# JPW/ACC Consolation: Lloyd "Gabby" Kraft

The granddaddy of all cribbage tournaments once again drew players from throughout the United States and Canada and near-record crowds descended on the Sands Regency in Reno in early February for the annual cribbage extravaganza.

The long weekend of pegging began in earnest on Thursday evening with the 16th running of the All-Star game. This action was won the the Central squad (see story, this issue), and the pegging continued unabated until the wee hours on Sunday night.

On Friday morning some 552 players (a record) began play in the Tournament of Champions, an event by invite ony, and after a grueling 16-game qualifying round David Clemmey, a One-Star player from Massachusetts, took honors with a great 28-GP card, picking up \$1,400 and another \$2,125 in side pools. The final four in the

playoffs completed the action with matches played late Saturday afternoon. First-time TOC player Betty Stewart (Roseburg, OR) zipped to the title by nipping perennial Reno winner Grand Master Russ Nelson (AZ) 3-1 to take home the \$7,000 top prize. Nelson garnered \$4,000 for 2nd. Old war-horse Two-Star Bob Julian (WI) and Harvey Rasmussen (WI) each won \$2,000 with a 3-4 finish. No Master Rating Points were earned in this event as it is by invitation only.

A whopping 650 players played a satellite "Cribbage Bowl" event on Friday afternoon, and after a 12-game high card match was completed, Master Bill O'Malley (OR) scored a superlative 25-GP card to take home the \$2,200 grand prize. Carolyn Blackman (OR) came close with a 24-GP card and took home \$1,850.

On Saturday morning a near-record crowd of 1,066 peggers had the Sands buzzing in anticipation of the upcoming 22-game qualifying round. The pegging was hot and heavy, and when the pegs were laid away in the late afternoon it was Bryan Riches, pegging on his home turf (Reno) taking Q honors with one of the best Q-rounds of the year...a 42 GP gem! This great card was worth \$1,480 from the Q-pool. Grand Master H. Ross Njaa (CA) posted a 41-GP card and took home \$1,250!

The playoff action continued through 10 rounds, with the winner being awarded \$10,000 and a whopping 385 MRP's. When the playoffs wound down on sunday afternoon, it was a "grand" finale for Roger Grandgeorge, pegging out of State Center, Iowa, as he waltzed to the championship with a 4-1 win over James Morrow (WA) in the final match. In fact it was a "ten-grand" finale! Morrow fared quiet well and took home a whopping 315 MRP's and \$6,000 with this high finish. One-Star James Langley (CA) and Grand Master Connie Staven (WI) finished 3-4 and each garnered \$3,050 and 252 MRP's each.

The JPW/ACC Consolation is always the 2nd largest event of the cribbage year, and this year was no exception as a huge crowd of 780 peggers signed on for play. After a 9-game Q round, it was Dutch Gerlich (MD) zipping home with a grand-slam 21 9/9 +214 card to take honors. But when the pegs were laid away, it was two old pros battling for the top prize...and Lloyd "Gabby" Kraft, a Life Master from Seymour, WI, came away the winner, besting Grand Master Larry Loupee (IA) in the final playoff match. The win came with a \$2,060 prize and 180 MRP's. Kraft also has the destinction of having won the JPW/ACC Open Main Event (in 1999). Master Dan Zeisler (CA) and Doug Jansen (OR) finished 3-4, and each carted home 112 MRP's for this high finish.

Once again, the Sands Regency, with able assistance from Barbara Rainey, rolled out the red carpet for the players, furnishing coffee and cakes three-days running. The Sands also treated the players to outstanding buffets as well. The usual TOC badges were also given to all 552 TOC players. This three-day extravaganza continues to be the "one and only of its kind" cribbage event in the entire world.



Iowans were hot in Reno. With nine players from the Hawkeye state, eight qualified for the playoffs in the JPW/ACC Open, and 6 of the 7 entrants from Iowa qualified for the playoffs in the Consolation as well.

When TOC Champion Betty Stewart reported to her job in Roseburg, Oregon on Monday morning, she was surprised with the standing ovation she received from her 40 fellow employees.

John Furler (OR) was among the very few who qualified in all three events (TOC, JPW/ACC, & Consolation).

The fashion-show champs had no competition as Sharlene and Bill Medeiros (MA) produced a variety of clothes that were the envy of the entire crowd.

Rex Paddock (MT) had all but conceded a game, being far-far back, when he strung a run of 17-17-28 hands together to stun his opponent.

Lady luck smiled on many players on the slots and tables. Katie Nordlund (MN) won \$2,000 on a quarter machine; Ann Tork (WI) went home with \$8,000 on a dollar slot; Kathy Pacocha (CO) won \$1,500 on a quarter machine; Patrick Barrett took \$1,500 at black jack...and many others were smiling as well. Of course, as with the smiling winners, there were a few sad-faces as well.

As for Calvin Braun (NY), he loves the 5 of clubs. The week before Reno he cut the 5 of clubs for a 29-hand. In Reno, he cut the 5 of clubs for a 28-hand.

And Bob Gromke was busy cutting 5's as well. He scored two 28-hands (Sat. & Sun.).

Sad stories were in great supply as everyone seemed to have a tale of woe (what else is new?). But the saddest of all was a player who was in the process of winning a playoff match 3-2, needing 11 to win, held a 10-hand and knew he had 2 in the crib. In his excitement, pegged both hands as one, and falsely claimed the game...and lost the match!

A filming crew was on hand making a documentary about cribbage. One of their shots was taking footage of Cribbage World editor's (DeLynn Colvert) car. This 1990 Honda CRX has logged 531,000 cribbage miles...and was covered with mud in the parking lot!

# Jim Pokorney Takes Carter Classic

Jim Pokorney (WI) zipped to the Carter Classic Championship on January 15. This event played to 131 peggers in Carter, Wisconsin. Life Master Les Kvien (IL) took Pokorney to the wire, but had to settle for 2nd. Pokorney earned 196 MRP's for the win and Kvien added yet another 147 to his lofty lifetime talley (6,400+). Two-Star Warren Sondericker (WI) also added to his 16,700+ lifetime talley with a 3-4 finish. Grand Master Jim Huser (WI) also finished in this bracket. Sondericker took Q honors as well, scoring a great 40 GP card (+307), and taking home an aggregate 175 MRP's.

Master Jerome Tork (WI) won the 64-player Consolation, nipping One-Star Frank Danielski (WI) in the final playoff match. Grand Master Al Karr (WI) and Master Pat Kufahl (WI) finished 3-4. Jim Knorr (WI) took Q honors with a nifty 18 GP +186 card.

The 17th Annual Super Lite Open, played at the Dante Club in West Springfield, MA on January 29 sported a field of 118 peggers. This event continues to be a popular one and this time around it was Life Master Dick West (MA) nailing down the championship. The final match was played by two heavyweights in the ACC, as another Life Master took home 2nd...Dwight Christiansen (CT). West took home 147 MRP's and Christiansen earned 105. Grand Master Earle Remington (RI) finished in the 3-4 bracket with Gene May (MA). West was also the event's top Q player, with a superlative 24 11/12 +163 card, adding another 55 MRP's to his take-home number (202 aggregate).

Master Roger Bouchard (CT) took home the bacon in the 62-player Consolation, nipping another Master pegger in the final playoff match...Bob Bousquet, Jr. (MA). Louis Choiniere (MA) and Holli Umbrianna (RI) finished in the 3-4 bracket. Leo Genorow took Q honors with a 17/8 +131 card.

Director Charlie Finley reported no 28's or 29's showed in this 17th Annual.

# Record Crowd Peter Lerch Savannah King

Master Peter Lerch, pegging out of Hope Mills, NC came south to Savannah, Georgia and joined the record crowd (86) in an attempt to take home the Georgia crown, and he did just that, nipping Joe Lewis III (FL) in the final playoff match. The win came with 147 MRP's and bragging rights galore. Master Jim Lunder, another Floridian, and old pro Russell Perkins, a Grand Master from North Carolina, finished in the 3-4 bracket. Both earned 70 MRP's each. Lou Gardner (GA) took Q honors with a 33 14/22 +273 card (35 MRP's).

In the 60-player Consolation it was "Easy" Ed Craren (FL) taking home the win. Chuck Dolge (NC) finished 2nd, followed by Bob Bovill (NH) and Paula Abele (FL) in the 3-4 slot. Martha O'Donnell (CO) took Q honors with a great 16 8/9 +104 card.

Director Bill Cooper reported that Mike Elkins won the Friday night event and Gaylord Matti took home, the top prize on Saturday night. The Saturday night game had two 28's show (Fred Desnoyers and Matti Bradshaw). Bradshaw's was of the difficult variety...scored in the crib! Sanctioned 28's were scored by Ray Wanke and Joy Barnes. The national drought of 29's continue as nary a 29-hand showed. Cooper also reported the record crowd came from all over the nation...only one Savannan showed.



The Central squad tattoed the boards with steady play with all 8 team members posting high marks to easily cop the match. The yearly match now stands at six wins for the East, five for the Central and West. The scores:

For the second year in a row, Rob Medeiros, a One-Star player from Massachusetts, scored the meet's high card...a 27 12/16 +154. Grand Master Chris McComas (WA) was 2nd with a 22 11/16 card. Grand Master James Huser (WI), Master Bob Joslin (MN), Life Master Don Flesch (WI), and Two-Star Joe Bernard (IL) paced the Central Region to the win by winning 10 games each (10-6).

### **Duane Toll Continues Torrid Pace**

Three-Star Duane Toll, Sutherlin, Oregon, continues to make shambles of the 2006 Master Rating Point Race. After seven month's play in this cribbage year's action he has posted an outstanding 1,700+MRP's, leaving his competitors far, far behind. Only One-Star Ron Morgan has cracked the century mark and has an outside chance to catch the streaking Toll.

Erik Royland Locke (OR) is a relative newcomer on the "trail" but he recently earned his Master rating and is zipping along in third place this cribbage year (840 MRP's). One-Star Jim Hornbacher (WA) is over the 700 mark, and two peggers have topped 600: One-Star Larry Samet (MA) and Life Master Todd Malmgren (OR).

Eight stellar peggers are over the 500 mark: One-Star Gerald Gruber (MN); Grand Master Keith Widener (NC); One-Star Jim Langley (CA), Life Master John Furler (OR); Grand Master Jim Crawford (CA); Grand Master Tony Danihel (WI); Life Master Richard Frost (WI); and Life Master Les Kvien (IL).

Some 22 peggers have topped the 400 mark...and with but five short month's action remaining this cribbage year, the top ten honors are up for grabs!

### **Correct Odds**

In case someone has not yet indicated the flaw in Jack Carter's flush claim (Jan. CW, page 3), his odds are off quite a bit.

The number he gave is the total population of all possible crib hands - ie the answer to the question "how many different ways can 13 cards be formed from a standard deck of 52". The frequency of 3 flushes (both hands and crib) can be determined by choosing 6, 6, and 1 from 13 (all cards of one suit). This can be done in 12012 ways. The odds of Carter's club flush hand is 12012 / 635013559600 or roughly 1 in 53 million - in the ballpark of the Powerball lottery. The odds of 3 flushes (of any suit) would be about 1 in 13 million.

- 3) If the pone lead matches the starting card, he or she gets two points. However, the count doesn't change. If the starter is a four and you pair it to lead, you get two points, but the count is still four.
- If you match the lead suit with a jack of the same suit, you get a point.

We played a couple games American style and then a couple his style. The last few holes of the game and the pegging take on a totally different aspect played this way. I think we both found our heads spinning a little bit.

Rule of the month review - This month instead of reviewing a specific rule, I'd like to address some of the basics for our newer members. Some are rules and some are courtesies. (1) After the deal, pone is not allowed to cut the deck until both players have put two cards into the crib. (2) When cutting for deal or prior to the hand, the deck should be held so that neither player can see the bottom card. (3) When playing the hand, the previously played cards should be placed so that the identity of all cards are visible. (4) Pone should not reach over the board to pick up the dealers previously counted hand or crib. It is the dealer's responsibility to place their hand and crib face up and visible on pone's side of the board after each has been counted.

News from Club 271 in Albuquerque, NM. The club had built up their skunk can to about \$270. Ray Kranz (NM 68) scored a 28 hand in September 2005 and took 25%. After that, the can went untouched for almost four months. In January 2006 that changed! Marge Williamson (NM 87) scored a 28 hand taking 25% and on January 28th, Ida Mae Devine (NM 71) scored a 28 hand and on the same day Herman Shipley (NM 179) scored a Grand Slam scorecard, each taking 25%. ### Cribbage History

When Cribbage was first played, in the 17th century, the court cards showed figures depicted at full length. Whereas the kings and queens wore long robes completely covering their lower limbs, the knaves (not called Jacks until the 18th century) were always shown with both legs and feet visible. For an illustration of this, see my article on the ancestor of Cribbage at <a href="http://www.davidparlett.co.uk/histocs/noddy.html">http://www.davidparlett.co.uk/histocs/noddy.html</a>

It is my firm belief (though I cannot prove it) that the phrase "two for his heels" refers to the fact that, having turned a court card, you know immediately that it's a knave because you can see his heels. Conversely, "his nob" is 17th century slang for "his head", which is what you see at the opposite end of the card.

The phrase "his nobs" in incorrect. As far as I can make out, it first appears in 20th-century American literature. I believe someone confused the phrase "his nob" with the phrase "his nibs" (or Nibs), meaning an employer, a superior, or a self-important person, which the Oxford English Dictionary dates to the 19th century but marks "origin unknown". I can absolutely confirm that "his nibs" is completely wrong and based on an ignorant misunderstanding.

I hope this helps. Don't hesitate to ask if I can be of any further assistance. Cribbage is one of my favourite games!


