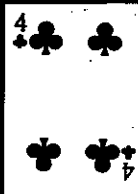

AMERICAN CRIBBAGE CONGRESS

474 In Green Bay! **MGM: Ken Patenaude**

Players come from far and wide to play at Green Bay's MGM Oneida Open and the 26th Annual drew a whopping 474 players. A special player came from Attleboro, MA, and he took home all the marbles...Master pegger Ken Patenaude! And it was no surprise that one of the Barrett's clan of fine peggers took home 2nd...Mike Barrett from Wisconsin Rapids, WI. Another pegger a long way from home, and no stranger to the winner's circle zipped to a 3-4 finish...Life Master Donna LaFleur (CT). Kelly Holt (WI) also finished 3-4. With the large crowd, Master Points galore were awarded. Patenaude took home 252, and Barrett garnered 196. LaFleur and Holt each earned 147. Veteran Aggie Mikulsky (WI) took the Q action with a great 39 18/22 +212 card (65 MRP's) and is knocking on the door for her Life Master rating.

Another large crowd (182) played the Consolation, and it was Bob Culver (WI) winning going away, nipping Grand Master Tony Danihel (WI) in the final playoff match. Syl Lulinski (IL) recently earned his One-Star rating, and he continues his fine play by taking home a 3-4 finish. Dan Kuchn (WI) also finished in the 3-4 bracket. Tony Culver (WI) had the hot score card and took the Q action with a grand slam 18 9/9 +143.

Directors Miller and Gallagher reported some \$3,000 was raised for the Salvation Army, Cerebral Palsy, and other charities. They also reported a whopping \$89,445 was paid to the players, with a great portion casino perks (\$25 for every 24-hand, \$50 for grand slams, \$100 for 28-hands, and \$250 for the lonesome 29, scored by One-Star Rob Medeiros (MA), the first to show in sanctioned play in 3 months, and only the 4th played in sanctioned action this cribbage year.

Players are extra honest in Green Bay. One player left his \$25 for a 24-hand in the rest room, and the money was returned by another player who found it on the counter. And first-time player Paul Niec won \$250, but found \$300 in his envelope...and promptly returned the extra \$50 to director Gallagher. Cribbage players have a long track record of camaraderie and honesty!

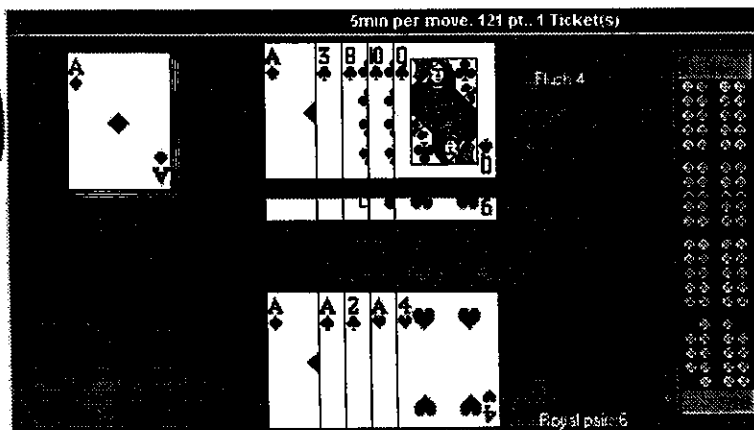

This Master pegger's win is her second Main Event win at this event, plus owning a Consolation win as well. Spouse Jeff (Life Master) has equalled her run with two Main Event wins and a Consolation win. This dead heat is one of cribbageland's stranger stories...which will be the one to break this tie?

Joy nipped Bruce Goff (WA) in the final match and raked in another 196 MRP's. Spouse Jeff finished in the 5-8 bracket (losing to Joy) to make a clean sweep for the Shimps. Dick Strong (MT) and Lou Weisenberg (CA) finished 3-4 and took home 105 MRP's each. Jack Nelson scored a superlative 39 18/22 +233 card to take Q honors (and 65 MRP's).

Life Master Jeanne Hofbauer (WA) nailed down the Consolation win, taking home 84 MRP's to narrow the gap in earning her One-Star rating (9,100+ MRP's to date). Grand Master Don Brown (CA) is also closing in on his Life Master with a 2nd place finish. Grand Master Rosemary Hendricks (WA) and Doris Henken (IL) finished 3-4.

Phyllis Schmidt 3-Time Winner of Tri-Valley

Two-Star Phyllis Schmidt (MA) took home the championship at the recent Tri-Valley Open, played at Medway, MA. This is her third victory at this event, and this time it was a slam-dunk! She also took Q honors with a 22 10/12 +142 card, adding yet another 192 MRP's (aggregate) to her lofty lifetime 17,400+ mark. Her final playoff match pitted her vs. One-Star Al Miller (NH) and she prevailed for her 16th Main Event win. John Campanella (MA) and Master Tom Fiorini (MA) finished in the 3-4 bracket (and garnered 70 MRP's each) in this 124-player event.

With 74 players signed on for the Consolation, it was Life Master Phil Martin knocking down the win, besting Grand Master Cindy Veradt (MA) in the final playoff match. George Byer and Master Barry Spadea finished in the 3-4 bracket. Master Syd Lampke (MA) posted a grand slam 20 9/9 +209 (a very hot card) to easily take Q honors.

Director Pat Llewellyn reported yet another grand slam, this time in the doubles match. Kate Furler and John Campanella took 9 straight to easily win this event. Llewellyn also reported that Nicholas Cheung, Tom Clark, and George Edge scored that elusive 28-hand...and, as usual, no 29's showed.

Dolly Hawkins Tops In Florida

Polly Hawkins zipped to the win at the recent Greater Orlando Open, besting some 94 players in the process. The win came with 147 MRP's, the winner's purse, and her first ACC Main Event win. Georgian David Foxwell took home 2nd, followed by Ken Rasmussen (MI) and Fred Adolphson (FL) in the 3-4 bracket. Floridian Esther Rolfe posted a great 38 18/22 +206 to easily take Q honors.

Master Lindsay Peever (FL) had a great run in the 58-player Consolation, taking Q honors and zipping to a 3-4 finish in the playoffs. But it was Chip Digiovanni (FL) coming home the winner, besting Joe Daesch (FL) in the final playoff match. J. J. Gella (FL) finished in the 3-4 bracket with Peever.

Lola Clay Wins Two Trophy Boards Les Sumner Cops California Championship

Lola Clay (CO) turned 85 in January...and had never won a trophy board. But at the California Championship, played at Santa Rosa on February 25, Clay won two trophy boards! One for being high qualifier in the 56-player Consolation, and another for coming home 2nd in the same event.

But in the Main Event, it was Grand Master Les Sumner (NV) showing the way, topping 86 peggers in the field, earning 147 MRP's for the win. Nancy Rojas (CA), fresh from a grand win in doubles in Reno, finished 2nd. Stan Katzman (CA) and One-Star Jim Langley (CA) finished 3-4. Langley zips to 3rd place nationally with this high finish, having topped 900MRP's for the year. Charlie Dunn (CA) scored a nifty 27 12/14 +288 card to easily take Q honors.

Grand Master Richard Wardenburg (CA) kept Lola Clay from running the boards in the 56-player Consolation as he took home the win. Clay took 2nd, followed by Dalton Bedient (CA) and Walter Reed (CA) in the 3-4 slot.

According to director Avon Ray, Sumner sweetened his run to the championship by scoring the meet's only 28-hand. And, as usual, no 29's showed.

BOD Member Fred White Cops January Hawaii Open

Master Fred White (HI) is an ex-member of the ACC's Board of Directors (serving last year's term)...and he did some directing of his pegs into the winner's hole more often than not in taking home the January edition of the Hawaii Open (17 players). Barry Farinara was a long way from his home in England, and in taking 2nd (and qualifying tops), will have yet another Hawaiian story for his pegging friends over a pint of stout. Charlie Rogers (HI) and Mel Vios (HI) finished 3-4.

Director Tsarkie won the Last Chance with a nifty 19 8/9 +152 card.

122 In Illinois

Bob Wingo Tops In Illinois

The Illinois Open, played at Crystal Lake, saw 122 dedicated peggers in action, and when the pegs were laid away, only Bob Wingo (IL) was left undefeated in the playoffs. The win came with 147 MRP's, bragging rights, and a nifty winner's purse. OldPro Two-Star Warren Sondericker (WI) finished 2nd, followed by Tim Sury (IL) and Master Cyril Schmidt (WI) in the 3-4 bracket. Grand Master Al Karr took Q honors, scoring a very nice 26 16/22 +200 card.

One-Star Martha Fingleton (WI) took home the bacon in the 67-player Consolation, nipping One-Star Syl Lulinski (IL) in the final playoff match. Both Fingleton and Lulinski are members of the Cribbage Hall of Fame, and they continue to show their expertise on the boards. Jerry Newhouse (WI) and Claudette Wandt (MI) finished 3-4. Bart Jaeger (NE) won 7 of 9 games in the Q round to take the Q prize (15 7/9 +115).

Early on they played a double-elimination event, but changed to a round-robin format that is played to this day. The first sanctioned Dante Club Open was played in 1980, making it the oldest one-day sanctioned event in American Cribbage Congress history.

Two-Star Phyllis Schmidt (MA) began her pegging career in this first event played in 1980. She won and has been hooked on the game ever since. And she is the only two-time winner.

Director Bickford reports that for many years a full-house 192 players played, but with the proliferation of events in New England, the number of participants has dropped a bit. Bickford would like to see that full-house 192 again this coming November 5. Mark your calendars.

of the Month

Running A Bluff by DeLynn Colvert

You are holding an A-J-Q-K and your opponent leads a 3. It doesn't take a rocket scientist to determine that if your opponent holds a 2 in his/her hand, you have a loser, no matter what card you play.

I have trained myself to quickly play my ace on the 3 lead, hoping my opponent will believe I have a run-trap set in motion. If he plays his 2 for a run of three, I have given but a single point away, but in many cases, the bluff will work and they play a J-Q or K, and I come home the winner in the pegging exchange, pairing their face card, and very likely getting a go with my ace. They will rarely trap my ace, because if they hold a 3-3-2-Q, or 3-2-1-Q for example, they will take the run early on.

Several years ago I hosted a series of youth cribbage tournaments at North Lake Tahoe. My co-director for these events was Dan Zeisler, the Cribadier General in charge of ACC youth programs. At these tournaments, the young players received cribbage boards, custom pegs, cribbage T-shirts, playing cards, and other perks, all donated by the ACC, individual ACC members, and the North Tahoe business community.

The last year that I hosted this tournament, my friend and fellow cribbage player Mike Wiley became gravely ill and decided to donate his cribbage trophies to the youth program before he died.

When Dan and I handed out Mike's trophy boards to the young players at our next event, the response was overwhelming. Mike had many nice boards, and the young players received them with gratitude and enthusiasm.

Among Mike's collection were also several plaques. While it is easy enough to remove an engraved plate from a trophy plaque and replace it with a new one, wall plaques have only visual value and cannot pass on the pleasure of play to future generations.

Dan Zeisler tells me that several other ACC members, after learning of Mike's gesture, donated their own impressive collections of trophy boards to support the youth program and inspire young players.

A well-made cribbage board is truly a "gift that keeps on giving," a source of pleasure as well as pride to whoever enjoys the hours of playing on it. Since we have so many fine cribbage board craftsmen in the ACC (such as Bill O'Malley, Chris Christensen, and Roy Boyles), it makes especially good sense for tournament directors to select boards as trophies.

I was sorry to read in a recent CW of the passing of Carl Mantini, one of the greatest board makers of all. A retired machinist, Carl produced a cast-aluminum-on-walnut board with a perfect fit and feel, the ultimate in precision and craftsmanship.
