


235 Play at Chinook Winds **Rick Baird Tops Oregon Coast**

The huge Chinook Winds Casino is a perfect place to play cribbage, especially with the wind and rain outside, and a warm and spacious playing area inside. Master Rick Baird, Roseburg, Oregon, found the playing area just fine, thank you, as he roared to the championship, besting a huge crowd of 235 peggers in the process. Two-Star Paul Hatcher (OR), in quest of his 11th sanctioned win, fell a match short and took 2nd, followed by Paul Roy (OR) and Jay McCloskey (ID) in the 3-4 bracket. Baird, in winning, garnered 196MRP's, the winner's purse, and a nifty Bill O'Malley trophy board...and his first ACC sanctioned win to boot. Grand Master Darren Black (OR) blistered the boards in the Q round with a nice 37 17/22 +191 card to take honors. With the 55 MRP's earned in the Q round Black earned his Life Master.

Lillian McKinney (OR) zipped to the Consolation win, besting a large field of 148 peggers in the process. Her last victim was newly-crowned Grand Master Jeanne Jelke (WA). With the win McKinney earned 84MRP's and another O'Malley trophy board. This, too, was her first ACC sanctioned win. Master Eugene Wilkerson (OR) and Mike McCammon (NV) finished 3-4...and 40 MRP's each. Master Nancy Lorenz (OR) scored a superlative 19 8/9 +144 card to easily take Q honors.

Directors Jeanne & Roy Hofbauer, and Bernie Nelson sported a full array of satellite events. The winners:

In oddities, George Mackie burned up the track in the Early Bird, even scoring a 28-hand in the process, but when the Main Event scores were posted, Mackie came home with a dismal 4/18 8GP card. Such is cribbage! Don Smith, Oregon City, OR earned his Grand Master by earning 25 MRP's in the qualifying round.

The host Chinook Winds Casino, home of last September's Grand National, once again furnished a grand playing area, complete with a panoramic view of the Pacific Ocean. The casino also furnished coffee and soda three days running, plus pastries as well. 235 peggers attest to well-run events at this facility.



Del Anderst Nails St. Paul Event

Del Anderst (Lake City, MN) was hot at the recent Capital City Open (St. Paul, MN). A sizeable field of 142 peggers could not cool him down and he zipped to the win, earning 196 MRP's and the champion's laurels as well. His last match was vs. Tim Kunst (MN) and he prevailed for the win. Kunst took home 147 MRP's for his fine run. Ed Balcer (MN) and Grand Master Jim Huser (WI) finished 3-4 (105 MRP's each). The nation's front runner, Duane Toll (OR), again showed his expertise by qualifying tops with a near-record breaking 44 19/22 +348 card (see story, this issue).

Mark Breneman (MN) took home the Consolation action, nipping Rick Vee (SD) in the final playoff match. Two veteran pros finished 3-4...Life Master Bob Sommer (MN) and Two-Star Bob Julian (WI). Julian's high finish give him yet another shot at earning All-American honors (top ten nationally). Life Master Ron Hamilton (KS) scored a nifty 19 8/9 +180 card in the Q round to easily take honors.

Harold Buckley Tops in Canada

Grand Master Harold Buckley (AB) came away with the win at the Edmonton Easter Open on April 15. Doris Sanders (AB) finished 2nd, followed by Irene Lamoureux (AB) and David Carter (AB) in the 3-4 bracket. Lamoureux had a fine event, as she also took Q honors with a 21 9/12 +177 card.

Lorne Tanton (AB) won the Consolation, but the event was not sanctioned, being a player short (16 in the field). Dwayne Pankiw (AB) took 2nd. Terry Mandzick was the top Q player with a 11 5/7 +107 card.

Director Buckley reported nary a 28 or 29-hand showed, but he added 70 MRP's to his lifetime totals...the highest MRP total in Canada.

Tony Montooth Nails Tax Relief Open

Tony Montooth (CA) made a major push towards his Grand Master rating by winning the Tax Relief Open, played in Alamo, CA of April 15. Montooth stands at 3,800+, needing a scant 200 to earn this honor. With 102 in the field, he garnered 147 MRP's...and added more taxes, getting no tax relief for his efforts. Life Master Heidi Glashan (CA) took 2nd, followed by Barbara Stockman (CA) and Life Master Mel Ashley (CA) in the 3-4 bracket. Jay Sorenson (CA) won 12 of 16 games to take Q honors (26 12/16 +174).

Jesse Jarrell (CA) is nearing his Three-Star rating by winning the 56-player Consolation. Life Master Herschel Mack (CA) came close, and finished 2nd, followed by ex-Canadian Mary Gladish (see her poem, this issue) and Bill Johnson (CA) in the 3-4 bracket. Gladish also took Q honors with a 16 7/8 +152 card.

Director Mary Hermann reported that only Bob Bartosh (CA) could score a 28-hand...and no 29's showed.

Almost a Record! 44 19/22 +348

Three-Star Duane Toll (OR) is on a roll this cribbage year, and has made a shambles of the annual MRP race, standing at well over 2,000 MRP's with two months play remaining.

To emphasize how he is dominating play is illustrated by his near record score at the Capital City Open played at St. Paul, MN on April 28-30. In the Main Event qualifying round he won the first 12 games, with four skunks, taking a whopping 28 GP's to the lunch break. After lunch, he lost his first two, then ran off seven more wins (with two skunks), and with one game to play stood at 44 GP's. If he could win the last game by a skunk he would own the 22-game qualifying round record! But his opponent was Earl "The Fox" Fox, and Fox nailed down the last game with an 18-point win. The record is currently owned by Sharlene Medeiros (MA). She scored a 46 20/22 +501 at Green Bay, WI on February 28, 2004.

Mel Ashley Wins Chico Open

Stamp dealer Mel Ashley is a Life Master from Marina, CA...and he put his stamp on the Chico Open, played in Chico, CA on March 24-26. With 104 in the field, Ashley carted home yet another 147 MRP's to add to his 7,200+ lifetime tally. Nancy Rojas (CA) took Ashley to the wire, but settled for 2nd. John Prehn (CA) and Jim Waldvogel (CA) finished in the 3-4 bracket and earned 70 MRP's each. Grand Master Les Sumner (NV) took Q honors with a nice 36 17/22 +192 card (50 MRP's).

Marvin Brogden (CA) ran the table in the 58-player Consolation as he took Q honors (17 8/9 +74) and went on to win the playoffs as well. Life Master Boyd McDonald (CA) was the last to try to cool off Brogden, but he, too, fell to this hot streak. McDonald settled for 2nd, followed by Life Master Heidi Glashan (CA) and Betty Stewart (OR) in the 3-4 bracket.

Bruce Sattler Smokes Western New York Open

Life Master Bruce Sattler (MD) was rolling big-time at the recent Western New York Open. In the playoffs, he won 9 games in a row enroute to the win in this 53-player event. His last victim of this hot run was Cal Braun (NY). Richard Bett (NY) and Sue Cousins (ME) finished 3-4, each earning 42 MRP's. Winner Sattler took home 105 MRP's, with Braun earning 70 MRP's for 2nd.

Phil Lococo (ON) won the 40-player Consolation, nipping local Master Stan Bochinski in the final playoff match. Jeanne Jelke (WA) was a long way from her Pasco, WA home, but this Grand Master help pay for her trip with a 3-4 finish. Andy LaVenture (VA) also took home a 3-4 finish. Bochinski had a fine event as he also took Q honors with a 15 7/9 +76 card.

Director Nelson Wheaton reported George and Donna Lozy won the Doubles event, and the Early Bird went to Laurie Rancourt. Berta McGuire scored a 28-hand in Consolation play, but, alas, is not an ACC member, and will not receive a frameable 28-award.

Wheaton reported players came from far and wide to play in New York, as some 13 states and Canada were represented.

John Hiland Accepts Challenge, Takes Milwaukee Event

Life Master John Hiland accepted the Milwaukee Challenge, and pegging on his home turf, took home all the marbles at the recent Milwaukee Challenge. In besting 149 players, Hiland adds yet another 196 MRP's to his lifetime ledger, standing at the 7,000 mark. Matt Peterson (WI) was the last pegger to try to stop Hiland's march to the title, but he fell as well. In finishing 2nd, Peterson took home 147 MRP's. Peterson was aided in his run to the top brackets by scoring a 28-hand in the playoffs. George Stankus (WI) and Grand Master John Syftestad (WI) took home a 3-4 finish (and 105 MRP's each). Master Karen Bouffiou was also pegging on her home turf, and peg she did! She nailed down one of the ACC's best qualifying scores this cribbage year...an astounding 43 20/22 +261 card. This great card netted Bouffiou 85 MRP's!

Hall of Famer Bob Madsen (IL) ran the table in the 87-player Consolation, taking Q honors as well as winning the playoffs. This great run netted this Life Master 102 MRP's to add to his lifetime ledger. Bob Kiley (WI) finished 2nd, and was unable to sidetrack Madsen's run for the title. Master Ed Heinowski (WI) and Jeanne Wauters (WI) finished 3-4.

Max Steplyk's 39 GP card usually takes the top Q prize as well, this time only good for 3rd place. Lazachek's nephew, John Mauser, was in attendance, and is NOT an ACC member. Wrong move as his 29-hand would have earned him \$100 from the ACC. Table "H" saw Mauser score a 29-hand, and Tom Cook and John Swett scored 28-hands. "H" stand for hot!

Lazachek reminds all that this event will be played, once again, at the Radisson again next year.

going out and her needing 26, he gets cute and says, "Maybe I can deal you a 24 hand." Ha!





Internet Cribbage Newsflash!

In late April, MS Zone will discontinue Cribbage on their site effective June 19, 2006. This was a surprise to everyone. The ACC has run their Internet Cribbage tournaments there since the inception over two years ago. MS Zone did not permit the ACC to run their tournaments on the Zone. Thanks to Lois Fosdal, our Assistant Statistician, we are able to piggyback onto Pegging Pals for our tournaments.

At this time, the ACC and Game Colony are in negotiations for the purposes of promoting cribbage by having having our ACC internet cribbage tournaments hosted by Game Colony. Though not fully finalized, I expect that there will be a signed agreement soon. Some of the benefits for the ACC and its members are listed below.

1. The ACC will continue to offer **FREE** tournaments on Game Colony. Registration in Game Colony is **FREE**.

2. Game Colony will develop the necessary co-branded pages for entrance into the ACC area. When you enter the ACC area, the pages are branded with the ACC logo and verbiage along with the Game Colony logo. I displayed to several board members the entrance pages that Game Colony developed for other game organizations and we agree that these are most professional. It will be great to see ACC highlighted.

3. Secure Site: You see only the cards that are needed for play at the time of play, the remaining cards are placed on on the secure server until needed. I play frequently on a 28.8 dial-up, and there is almost no delay.

4. *Manual Scoring Option* - This option requires that you score your points during play and counting of your hand and crib. If you claim more than you have, you peg is placed in the correct hole and the non-offending player receives the amount of overpeg as a penalty. I expect that we we begin on Game Colony, we will begin with automatic scoring; this allows everyone to become familiar with the site before adding complexities.

5. Family Rated Site: All chat goes through a filter process; it is very tight. What you enter may get echoes back to you, but it will be trapped. Isn't it an added plus for many people to know they can bring their kids in to play, their spouse, their mother or even their pastor and not risk being embarrassed by racial slurs, sexual comments and/or profanity?

6. *Contact Us* - A means to request information from Game Colony. Some examples include; bug reports, questions, comments, rules, concerns, etc. Once submitted, you receive an acknowledgement within several minutes. Game Colony strives to respond to all submitted within 24 hours. I have frequently used this feature and I can attest to their responsiveness.

7. Moderated Forum - All postings are reviewed to ensure they meet Game Colony appropriateness. The postings are not immediate to ensure the appropriateness.

8. Disconnects/boots: In four years only once was I not able to return to the exact point of the game from which I was at the time of the disconnect. I have played over 7500 games on this site and only on one disconnect could I not return to the exact point (about 3 years ago).

9. Supports both Windows and Macintosh.

10. Great TDs - One of our ACC members is a Game Colony TD.

11. The Game Colony tournament internal logic performs the assignments for the start of the tournaments; byes are in the first round.



Rule of the month review – Refusal to Conform to the Rules: Any player who willfully refuses to conform to any ruling after having been informed of it by three judges is not permitted to continue playing in the event and must be removed by the tournament director.

Shalimar, Florida


