

Kevin Augustine (BC) smoked the boards in the Qround with a great 38 18/22 +242 card (60 MRP's).

This event had the cream come to the top in both the Main and Consolation, as the ACC's top ranked stars finished high in the playoffs. ### **ATTENTION ALL CERTIFIED JUDGES**

Cribbage players are entitled to the fairest, and most professional and impartial interpretation of rules that the American Cribbage Congress can provide. As certified Judges, it is your responsibility to provide these services.

When you make a "Judgemental" decision, when situations that are not covered in the rule book, I am requesting you notify me (Al Miller) with the details. I will then forward the problem to the Rules committee. In this way the rule book can be improved.

Tournament and Grass Root Directors are given the names of certified Judges in a particular region. However, Directors may not know you personally. Let the Director know you are a certified Judge (show the Director your ID card) and available for judging.

Directors make the final selection in the appointment of Judges for any event.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS AND GUIDELINES FOR THE CONDUCT OF JUDGES

There should be always two (2) Judges making a call.

Regarding the following types of problems always consult with at least one other Judge before making a decision.

- A. Not covered explicitly by the rules and calling for a judgement.
- B. Covered by the rules but involve an obvious deficiency in the rules.
- C. Apparently covered by the rules with differing results.

Only the originally called Judge should interface with the players. The other Judge(s) should be consulted away from the playing area and the original Judge return to deliver the decision.

Avoid making decisions on matters not relating directly to the playing rules (Disqualification of late players and disruptive behavior). These matters should be referred to one of the tournament officials.

Avoid acting as a Judge in decisions involving a relative or close friend.

Always take a rule book with you when called to act as a Judge and always quote and show the applicable rule (s) when giving the decision.

Rule of the month review – Starter Card: After the pone counts their hand and before the dealer begins to count their hand, the pone may remove the pack, leaving the starter card in the approximate area where the pack was. The <u>suggested</u> place to lay the starter card is on the top of the cribbage board. The starter card may <u>not</u> be mixed with either hand or with the crib.

End of the GR Season! Well, here we are again at the end of another Grass Roots season. It's gone by really fast hasn't it! Club. Directors & Club Statisticians should take the following actions prior to the end of May: Make sure everyone on your Club roster that is listed as a Member has paid both their ACC and GR fees. If you have players who have earned GR points this season, they will lose those points if their fees have not been paid by the end of the 05-06 GR season. Do you have players on your roster who have not, or will not play by 5/31/06? If so, bring up that player's record and click on Remove. Make sure you have submitted award certifications to your Regional Statistician for all players (members and visitors) who have played in your club and scored a 28 or 29 hand or a Grand Slam scorecard.

Of special interest to Grass Roots Club Members Most ACC members are aware that the ACC Board of Directors (BoD) meets twice a year to formulate policy and procedure for the ACC. These meetings take place during the February JPW/ACC weekend in Reno, NV and again in September when and where the Grand Nationals are held. Did you know that the Grass Roots Board of Volunteers (BoV) also conducts meetings on those same weekends? The Grass Roots BoV is made up of the GR National Commissioner, Statistician, Secretary, Tournament Director, Club Directory Chairman, Grass Roots Regional Commissioners, Statisticians, Awards Chairman and Awards Procurement folks. Anyone is welcome to attend these meetings and participate in the

discussions. If you have a Grass Roots item you would like to have discussed, prepare it, as you would like it to read. Send it to Valerie Sumner at vgsumner@charter.net. Agenda items should reach Valerie by the first week of January or August.

Valerie by the first week of January or August. Check your standings! This Grass Roots website does not require any specialized computer skills and any ACC member may log on to www.accgrassroots.org and click on Members-Only. Enter your seven-character ACC number. (Ex: OR00001) The Grass Roots website knows you and will personally greet you when you log on! Click on Go to Member Center. Click on Member Statistics to see how you are doing in your Club, Division or Region. Click on any of the other tabs on the left for a wealth of information such as club locations, Grass Roots Commissioners or to review the rules. Grass Roots Policies and Procedures are available and may be printed out. New members will need to wait until after the monthly update following becoming a member same for returning members.

Under the Grass Roots Rating Point System, Grass Roots members are nationally recognized for both current year and cumulative lifetime achievement. Grass Roots members are eligible to earn 28-Hand, 29-Hand and Grand Slam Awards while playing as a Member in their own club or as a Visitor in another club. Players must have a current ACC and Grass Roots membership. Members and Visitors are players who belong to any Grass Roots club and whose fees have been paid. Guests are anyone who has not paid both their ACC and GR fees. Guests are not eligible for Grass Roots awards.

Good news and Bad news! Ray Kranz (NM 68) playing out of Club 271 in Albuquerque, NM had good news on April 15<sup>th</sup> attaining a 20/8/+245 scorecard. The bad news happened the same day. Because the Sandia Peggers are a Division #2 GR club, they only play 24 nine game tournaments and April 15<sup>th</sup> happened to be one of the unofficial days.
