George Mackie Wins **Washington Title**

Director Ras Rasmussen retained his title as the ACC's top promoter as he beat the bushes lining up some 109 sponsors for his Washington Championship, played in Centralia, WA in mid-January. Rasmussen reported some \$13,000 in cash, merchandise and services were added to his prize fund. This largess continues to draw a crowd. and this time around some 188 players were on hand for some spirited pegging.

Grand Master George Mackie, pegging out of Seattle, had the hot hand and came home the winner, besting Life Master John Furler in the final playoff match. The win came with 196 MRP's, a 4figure winner's check and a nifty trophy board. Furler took home 147 MRP's for 2nd and a trophy board as well. Three-Star Duane Toll (OR) continues his hot streak and added yet another 140 MRP's (aggregate) to his huge national lead this cribbage year. Ron Gustafson (WA) also finished in the 3-4 bracket and took home 105 MRP's as well. Craig Jenson (OR) took Q honors with a nifty 38 17/22 +269 (60 MRP's).

The Consolation drew a sizeable 140 peggers and it was Master Dan Marsh (OR) taking home the marbles. He nipped Alaskan Darlene Stier in the final match. Stier is also a Master pegger. The 3-4 bracket saw Grand Master Todd Anderson (OR) and last year's national runner-up Grand Master

Jim Crawford (CA) take that action. The top qualifier was Master Bruce Gentry (WA) (18 8/9 + 161).

Rasmussen reported all events paid at least 118% paybacks, and all 28-hands were rewarded with \$50. Some 18 23-hands were paid \$23 each as well. Even the lowest score of the day in the Main Event received a surprise \$50 bill. The host Moose Lodge provided tasty meals three-days running and the Boy Scouts received \$300 for assisting in the parking and security. A raffle sported some \$2,000 in prizes as well. Rasmussen reported five new members to the ACC were signed on board...and he looks forward to yet another banner event next year. Stay tuned.

Two-Star Final Palmer Vs. Schmidt

The action was hot and heavy in Virginia's longest running consecutive year event as the usual suspects assembled to get the New Year off to a fast start with only four days to recover from New Year's Day football! Friday night's Opening Skirmish saw Grand Master Larry Phifer of Raleigh, NC, top the field of forty players with a 21/19-10/183 card. In Saturday's Main qualifying event, John Noblet (VA) led the qualifiers with a 34/17-22/131, but could not hold off Two-Star Life Masters Harry Palmer and Two-Star Phyllis Schmidt who met in the finals to make it an all Massachusetts final. These two have a total of 46 lifetime tournament titles between them, and it was Harry who added a 23rd title to his resume with a hard fought 4-3 win over Phyllis. Joyce Bryant (MD) and Bill Cooper (GA) rounded out the top four in the field of seventy participants.

Grand Master Russ Perkins (NC) recorded a 19/9-10/149, losing a single game by 1 hole, to qualify first in the forty-six player Consolation qualifying event. But, at the end of the day, it was all Richmond in the finals as Ron Reece (VA) and newly crowned Master Hugh Berry (VA) met to decide the Consolation tournament champion. In a closely contested match, Berry prevailed to take the title. Bruce Sattler (MD) and Bob Moore (VA) finished in the third place position.

In the Friday night Opening Skirmish Andy Laventure (VA) recorded a twenty-eight hand. This was a preview of what was to come in the Main event as Larry Phifer (NC), Andy Hulcher (VA) and Matt Easterbrook (VA) all followed with twenty-eights in that event. Bob Moore (VA) took Saturday's Old Dominion Special and first time tournament participant Cate Campbell (NJ) finished in the money! It's always good to see new faces on the tournament trail. Bruce Satter (MD) won the High Roller event - again with an 18/8-10/157 card. By qualifying fifth in the Main, Howard Terry (VA) attained his Master rating. Terry and Palmer teamed with Keith Widener (NC) to take first place in the Three Person Team competition with a combined game point total of 92.

Needless to say a good time was had by all and the Richmond Cribbage Club will again host this event on January 12 – 14, 2007.

862,449,968!

My name is Kevin Kurowski, and a Paraplegic due to a car accident. I have been in rehabilitation centers for a year now. It does get kinda boring and I do things to keep my mind busy. One of the things I used to do is split the deck into four piles of 13 and see how fast I could count them cribbage style. They would range from 20 something to the hundreds. I then got wondering what the entire deck would be if you counted it cribbage style. I had no idea how big the number would be until I got into it for a while. I was thinking thousands, not millions. The easiest one was the flush's. There are 13 cards of each suit and four suits so that makes 52. Then the pairs, since four of a kind is 12 points (six different ways to get a pair for 2 points) and there are 13 sets that makes 156 points. The straights are where the big number comes in. If you start out with an ace through king you have 13 points (one for each card). Then if you introduce another king it doubles, then another and it triples, and the last and it quadruples, so 13 times all four kings is 52. Then multiply 52 by four queens and you come up with 208. If you do this with all the remaining cards you just keep multiplying your total by four and bringing your number up to the 13th power which is 872,415,232 This leaves all the combinations of 15's, There is no easy calculation to find all the fifteens in the deck. I actually spread them all out on the table and did them by hand, being careful not to miss any. I ended up missing some and Roger Nelson, (you website visit his can www.bikwritr.net) and I worked together and figured out a system of calculating all of the 15's.

Add all of these up and you get a grand total of 34,528 points in fifteens. Add this to the 156 in pairs, 52 in flush's, and 872,415,232 in Straight's and you get yourself a grand total of 872,449,968 if you were dealt the entire deck and counted it cribbage style.

Hey, Kevin, I just needed a single point to win a high roller event recently. Could I get it? No way! Ed.

Al Miller (NH) earned his One-Star rating last year...and he continues to pile up the MRP's by winning the recent Northern New England Championship, played at Portsmouth, NH on December 2-4.

With 82 peggers in the field, Miller took home yet another 147 MRP's to add to his lofty lifetime total. Jerry Hardy (ME) was Rookie of the Year for the 2004 season, and he, too, is still knocking out the MRP's as he finished 2nd (and earned 105 MRP's). Vickie Soule (ME) and Theresa Clark (MA) took home a 3-4 finish (and 70 MRP's each). Master John Brennan (MA) had the hot hand in the Q round, scoring 35 GP's and taking home 45 MRP's for this fine effort.

Mandell Chernoff (VT) captured the 42player Consolation title, nipping Joan Fletcher (CT) in the final playoff match. Master Bob Fitzgerald (CT) and Stan Plachowicz (MA) finished 3-4. One-Star Bill Medeiros (MA) scored a superlative 22 GP card in the qualifying round to easily take honors.

Director Scott Noble reported Jeff Raynes won the Friday Early Bird, Keith Widener took the High Rollers, and the Doubles event was copped by Chuck Dolge and Zach Widener. Jeff Raynes scored the event's only 28-hand in the Consolation.

Grand Master Jim Crawford (CA) took home a nifty 110 MRP's (aggregate) by qualifying tops (21 9/12 +193) and zipping to the win in the playoffs at the recent Winter Solstice Open (Ventura, CA). of the Month Giving Your Hand Away by Daniel Kotok

Daniel Kotok (FL) is a new player insofar as tournament play is concerned. He wrote Cribage World to express his dismay over losing a game because he stalled too long on the play and feels he gave his hand away.

Kotok needed 7 to win with the deal, and his opponent needed 6 to win with first count. Kotok holds 2-4-4-9, and his opponent held 9-9-10-10, and led a 9.

Kotok stalled over the play and finally played a 4. His opponent played a 10, and later trapped Kotok's 9 for the winning three pegs. Kotok feels he gave his hand away with the delay in mulling over that first card played.

Moral of the story: Be prepared to play without stalling if at all possible. Get in the habit of stalling slightly even with a "nobrainer." At least try to disguise your play with consistent speed in pegging.



Van Dyke surges, Poppe is remembered

Mark Van Dyke has spent more time than anyone atop the ratings list, and the 2004–5 Internet Champion has added yet another month to his belt, compiling 186 IRPs during November, including two victories, a Second Place and a Third Place finish to claim the top spot by a substantial margin. This resident of Grand Haven, MI, who pegs online as loosespokes1135, certainly displayed his championship form. Tied for Second Place are Van Dyke's neighbor and perpetual chaser John Schafer (netview85) of Battle Creek, MI, and John Dellarsina (ginprofessor3) of El Cajon, CA, who has come on quickly after winning his first ACC Internet event as recently as September 5.

Player of the month, though, is Saskatchewan's finest, Donald Olney (olney_1147), who hails from Carievale, on the banks of the Antler River, just 20 km from the border with North Dakota, if you're keeping track. Olney won two large tournaments, worth 63 IRPs each, finished Third in another and added three more high finishes to amass 210 IRPs on the month to enter the Top Ten in style.

As reported in December, Annie Poppe died suddenly on November 15 as a result of a cerebral aneurysm. Annie was a regular tournament director for ACC Internet Cribbage on Thursday nights, a task she performed with her online nickname +Clas_syLady, a moniker she certainly lived up to. In her honor, the ACC will hold an annual online memorial tournament. The first Annie Poppe memorial was held on Thursday, November 17th, and attracted 212 players. The single-elimination 4-stake match event was won by a non-member. The highest-placing member was our own Internet Cribbage Commissioner Robert Milk, who took Third Place.

The November 19 Pegging Pals single elimination event was won by Charles Barnes (Chuck_FL1445), the 2003–4 Grass Roots Division 1 Champion (your friendly ACC Internet Cribbage Editor remembers this well, as he finished Second that year!), which goes to show the caliber of player we attract online! It also proves that Charles can win outside Florida. Congrats to Charles for his first ACC Internet victory. Our other November first-timer was James H. Morrow (_29seeker), who directs the Silver Dollar Grass Roots Club in Sunnyside, WA.



SLOW PLAY & FAST PLAY

There has been much discussion on slow play. Let's look at this controversy and its' possible solutions from a realistic standpoint. There are essentially three kinds of players. Slow players, fast players and average players. In an idealistic situation, everyone finishes about the same time and moves one seat to the right. As we all know, the majority finishes at about the same time. The fast players finish early and are waiting to move. They usually have to wait a short time to start their next game. If two fast players have just played, each is waiting to move one seat to the right. The slower players on the other hand will play their match and move when they are done. The problems of slow play arise not from a single game but from a series of slow games that tend to slow down the entire table. At that point, many players are standing and waiting for the game(s) in front of them to finish. There are many reasons for slow play that have been discussed adnauseam so I won't go into them here. There is however, one very simple method of discovering that a player is playing too slow. If the games on both sides of you consistently finish before yours, then the slow player(s) should make an effort to determine what is causing their games to be slow and to correct the problem.




