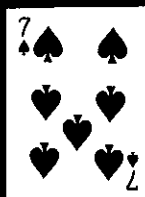
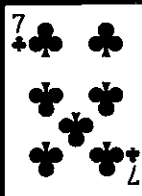

Vicki Soule Cops Ocean State

On May 7, the LeFoyer Club in Pawtucket, Rhode Island was alive with peggers, as some 120 were in action in a try for the Ocean States Championship. Vicki Soule, pegging out of Woolrich, Maine zipped to the win, besting Master Barbara Barbour (CT) in the final playoff match. The win came with 147 MRP's, bragging rights, and the winner's purse. Barbour nailed down 105 MRP's for her 2nd place finish. Master George Edge (RI) and Bob Wahlgren (MA) finished 3-4 (and 70 MRP's each). Grand Master Doris Perkins took Q honors with a nifty 22 +168 card (45 MRP's).

With 62 peggers in the field for the Consolation event, it was Alice Monkiewicz coming home the winner. She nipped Mark Soule (ME) in the final playoff match. Soule also nailed down a 2nd place finish at the recent Grand National in Oregon. John Campanella (MA) and Lee Dillon (MA) finished 3-4. Soule also took Q honors with a 15 +135 card.

Director John Chambers reported Frank Sigda and Jeanette Verzillo scored 28-hands...and that no 29's showed.

Jim Tanner Tops In North Carolina

Jim Tanner, pegging out of Moseley, VA nailed down the win at the recent 74-player North Carolina Open. Tanner nipped Brenda Snow (NC) in the final playoff match and took home 147 MRP's for the effort. Snow garnered 105 MRP's for 2nd. Jan Viands (VA) and Chuck Yoemans (VA) finished in the 3-4 bracket. Viands also took the Q action with a nifty 36 15/22 +272 card.

Grand Master Larry Phifer (NC) took home the marbles in the 50-player Consolation. Master Peter Lerch finished 2nd, followed by Virgil Dulin (NC) and Danny Bennett (NC) in 3-4. Lerch scored a great 19 8/9 +127 card to easily take Q honors.

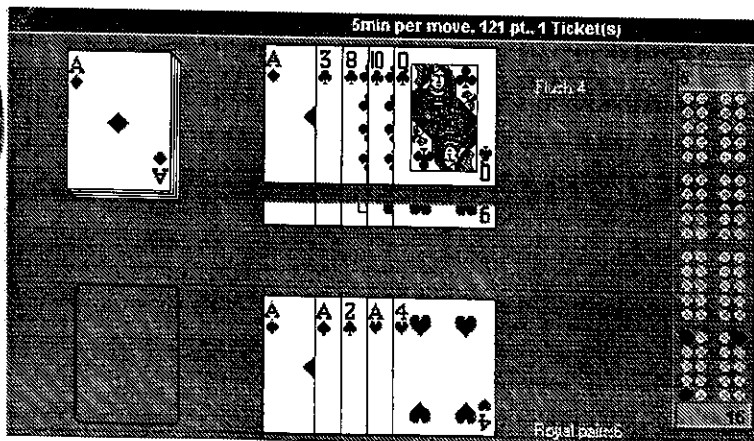

Richard Frost Nails "That's a Go"

Life Master Richard Frost (WI) took many "Goes" in winning the "That's a Go" event played in Appleton, WI in early June. In besting the 87-pegger field, Frost took home yet another 147 MRP's to add to his sizeable (8,600+) lifetime tally. Master Lee Tesch (WI) nailed down 2nd (105 MRP's), followed by Louis Kampo (WI) and Don Hannulah (MI) in the 3-4 slot. Grand Master Doug Henderson (WI) scored a great 36 17/22 +182 card to easily take Q honors.

Director Kristina Wright (WI) came home the winner in the 52-player Consolation. She zipped by Grand Master Al Karr (WI) in the final playoff match. Master Dan Pluff (MN) and Master Sharon Schaefer (WI) finished 3-4. Hubby Al Schaefer (Life Master) took Q honors with a 16 7/9 +137 card.

Director Wright reported that only Dutch Haglund could score a 28-hand...and that no 29's showed.

Dan Marsh Cops Diamond Mountain

Master Dan Marsh (OR) throws his hat into the ring for All-American honors this cribbage year by winning the Diamond Mountain Open (Susanville, CA) on May 21. With 114 peggers in the field, Marsh took home 147 MRP's and has topped the 1,000 mark for the year. Two-Star Paul Hatcher (OR) finished 2nd, and has topped 900 for the year, and, he too, has a shot at All-American honors. James Fanning (CA) and Grand Master Jim Crawford (CA) finished 3-4. Hatcher also took Q honors with a nice 33 15/22 +66 card.

Vaida Stevens (CA) nailed down the Consolation win, besting some 80 players in the process. Life Master Herschel Mack (CA) finished 2nd followed by Anna Dunn (CA) and One-Star Jim Langle (CA) in the 3-4 bracket. The whirlwind Grand Master...Cy Madrone...took Q honors with an excellent 20 9/9 +183 grand slam.

In besting a huge crowd of 138 peggers, Brown took home a whopping 196 MRP's and bragging rights galore. Helga Hepdith (BC) had the crowd buzzing as this was her first sanctioned event ever, and she very nearly took it all, settling for 2nd (and 147 MRP's to kick off her ACC career). Master Laurie Logan (MT) and Richard Crawford (NV) finished 3-4. Gerry Klein posted a great 36 16/22 +239 card to easily take Q honors (and 50 MRP's).

Local Don Bain took home the win in the 100-player Consolation, besting the streaking Master Erik Locke (OR) in the final playoff match. Locke is well over the 1,000MRP mark for this cribbage year and has an excellent chance of earning All-American honors. Fredella Haab (MT) and Dave Braach (MT) finished 3-4. Local Evon Forrest scored a nifty 18 8/9 +181 card to take Q honors.

Grand Master Russ Perkins was rolling bigtime at the February 2nd Annual Charlottesville Open (NC)! He zipped to the top Q score (37 17/22 +214) and continued on to win the event in the playoffs. This great run netted Perkins 160 MRP's (aggregate). Jack Howsare, a Master pegger from Virginia Beach, VA, was Perkins' last playoff victim, but 2nd netted 70 MRP's to ease the pain. Life Master Larry Phifer (NC) and Sandra Shrum (VA) finished 3-4.

Master Bernard Whitfield (NC) took home the win in the 34-player Consolation, nipping David Smith (NC) in the final playoff match. Master Rick Bryant (MD) and Clyde Royce (VA) finished 3-4. Grand Master Bruce Sattler (MD) scored a 17 7/9 +123 card to take Q honors.

Director Scott Noble reported that Russ Perkins was a winner from the get-go, taking home the Friday Kick Off event. Fran Ward and Ray Fischer took the Saturday Doubles, and the High Rollers was won by Keith Widener.

Zach Widener Benefit Clyde Awtrey Wins Atlanta Classic

Clyde Awtrey (GA) came home the winner in the 42-player Atlanta Classic in late April, but the big news was the play of teen Zach Widener (NC). He took top Q honors in both the Main and Consolation, and zipped to the Consolation win as well. Steve Angier (GA) also had a hot weekend, as he finished 2nd in the Main Event, and took home the Friday night game, and proceeded to win the Saturday night game as well. Grand Master Russ Perkins and Terry Trostad (GA) finished 3-4.

In the Consolation, the late Grand Master Bobby Stuart (GA) finished 2nd, with Gene Bradshaw (GA) and Life Master Larry Phifer (NC) finishing in the 3-4 bracket.

Directors Barri Gehrand and Valerie Nozick reported an unusual oddity. Bill Cooper scored a 28-hand vs. Martha Sanders, but he lost ground as Sanders was holding a 4-4-6-6 and also turned a 10-point crib with the five-card cut. Such is cribbage! Cooper's 28-hand was the only 28-hand reported.

Connecticut Championship 6th Western Massachusetts Classic Phyllis Schmidt Wins Two In Row

Two Star Phyllis Schmidt, Williamstown, MA, rang up her 16th and 17th sanctioned wins in consecutive events in May and June. On May 21 she raced to the win at the Connecticut Championship, besting some 86 peggers in the process, and again on June 4 she won yet again in taking home the bacon at the 6th Western Massachusetts Classic (108 players). The double wins vault her among the leaders this cribbage year with 900 MRP's in the bag, giving her yet another shot at All-American honors. She has earned All-American honors six times and currently stands at 6th (lifetime) in earning Master Rating Points (18,000+).

Connecticut Championship:

Mike Fetchel (CT) very nearly upset Schmidt's great run with a run of his own. He took Q honors (22 9/12 +168) and took Schmidt to the wire, finishing 2nd. Sue Cousins (ME) and Grand Master Joan Morrison (MA) finished 3-4.

Dottie VanDenBerge (MA) had a fine run in the 48-player Consolation, taking Q honors with a grand slam 16 8/8 +191 and finishing 2nd in the playoffs, but it was Vicki Soule (ME) coming home the winner. Holly Umbrianna (MA) and Master Lou Petosa (CT) came home 3-4.

Director William Richmond reported that Joan Morrison scored the event's only 28-hand, and that Doris Perkins, Joyce Vanelli, and Morrison copped the three-person team event.

6th Western Massachusetts Classic:

Grand Master Ann Somers (MA) came close and took Schmidt to the wire in the final playoffs in this 108 player event. She had to settle for yet another 105 MRP's for this fine effort. Master Dave Statz (NH) had a fine event, as he qualified tops (21 10/12 +106) and finished in the 3-4 bracket with old pro Warren Sondericker...a Two-Star player from Wisconsin.

Ray Varhue (NC) played his first sanctioned tournament in style, as he qualified tops in the 60-player Consolation, and finished 2nd in the playoffs as well. Matt Piechota (MA) kept Varhue from a clean sweep, as he took home the win in the playoffs. Marilyn Gaudreau (MA) and Life Master Emil Chrabaszcz (MA) finished 3-4.

Director Phyllis Schmidt reported that Bob Drukman and Dave Clemmey scored 28-hands, and that she teamed with Drukman and Clemmey to take the three-player team event.

Sylvia Norris Takes Channel Islands

Sylvia Norris (CA) came to play at the recent Channel Island Open (Ventura, CA) as she raced to the win besting some 44 players. Her last victim was Darlene Dean (CA). Dean, in her fine run racked up 70 MRP's, with Norris taking home 105. This was Norris's first sanctioned win, coming complete with a nifty trophy board as well. Wayne Scranton (CA) took Q honors and finished in the 3-4 bracket with Ron Hoglund (CA). Scranton and Hoglund each garnered 42 MRP's, with Scranton taking on 45 MRP's for his top Q score of 22 10/12 +156.

Master Norm Nikodym (CA) took home the win in the 33-player Consolation, edging Michael Namm (CA) in the final playoff match. Mel Krantz (VA) and Pat Hendsch (NV) finished 3-4. Charles Dunn (CA) took Q honors with a 14 7/8 +90 card.

Director Cy Madrone reported that three of the nation's top ten players were in action, but they had to eat "humble pie" at the host Marie Calenders, as only Jim Crawford (CA) could muster 4 MRP's. Ron Morgan (CA) and Bob Bartosh (CA) got the "horse collar!" Madrone also reported nary a 28 or 29-hand showed.

DeLynn Colvert Takes Alberta Open

Canadian cribbage can take on some unusual happenings and the double-header played in Edmonton in late June was no exception. In the Alberta Mid-Week the low Q score was a rare 26 GP card, and on the weekend, the Alberta Open's low Q-score was an astounding 30 GP card! Nary a 29 GP card made the playoffs!

In the Mid-Week event it was Ken Totten (BC) all the way as he roared to the win in this 33-player event. Grand Master Harold Buckley (AB) finished 2nd, followed by David Carter (AB) and Lorne Tanton (AB) in the 3-4 bracket. Tanton was also the event's top Q player with a great 39 GP card (65 MRP's).

Four-Star DeLynn Colvert (MT) won the 25-player Consolation, edging Zach Widener, the teen-age phenom from North Carolina, in the final playoff match. Widener also took Q honors with a 17 8/9 card. Ed Weilep (WA) and Bob Townsley (BC) finished 3-4. Weilep also won the High Rollers, with the team of A. Ficko, H. Mueller, and H. Buckley taking team honors. Buckley also took the Super Q action.

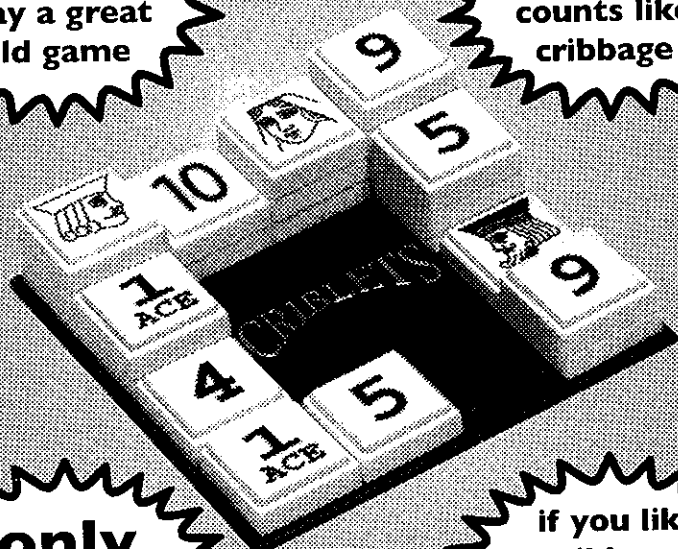

I'll make contact with the club in your area for you or show you where to play cribbage on-line.

Club 48 GR News: Aloha Montooth waited until the last minute to score a 29 Hand for Club 48. The 5 of spades was cut in her next to last game of the official GR season! She will get \$50 from the club. Also during that last night of the GR season, **Jim Crawford** was in first place 4 points ahead of **Bob Greneveld** with 4 games to go in the club's Quarterly point race. Bob and Jim were seated next to each other and Jim mentioned to Bob that to win the Quarterly race, Bob had to win the last 4 games and Jim had to lose most of them. So Bob did and so did Jim. He leads the 9, hoping for a K-Q response, and he then plays his 4 for 23, trapping any 5's in his opponent's hand for a nifty 31 for 5 play.

Even if his opponent play a six for "15", he then will play his 4 for 19, hoping his opponent will fish in with a 5 for a run of 3. He then plays his 3 (run of 4), hoping "27" is a go, then plays his 2 (run of 5, and a go).

If the 9 is paired, then the 4 is played for yet another attempt to trap a 5.
