Barbara Bouchard Scores \$1,100 29-Hand Reno: Ras Rasmussen

"28-hand!" shouted Eveleyn Gillmore (CA) on the very first hand of the qualifyng round of the Veteran's Day Classic in Reno on November 11th...the third time within six weeks that has happened in the Western Region. And the 22nd game, with but a hand or two to play, a "29-hand!!" shout rang out as Barbara Bouchard, pegging our of Cornish, Maine nailed down the \$1,000 Saturday bonus for this gem, with the ACC adding yet another \$100 for the 4th sanctioned 29-hand of this cribbage year.

The next day the streaking One-Star Ras Rasmussen (WA) zipped to the playoff win...and the National MRP lead as well by winning a 4-2 match with Minnesota's Mike Burns, a Grand Master who kicked off this event with a stirring rendition of the Star Spangled Banner a day earlier. With 298 peggers in action, Rasmussen took home 252 MRP's (and \$2,250) and is standing at the 600 mark this cribbage year. Burns took home 196 for 2nd, Grand Master Don Patrin (MN) and Rod Foy (CA) finished 3-4. Foy recently earned his Master rating and continues his fine play with this high finish.. Ben Holder (CA) unofficially earned his Master rating as well by posting a nifty top-Q score of 35 16/22 +223.

The Consolation fielded 204 players and Master Thelma Weber scored a superlative 19 9/10 +119 card to take Q honors, but when the pegs

were laid away only Tom Moler (NV) was left standing, taking home \$900 and 112 MRP's for the win. Sylvia Sutton (CA) also unofficially earned her Master rating by taking home 2nd (and 84 MRP's). Grand Master Richard Wardenburg (CA) and Calvin Libby (ME) finished 3-4.

John and Sheila Kern, La Mesa, CA kicked off the long weekend of pegging by nailing down the Doubles win on Friday night. The win came with a generous \$1,250 prize. Steve Hastie (CA) nailed down the Saturday night High Roller event (\$600) and the Sunday Night Special saw Dennis Bays (CA) come home the winner, taking home \$380 "gas money" to wind down the weekend's play.

Barbara Bouchard scored the event's only 29hand, but a bevy of players scored 28-hands: Evelyn Gillmore, Ira Deutsch, Annett Eiffert, Dee Kinney, Jackie Doppelt, and H. Ross Njaa.

The Sands once again rolled out the red carpet for the players adding \$2,500 to the prize fund and furnishing coffee and cakes 3-days running. The usual turkey/ham buffet lunch on Saturday was a bargain to boot. Bill and Dorthalee Irons, Roberta Huff and staff ran a well-run event, with Barbara Woodward representing the Sands with her usual expertise. The Sands donated \$2,980 to the Veteran's Fund as well.

Dan Marsh Tops Salem

Master Dan Marsh (OR), a member of last year's All-American team, continues to show his expertise on the boards by taking home the win at the 122-player Salem (OR) Classic on October 29. His last playoff victim was Larry Pisha (OR). Marsh carted home 147 MRP's and Pisha garnered 105. Grand Master Chris McComas (WA), an All-Ameican in 2005, finished in the 3-4 bracket with Tom Dobscha (OR). Each player took home 70 MRP's. Last year's MRP National Champion Three-Star Duane Toll (OR) zipped to Q honors with an excellent 40 18/22 +280 card, one of the highest recorded this cribbage year.

It was ex-National Champion day in Salem as two-time National Champ Jim Langley (CA) ran the table in the 78-player Consolation. This One-Star player zipped to Q honors with a 16 7/9 +90 card and won the playoffs as well, adding 99 MRP's to his lofty lifetime total (14,600+). Master Nancy Lorenz (OR) finished 2nd, followed by Master Laurie Logan (MT) and Master Dean Bauman (OR) in the 3-4 slot.

Bill Johnson Hot At FeatherRiver

Bill Johnson from nearby Red Bluff (CA) was smoking at the recent Feather River Open, played at Oroville, CA on October 7. Johnson nailed down a 31 GP card (18 games) to take qualifying honors, and then waltzed through the playoffs to take home the championship as well. With 110 players in the field, Johnson took home a whopping 197 MRP's. His last playoff match was against the formidable Three-Star Jesse Jarrell (CA) and Johnson prevailed. Jarrell has won this event 4 times, and almost a 5th in the 21-year history of this event. One-Star Jim Langley (CA) and John Prehn (CA) finished 3-4. Langley's high finish keep him on track for yet another National Championship.

Grand Master Ira Deutsch (OR) won the 50player Consolation, nipping Grand Master Jerold Montgomery (CA) in the final playoff match. Rod Foy (CA) earned his Master rating in finishing in the 3-4 bracket with Richard Hinrichs (CA). Hinrichs also took Q honors with an 11 GP card (7 games).

Directors Vaida and Tom Stevens reported Life Master Boyd McDonald (CA) winning the Friday night game, and three players scored 28-hands...Dennis Phillips, Del Robinson, and Roger Bailey. The Steven's claim their swiss steak dinner is one reason for the continued popularity of this event.

With 60 peggers in action, he garnered 105 MRP's...and 2nd place winner Rodney Rideau (CA) carted home 70. Master Pam Pomeroy (CA) and Richard Smeltz (CO) finished 3-4 (42 MRP's each). Pomeroy also won 10 of 12 with a skunk in the qualifying round to take honors.

Director Obie Weeks reported Collin Pratt (CA) won the Early Bird with 18 8/9 +140 card...and all the players were treated to avocados. No 28's or 29's showed.

Pam Pomeroy Takes Orange Crush

With the match at 3-3, Bloeser won the 7th and final game to take home the marbles. Bloeser also took Q honors with an outstanding 38 17/22 +293 card. This run netted an aggregate 130 MRP's for Bloeser. Frank Horn (MO) and David Yaeger (MN) finished 3-4.

Grand Master Marvin Lang (IL) took home the win in the 18-player Consolation, besting Don Phillips (MO) in the final playoff match. Lynn Gillespie (WA) is knocking on the door for his Grand Master with a 3-4 finish with David Yaeger (MO). Phillips also took Q honors with a 16 8/9 +85 card.

Hunt took home 147 MRP's and the champion's bragging rights. Her last playoff opponent was Rick Vee (SD) and she prevailed for the win. Vee took home 105 MRP's for his high finish. Vee was hot the entire weekend, as he copped the Friday night action with a stellar 19 8/9 +158 card. Roger Widdowson (CO) was also on a roll as he took Q honors in the Main Event with a 36 17/22 +234 card, and waltzed to the 3-4 round before falling, Ron Bellomy (CO) also finished 3-4.

Starting on January 1, 2007 all tournaments will have random seating. This means that all seats will be drawn from one common container. The only exceptions would be for handicapped seating and for all major tournaments, which will have assigned seating.

Also, anyone attending with their spouse or a close friend, who they choose not to meet in the qualifying round, may draw three (3) numbers from the container and keep any two (2).

Also, starting on January 1, 2007, all directors will be receiving new report forms. The reason for the new forms is you must now report all payoffs, including "Q" pools for the Main and Consolation, and all satellite events.



News from the ACC Board of Directors Meeting

September 29, 2006

The ACC Board of Directors Meeting was held on September 29, 2006 in Wisconsin Rapids, WI. The following ACC Internet Cribbage topics were submitted for proposal proposed and were accepted by the Board of Directors.

1. Award Levels

Members will accumulate Internet Rating Points and be awarded certificates for reaching specified levels. These levels are:

- eMaster 2000 IRPs
- eGrand Master 4000 IRPs
- eLife Master 6000 IRPs
- eOne Star 10,000 IRPs
- eTwo Star 15,000 IRPs
- eThree Star 20,000 IRPs
- eFour Star 25,000 IRPs

and so on by 5,000 IRPs.

Once a player attains eMaster, they will receive an automatic invitation to the annual ACC Tournament of Champions.

I believe that there are a couple of players who have accumulated sufficient points to reach eMaster and several additional players not far behind. I will be reviewing the lifetime statistics and will make the announcements shortly.

2. Certificates of Achievement

The ACC Board of Directors approved the development of Certificates of Achievement for the ACC Internet Cribbage program. Lois Fosdal, the Assistant Internet Statistician, will lead the design of the Certificates of Achievement that follow the standard

ACC format for certificates. The design(s) will be presented to the ACC Board of Directors for their approval at their next meeting in February. Certificates of Achievement will be for those individuals who attain the various levels and for the top 10 point earners. Once approved in February 2007, certificates will be produced for all top 10 finishers going back to the first three seasons plus those who attain the award levels.

3. Study for the Feasibility of Fee-Based Internet Tournaments

The ACC Board of Directors approved the study for the feasibility of fee-based internet tournaments. I received many requests for holding fee-based tournaments. At this time there will be a study to determine if the ACC should support fee-based tournaments.

Rule of the month review - Placement of the cards in the crib: If all four cards are discovered to be on the pone's side, they shall be moved to the dealers side without exposure, unless the starter card has been turned and each player has played at least one card. In that event, the crib becomes the property of the player on whose side it lies and the other player becomes the pone and next dealer in that game.


