament Director Annie Poppe (+*Clas_syLady*) beat that with 107 players. Looks like there is a friendly TD "war" brewing in San Antonio between Annie and Don!

Rule of the month review:

Mixing the Cards: The pack must be mixed at least three times with the cards face down or otherwise hidden from both players. The dealer is not permitted to look at the bottom card after the last shuffle. If the dealer should do so, pone is to remind the dealer that this is not permitted and pone shall score a two-point penalty. The pack shall then be reshuffled.

The Complete Grassroots Manual

is available on-line. Grass Roots clubs are encouraged to review and print a copy for reference. Go to the Grass Roots website www.acgrassroots.org and click on Members Only. Enter your 7-character ACC number. (If you are a Life Member, do NOT enter the L at the end of your ACC number) Click on Club Manual. BRONZE AND SILVER AWARD PROCEDURE

It has come to our attention that a great deal of Grass Roots cribbage players are not familiar with the procedure for earning their Bronze or Silver awards. Every time you play in a Grass Roots nine game cribbage tournament, the top 20% of the players (including ties) earn Grass Roots rating points. After each session your club director or statistician reports the results of that sessions play to the Regional Statistician. This person in turn reports the results to Kristy Haught who is our National Statistician. Starting in December, Kristy sends Jeanne Wauters a monthly list of all players who have achieved enough points to reach their award level. Jeanne waits until about the end of March to send out the first batch of congratulatory letters to the club directors to give to those people. She sends out another batch about the first week in May and a final batch the first week in June to those who reached their level at the end of the season. Obviously those who receive their letters last have much less time to send in their orders. Any clubs that have finished their 2004-2005 season should make sure that those letters, which she has sent to the club directors, are forwarded to those players so that they may make their selections. This works

out fine since the awards are always shipped out about the time these clubs resume play again. Jeanne then compiles all the orders and sends in one large order during the middle of July (It takes about 6 weeks to receive all the awards). The idea is for us to receive all of the awards in time for presentation at the Grand National tournament. When all the merchandise has arrived, Jeanne inspects the orders to check for any possible errors. She provides the company with a shipping list documenting what goes where. Bronze and Silver Awards are presented to players at the Grand National Tournament in September. If a player is unable to attend the Grand National, the awards are shipped to their Club Director in late August to be awarded.

Richard Wardenburg (CA 1369L) of The Placer County Peggers/Club 190 in Auburn, CA scored two 28 hands in the April 4 2005 weekly Grass Roots tournament.

Some 29 hands don't count!! Ryan Gerlach (CA5085) has to work on his timing. Playing out of club #193, Ventura, CA., he scored a 28-hand on 3/16/05. 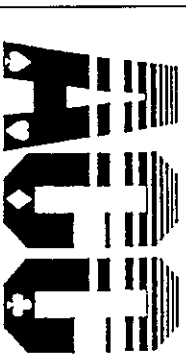
25 Members Will Form American Cribbage Congress's Board of Directors

In August, 1979, the American Cribbage Congress was organized. At the inaugural meeting held at the National Open in Raleigh, NC, a 26-member Board of Directors was named, and a 9-member Executive Committee was appointed. As we vote this month to form our next Board of Directors, the format has changed somewhat. We have pared the Board to 25 members, and have only five Executive positions. The five Executive positions are elected each year by the Board of Directors.

No more than 10 can be elected from any one region, nor less than six. Only four can be elected from a state. If five (or more) from one state are among the top 25, then candidate 26 (27, 28, etc.) would be elected (if from another state). The candidate(s) who finished 5th (6th, 7th, etc.) from one state would not be elected. Be sure to vote today. Support the ACC. This is your opportunity to elect Board Members of your choice. You may vote for up to, but not more than, 25 candidates.

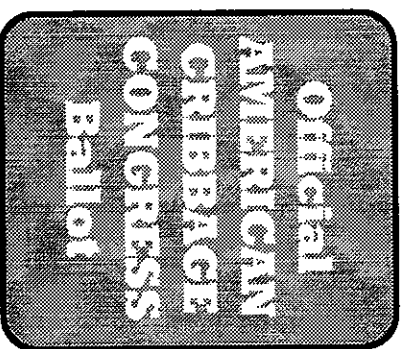

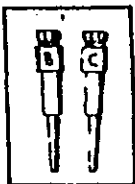
Colvert Absconds Win Super Q Money

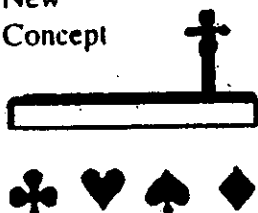
