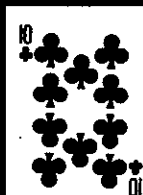
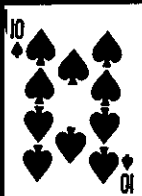

Ken Key Tops Madison Masters

Ken Key kept honors at his home base at Madison, WI in taking home the win at the Madison Masters on August 27. Key, in winning this 102-player match, zips among the national leaders in this fledgling 2007 cribbage campaign with some 147 MRP's in his ledger. Grand Master Marlene Lazachek from nearby Milwaukee came home 2nd, followed by the Iowa king of cribbage Roger Grandgeorge (he came home the winner at last February's JPW/ACC Open in Reno) and veteran Two-Star Joe Bernard (IL) in the 3-4 bracket (70 MRP's each). Grand Master Marvin Lang took Q honors with a nice 34 17/22 +192 card.

Another Two-Star player (Warren Sondericker, WI) took Q honors in the 64-player Consolation, but when the pegs were laid away it was Bart Jaeger (NE) standing alone at the top. His last match was vs. newly-crowned Life Master Jim Huser (WI) and he prevailed for the win. Pete Severson (MN) and Grand Master Emilio Perez (IL) finished 3-4.

Director Adelia Lange fielded a full array of satellites. The winners:

Richard Kodama August Hawaii King

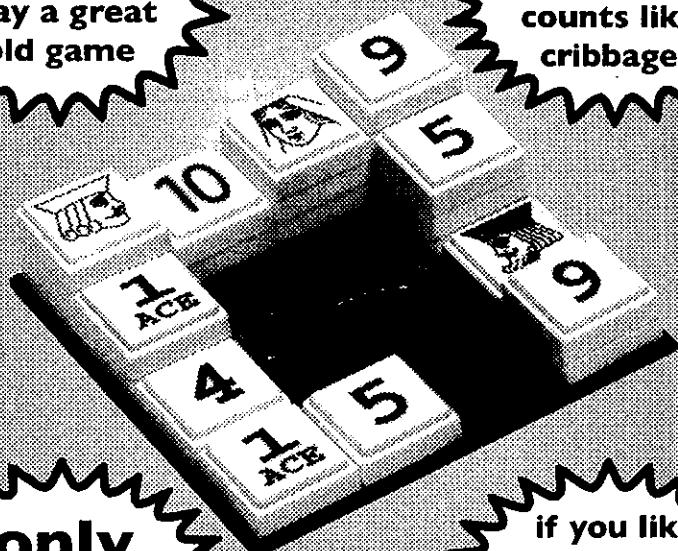

Wayne Steinmetz Takes Schaefer Shuffle

One-Star Wayne Steinmetz (WI) zipped to his 9th Main Event sanctioned win by nailing down the Schaefer Shuffle, played in Slinger, WI on August 12. With 86 players in the field, Steinmetz took home yet another 147 MRP's to add to his lofty 13,800+ lifetime tally. His last playoff victim was Lois Fosdal (WI)...a 2nd place finish rewarded her with 105 MRP's. Two Life Masters took home a 3-4 finish...Don Flesch (WI) and Gene Biegler (WI). Flesch was also the event's top Q player, posting a 26 11/14 +235 card, earning an aggregate 120 MRP's.

One-Star Rollie Heath (OR), on a vacation to see a few major league ball games, stopped in to play and paid for his baseball tickets by winning the 61-player Consolation. He nipped Clarence Charles (WI) in the final playoff match. William Dayton (WI) and Ray Schenk (WI) finished 3-4. Life Master Donna LaFleur was a long way from her Connecticut home, but she nails 'em wherever she travels, as she took Q honors with a nifty 15 7/8 +69 card.

Director Al Schaefer reported Master Ed Heinowski took the Friday night action. The cribbage grapevine reported Schaefer treated the entire field to a drink in celebrating his grand raffle win (see story this issue).

Bryan Gurden Tops Summer US Open

Bryan Gurden, pegging out of Las Vegas, nailed down the win at the Summer US Open, played in West Covina, CA on August 13. Master Darlene Carr (CA) zipped to 2nd place in this 50-player event, and added 70 MRP's to her lifetime ledger. Gurden copped 105 MRP's in winning. Steve Yellon (CA) and Michael Namm (CA) finished 3-4. Another Las Vegas player...John Bourgon...took Q honors with a 21 10/12 +158 card.

Beverly Castillo (CA) won the 35-player Consolation, edging Luther Lord (CA) in the final playoff match. Dave Olson (CA) and Jerry Person (CA) finished 3-4. Lord also took Q honors with a very nice 16 7/8 +129 card.

Slow Play

Board of Director member Larry Samet has come up with some guidelines for our membership that pertains to slow play:

Slow play is perhaps the most disruptive regularly occurring problem during tournament play. While intervention is difficult, some options are available for the tournament director.

We expect a tournament player to **play a game in 15 minutes**. Slow play is clearly evident when games take more than 20 minutes to complete. In practice, failure to complete 4 games in 75 minutes is slow. Failure to complete 8 games in 2 hours, 25 minutes is slow.

Recognizing slow play: awareness of the clock is essential, as some players finish games in 10 minutes, and a 15 minute player who does not keep up with them is not slow. In practice, when 2 or 3 players are waiting to play one person, a player on one side or the other is clearly slow. The players at the table will almost always know who the offender or offenders are. A lunch break may help slow players catch up, but if they want time for lunch, the problem may persist. Minimally slow play may be tolerated without significant disruption, but significantly slow play needs active management.

Management Guidelines for Tournament Directors: Always notice the time when play starts. Consider having designees...experienced players, judges, and board members...who are willing and able to act as your assistants in management of this issue. This spares the already burdened tournament directors. Consider regular announcements, "You should be on game two, game four, etc." Start early and have deviations from the needed pace brought to your attention or that of your designee. Speak to the slow players early...let them know they have been identified as slow players. See if there is something they are specifically doing to slow them down. Most common behaviors are: **excessive talking; excessive shuffling; ponderous play, slow at every step.**

Interventions: This is very difficult. Sentiment is strong, but mixed, that we cannot shorten games without unfairly penalizing uninvolved participants. 1- When a back up in movement is over a game long, have the front (slow) person skip that game and go on to the next. This loosens up the progress of the line, and speeds up many people. At the end of the qualifying round the

skipped game is then played by the two players who were skipped. 2- A player who is profoundly slow may be asked to give up his seat, and a fill-in may finish out the rest of the games. This should rarely happen, and should only follow a series of attempts to manage the player's situation. 3- After a lunch break, have identified players start 5-10 minutes before the whole group.

Behaviors that promote timeliness: Always be in your seat five minutes or more before the start time. Always know who you are following. Avoid smoking or bathroom breaks when your next opponent is ready to play. When counting your hand as dealer, immediately give the hand to the pone, then count your crib and hand that over as well. This is done by all experienced players and decreases time spent shuffling. Pick up all six of your cards at once. **Do not be a player who picks up his cards one by one, and looks at them one by one.** No eating at the tables.

Use common sense, be aware of your relationship to the other players...keep up the pace, and we all can enjoy our cribbage a bit more!

Life Master Al Schaefer, Jackson, WI, does his share of winning at the cribbage tables but recently he has topped that big time!

Ras Rasmussen Zips To National MRP Lead, Wins Montana Championship

One-Star "Ras" Rasmussen (WA), zipped over to Missoula, Montana, cashed in almost every event, and zipped back to his Napavine, WA home with well over a four-figure winner's check, kicking off the new cribbage year in great shape, standing alone at the top of the MRP race in the early going. He has earned very nearly 300 Master Rating Points in six week's play and is off and running. Canadians also found the Montana action to their liking, and lead by Lewis Skidmore's (AB) 2nd place finish, took home far more than their share of "grubstake" greenbacks. Another Canadian finished 3rd...Gordon Armstrong (AB). Wayne Wyman (MT) took 4th in this 100-player event. Rasmussen also took the qualifying round action with a 34 GP card. And he continued on the take the Super Q pot as well.

72 players stayed for the Consolation and it was Tom Brown (MT) taking home the top prize, and a trophy to boot. Grand Master Jeanne Jelke (WA) finished 2nd, followed by Gary Pinkley (WA) and David Braach (MT) in the 3-4 bracket. Pinkley also took Q honors with a 17 8/9 +131 card.

Director DeLynn Colvert reported that yet another Canadian (Gary Wirth) took home the High Roller pot (\$830). Americans did save some face by winning the Early Bird (James Morrow), the Doubles (O.K. Osborne & Faye Christopher), Saturday Special (Ken Haab), and the Last Chance (Clair Morse). And once again, the host Joker's Wild added \$100 to the last Chance event, and rolled out the red carpet to the players.

Remember When?

GRAND NATIONAL ONE

In September of 1982, the fledgling American Cribbage Congress decided to hold an annual Grand National Cribbage Tournament, complete with an Awards Banquet. Milwaukee was chosen as the host site of the first Grand National, with the Marriott Inn as the playing site.

With 10 days till game time, only 60 or so had registered, and President Joe Wergin and Bob Julian decided they needed to do some big-time promoting...and quickly! Julian suggested to Wergin that they make a tour of Milwaukee's taverns, scores of which played cribbage on a regular basis. This strategy worked, as the event had many, many walk-ins. In fact, the owner of the "FireUp Tap" won this 174-player event. His name? Jim Pershing. He was cajoled by Wergin and Julian to play...and he walked away with the \$1,075 first prize. Doris Donalies took home 2nd, as players from 20 states were on hand for this inaugural event.

Jim Arblaster suggested the Awards banquet be a tuxedo affair, but, knowing cribbage players, this went over like a lead balloon. The banquet format that we have today is similar to the very first. Arblaster began the "jinx" that continues to this day, as he contracted with **two bands** for the banquet dance, instead of only one. Four cribbage notables were inducted into the Hall of Fame: Sir John Suckling, Joe Wergin, Jim Arblaster and Nick Pond. The late Arnold Crews, Jacksonville, Florida, was crowned National Champion. The price of this banquet? A hefty \$20 (a large sum in 1982). And speaking of fees, the Main Event had \$32 entry fee, and the Consolation had a \$10 entry fee, with a \$5 Q pool. Souvenir glasses were sold, but no shirts or hats as we see at today's Grand Nationals.

The format of tournament play has changed since 1982. This first Grand National had players play a set of three games vs. seven opponents (a 21 game qualifying round). Q pools were strange as well, as a \$25 pool allowed all contestants to enter, paying back one in ten. A second \$10 Q pool would **not allow the top 50 players entry**. This pool also paid one in ten. A side pool of \$5 allowed players to chose a partner. The winners did not share with their partner. You could buy as many teams as you wished.

The first Grand National kicked off the ACC's very successful Grand National program. These premier events now routinely host 500 or more players. This Wisconsin Rapids event is the 25th anniversary...and director Patrick Barrett wishes the best of luck to all contestants of Grand National XXV!

Lynn Babbitt Takes Peer

The late August New England Peer Championship saw Pawtucket's Lynn Babbitt come home the winner. With 104 players in action, Babbitt took home 147 MRP's, kicking off the new cribbage year in style. Dottie VanDenBerge (MA) very nearly ran the table by qualifying tops (39 18/22+193) and finishing 2nd, netting an aggregate 170 MRP's for this hot run. Grand Master Louis Caccia (MA) and Master Nelson Bakken (CT) finished 3-4, and earned 70 MRP's each.

John Campanella (MA) took home the Consolation win, besting Vicki Soule (ME) in the final playoff match. Mike D'Elena (RI) and Joan Fletcher (CT) finished 3-4 in this 36-player event. Master Pat Frattallone (CT) scored a great 20 9/9 grand slam to easily take Q honors.

Director John Chambers reported that Frattallone's cards were smoking, as he also scored the ACC's 3rd 29-hand and earned \$100 from the ACC for this gem. Chambers also reported that Walter Ballou won the Friday singles match, and the Saturday doubles saw Toni Costa and Milly Kelly come home winners. Bill Medeiros and Bill Kraatz scored 28-hands.

This event is a "Peer" event as players are matched in the qualifying rounds by their lifetime Master Rating Points.

Joe Gates Cops Cowboy Country

Joe Gates "Rounded 'em up and headed 'em out" as he zipped to the win at the recent Cowboy Country Open, played in Cheyenne, WY. His last match pitted him vs. Ron Bellony (CO) and he prevailed for the win. Mary Skole (CO) and Grand Master Angelo Torrise (CA) finished 3-4 in this 48-player match. Master Sue Edwards (CO) scored an excellent 35 16/22 +233 card to take qualifying honors.

Edwards continued her hot streak into the Consolation match and came home the winner, besting 30 players. Lola Clay took home 2nd, followed by Randi Viola (CO) and Life Master Boyd McDonald (CA) in the 3-4 bracket. Jerry Mittelstaedt (CO) won 7 of 9 to take Q honors.

He earned All-American honors in the 2006 campaign, and is off and running once again. Skip White (OR) took 2nd, followed by Grand Master Ira Deutsch (OR) and One-Star Ron Morgan (CA) in the 3-4 bracket. Morgan earned All-American in last year's play as well, finishing a strong second nationally.

New Hall of Fame Procedures

At the Board of Directors meeting in Reno, a change was made in how the Hall of Fame is selected. The panel of people who vote for selections to the Hall of Fame has been expanded to 100 people. These consist of the 25 board members, and 75 members, chosen by board members nominating 3 each to form a panel of 100. The 75 members nominated should:

Be an ACC member for at least 5 years.

Have played in tournaments in at least 2 of the 3 regions.

Be able to state that he or she has followed and will follow events and careers in the ACC, and that he or she is interested and able to cast votes concerning who is deserving of entry into the Hall of Fame.

Be absolutely willing to always return a ballot. It would be acceptable to cast a ballot with no names; it would be unacceptable to not return a ballot, and this would result in removal from the panel. The ACC will demand 100% voting by the panel.

Be able to vote on merits, rather than politics.

Term of membership on the panel is 2 years.

The board felt that this expanded voting group was in the best interests of the ACC.

Matt Easterbrook Tops In Richmond

The 5th edition of the Richmond Classic was played in Warfield, VA, with 52 players from the Atlantic region participating. Grand Master Jeff Raynes, Cary, NC, scored a nice 22 10/12 +162 to take Q honors in the 12-game round. The championship finals saw Matt Easterbrook of the host Richmond Cribbage Club overcome a 52-point deficit to defeat Aaron Geroux (NC) in a closely contested playoff. Easterbrook collected 135 MRP's for the win, coupled with his 6th place qualifying position, leaves him a scant 34 MRP's shy of his Master's rating. Geroux picked up 100 MRP's for qualifying 5th and finishing 2nd. Robin Emery (VA) and Dave Leissner (MD) finished in the 3-4 bracket.

Some 36 entrants turned out for the Consolation event and at the end of the day Jim Tanner (VA) nipped Ray Meinert (VA) to take a closely contested all Richmond Cribbage Club final. This was Tanner's 6th tournament win and the 69 MRP's puts him in sight of a Master rating. He stands at 1,855. Director Rick Allen (VA) and Master Jack Howsare (VA) finished in the 3-4 bracket. Chuck Yoemans (VA) led the Consolation qualifying field by winning 7 of 8 games (15 7/8 +70).

The only 28-hand of the day was scored by Andy Laventure (VA) in the Consolation qualifying round. Director Allen plans to hold the next Richmond Cribbage Classic on August 25, 2007.

Michael Samet Tops Garden State

The inaugural Garden State Open, played in Piscataway, NJ, saw a first-time winner as well, as Michael Samet (NY) came home the winner. Life Master Roland Hall (VT) took home a 2nd place finish and added to his 7,900+ lifetime MRP tally. Life Master Dick West (MA) and Michael Burnham (GA) finished 3-4. Howard Terry (VA) took Q honors with a nifty 36 17/22 +193 card in this 66-player match.

One-Star Bill Medeiros (MA) won the 42-player Consolation, edging Master Harvey Glass in the final playoff match. Life Master Donna LaFleur (CT) had a fine match, as she qualified tops and finished in the 3-4 bracket with Scott Harker (PA).

Rule of the month review – Winner of the deal: Each player's cut card is the card at the bottom of the cards held in the hand, not the card on top of the remainder of the pack. The player cutting the lower-ranked card deals the first hand of the game. If both players cut a card of equal rank, the entire pack shall be reshuffled and they shall cut again. If a player exposes more than one card, that play shall cut again.

Grass Roots Club 288 in Belleville, IL. played its own Tournament of Champions on August

19, 2006. Any Grass member of any club was eligible. The only requirement was that to play in their TOC the player had to win a regular scheduled weekly tournament in club 288. They played 36 tournaments and had 17 eligible players. Thirteen of the seventeen played. One was in Iraq, two had quit and the 4th player was working that day. Fun was had by all, breakfast of biscuits & gravy and eggs, plus lunch of home-made pulled pork was included as well as the drinks. The players also enjoyed Goopy Butter Cake and Texas Cake for dessert. The winner was our own Lesley Donahue, who placed 2nd in the Club this past season. Second place was Frank Horn from Grass Roots Club 323 in Wentzville, MO., and Tracy Foutz of GR 288 took third place. We hope to make this an annual event. Dave Carey, Director GR 288.

Dave Mc Corkle of the Timber Capital Cribbage Club of Roseburg, OR took a trip to the north in mid August. He stopped by to play crib at the Chehalis-Centralia Cribbage Club on August 17. In a practice game Dave scored an elusive 29 hand. That was the seventh 29-hand scored in this group over the past ten years. The frequency rate for 29-hands in this group is one in 117,429 deals over that extended period. They say timing is everything. That might not be true with a 29-hand. Most players have never had one. Believe that 29 would be most welcome any time. Way to go Dave! Proof again that this is where the cards are hot and the tempers are not!

Reducing Errors on Scorecards in Club 191. I enter the Game Points, Spread Points, and Games Won on a Microsoft Excel Spreadsheet that I designed for all 9 games, or 10 games with a Sit Out. The computer totals the plus and minus columns and provides the total Game Points, Games Won, and Spread Points which makes it easy to identify errors on scorecards. Using the "Data Form" feature and the "10 Key", it takes less than one minute to enter all nine games from one scorecard. With 12 to 15 players we were

averaging 3 to 4 errors each week. We average 18 players now and don't have any errors some weeks. Most errors on scorecards are in these three categories. (1) The players record different numbers in the plus and minus columns for a game. The most effective way to avoid this mistake is for one or both players to state verbally the number of holes won by. (2) Addition??? We have a second person Check a scorecard for accuracy and initial a "Checked By" space. The only time an addition error is not found is when the opponent of the ninth game had a bad night, is in a hurry to leave, and initials "Checked By" without actually checking the scorecard. Another reason for addition errors is when a number is not legible and is mistaken for an-

other number. (3) Recording the points won or lost by in the wrong column. I remind the players to check the opponent's scorecard closely before they initial it. I also suggest entering the points for a win to the left side of the "Points" box and the zero for games lost on the right side of the box. This makes it easier to add the Game Points on the scorecard and it also makes it easier for the player or the person checking the card to identify points recorded in the wrong plus or minus column. The strategy for the above three problems on scorecards should also work on reducing errors on ACC Tournament scorecards. 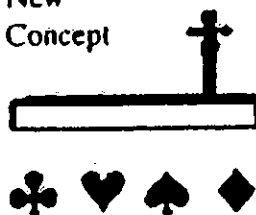
