American Cribbage Congress Hall of Fame

Hall of Fame Nominating Criteria

1- All nominations for the American Cribbage Congress Hall of Fame must be submitted in writing to the Chairman of the Balloting Committee.

2- An indivdual noiminated for the ACC Hall of Fame must meet the following *mandatory* criteria:

A- be a member in good standing of the ACC for seven (7) consecutive years or have been a member for a minimum of five (5) consecutive years until death intervened. B- have displayed and complied with the rules of ethical play.

C- Have displayed and complied with the standards of good sportsmanship.

3-In addition, to be eligible for nomination, a candidate is required to meet at least three (3) of the following *optional* criteria. He or she must have:

A- promoted the game of cribbage and/or served the ACC by specific acts or as specified in the written nomination.

B- established his/her expertise by being rated a Master player or higher.

C- established his/her expertise by being rated a Bronze Award recipient or higher in Grass Roots competition.

D- served as a Tournament Director, or Co-director, of an ACC sanctioned tournament for a minimum of five (5) years.

E-served as a Grass Roots Director, or Codirector, for a minimum of five (5) years. F- served as a member of the Board of Directors of the ACC for a minimum of four (4) years.

4- Any exceptions to or exemptions from the above criteria must be initiated by a current member of the ACC Board of Directors.

Hall of Fame Balloting Procedures 1- Publish annually in the November issue of Cribbage World the criteria for nominating individuals to the Hall of Fame. Declare that nominations are currently being

Declare that nominations are currently being accepted and must be in written form limited to one (1) page to the Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee of the ACC, postmarked no later than December 10 of that year.

2- The Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee will review all letters of nomination received for compliance with the nominating criteria and submit those letters to the ACC Hall of Fame Committee.

3- Voting will take place at the Board of Directors meeting held in conjunction with the JPW/ACC Open tournament in Reno, NV. All attending current ACC Board members have voting rights and each eligible nominee will be voted on by the Board.

4- Each nominee will be notified of the results of the balloting applicable to him/her. The President of the ACC or the Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee will notify in writing any members who are elected to the Hall of Fame. Induction, if any, will take place at the Grand National Tournament and Awards banquet later that year.

PEGGIN' AT THE PUYALLUP!

Seattle-area Grass Roots Cribbage Clubs promoted cribbage in a big way from September 9 – 25 at the Western Washington Fair in Puyallup, WA. This is the fifth largest fair in North America and the largest west of the Mississippi River.

More than 200 volunteer shifts were covered by club members from the Puget Sound area. They challenged visitors to a game of cribbage. Certificates were awarded fair-goers who won. Nearly 500 certificates were awarded in this manner. Hundreds of decks of playing cards were given away to lucky players. Information relative to the American Cribbage Congress and organized clubs was distributed. About 4,000 brochures "Cribbage Anyone?" were distributed. Hundreds of back issues of Cribbage World walked away with those fair visitors. Hundreds of pamphlets on how to play cribbage were distributed.

Fair attendance was expected to exceed 1,700,000. According to conservative estimates, half a million passed directly in front of the cribbage display. Folks were lined up waiting for an available chair for much of those 17 days. Thousands completed an entry form to be eligible to win a customized cribbage board. Each of the clubs in the area provided one of these boards.

Visitors to the fair were from every State, Canadian provinces, and some foreign countries. Regardless of home location, visitors who showed an interest were provided information as to club locations, playing schedules, contacts, etc. The primary purpose of the display was to create a public awareness of organized cribbage wherever located.

Home Team Sparkles in Michigan Tournament of Diamonds

Two players from Grand Rapids captured the top two spots in the 1st Annual Michigan Tournament of Diamonds, held in Grand Rapids, Michigan, on October 1.

In the 12-game main tournament, Marge Schoolland (MI) was high qualifier with 21/9 +151. But it was Brenda Carson (MI), starting from the second-low qualifier's position, who bested the 64-player field, as she rolled through the higher seeds in her half of the bracket before taking on one-star life master Bob McCabe (WI) in the finals. When the dust settled, Brenda had a firm grasp on the handsome diamond-shaped trophy and the \$600 and 105 MRPs that accompanied it.

In the 9-game consolation tournament, Al Scarantino (MI) was high qualifier with 20/8 +187 among the 38 entrants. Tournament co-director Pat Beaudin (MI) qualified #3 and waltzed into the finals against Fred Berger (MI) both of whom were playing in their first tournament final. With the match dead even, in the deciding fifth game it didn't look good for Pat, who was dealing from 15 holes out with Fred needing only 5 pegs to win the game and the match. Pat managed to deal Fred a mere two points, and Fred pegged only two points and thus ended up in the stink hole! With this exciting finish to his first-ever ACC tournament win, Pat took home the winner's trophy along with \$200 and 60 MRPs.

Side note: Pat Beaudin made all of the long boards used in the tournament, as well as the diamond-shaped trophies for the four winners. Perhaps this is what it takes to win a cribbage tournament: become a first-time tournament director, make all of the trophies by hand, and volunteer to do anything needed to make the tournament run smoothly!

This was the first edition of the Michigan Tournament of Diamonds, and great fun was had by all participants. Tournament co-directors David Aiken and Pat Beaudin put together a team of volunteers to help with all the details that make for a successful tournament. In addition, they solicited door prizes worth \$500 from local businesses and individuals. These products and gift certificates were then parceled out to twenty lucky players who preregistered for the tournament. 


