

Rookie of Year Mark Soule Shines GNXXIV: DeLynn Colvert

The Chinook Winds Casino in Lincoln City, Oregon was alive with cribbage players from throughout the USA and Canada in mid-September as the Grand National was in town. A whopping 556 peggers were on hand for this prestigious event, and play began a day early with a Thursday night game. With 214 peggers in action it was Jim Waldvogel (CA) nailing down a grand slam 20 9/9 card kicking off the action for the long weekend, and continued unabated until late Sunday evening.

The Main event had an unique final match, as old-pro Four-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT) was matched with this year's "Rookie of the Year" Mark Soule (ME). In a see-saw match and the score at 3-3, Colvert scored a 7-7-7 peg on 3rd street, quickly followed by a 6-6-6 peg on 4th street to salt away the championship...and \$5,000! And a bonus 355 MRP's to boot to begin the new cribbage year in style! Soule took home 252 MRP's for 2nd plus a whopping \$3,000. Grand Master Bryant Gilkeson (NV) finished 3rd, followed by none other than newly-crowned Life Master Bob Hanes (IA) in 4th. Hanes very nearly won his third Grand National, and remains the only player to win two of these events.

Another old-pro took Q honors...Two-Star Joe Bernard (IL)! He scored a superlative 41 GP card (75 MRP's), but lost his playoff match with last year's champ Three-Star Duane Toll (OR) in a tense match in the early rounds.

A huge crowd (394) played the Consolation, and Salem's Joe Cover earned his Master rating by zipping to a 18 8/9 Q score, but when the pegs were laid away only Hawaii's Charlie Rodgers was left standing, taking home the bacon and his Master rating as well. Hal Lamon (WA) came close but settled for 2nd, followed by All-American Chris McComas (WA) and Robin Freeburg (OR) in the 3-4 slot.

It was Ladies Day at the recent Schaefer Shuffle, played at Slinger, WI in mid-August. Nicky Kneich (WI) earned her Grand Master by winning this 88-player event. Her final match pitted her vs. director (and Life Master) Al Schaefer and she prevailed for the win. Lois Fosdal (WI) and Life Master Richard Frost took home a 3-4 finish.

The 62-player Consolation was won by Hall 'O Famer Martha Fingleton (WI), and she ran the boards, taking Q honors as well. Richard Dane (WI), playing out of the same Grass Roots club as Fingleton, took 2nd, followed by Vickie Lindner (WI) and Roger Wauters (WI) in the 3-4 slot. Lindner was the event's 2nd high qualifier causing director Schaefer to exclaim "Girls Rule!"

Friday night's winner was newlywed Adelia Lange (WI). Schaefer also reported that only Don Flesch (WI) could score that elusive 28-hand (Main event).

Bob Wahlghren Cops Silver City, Takes MRP Lead

Bob Wahlgren, North Grafton, MA can claim his place in the limelight. By winning the recent Silver City Open, Taunton, MA (108 players) Wahlgren zipped to the national MRP lead in the early going this cribbage year. The win came with 207 MRP's (aggregate), and bragging rights galore. He also took Q honors with a great 25 11 +219 card. Life Master John Rooney (MA) finished 2nd, followed by Armand Hamel (MA) and Rob Medeiros (MA) in the 3-4 slot. Medeiros earned his One-Star rating with his high finish.

Ron Rapoza (RI) won the 48-player Consolation, with Life Master Henry Delong (MA) in 2nd. Walter Ballou (RI) and Tom "Tossie" Shea (MA) finished in the 3-4 bracket. Delong was also this event's top Q player (16 7 +80).

Tournament director Jeannine duBois reported that she hogged all the 28-hands (one) and that no 29's showed. This was deBois's first directorship (with co-directors Wayne Tyler and Dottie Vandenberghe), and she was pleased with the excellent turnout.

Rick Vee Tops Cowboy Country Open

With players on hand from throughout the west, the Cowboy Country Open was aptly named. South Dakotan Rick Vee took home the marbles in the 62-player Main event, with Floridian Joe Lewis III taking home 2nd. New Mexico was represented by 3rd place winner Max Condiotti, and Coloradan Sue Edwards (Master) took 4th. Nebraskan Jerry Jaeger took Q honors with a nifty 34 16/22 +168 card.

Bob Fletcher (CO) won the 44-player Consolation, nipping Roger Widdowson (CO) in the final playoff match. Ron Bellomy (CO) and Don Phillips (MO) took home a 3-4 finish. Master George Rodriguez (MT) took Q honors with a 168/9+81 card.

Calvin Braun Wins New England Peer

In a rare match grandfathered by the ACC, players are matched by the number of MRP's they have earned, but once playoffs have started, the format reverts back to the standard method of play.

Calvin Braun, pegging out of Buffalo, New York, has not yet reached his Master rating, but he proved to be a peer of the very best by taking home the win in the 132-player New England Peer Championship. He will certainly move up a notch or two with the 196 MRP's earned. Canadian Alan Wilson finished 2nd, with highly-ranked Life Masters Dwight Christiansen (CT) and Henry Delong (MA) in the 3-4 bracket. 2004's Rookie of the Year Jerry Hardy (ME) showed why he earned that honor as he zipped to the high Q score (37 17/22 +215).

Master Roger Bouchard (CT) very nearly ran the table in the 56-player Consolation as he took top Q honors (18 8/9 +66) and raced to a 2nd place finish as well. Master Ken Patenaude (MA) came home the winner in the playoffs, with Bouchard 2nd, followed by Elijah White (ME) and Jeannine duBois (MA) in the 3-4 bracket.

He organized the Puget Sound Open, played in Tacoma, WA in early September, and 120 peggers showed for the opening bell. And another veteran of the cribbage wars in the Northwest came home the winner...Master Dot Mickow (WA). Her last match pitted her vs. yet another regular... Master Lynn Gillespie (WA), and she prevailed for her 2nd ACC sanctioned Main Event win. Master Don Smith (OR) and newly-crowned One-Star Rollie Heath (OR) finished 3-4, and each took home70 MRP's. Local Jim Boettcher took Q honors with a nice 36 16/22 +165

Canadian Egon Koch (Master) won the 84player Consolation, nipping One-Star Roy Hofbauer (WA) in the final playoff match. Susan Knutson (WA) and Don Zeutschel (WA) finished 3-4. Ted Nelson from nearby Seattle took Q honors with a 17 8/9 +83 card.

Rollie Heath had a fine weekend as he added an Early Bird and High Roller win to go with his 4th place finish. Nancy Lorenz and Sue Pisha took home the Doubles championship, and Don Smith won the Saturday night game. Director Hornbacher reported George Stanton and Bill Rocheleau scored sanctioned 28-hands, and Millie Moritzky scored a 28 in the Early Bird.

Hornbacher also reported the host Tacoma Elks did a fantastic job in rolling out the red carpet for the players, and he has contracted with the Elks for next September 1-2-3 for a re-match. In an oddity, Hornbacher reported that Verne and Jeanette Nielson and Hal and Joyce Lamon donated money to buy a TV and DVO player for the raffle....and Jeanette came away the winner.

Laura Bragg Tops Mike Stier Memorial

The Mike Stier Memorial event in Anchorage was won by Laura Bragg (AK). Steve Yates took home 2nd in this 25-player event. Master Henry Carle (AK) and Don Captain (AK) finished 3-4. Carle also was the top Q player with a nice 31 13/18 +256 card. Director Mike Rowe reported a nice tournament to kick off their season opener.

Katrina Relief Fund: \$600 Bill Richmond Takes Daniel Webster Open

Bill Richmond (CT) earned his Master rating in last year's play, and he continues to pile on the MRP's by winning the 112-player Daniel Webster Open, played on September 11 in Nashua, NH. The win came with 147 MRP's and a nice winner's purse. Lynn Babbitt (RI) finished 2nd, followed by Master Betty Schaeffer (FL) and Donald Russell (ME) in the 3-4 bracket. Life Master Phil Martin (CT) won 10 or 12 (22 10/12 +186) to take Q honors, adding yet another 435 MRP's to his lifetime ledger.

Stan Plachowicz (MA) won the 58-player Consolation, nipping the event's top qualifier Grand Master John Groz (FL) in the final playoff match. Groz qualified with an 18 8/8 grand slam +168. He scored a combination 64 MRP's for this nice run. John Campanella (MA) and Master Harvey Glass (CT) finished 3-4.

Director Henry Bergeron reported Doris St. Marie scored the meet's only 28-hand and the players donated \$297.22 for the Katrina Relief Fund. This amount was matched by the Shaw's Supermarkets/ Albertsons, as, once again, America's cribbage players show their generosity in aiding others less fortunate.

Wayne Steinmetz Wins Madison Masters

Perennial winner One-Star Wayne Steinmetz (WI) has come home with yet another win as he copped the Madison Masters in Madison, WI on August 27. With 119 players in the field, Steinmetz is off and running in the new year with 147 MRP's in the bag. Bart Jaeger (NE) took home 2nd, followed by Frank Pacocha (WI) and Grand Master Jim Huser (WI) in the 3-4 slot. Steve Kari (MN) took Q honors with an outstanding 38 GP +236 card.

Bob Kiley (WI) won the 89-player Consolation the hard way...he had to get by Grand Master Emilio Perez (IL) in the final playoff match, and Kiley prevailed for the win. Al Scarantino (MI) and Master Gael Haelfrisch (WI) took home a 3-4 finish. Jerry Jaeger (NE) scored a 16 GP card to take O honors.

Director Adelia Lange reported nary a 28 or 29-hand showed in this long-running event. This Masters event was played in 1980 and stands alone at the top of the heap (along with the National Open) as the ACC's longest running event.

Jeanne Hofbauer Cops Winnemucca Fall Classic

Life Master Jeanne Hofbauer (WA) was one of the codirectors at the recent Grand National XXIV, and after that workout, she let her hair down bigtime at the Winnemucca Fall Classic. With the pressure off, she easily zipped to the win, besting a large field of 154 peggers. With the 196 MRP's, she has reeached the 9,000 MRP plateau and is off to a great start this new cribbage year. Verne Nielsen (OR) was also one of the Grand National's co-directors, and he "relaxed" to a 2nd place finish...and earned his Life Master as well. Mike McCammon (NV) took home the top prize last year in Winnemucca and very nearly did it again, taking home 3rd. Life Master Bernie Nelson (and yet another Grand National co-director) (OR) finished 4th. It certainly appears it pays to run Grand National events, as the cribbage gods reward you handsomely.

Life Master Herschel Mack (CA) finished a disappointing 11th in last year's All-American race, but he is determined once again to make a run for the roses by taking O honors (35 16/22 +155).

Last year's National Champ, Three-Star Duane Toll (OR) is also at it once again as he won the 118-player Consolation, nipping Master Bob Gromek (NV) 2-1 in the final playoffs. Grand Master Jerold Montgomery (CA) and Mike Watson (OR) finished 3-4. Grand Master Richard Wardenburg (CA) took Q honors with a nice 17 8/9 +103.

A highlight of this event saw "Ratso" Roderick score the ACC's first 29-hand of the new season. In an oddity, "Ratso" also scored the last 29-hand of the 2004 season.

This event had directors galore as DeLynn Colvert, Sharon Hejtmanek, Jeannette and Verne Nielson, Peggy Scalley, and Graeme Gossett had the show on the road with great paybacks. USA DEFEATS GREAT BRITIAN! Don Brown Wins Shut Up and Deal Event





Save a Stroke Victim

Symptoms of a stroke (a true story). Susie is recuperating at an incredible pace for someone with a massive stroke all because Sherry saw Susie stumble...that is the key that isn't mentioned below...and then she asked Susie the 3 questions.

This literally saved Susie's life...Susie failed all three so 911 was called. Even though she had normal blood pressure readings and did not appear to be having a stroke, as she could converse to some extent with the Paramedics, they took her to the hospital right away. Thank God for the sense to remember the 3 questions! Read and Learn! Sometimes symptoms of a stroke are difficult to identify. Unfortunately, the lack of awareness spells disaster. The stroke victim may suffer brain damage when people nearby fail to recognize the symptoms of a stroke. Now doctors say a bystander can recognize a stroke by asking three simple questions:

- 1. *Ask the individual to SMILE.
- 2. *Ask him or her to RAISE BOTH ARMS.
- 3. *Ask the person to SPEAK A SIMPLE SENTENCE.

If he or she has trouble with any of these tasks, call 9-1-1 immediately and describe the symptoms to the dispatcher. After discovering that a group of non-medical volunteers could identify facial weakness, arm weakness and speech problems, researchers urged the general public to learn the three questions. They presented their conclusions at the American Stroke Association's annual meeting last February. Widespread use of this test could result in prompt diagnosis and treatment of the stroke and prevent brain damage. A cardiologist says if everyone who gets this message gives it to 10 people, you can bet that at least one life will be saved.



Rule of the month review:

If two or more cards are played together, the card that corresponds to the announced count is deemed to be the card played and the other(s) shall be retrieved. If the count is not yet announced or does not correspond with any of the cards, the player may play any one of the cards and retrieve the other(s) without penalty.

It was the visitor Carl "Big Money" Heath laying down a 28 hand on the first hand of the third game. Carl scored a 29 hand in the Washington State open, a few years back; He may have found his "Lucky playing Hall" at the Sunnyside Eagles. Where does the name Big Money come from? The 28/29 pot. Carl got ½ of it for a cool \$160.

2005 Chehalis-Centralia Cribbage summer season: Our twelve sessions of summer resulted in some excitement for those who kept us on their calendar. Average attendance during summer quarter was 22.25, only two players less than for official season. Laurie Crosslin of Rochester scored the best scorecard of the summer. Laurie went on a rampage on the first session of the summer period to score 18/8/135. Nobody could match that in the eleven sessions remaining. Three players scored double wins during summer play. Dick Winslow who passed away on 8/15 scored the only consecutive wins. "JUST Dick" won with a 15/7/ 113 on 6/9/05 and topped that effort with a 15/ 7/118 the following Thursday. First runner-up was Brother Gary RAS with 125/58/+349 and a batting average of .586. Club Champion for summer period was "RAS" with 135/61/+637 and a batting average of .565. How can that be? Both runners-up had a batting average higher than the champion. Remember that I had perfect attendance. The runners-up missed one summer session. During other periods of the official season, second runnerup would be awarded \$20 cash. First runner-up would be the recipient of \$30 cash. The Quarterly Club Champion would be awarded \$40 cash or customized engraved crib board trophy as preferred


